

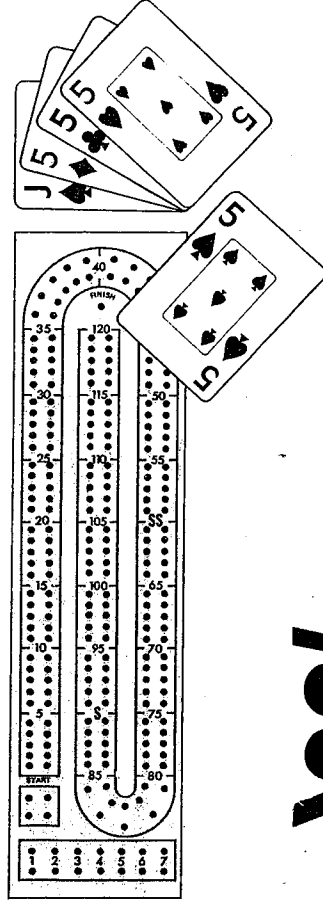

The first 29 hand of the 83-84 cribbage year was held by American Cribbage Congress member, Warren Klausner of Racine, Wisconsin at the American Cribbage Championship in Appleton, WI. on February 5, 1984. As an active member of the Congress, he is entitled to a certificate commemorating his achievement and a cash award of \$100.00. Warren is also a charter member of the Congress and has been an eager participant at many sanctioned tournaments. The Congress was most happy to present his award to him at the MGM Tournament in Green Bay, WI. on February 25, 1984. Congratulations, Warren! Keep on peggin'!

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP CRIBbage TOURNAMENT

Ev Bey reports he is warming up for the 13th Annual World Championship Cribbage Tournament in Quincy CA by playing the "grand ol' game" all over the world. On a recent trip to China he held a 28 hand while riding on a Chinese train from Nanjing to Beijing.

The WCCT, to be held Saturday May 5, 1984 is sponsored by the Quincy Rotary Club and is chaired this year by Rich De Mars. It is the largest one-day tournament on record and the longest running tournament to date. In addition to providing a challenging day of cribbage, this event helps support the many civic and charitable endeavors of the Rotary.

SOMETHING NEW 'DUFFERS AND PEGGERS'

In keeping with the adventurous spirit of the World Master's Cribbage Tournament, scheduled for May 18, 19 and 20, 1984, a new idea is being introduced this year. Since many cribbage players enjoy adding a few days of recreation to their tournament trip, the director of the Master's, Charles Steinhauer, is offering a golf outing in conjunction with this year's event.

Two separate golf tournaments will be available, one on Thursday, May 17 at 1:00 in the afternoon and a second one on Friday, May 18 beginning at 9:30 in the morning. Prizes will be awarded so all you duffers polish up those clubs and come on out and have some fun!

Cribbage play will begin Friday night with an Early Bird Tournament with the main event following on Saturday morning. Championship rounds are to be played on Sunday while those who have missed qualifying can enter the consolation tourney. A Last Chance event will top off the weekend of play. (see enclosure)

1984 AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CHAMPIONSHIP
FEB. 4-5, 1984 APPLETON, WISC.

The Paper Valley Hotel and Convention Center was the setting for this well attended tournament. 342 players representing 6 states were welcomed by Director, Peter Danielson, on Saturday morning and vigorous play was begun. James Schneider of Menominee Falls, WI emerged the victor when playoffs were completed on Sunday. Second place was captured by Pete Negro of Iron Mountain, MI with Leo Lawrence, West Allis, WI taking third over Ernest Paltzer, representing the host city, Appleton. Ronald Reetz, also from Appleton won fifth place with Stan Fink, of Kaukauna WI coming in sixth. In seventh and eighth places were Leroy Fieck of Kaukana and Jack Barrett from Wisconsin Rapids, WI.

Veteran Robert McCabe, of Brown Deer, WI came on to win the consolation event on Sunday challenged by John Petro, of Woodstock, representing the highest Illinois winner. Minnesota shared in the winnings with Fritz Roberg of Duluth taking third place over Vern Charbonneau from New London, WI settling for fourth.

The "Early Bird" on Friday night and the "Saturday Night Special" offered players an opportunity to compete in partners play. The winning pair on Friday was John Danielson, Manitowoc, WI and John Gasper, Pewaukee, WI. Saturday night Jack and Pat Barrett of Wisconsin Rapids, WI took first place.

In addition to being the site of the first 29 hand, held by Warren Klauser, a 28 hand was dealt to John Danielson. As an active member of the Congress this entitles John to a framed certificate.(see editor's note pg.11)

GATEWAY TO THE WORLD CRIBBAGE CLASSIC
FEBRUARY 18-19, 1984 KISSIMMEE, FLA.

Director Dave McGuire, was happy with the participation of 60 players from 15 states and the province of Ontario, Canada in this tournament representing areas from coast to coast. The lure of Florida in February has made this a very popular stop on the tournament trail.

Travelling from Milwaukee, WI was first place winner Robert Julian battling Betty McGuire, from Kissimmee, FL who came in second. Two more Floridians vied for third and fourth places with L.P. Payton of Sanford topping Robert Muelver of Orlando.

The consolation event on Sunday, was won by Ralph Wermers of Mitchell, SD over Marian Quackenbush of Lawrenceville, PA. Haley Johnson, St. Cloud, FL placed third and Robert Read, Winter Garden, FL finished fourth.

Two 28 hands were reported from this tournament. They were scored by Lloyd Parsons of Banner Elk, NC and Bob Anderson of Merrifield, MN.

FEBRUARY 17-19, 1984 PRINEVILLE, ORE.

In four years, Joe Nelson has doubled the number of entrants in this tournament and was pleased to welcome exactly 200 competitors for the main event beginning Saturday morning. Dennis Moran of Elko, NV topped the field of players from 7 states with Roger O'Hara of Salem, OR coming in second. Mac McMurdo from Pasco, WA took third place over E.H. Tollen of Bend, OR. Pasco was also represented by Richard Southwick, who placed fifth and another Oregonian, Shirley Michael of Portland had to settle for sixth. Seventh place was taken by Les Weekly of Salem, OR while Ermin Bear of Eugene, OR won eighth.

Winner of the consolation bracket, played on Sunday was Louie Rasmussen of Vancouver, WA. Second place honors went to John Wright from Madras, OR. Rob Palmer of Baker, OR was the third place winner with Ron Wilson of Prineville, OR coming in fourth.

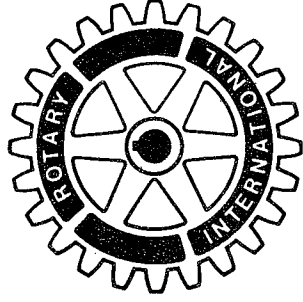

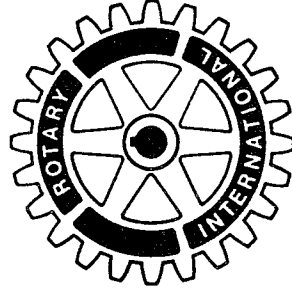

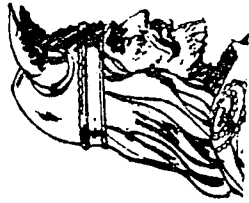
