NOMINATIONS

In the May issue of the Cribbage World you will find a ballot for election of members to the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress. Everyone should take an active interest in who they want representing them on that board. The nominating committee of the B.O.D. will submit names of people they consider to be actively involved in the game of cribbage and who would make every effort to attend meetings of the Board of Directors and actively pursue answers to problems confronting the Board. These meetings are held at the Grand National Tournament, the National Open at Raleigh, NC and at a changeable site and date during the winter months. Any person feeling that they would like to become a nominee for the Board of Directors can submit his or her name on a petition signed by at least 5 active members of the American Cribbage Congress. This petition must be in the hands of the Secretary of the American Cribbage Congress no later than April 28, 1985. The address is on the back page of this Cribbage World. Nominees for Mr. & Mrs. Cribbage World should also be submitted to the secretary on a petition with 5 names.

Terms of new directors commence September 1, 1985 and are for 2 years. 12 new directors will be elected. 13 existing directors will be entering their 2nd term. Only 4 members can be on the board of directors from any one state. Watch for your ballot next month!!!

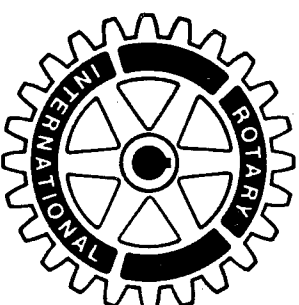
