## THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

The Congress may be taking a giant step forward as announcements are being made daily over the airwaves in Texas, eastern Iowa, central Illinois, and western Wisconsin, such as:

"It's the fastest growing game in America. In fact, it's been said to be the best two-handed game in the world. We're speaking of the game cribbage. The American Cribbage Congress, a non-profit organization, says, let us help you start a local cribbage club in your area. Once your local club has been formed and has joined the Congress, your club members can then play in local, state and national tournaments, thus earning a national rating. Each member will receive monthly the CRIBBAGE WORLD magazine, plus more. Sound like fun, go for it! For your free informational packet, simply dial toll free 1-800-ZZZZ-ZZZZ. That's toll free. Call today and your free informational packet will be on the way."

As a non-profit organization, we qualify for public service announcements (PSA), as this program aims to help people enjoy their favorite game. We cannot solicit membership or attendance at tournaments because that would come under the classification of advertising.

Texas was chosen as one of the states in the pilot program because we have less than 30 members in the entire state. In eastern Iowa there are few people on the rolls, as there are in central Illinois and western Wisconsin.

Fifty cities were included in the radio project in the first mailing of July 15. The deadline for magazine news is on the 20th of the month, so there will not be a follow-up report until September.

This writer has received dozens of letters from new members, all asking the same questions: "Why don't you advertise the Congress? Why don't you get articles in magazines and newspapers? I just heard of the Congress a few days ago. Where have you been?"

There are 5,000 radio stations in the United States. If 40% of them air our messages, we could be on the way to doubling or tripling our membership. Jeff Monroe, the new Secretary-Membership, says that he is ready for a sudden increase. Please note that the ZZZ-ZZZZ in the 800 number is a dud, so

that other Congress business does not call our 800 number, which is on the Pacific Coast. Always "Think Big!" with us.

### Direct Mailing Project Is a Great Success!

The books on the drive for new members through direct mailings can be considered closed now. The members who donated to the program can rest assured that their dollars brought in new members.

There were 1,112 packets mailed extolling the benefits of having a membership in the Congress, and a total of 151 new members resulted. The percentage of return was 13.58%, triple the percent that the large mailers of magazine and soap/detergent advertising realize. These companies are happy when they receive a 3.6% return.

Many thanks to the people who financed this program. We proved the advertising slogan, "You must give in order to get" or "It pays to advertise."

### Cribbage Is Played at College

It won't be long now and the schools will be opening up for the new season, and many young people will head for college. Be sure to send a cribbage board and a pack of cards along with them.

The contract bridge people have noted that most of their members are over the age of 53, so they are starting a campaign for bridge classes in colleges and high schools.

We cribbage fanatics can't sit back and not fight back. We have an advantage because fourth and fifth graders can handle crib, so we can get a head start. Then, too, cribbage can be played by two people, and it is a fun game, whereas bridge competition is of the dog-eat-dog style. Did you ever view a bridge tournament between the experts? There is no fun there at all. That is the reason why most of their players are over 53 and giving up the game.

## MISSING MEMBERS

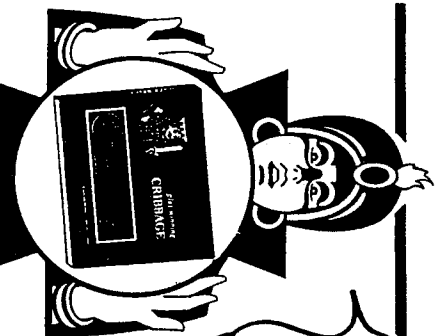

## HOW MASTER POINTS ARE EARNED:

TOURNAMENT MUST BE SANCTIONED BY THE AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS.

Qualifying Round: Top 1/8 earns one-quarter points, i.e., 100 players, top qualifier earns 25 points, 2nd earns 23, etc.

Main Tournament: Top 1/8 earns full points, i.e., 100 players, champion earns 100 points, 2nd earns 92, 3rd earns 84, etc. If 40 or more players, BONUS POINTS are earned: 1st earns 40 bonus points, 2nd earns 20, 3rd earns 10 and 4th earns 5. In this example, No. 1 earns 140 points (100 + 40).

Consolation Tournament: Top 1/8 earns one-half points, i.e., 64 players, 1st earns 32 points, 2nd earns 28 points, 3rd earns 24 points, etc. BONUS POINTS are earned: 1st earns 20 bonus points, 2nd earns 10 points, 3rd earns 5 points and 4th earns 3 points. In this example, No. 1 earns 52 points (32 + 20).
