Season Finale

he 2011–2012 tournament season ended with a whoosh on July 31, as Life Master (6*) **Duane Toll** (Sutherlin OR) sucked up even more MRPs on his way to another national championship.

In the final month of play, twenty-four tournaments were held coast-to-coast—from Reno to Raleigh, and at such diverse points in between as Kenosha, Pahrump, St. Cloud, and Sunnyside. A total of 2,751 players entered these sanctioned tourneys—twelve of them in the last week alone—as several MRP-chasers made major moves in the standings.

In Raleigh, Master Marvin Lewis (Chesapeake VA) skated through seventeen rounds of play without a loss—and without his trademark ponytail—and captured the thirty-ninth National Open championship. This exquisite performance in the last weekend of the season secured for Marvin a top fifty placing in the Eastern Region.

Several point-chasers descended on the small Midwestern town of St. Cloud MN to fight over the cool trophies awarded at *four* mains and *four* consolations played in the space of *six* days. **Don Urban** (Marengo IL) did so well in St. Cloud that he jumped from #23 to #11 in the Central Region standings, in the process both earning his Master Award and becoming an alternate on the Central Region All Star team.

Not surprisingly, the biggest action seemed to revolve around Life Master (*) Cy Madrone (Santa Barcontinued on page 10

Portland Open July 15 was a good day to be a member of the Symons family (Madras OR). Grandfather Marty Symons placed ninth in the consolation. Grandson Ian Symons took fifth. And grandmother Irma Symons qualified #2 and took first place.

Run for the Gold For the first time since joining the ACC thirteen years ago, Jim Crawford (Mountain View CA) got a string of pearls—in the consolation at Alta CA. If this can happen to a former winner of both the 2004 Grand National and the 2005 JPW/ACC Open, it can happen to anyone!

Midweek Challenge Life Master (*) Frank Ornie (Drain OR) stopped Life Master (6*) DeLynn Colvert (Missoula MT) from claiming his fourth consecutive championship. DeLynn won the consolation in 2009 and the main in 2010 and 2011, only to come up just short in his bid for a four-peat!

National Open Eleven Connecticut players traveled seven hundred miles to play in Raleigh, and ten of them earned MRPs. Grand Master Roger Bouchard (Glastonbury CT) finished third in the NOCT main, and Life Master (*) Phil Martin (Newington CT) finished second in the Come Monday tourney. Unfortunately, he had to forfeit the championship match in order to catch his plane home!

bara CA). Cy's successes in Minnesota—among them, high qualifier in MRP Chaser #1 and winner of Last Chance—followed hard on the heels of his win the previous week at Run for the Gold in Alta CA. The MRPs that Cy earned in July pushed him ahead of both Life Master (*) Mel Ashley (Marina CA) and Life Master (*) Erik Locke (Wood Village OR) in the Western Region standings and earned Cy his second appearance on the All American squad.

Meanwhile, in southern California, Mel Ashley made it to the finals of the South Sacramento Moose Madness main tourney. As good as this was, it left Mel just a

few points away from securing a spot on the Western Region All Star team. But it wasn't all bad news for Mel, as he did capture his second All American award.

Of course, the biggest news of the season's end is that **Duane Toll** is once again the ACC champion. He won his eighth championship in impressive fashion: by winning seven tournaments throughout the year and by setting a new seasonal record of 3,121 MRPs—shattering by 350 points his previous record of 2,771 MRPs,

a mark that he set last year.

Here's how Duane now stacks up against ACC leader Life Master (6★) De-Lynn Colvert (Missoula MT):

At this time last year, these numbers were 2,426 MRPs and 6 tourneys.

Youth Teaching Tip

One important thing to teach kids learning the game of cribbage is the strong luck factor involved—perhaps as much as 80% luck and 20% skill. With that knowledge, a young player may better understand if he or she is defeated by a player with lesser skills, or not get too big of a head if they beat a veteran player. Often at tournaments, I see people get frustrated and upset about getting bad cards or rarely catching a cut. Let's all remember that cribbage is a game to be played for fun. The only thing that gets in the way of the fun is when we take winning or losing too seriously.

Youth News

Requests for teaching manuals and startup kits are on the rise. Approximately 90% of all requests are from teachers wanting to incorporate cribbage into their math classes or as an elective. The youth component of the ACC is essential to keep the game of cribbage alive in our younger generations, ultimately maintaining a healthy ACC membership in the future. There is no cost for sending out teaching manuals, but a startup kit (ten long boards) costs \$150 to process. Donations made to the ACC Youth Program make it possible to place these boards in classrooms. When you renew your membership, please consider contributing to the Youth Program (check the donation option on the membership form) so we continue to have the necessary funds to meet these requests.



Main Tourney Playoffs

Effective August 1, all main tournament playoffs are required to be best of five games throughout the playoffs—including the first round of one-day tourneys. On rare occasions, if time constraints require an early exit from the playing location, the regional tournament commissioner may approve best of three games, but any exception must be requested prior to the start of the tournament.

Grass Roots Division Winners

Joseph Cornelissen (Rotonda West FL) is the Grass Roots national champion and Division 1 champion. Joseph was also the national champion in the 2007–2008 season, when he set the national record of 383 GRPs. This year, he set a new record by scoring an astounding 461 points in only thirty weeks of play!

The amended agenda was approved with additions, the minutes of the September 30 BOD meeting were approved as amended, and Scott Kooistra reported on the TOC and JPW/ACC Open.

All American Team: after discussion, Logan moved to rescind his motion that eliminated the All American Team and restore it as it was prior to the September 30 meeting. Motion approved 21-3. Milk moved to form an ad hoc committee to study expansion of the All American Team. J. Hofbauer amended it to consist of eleven members (three from the Eastern and Central Regions, five from the Western). Motion approved 23-1. Committee members appointed, as follows: Eastern Region: Widener, Milk, and Perkins; Central Region: Steinmetz, Richard Frost, and Shimp; Western: Brown (chair), Hall, Dan Marsh, Larry Hassett, and Herschel Mack.

BOD Agenda: Barnes asked that the BOD agenda be posted on the ACC's website and printed in *Cribbage World* prior to each meeting.

Hall of Fame: Barrett reported that 100% of the ballets were returned this year. Perkins announced that Patrick Barrett was voted into the Hall of Fame.

Treasurer's Report: Marlene Lazachek discussed the income statement, comparative balance sheet, and cash balance sheet. Items of note: money from Game Colony decreased: we received \$7,200 in 2010 and \$4,500 in 2011. A new computer was purchased for R. Hofbauer (\$547) and a new printer for Larry Hassett (\$1,200). Milk moved to approve the treasurer's report. Motion approved.

Policy Manual: Perkins handed out replacement pages. The entire Policy Manual is to be posted on the ACC website.

Membership Secretary's Report: Larry Hassett reported that membership is down slightly. He is reprinting the *Cribbage Anyone?* flyer.

New MRP Program: Larry Hassett passed out a condensed version on of new software program, which will improve and simplify the process. The goal is to review this again at the September meeting and then put it out for bids.

Executive Committee Report (J. Hofbauer): approved new printer for Larry Hassett.

Ethics Committee Report (Logan): did not take any actions.

Grass Roots Program Report (Joan Rein): just over 4,000 members so far this year. Fees for GRRT and GRNT were increased from \$12 to \$15, with one dollar of the increase being paid back in the prize fund and two dollars going to offset the increase in the cost of awards. A new Grass Roots award level has been established above the

Gold level-Platinum.

Youth Cribbage (Dan Zeisler): Dan gets a steady stream of requests for manuals from all over the country. He has seen a huge increase in board donations as boards are being recycled and being put into the hands of youth players and teachers. Dan announced the establishment of the Youth Cribbage Recognition Award to honor the organization or individual who goes out of their way to support the youth cribbage movement. The first winner of this award was Barbara Woodward and the Sands Regency.

Internet Program (Milk): a nine-game Grass Roots-style internet tournament has started on Wednesdays at ecrib-bage.com. The ACC's Facebook site has been getting about 150 hits per week. The ACC's twitter account is so far being used mainly by the Sands. Milk moved that the ACC spend \$400 for a year's worth of advertisement on ecribbage.com. Motion passed.

PR/Publicity Report (Norm Nikodym): Norm has looked into magazine advertising, but is not impressed with it. Finley shared a business card that he has available for Grass Roots clubs. If you email him your club information, he will print business card specifically for your club to hand out.

Judges Report (Shimp): since the inception of peer judging in tournaments, the problem that has plaqued us the most has been bad judge decisions. The ACC requires two judges to be present in every ruling. With anyone able to become a judge because it is an open book test, we are considering have a tiered system of judging so that when there is a judge call, a new judge is accompanied by a senior judge. Shimp asked to be informed about bad judging calls.

Tournament Rules & Guidelines Report (R. Hofbauer): after discussion, R. Hofbauer moved that two one-day tournaments may not be held at the same venue on consecutive days, but each regional tournament commissioner may grant a maximum of three weekend exemptions per year per region, retroactive to the beginning of the cribbage season. Motion approved 18-6. R. Hofbauer announced that money taken out of entry fees as a donation to nonprofit organizations or charities should be sent to the tournament commissioners, who will send it to Marlene Lazachek, who in turn will send the money to the charities from the ACC. This information will then be reported in *Cribbage World*. This will address concerns about where this money goes.

President's Report (J. Hofbauer): copyright has expired on two ACC logos. Motion passed unanimously to renew copyright for both logos.

Executive VP Report (Schaefer): Todd announced that Hannula would be taking over next year as director of the TOC and that Peggy and Rick Shea will be codirecting JPW Open.

VP of Policy Report (Perkins): Cathy issued a replacement page for the Policy Manual that reflected the earlier vote on the All American Team.

VP of Operations Report (Campbell): Dave reported that he approved purchase of two items for Aiken: storage units for CW archives and printer.

Member-at-Large Report (Shimp): no report.

BOD Minutes—continued from page 37

Grand National 31: Joan Rein reported that plans are moving along smoothly. Hotel rooms are \$89/night plus \$2 for parking. A website will be set up, and raffle tickets will be sold at tournaments prior to GN to aid fundraising.

Grand National 32: O'Neil updated plans for the Atlanta GN; the hotel will hold up to 800 people and is close to many attractions.

Grand National 33: Brian Neeley said plans are in the early stage.

Rule Modification: discussion involved how judges should rule when a player errantly says "go" when the count is 21 or lower. Shimp (head of the judging committee) said that no judge should ever rule a renege in this situation and said that an article in *Cribbage World* would be appropriate. The issue was sent to the rule committee for inclusion in the next rulebook.

Ethics Committee clarifications: Brown addressed some questions and concerns about membership information. Perkins said that our policy manual states that any information gathered on members can be used only for ACC purposes. It was decided that an attorney review this policy.

ACC's Assumed Power of Discretion: Brown asked whether the ethics committee should have BOD approval prior to any suspension.

Proposal for Three Yearly BOD Meetings: Widener asked that a third BOD meeting be held in Raleigh NC at the National Open in July. He presented three reasons: (1) this would reduce the length of BOD meetings; (2) it would coincide with the end of the cribbage season, which would be an appropriate time to institute changes; and (3) new BOD members could attend the meeting as nonvoting members to get up to speed on issues before the next meeting. A straw poll showed only three BOD members in favor of this.

Proposal to Establish Same Weekend Distance Limitations: Widener would like a rule that two sanctioned tournaments not be held in the same region on the weekend, because they draw from the same pool of people, which reduces the number of people attending. Discussion indicated that there was no interest in pursuing this issue.

Proposal for a National Championship Tournament: Widener would like to see a national championship playoff tournament held at Grand National each year. The tournament would consist of thirty-two players, ten from each region and the two players with the next highest MRP totals. A straw poll indicted enough interest to bring this back to the BOD for further consideration.

Next BOD Meeting: Friday, September 21, at 9a in Appleton WI.
