However, Dick Cornwell of Sunnyvale, California, while at Raleigh announced that this ICA figure was about three times too high. Dick says he and his buddy engineers will recompute and let us know.

- THE ORDER HAS CHANGED -

Our little fraternity has changed but its mission remains the same - support of the junior activities.

As of September 1st (81) initiation fee for membership in this elite corps will be \$25. as a donation to the junior program or a \$25.00 ad in Cribbage World. Initiation fees will go directly to the treasury.

Membership is presently up to 35 Generals and we hope to hit 100 before the end of CY 1981-82. By the way, there were ten or so CG commissioned last August (80) & The Cribadier Adjutant will soon be notifying you that your dues are due....

MASTER POINT PARADE

Badgers continue to dominate the top fifty super list with 25 players. Actually the list shows 51 players this month because we have four tied in 48th place. That's forty nine percent for the Badgers. Following Wisconsin comes Minnesota with six and California with four. Three of the four Golden Staters are women. Fourteen states are represented on the top fifty hit parade which includes 45 gents and six ladies.

Arnold Crews regains the lead with a brilliant fifth place finish at the National Open in Raleigh earlier this month. Secretary Jim Arblaster also showed well (9th - 203.67) as he jumped from 12th to 3rd place, while Dan McHugh, the Pittsburgh whiz, finished up in the runner-up spot takes over the 10th slot.

Hey, how about the Mr & Mrs team in 11th and 12th places? Great huh? Mary was great at Raleigh, she tied at 7-8 places for 227.67 master points which jacked her up from a mile and a half off the board to 12th place.
