Hall of Fame

The Executive Committee, after conducting several powwows during the past 12 months, finally presented to the Board an all-systems-go policies and procedures guide for the operation of our very own Hall of Fame. All agree it is a great start and hopefully it will mushroom and maybe one day it will surface somewhere in this beautiful land of ours in a permanent place.

Four were elected to the Hall in its first year. Sir John and Ol Joe made it on the first ballot, while Mr Secretary and Vice President Nick Pond gain entrance on later ballots. These five star cribadiers were elected by the Board at its annual meeting in Raleigh, NC earlier this month.

To be elected a nominee must appear on 80 percent of the ballots cast in any one polling. Ten separate pollings will take place each year at the annual meeting. Any and all cribbage players, living or dead, active or retired, are eligible for nomination, election and induction.

Those elected to the Hall will be inducted at the annual Awards Banquet or at the next official function they attend.
