NEW RULING: In answer to several complaints from the field, the Board of Directors, by a vote of 23 to 3, revised the tournament players rating system which now requires a player to play in at least three sanctioned tmnts to become eligible to receive All American honors or other such awards. The new ruling will go into effect September 1, 1982, the beginning of the next cribbage-year.

Wizard George beat out a tough competitor in Vicki Aud of Shalimar, FL who was playing in her first tournament. Arnold Crews of Jacksonville & Dave Fournier of Casselberry finished 3rd & 4th. Twas 2nd straight year Arnold walked off with a hefty Q-Pool first prize. In the Consolation it was Marlyne Arblaster in a breeze. Dave McGuire, also of Kissimmee, was the runner-up with Fast Eddie Bowes (Mr Cribbage World '82) of Milton, Mass finishing third. Two years straight this event was awarded a Five-Star rating by the Congress, with 111 percent payback. It's always over 100% payback in Fla.

Prineville: Rob Palmer of Baker was the gent they crowned as the Oregon State champion. He beat out D. H. Ford of Mitchell in an exciting finals match.
