- NOMINATIONS FOR DIRECTOR

Ballots for the election of Directors will be mailed out as soon as they are off the press, hopefully before the end of May. This will allow about 30 days to mull-over, mark and mail your ballot before the June 30th dead-line. Ballots received with a July post mark will not be counted. So make sure you get your ballot in the mail pronto.

Thirty-eight members have been nominated to fill the 13 two-year term positions. You'll be voting for up to 13 on this ballot. Ballots with more than 13 votes will be tossed out. Again, return addressed envelopes will be furnished. No stamps though, we cannot afford it.

Here is a little twitch for you. The bylaws state that no more than four from any one state or province can be in office at the same time. So, you see it is possible for some one to receive more votes than another nominee and not be elected. For example let us take Wisconsin; there are two already on the Board for one more year and there are four Wisconsinites on this ballot of which the top two will be elected. That's the way the mop flops....

- CRIBBAGE SOLITAIRE





Wendell Riherd picked up 145.21 points in the Legion event and as a result he is back on top of the blue-ribbon list of cribadiers. 

- CRIB NEWS -

A rule change will soon be published pertaining to "overpegging and claiming the game."

A precedent was established by a ruling in the 1978 National Open Tournament in Raleigh, NC. A three judge panel ruled that a player claiming the game by pegging over the mark forfeits the game regardless of the position of the opponents pegs.

Since that original ruling in Raleigh, it has happened three times in sanctioned competition - Antioch, IL, August 1981; St Paul, MN, February 1982; and Wilmington, NC, March 1982. In each case the judges ruling was the same, "He who makes false claim of the game, forfeits the game."

The National Rules Committee advises that this <u>approved ruling</u> will be included in a rules book change which is expected to be published in either May or June 1982....
