- HALL OF FAME -

Everett E. Bey, founder of the World Championship Cribbage Tournament which he sired and christened in Quincy, California, has been elected to the Cribbage Hall of Fame.

Everett is the fifth cribber to be elected to the Congress Hall of Fame which was established just last year.

Enshrinement ceremonies will take place at the annual Awards Banquet on October first at the Marriott Hotel in Springfield, Massachusetts.

Sweet Old Bey (SOB), as he is affectionately known as, received the required 80 percent vote of the Board members on the seventh ballot. There were ten ballots taken in all and no others were elected to the Hall at this meeting. Plans were to elect three but President Wergin called off the balloting when it was evident the log-jam could not be broken.

Everett recently turned sweet 65 and promptly retired from being edior-in-chief for seven weekly newspapers which he owns in northern California, in the beautiful Feather River region. He now plans to travel quite a bit. His first trip will be to jolly ole England and he is attempting to put together a cribbage tour consisting of about eight or ten stateside cribadiers. RULE ON MUST CUT - STRIKES BLOW FOR LOGIC -

At the BoD meeting in Raleigh late last month the MUST CUT rule was strengthened by the addition of two two-point penalties. Here is how the changed rule will read:

Rule III - Cutting

3. - Before the Deal

- "a. Dealer shall place the pack on the table for the pone to cut. Dealer is penalized two (2) points for not complying with this rule. However, penalty is not assessed until the six cards have been dealt and picked-up. Dealer has until this point to redeem himself.
- b. If pone refuses or fails to cut the pack, he is penalized two (2) points. Dealer should then cut the pack himself."

In the past the Board vote on the must cut ruling was not unanimous. The vote to add the two two-point penalties was unanimous and without abstentions.

Both common sense and foresight of the must cat ruling obviously escaped several North Carolinians who nearly retched when hearing the announcement that the must cut rule would be in effect at the National Open tournament next year.

For what is it worth: There used to be a regular at Raleigh until he/she was caught stacking cards at a tournament in New York state a year or two ago. If my memory serves me correctly, this same person cashed in the top 16 at the National Open three years in a row. No one ever did that before - not even the wizardry of Arnold Crews or Johnnie Wilkinson stood up for such a period of time.

MASTER POINT PARADE

The following statistics were compiled from the results of 45 tournaments. That's five additional tournaments since the Master Point centerfold was published last month: The MGM, South Shore Open, Hayward Charity Classic, Minnesota Open & the 10th National Open.

Leo Schwedrsky picked up 365 points and leaped from 11th to the number one spot in one easy lesson. The biggest gain was by Tom Pare (New Berlin, WI) who on the strength of 390 points went from 29th place all the way up to b ecome the runner-up. A couple of other big gainers were Rudy Hebein with 355 points & Larry Rowley of Madison picked up a cool 271 points.

Don Nadeau, winner of the MGM, jumped on the band wagon in 23rd place while Cathy Perkins, winner of the National Open, climbed on board in the 30th spot.

The top ten is strictly all-macho. Mary Cornwell of Sunnyvale, California, fell from the top ten down to 14th place, however, she is still captain of the Women's All American team at this point.

At this point (?)... There are only three tournaments scheduled for this, the final month of CY-83. However, there are two completed tournaments to be heard from. The Willows (CA) report was incomplete so it was returned. The Vic Christofferson tournament which operates out of Racine (VFW), one night a month for seven months, has not been heard from. We're mustering a search party now....
