NOMINATIONS

Sixteen candidates have been nominated for 12 two-year terms on the American Cribbage Congress board of directors.

In keeping with the ACC Constitution, to assure representation throughout the manufership, six of the nominees are from the Midwest, five from the Eastern states, three from the West and two from the South. (Cont.)

In addition, members who seek nomination may submit their name along with the signatures of at least five members in good standing. These will also be included on the ballot which will be distributed with the May issue of the Cribbage World. Deadline for submission of these additional nominees is April 30, 1984.

Terms of new directors commence September 1, 1984. Although no limit is placed on the number of nominees from any state, no more than four members of the board shall be from one state. Wisconsin has three board members who will continue in office; California, Florida, Illinois, Minnesota and North Carolina each have two directors continuing in office; and Iowa and Minnesota each have one board member whose term continues.

The next issue of Cribbage World will contain. a short biography of each candidate, due April 25. Ballots must be returned to the ACC secretary by June 15, 1984.

Members of the nominating committee were Ev Bey, California; Scott Kooistra, Minnesota; Harry Palmer, Massachusetts; and president Joe Wergin, Wisconsin.

Nominations are also open for Mr. and Mrs. Cribbage World. These names must be accompanied by five signatures of members of the Congress in good standing and be submitted to the secretary by April 30, 1984.

This tournament graciously hosted the American Cribbage Congress' Midwinter Board of Directors meeting. Tournament director, E. Hargesheimer, Jr. of Hamburg, NY reports that 13 states were represented at this two day marathon with over 1250 different cribbage games played.

Jeffrey Clark of Antioch, IL emerged the winner from a field of 68 contestants competing at the Regency Motor Inn in this fifth annual tournament. Jeff lost only once during this two day double elimination contest and then only to the second place winner, Frederick McGibney from Burlington, VT. Third place was taken by Harry Palmer, West Springfield, MA with fourth, fifth and sixth places taken by Western New Yorkers; Paul Eichler of N. Tonawanda, Samuel Joseph, of Cheektowaga and Robert Corp of Grand Island.

The tournament directors believe this 5th Annual event will spark considerable local interest in the gentlemanly game of cribbage. Plans are already being made for the 6th WNY Open the third week of March, 1985.

ESCAPE TRY FLOPS

ROSEBURG (UPI) - A clever Douglas County Jail immate used a cribbage board to smash through the "shatterproof" window of his fourth-story jail cell, but he fell 35 feet when his bedsheet "rope" snapped as he began his descent.

John Richard Casper, 23, Sacramento, Calif., was in good condition and under police guard at a Roseburg hospital Sunday with a bruised back resulting from his fall, which occurred shortly after 7 p.m. Saturday.

Sheriff's Cpl. William Pinkston said a guard apparently spotted Casper's escape attempt and tried to restrain him but was unsuccessful and he broke away for his ill-fated climb, which ended quickly when his rope made out of bedsheets snapped from his weight.
