The American Cribbage Congress has survived its infancy and struggled through its formative years. It was born in August of 1979 in Raleigh, NC weighing in with a Charter Membership of 545. It has gained to a current membership of 2761. It should continue to grow with the continuing enthusiasm of its present members.

In celebration of our 5th birthday, when you renew your membership this year invite a friend to join the ACC. If you know of any lapsed members remind them that we need their support in order to continue to inform and involve our fellow cribbage lovers.

During the months of August and September all of the members of the American Cribbage Congress will receive a billing statement regarding dues. A self addressed envelope will accompany this billing and we would appreciate all of our members returning their dues as soon as possible. Thank you.

TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS

During the recent Board of Directors meeting in Raleigh, NC a decision was made to schedule the Third Annual Invitational Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas, NV on December 14th. There will be no master points awarded in this tournament since participation is limited to invited members who were rated in the top 100 in 1983-84 and the previous 2 seasons.

The board also authorized invitations to any other members who are in the top 50 in the final 1984 Regional lists and any others who were in the final 16 in the 1982 tournament or in the final 8 of the 1983 tournament. Those who are eligible will be notified by mail after the final standings are completed for the 1983-84 season.

The Tournament of Champions will be followed, on Sunday, December 15, by a sanctioned Las Vegas Open, instead of a consolation tournament. Master points will be awarded on a normal 1 out of 8 basis. All members of the A.C.C. will be eligible to participate.

Make your plans, you top players! This tournament is a real challenge. More details will follow in future Cribbage Worlds.

There is no entry fee for the tournament. No cash prizes will be awarded but there will be prizes such as trophies and items that will appeal to juniors.



3rd ANNUAL GRAND NATIONAL

Cribbage Tournament & Awards Banquet

The third annual Grand National Championship will be held on the 29th and 30th of September 1984 at the Ramada O'Hare Inn in Rosemont, Illinois. The tournament is open to anyone 18 years of age and older. This tournament is sanctioned by the American Cribbage Congress and national rating points will be awarded.

Registration begins at 7:00 A.M. Saturday. Orientation and presentation of rules with a question and answer period at 8:00 A.M. The tournament begins promptly at 9:00 A.M. All players play 2 games against 11 opponents on Saturday. Qualifiers from Saturday's round play in single elimination, best of 5, on Sunday, to determine the tournament winners. The number of qualifiers for Sunday's finals will not exceed 64, and is determined by the number of entries.

The entry fee for non-A.C.C. members is \$41.00 and \$36.00 for members. Checks received without the properly filled form will be returned.

There will be an optional 'Q' pool for Saturday's qualifying round. The 'Q' pool prizes will be graduated. There will be a consolation tournament on Sunday for those players who do not qualify for the finals. Entry fee is \$20.00 including \$5.00 toward a 'Q' pool on Sunday with the same graduated prizes.

The committee will do its best to keep expenses down and guarantee at least 90% return of the entry fees in the championship tournament, as well as all 'Q' pools.

The Ramada O'Hare has set aside a block of rooms at reduced rates of \$48.00 per night, double occupancy. If reservations are made by phone, you must mention that you are attending the Grand National Tournament. Toll-free reservations call 1(800) 228-2828.

The Ramada Inn located at Manheim and Higgins Rds. in Rosemont, IL has easy access from all tollways and courtesy buses from O'Hare Field every 15 minutes. The hotel offers restaurants, swimming pools, tennis, and free golf on their lighted golf course.

There will be a Friday Night Earlybird starting at 8:00 P.M.



Troy Haynie from Los Gatos, CA emerged the winner over Butch Reynolds of Santa Maria, CA while Frank Zabrowski, Fremont, CA was victorious over Mel Carrera from Reno, NV coming in fourth. In addition to cash prizes, trophies and cribbage boards were awarded to the top eight finishers.

MINNESOTA OPEN CRIBBAGE TOURNAMENT JULY 7-8, 1984 MINNEAPOLIS, MN

Tournament director Scott Kooistra reports that all went well at the 4th Annual Minnesota Open. The event attracted 230 players from 11 states and Canada. Julius Frevel from St Paul, MN defeated George DeMers from Minneapolis in a close 7-game match to claim first place. In another battle of locals, Al Mahowald from Apple Valley, MN beat Frank Trojan from St. Paul for third place.

The consolation tournament attracted 108 players on Sunday. Gene Lindgren, another St. Paul entry, defeated Fred Tilker from Madison, WI for first place. Al Maybrey of Fridley, MN won third place and Jim Mahan from Robbinsdale, MN took fourth.

Scott Henderson scored a 29-hand in the Early Bird tournament on Friday night. Scott hails from Madison, WI. Three players held 28-hands in sanctioned tournament play. They were Delrose Bruesehoff from Hopkins, MN; Octave

Irey from Richfield, MN: and Gen Kaufmann from Oshkosh, WI.

The Minnesota Open featured a computer entrant in the Friday night Early Bird tournament. The program, called Cribbage Partner, was devised by Bruce McKay. The computer won 7 games and lost 2 against 9 players. It was a big hit with the players!
