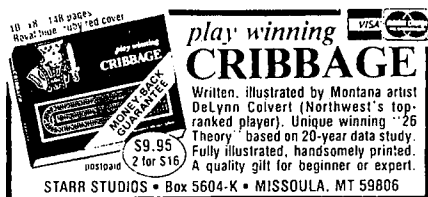

FIRST GEORGIA OPEN CRIBBAGE TOURNAMENT
JAN. 28-29, 1984 AUGUSTA, GA

It was a small world indeed when Luis Lizarribar, Georgia Open Tournament director, found that Earl Themze and Paul Colbenson had recognized each other as they were checking in to play at the Georgia Open, as advertised in "Tournament Trails" in the Cribbage World. Earl and Paul had not seen each other for 40 years, after having gone to school together. Kind Luis helped them celebrate their reunion by awarding them dinner certificates at the Town Tavern, one of the sponsors of the tournament.

This first time event drew 62 players from 7 states. Top honors were won by Robert Gombatz of Raleigh, NC in first place; Richard O. Ricke of Greenville, SC taking second; Earl T. Henze from Rushford, MN placing third and Joe Kirchgassner also of Raleigh finishing fourth.

There were three 28 hands reported. They were held by Frances Wade, Chesapeake, VA; Luis Lizarribar, Augusta, GA and Paul Woytovich, Hickory, NC.

A consolation event was held on Sunday with 40 players participating. First place was captured by Georgian, Charles Doman of Atlanta with second being won by Luis Lizarribar, Sr. of Augusta, GA. George Burwell from Warrenton, NC came in third over Paul Colbenson, Atlanta in fourth.

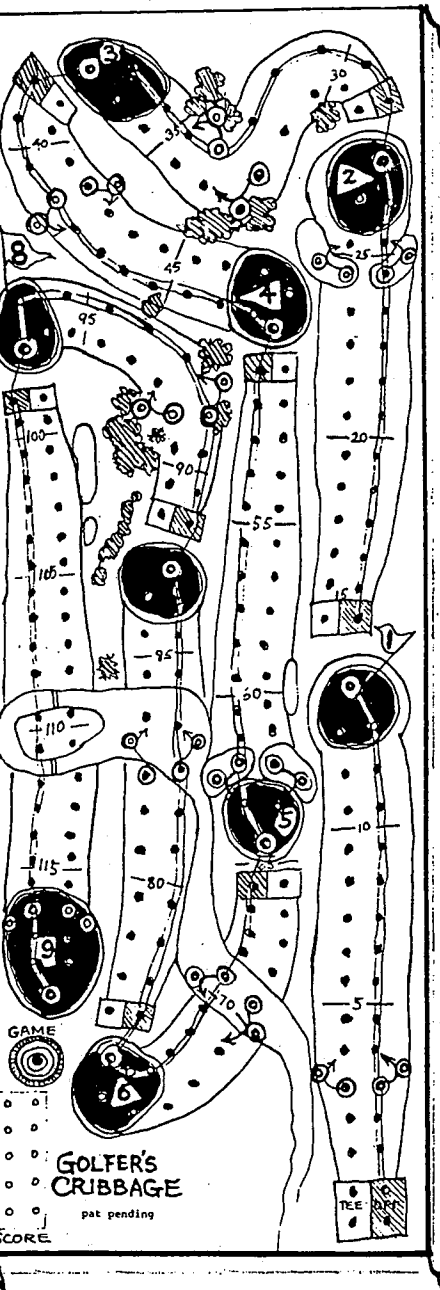

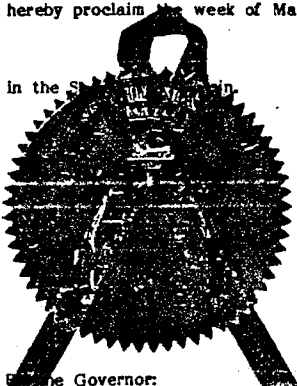
WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin recognizes the social and economic benefits that have been derived from six years of Masters' competition; and



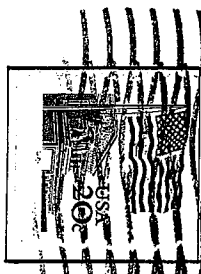
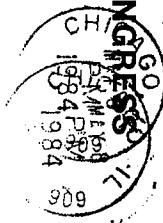
