He played some unbelievable cribbage for the three days of the tournament. He never lost a match! Runner-up was Scott Kooistra of Brooklyn Park, MN, a familiar name on the tournament trail and a hard working member of the Board of Directors of the ACC. Third place winner was Ev Bey, VP of the ACC from Quincy, CA followed by Bob Gombatz of Raleign, NC taking fourth. Alex Wingate from Golsboro, NC was fifth and another ACC director who is also the #1 master point achiever, Bob "Mick" Michaelis, of Marinette, WI placed sixth.

The consolation tournament was won by Dorothy Chance from Richmond, VA with Carl Palmer of W. Springfield, MA as runner-up. Maxine Maddox, Wilmington, NC took third over Bob Blackford in fourth.




