September 21st and 22nd are the dates for the 1985 Grand National Tournament and Awards Banquet. This gala event will be held at the Granada Royale Homotel in Denver Colorado. Make your plans to join us in honoring the top cribbage players from each section of the country. This Rocky Mountain Funfest is the American Cribbage Congress "bash of the year". In addition to the master point champions other cribbage celebrities will be given recognition for their efforts on behalf of the "grand ole game".

This 3rd annual tournament, under the direction of Kate McDonald and held to benefit the Companions of Alameda, welcomed 76 participants.

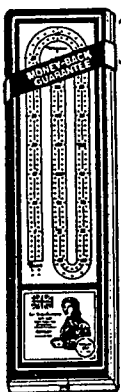

## WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

MAY 4, 1985 QUINCY, CA

Plumas A. Stokes of Quincy, whose father named him after the county that originated the World Championship Cribbage Tourney, outpegged 375 other cribbage players to win the 14th renewal of this largest one-day tournament. Runner-up was Robert Ozanish of Rancho Cordova, CA. In an unusual scoring procedure Amelee Killion from San Luis Obispo, CA tied for third place with Tom Stevens from Oroville, CA.

Nevada, Oregon, Colorado, along with California, were represented in the 64 qualifiers in this largest American Cribbage Congress sanctioned tournament of the year, to date. The Quincy Rotary Club is also a winner in this event as proceeds beyond expenses and prizes go toward local community service projects. Tournament directors, Bob Moon and Ev Bey, with their able staff, are to be commended for their efforts on behalf of cribbage and their community.

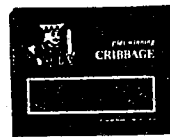

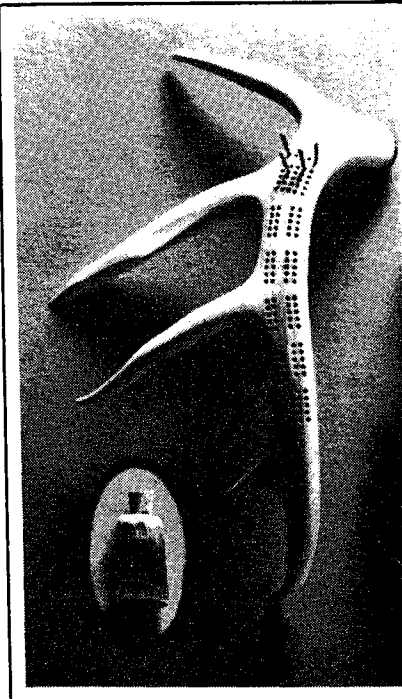
