ELECTION RESULTS

SMALL TURNOUT DECIDES THE WINNERS

The \$100,000 for charity will be divided proportionately among the 25 agencies designated most often by tournament entrants.


THE WINDJAMMER CHALLENGE MAY 11, 1985 ANTIOCH, IL

There are no grammatical errors in these statements. The sentences are correct for you can regard two and two as a single idea and modify the single idea with the singular "is" or you can also regard two and two as separate units and use the plural verb "are." In all other forms of rhetoric, except the use of number operations, the form of the verb must reflect that of the subject it modifies. Which form of the verb do you use in the pegging and count of your cribbage hand? Remember, either, way, you can be correct grammatically if not numerically.
