SEPT. 21-22, L985 DENVER, CO

The Granada Royale Hometel in Denver, CO was the site of this years Grand National Tournament which drew 136 entries from all over the country. As is customary at the G.N., there was a board of directors meeting which drew the largest group of directors in recent history.

The old expression "always a bridesmaid" used to apply to Scott Kooistra of Brooklyn Center, MN. Scotty had taken 2nd place in 7 major tournaments over the last few years but this time he was not to be denied. He took first place honors over Lawrence Tomko of Littleton, CO who was playing in his first tournament. Third place was captured by author DeLynn Colvert from Missoula, MT over Costy Haddad from Aurora, CO.

The consolation tourney was won by Pat LaBrassew of Albany, OR. He beat your secretary, Bob Madsen, of Chicago. Third was taken by Martha Fingleton of Milwaukee who defeated Mike Stevens of Salt Lake City.

There were two 28 hands during the weekend, both were captured by Colorad ans. Larry Sheppard of Denver had one in the main event and Mike Murray of Westminster received his during the consolation. Congratulations to all of the winners and our thanks to Dick Graham for all of his efforts in running the tournament.

GRAND NATIONAL AWARDS BANQUET SEPT. 21, 1985 DENVER, CO.

Cribbage enthusiasts from around the country gathered at the Awards banquet to honor the top Master Point earners for the 1984-85 season. In addition, a number of other awards were given. The Guy Pence Award for most recruitments went to Joe Nelson of Prineville, OR who signed up 150 new members.

This years recipient of the HALL OF FAME award was G. Douglas Anderson who was the author of the book "ALL ABOUT CRIBBAGE". Mr. Anderson was a student of the game. His book was used as a guideline for our present rules. Mr. Anderson's widow, Beatrice, and his son David, both from Canada, accepted his award.

The President's Special Award went to Jeanie Hill of Hermiston, OR for her outstanding organization of the Grass Roots program in Oregon and her enthusiasm for making "Cribbage Competition for All" a reality in the Northwest.

The award for Mr. & Mrs. Cribbage World went to Bob and Elda Madsen of Chicago, IL. Bob is the National Secretary-Treas. of the American Cribbage Congress and Elda is his right arm and is very active in assisting tournament directors whenever possible.


