Stan McMaster took 3rd, followed by Roger Wilson, a tough pegger from Boulder, CO. Two Californians finished 5th and 6th...Sundae Webb and Syd Balows. Canadian George Saari took 7th, while ACC BOD member Bernie Nelson from Pacific City, OR, finished 8th, and also collected in the Sunday "high roller" to ensure a profitable weekend.

Another large consolation crowd of 182 peggers saw Bill Harvey, El Cajon, CA, not only finish as top qualifier, but won the play-offs as well. Jim Jackson, an Oregon pegger, won 2nd place, followed by Sylvia Sutton, Burbank, CA in 3rd, and George Hayashi, Seattle, WA in 4th.

In the early bird doubles, the large 124-team event was won by the Carmen and James Brooks duo from Crescent City, CA.

Susan Chambers was the top qualifier in the main event, carding a nifty 36 GP's. Susan hails from Corvallis, OR.

The Sunday "high roller" was won by George Petievich, Nevada City, CA. This 50-person event had an unusual finish. All seven winners carded a 17 GP card, with the tie-breaking system determining the winners.

And as usual, Bill and Dorthalee Irons, Toni and Scott Kozlowski, and Barbara Woodward staged a first-class event, and the Sands Casino was hospitable to all the players.

Jack Wunderlich Abdicates Cribbage Throne in Lincoln, NE

After 8 years of directing cribbage tournaments in Lincoln, NE, Jack Wunderlich is retiring to playing status only. His last tournament that he will direct will be played at the Airport Inn in Lincoln November 4.

The Lincoln Star newspaper gave Jack quite a spread about his cribbage career...one of the highlights being his "million dollar" tourney idea that almost worked. The logistics were just a bit too much, but the ambitious Wunderlich gave it the "old college try!"

198 In Salem, OR Natalie Coons Wins Capital Classic

Natalie Coons won the consolation event in the 1989 Capital Classic, in Salem, OR, and came back in 1990 and won the main event! Natalie hails from Chiloquin, OR. In taking the title in this record-breaking event, Natalie is off to a fast start in the Master Point race for the 1991 season.

And speaking of fast starts, Roy Hofbauer is burning up the track. Roy finished a strong 2nd, running his total MRP's to the near 500 level, and is the nation's frontrunner for the new season. Roy is the Western Region Tournament Commissioner and a member of the ACC's Board of Directors.

Art Ferenz, Bend, OR, claimed 3rd, and perennial All-American Jesse Jarrell, from Pittsburg, CA took 4th.

In the 98-player consolation, Skip Ornie, Forest Grove, Oregon, took the title, with local Jim Clark in 2nd. Denny Van Orsow of the famous Van Orsow pegging clan finished 3rd, with Mike Kuvaas, the Medford flash in 4th. Denny hails from Culver, OR.

Fritz Delplanche, Cornelius, OR won the "high-roller" with a fine 17GP +136, and the local duo of Paul Hatcher and Leon Stormo won the doubles with a super 20GP +231 card!

Gene Sissel, Baker City, OR, scored the first 29-hand of the 1991 season in the consolation match.

Jim Ready Wins Massachusetts Open

Jim Ready, Stoughton, MA, bested a huge field of 166 peggers in winning the recent Massachusetts Open.

This inaugural event drew players from 12 states, including Ed Blecker from distant Alaska. And player's comments were very favorable, according to Eddie Donahue, tournament director.

Jim Ready bested Bob Hayman, Norwood, MA for the title in a very hard-fought series. Both players had an excellent chance of winning the final game on 4th street...but both came up with a 4-hand and a 2-crib. Jim finally claimed the title with a first-count hand.

Stan Tkaczuk of Wareham, MA claimed 3rd place, followed by Bill Shoemaker, West Hartford, CT.

Al Tenenbaum, Cransbury, NJ, claimed the title in the 106-player consolation. Russ Fisher from the sunshine state (FL) claimed 2nd, while two "locals" claimed 3rd and 4th. Frank Sheehan, Canton, MA in 3rd, while author John Chambers of Providence took 4th.

Joe Cornelissen and Paul Gallagher won the 80-player Saturday night doubles.

Director Donahue signed up 11 new ACC members, including Joseph Kral, Canton, MA, who held the only 28-hand of the day.

Ed "Boots" Kivett Scores 29-Hand

At the recent Sandpoint Open, Sandpoint, Idaho, Ed "Boots" Kivett scored the 2nd 29-hand of the young 1991 season. The first was scored by Gene Sissel, in Salem, OR in October. "Boots" hails from Spokane, WA, and Gene is from Baker City, OR.

Bob Gombatz Escapes Hurricane Lilly... and Wins Portside Open

One hundred and twenty players braved the threat of Hurricane Lilly to play in the recent Portside Open, in Portsmouth, VA, and perennial winner Bob Gombatz took home all the marbles...in the sunshine! (The hurricane failed to materialize, leaving a gorgeous week-end for cribbage.) Bob is one of the south's premier players and hails from Raleigh, NC.

Richard Wurman, Arlington, VA took 2nd, followed by Dennis Lillo, Alexandria, VA in 3rd, and Carlyle Butler, Reidsville, NC in 4th.

The 78-player consolation was won by Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA, while Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA took 2nd. Phyllis is on a rampage this cribbage year, earning a bundle of Master Points to put her near the top of the heap in the early going. Dan Samonsky, Belvedere, SC took 3rd and Richard Corbin, Raleigh, NC finished 4th.

29-Hands No. 3 & 4 Louis Choiniere Boyce Henderson

Louis Choiniere, Chicopee, MA, scored the third 29-hand of the 1991 season November 4, while playing in the Dante Club Open in West Springfield, MA.

29-hand No. 4 was scored by Boyce Henderson, Portland, OR, in the 21st game of the qualifying round at the huge (312 peggers) Veteran's Day Classic in Reno, NV, November 10.

Louis will receive \$100 from the ACC for his 29...but Boyce will do much better. The Sands Casino in Reno added \$1,000, so Boyce stands to make \$1,100 for his gem!

Montanans' Clean Out Idaho

The Montana contingent took all four of the top spots in the main event, and also won the consolation at the recent Idaho Championship in Wallace, Idaho.

DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, won the title and continues to be the top winner in sanctioned play in the USA. This was DeLynn's 12th sanctioned win. Steve Daer, Hamilton, claimed 2nd. This was Steve's 2nd sanctioned tournament, and he has claimed 2nd both times! A great start for a rookie! Two other Montanans' claimed 3rd and 4th; Henry Poppham, Missoula, in 3rd, while Evon Forrest took 4th.

In the consolation, Keith Forrest, Florence, MT, took honors. This was Keith's first sanctioned win. Tough-pegging Ken Cochlin, Kennewick, WA took 2nd, followed by Bayard Lliteras, Coeur D'Alene, Idaho, in 3rd. Another Montanan--Rex Paddock from Missoula--took 4th.

Tournament director Roy Carlson, as usual, put on a "fun" tournament and continued with his great cash paybacks.

190 in W. Springfield, MA Dennis Cousens Wins Dante Club Open

Dennis Cousens, Gorham, ME bested a huge field of 190 peggers to capture the Dante Club crown...and a nice bundle of 200 Master Points.

This West Springfield, MA event saw Bob Drukman take 2nd place, with perennial winner Stu Stromberg in 3rd, followed by Bill Cooper in 4th. Bob hails from Brockton, MA, Stu was on his home turf, and Bill is from Marlboro, MA.

126 peggers were in the consolation competition...and Robert Hinkle, Newington, CT, came away a winner. Bruce Gourley, Norton, MA, finished 2nd, with Frank Frederickson, Stoughton, MA, in 3rd. Dorothy Borehman claim 4th. Dorothy is from Rayham, MA.

Pat Tucci, Saco, ME, was the high qualifier in the main event.

Five 28-hands were scored, but the BIG HAND (A 29) was scored by Lou Choiniere, Chicopee, MA. This is the 3rd 29-hand of the 1991 season, and is worth a cool \$100 for Lou.

Clifford Allen bested fellow club member Boots Kivett for the championship.

National Master Point leader Roy Hofbauer, Washougal, WA, claimed 3rd place (after qualifying first with 37 GP's) and continues on a year-beginning "hot streak." Roy has amassed almost 500 MRP's in 2-short months to take an early lead in the race for the 1991 national title. Roy edged out tough-pegging Joyce Gearin, who finished 4th. Joyce hails from Dufur, OR.

The consolation was claimed by another "famous" Hofbauer--Jeanne. Jeanne almost made the 1990 All-American team, missing by an eyelash. The 48-player consolation had Henry Popham, Missoula, MT, in 2nd. Bill Hill, Hermiston, OR., won 3rd place followed by Pat McNulty, Libby, MT, in 4th.

Boots Kivett also scored the 2nd 29-hand of the new cribbage year in the main event.

Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert won both the Saturday night special and the last chance events, but, alas, failed to qualify in either the main event or the consolation.

Director Ron Stark did a "bang-up job" running his first tournament, and the Elks Scholarship Fund benefited from this tournament.

Joe Cotoia picked up a nifty 200 Master Points for his winning effort in the recent New Hampshire Open played in Nashua, NH.

By besting the huge field of 196 players, Joe, who hails from Newton, MA, is off to a fine start in the Eastern Region in the Master Point race.

Also scoring a bundle of Master Points, Gilbert Gadoury, W. Warwick, RI, captured 2nd, followed by Ken Veterline, Bar Mills, ME in 3rd. Veteran pegger Emil Chrabaszcz begins the 1991 season with a nifty 172 Master Points in claiming 4th.

And if your first name was Joe, you were in the chips! Joe Lasorsa, Jr, Nashua, NH won the large 140-player consolation. Marline Clark, Manchester, NH took 2nd. These two players are not ACC members and forfeited a sizeable bundle of Master Points.

3rd place was won by Larry Samet, a tough pegger from Wellesley Hills, MA, and master mind of our new ACC scoring system. His system netted him a cool 61 Master Points. 4th was claimed by Jim Tucci, Saco, ME.

Harry also advises players wishing to cut shuttle costs to wear a yellow ribbon on your lapel and congregate in the area around the United terminal...in this manner you may be able to share the shuttle expense with fellow players.

A bus service is also available to the Diplomat, but requires one change in downtown Hollywood.

So, think Hollywood in 1991, fly United, and use the Ft. Lauderdale International airport.

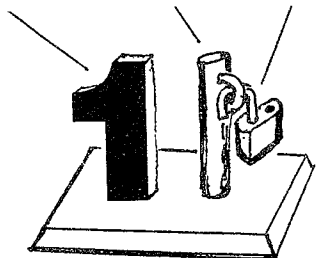
Martha Fingleton Scores First Sanctioned Win

So Pat, keep pegging in Edina, MN!

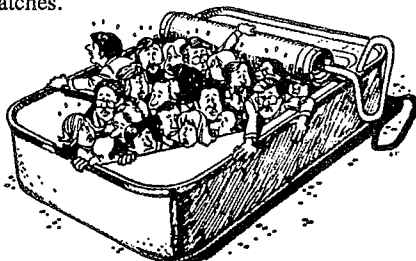
Schmidt, Hofbauer, Drukman Take Early Lead for National Title

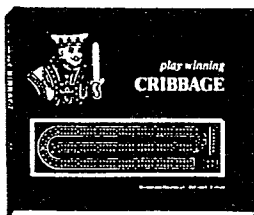
Players Aren't Sardines!

Summary

Board of Director's Meeting

Des Moines, Iowa

September 21, 1990

With only one member of the Board of Directors not present at the September 21 meeting in Des Moines, Iowa, the summarized agenda:

The minutes of the Raleigh meeting were approved.

Fred McGibney's Treasurer's report was discussed and accepted.

Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert discussed mailing costs. An anticipated \$200 per month increase in mailing costs in early 1991 was considered for budgeting purposes. An increase in foreign memberships to cover mailing costs was defeated 13-12. All memberships will remain the same.

Cathy Perkins committee presented a motion for tie-breakers, and was carried by majority vote. Tie-breaking criteria will be mandatory beginning the 1991-1992 season:

- 1-Game points
- 2-Games won
- 3-Net spread points
- 4-Plus points only

Cathy Perkins moved for a motion to give tournament directors the option of scoring formats in a round-robin format. Syl Lulinski amended the motion to read "the type of scoring system must be listed in all pre-tournament literature and be announced at the beginning of a tournament." The motion carried 27-2.

Perkins moved for a mandatory random seating in all sanctioned events. The motioned carried and will be effective immediately.

Perkins moved for a motion to have double elimination guidelines adopted for match play. The motion carried.

The following guidelines were adopted:

- 1-All matches minimum best of five games
- 2-Cut for deal, loser deals thereafter
- 3-Skunks-optional

Regionalization (realignment) was dropped 26-3.

The position of Archivist was added to the Bylaws.

Nick Pond volunteered to head a committee on "resource utilization."

Syl Lulinski discussed the ACC Open and Tournament of Champions. Martha Fingleton, Scott Kooistra, Bob McCabe, and Warren Sondericker will head the ACC Open, while Joan Rein will head the Tournament of Champions. Everything is falling into place ahead of schedule.

Jack Monroe made a presentation (via Jeff Monroe) for holding the 1993 Grand National in Napa, CA. Other sites under consideration are Portland, OR (Pat Crozier), and Missoula, MT (DeLynn Colvert). A final vote will be made at the February BOD meeting.

Syl Lulinski presented "tournament data" to the Board.

Bob McCabe moved to end the year end closing to July 31, effective 1991, to allow more time for the Grand National preparations. Passed 29-0.

Hall of Fame voting produced two new members: Bob McCabe and Scott Kooistra. Both elected on first ballot.

Joseph Wergin elected President. Bob McCabe elected Executive Vice President. Scott Kooistra re-elected Vice President Operations. Ev Bey re-elected Vice President Policy.

Butch Reynolds moved to allow up to \$2,000 for a word processor, software and computer

for use of Executive Vice President. The motion carried.

Syl Lulinski extended a "thank you" for countless hours of service to the ACC as Executive Vice President.

Jeff Monroe complimented for new membership cards with MRP information.

An audit is in process and work on licensing agreement for use of our rule book or other information is being investigated by Ev Bey.

Jerry Dickinson reports 121 Grass Roots clubs now in operation.

Tom Gallagher introduced and discussed the 1992 Grand National, to be held in Green Bay, WI.

Over Counting Should Be a Crime

The past year, my brother and I have been witnessing more and more over counting and/or over pegging. We realize that most of these mistakes are honest, but some may not be. Thus, we feel that the "one to one" penalty is not sufficient. We propose a stronger approach in dealing with this problem. Perhaps "two for one" would be a more appropriate penalty.
