
Pat commented, "A fantastic day, an unbelievable run of cards with all the breaks going my way."

MASTER POINT PARADE



HOW MASTER POINTS ARE EARNED:

TOURNAMENT MUST BE SANCTIONED BY THE AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS.

Qualifying Round: Top 1/8 earns one-quarter points, i.e., 100 players, top qualifier earns 25 points, 2nd earns 23, etc.

Main Tournament: Top 1/8 earns full points, i.e., 100 players, champion earns 100 points, 2nd earns 92, 3rd earns 84, etc. If 40 or more players, BONUS POINTS are earned: 1st earns 40 bonus points, 2nd earns 20, 3rd earns 10 and 4th earns 5. In this example, No. 1 earns 140 points (100 + 40).

Consolation Tournament: Top 1/8 earns one-half points, i.e., 64 players, 1st earns 32 points, 2nd earns 28 points, 3rd earns 24 points, etc. BONUS POINTS are earned: 1st earns 20 bonus points, 2nd earns 10 points, 3rd earns 5 points and 4th earns 3 points. In this example, No. 1 earns 52 points (32 + 20).

LETTER TO CRIBBAGE WORLD

The Tournament Director's column is a welcome addition to CRIBBAGE WORLD, and it has been very informative. Al Odom made some valid points in a recent issue, and in June Dale Munroe presented a solid case for flexibility. Hopefully, the new guidelines will provide reasonable parameters so that the need for "grandfathering" will disappear.

There is one specific area that I believe needs to be addressed and, in my opinion, should allow little latitude in application. That is the practice of offering a "Q" pool without clear and prior information concerning the number and method of payout. Most tournament directors do this, but the few exceptions are the reason for this letter.

A "Qualification Pool" is by definition a pool for those who qualify. Therefore, qualifying 24 players and only paying 20 as an after-the-fact practice should not be tolerated. The same applies to the method of payout. If equal shares is the desired format, then no further explana-

tion is required. But if graduated payout is selected, then I believe it is prudent to provide a percent breakdown prior to entry. As a guideline, the top 5 qualifiers should not share in more than 40% of the Q-pool purse.

In summary, I believe that tournament directors should have the flexibility to choose whichever format they prefer, but specific information concerning the number of qualifiers to be paid and the method of payout should be provided prior to Q-pool entry.

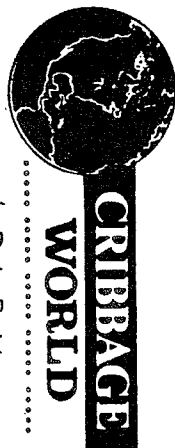
