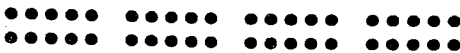

Rocky Mountain Roundup **Ray Van Orsow Cops Montana Championship**

**LeRoy Carlson Wins Sandpoint Open
DeLynn Colvert Takes Helena Classic**

The Northern Rocky Mountain area is alive with peggers in September and October...as this is CRIBBAGE season in this area. Helena, MT, Missoula, MT, Sandpoint, ID, and Wallace, ID have their annual matches in these two months.

The largest is the Montana Championship, and this 10th annual 124-pegger event was claimed by perennial winner Ray Van Orsow, the Portland, OR king of cribbage. Ray not only claimed the \$1,000 first place prize...but he teamed with another excellent pegger from Portland (Anne Williams) to take the doubles crown as well.

Ray had a tough final match with Vicky Rodriguez, an ex-Montana champion from Billings, MT. Vicky came within one game of being the first repeat winner of this event.

Amos Olmstead, Helena, MT, continues his winning ways by garnering 3rd place, followed by another tough pegger, Phil True, Richland, WA.

Amos was also the top qualifier with a fine 40 18 +251. Alas, he did NOT play the "Q" but he still went home with a pile of winnings.

Henry Popham, Missoula, has a habit of winning consolation events, and he claimed yet another...besting some 78 peggers in the process. His task was not easy, as he had to get by Ray Hanes, the Walla Walla, WA king. Tim McNulty, Libby, MT was 3rd, followed by the Carson City "king of the road" John Jantos. John has been spotted pegging nationwide, and is steadily improving his winning percentage.

St. Thomas Island is a center for cribbage activity in that part of the world according to David Pearce who called several weeks ago for information. In the absence of Commissioner Jerry Dickinson who took the long way around to return from Fort Lauderdale, we sent Pearce some preliminary information.

When it was suggested to the former Chicago resident that he organize a Grass Roots club and then stage a tournament, he vetoed that last idea saying: "Here, we try to find excuses to get off the Island for a short spell."

The 1991 - 92 Public Relations Committee has rolled up its sleeves and it has set as its objective 10,000 members by 1993. Members of the group have come up with some promotional ideas that should work.

* The kickoff will be the distribution of some 10,000 bumper stickers that have been created by our artist, DeLynn Colvert. A new Director of the Congress, Lee Norris, consented to have his address imprinted on the stickers to answer all inquiries.

* This scribe is testing the idea of advertising in the fraternal, benevolent, and service organizations by placing a one-inch ad in the November issue of THE BADGER LEGIONNAIRE.

* The updating of our brochure, "CRIBBAGE ANYBODY?" is being headed by George Webb, a senior member of the PR Committee. George says that distribution will be more extensive than the first issue in which 30,000 copies were passed out.

* A Florida newspaper columnist, a former member of the Board, and popular master of ceremonies for Congress functions, Bill

Campbell is preparing an article on cribbage to be submitted to the national magazine market. Bill resides at Fort Walton Beach, Florida.

We called Joe Edley, an official of the National Scrabble Association, regarding low-cost advertising. The word expert is employed by an advertising firm in New York. He answered the question by saying: "Send material on cribbage to every library in the United States and Canada as they like to have lists of all organizations with person to contact locally, place, day, and time that a group meets. This places every member on a mission to report to his or her local library of Grass Roots activities and at least to give the library a copy of the CRIBBAGE WORLD magazine for reference.

* Also serving on the Committee are Russell Cook, Punta Gorda, Florida, a specialist in advertising and promotion along with Phil Babcock, who advocates advertising in a national magazine such as AARP. Babcock is the Assistant Chairman of the Public Relations Committee, and resides at 4435 Brookside Dr., Alexandria, VA 22312. Send your ideas to him.

Later News: Jerry Dickinson just reported, that with the new Grass Roots Award System, some clubs will be playing the full 40 sessions rather than 29 because of the added chances of earning rating points.

Commissioner Dickinson has devised an improved system for the playing off of byes in major tournaments. A great deal of time will be saved in cross-checking and in the playoff of byes. Gaylord Matti, director of the MADI-SON CLASSIC, is smoothing out the mechanics of the plan with Jerry. The important result is that the players will like it.

LeRoy Carlson, veteran tournament director from Wallace, Idaho, decided to accept some prize money, rather than pay it out, as he bested the field of 40 peggers at the recent Sandpoint Open, Sandpoint, Idaho.

LeRoy edged out another veteran Idaho pegger--Bayard Lliteras--for the title. Bayard hails from Coeur D'Alene. Two Montanans took 3rd and 4th: Don Clark (Libby), and Shirley Schill (Helena). Shirley has been on a roll lately.

Another Montanan, Micki Daniels (Libby) took the consolation, edging local Henry Ricard in this event. Two veteran peggers took 3rd and 4th: Milo Roinstad (Missoula, MT), and Ken Cochlin (Richland, WA).

The Friday night doubles were claimed by Boots Kivett and Mattie Young (Spokane, WA). The Saturday night special was taken by Chris Field (Missoula, MT). Gene Branson, St. Regis, MT, was rolling in the qualifying round, racking up some 36 GP's to take home the "Q" money.

Director Ron Stark had fair paybacks and a friendly group of peggers. The crowd was held down a bit by a conflict with the Salem, OR, tournament.

Colvert Wins No. 16 in Helena

Last Chance Gulch was alive with gold miners a hundred years ago, but the last weekend in September found Helena, Montana overrun with peggers...thanks to the invitations from Vivian Carter, Walt and Tana Conell, with help from Marlene Stellmon, and others from the Helena Cribbage Club.

Life Master Delynn Colvert, Missoula, MT, tried his luck at "gold mining" and struck it rich, winning his 16th sanctioned main event. Local Shirley Schill made the final match a tough one, but she finished a fine 2nd. Canadian Edgar Bastedo has a habit of coming "south of the border" and taking home a basket of American Dollars...and he did it once again, finishing 3rd, edging out Chester Field, a fine pegger from Missoula, MT.

Meg Angell, Helena, had a very fine 37 GP's in taking qualifying honors. Chris and Chester Field won the Friday doubles match, while Wayne Wyman, Billings, went home a winner after taking the Saturday night event. Shirley Schill continued her winning ways by copping the "Crybaby" event.

The consolation was won by Steve Daer, Hamilton, MT, with 2nd claimed by veteran pegger Amos Olmstead, Helena, MT.

Carol Holt Waxes Husband Jack in Salem

It was Lady's Day at the recent Capitol City Classic in Salem, OR, as the fair sex won almost every event, including the main event.

Carol Holt, an excellent veteran pegger from Portland came away the winner...but not before a tough final (and unusual) match with her husband Jack. Each player won alternate games before Carol claimed the title. Jim Brooks, another tough pegger from Oregon claimed third. Dorothy Roun flew in from Fort Lauderdale just in time to take a very fine 4th in this 174-pegger event. Dorothy's notoriety in Florida (her photo and story appeared in the Miami newspaper) inspired her to one of her best finishes since a Helena, MT match some two years ago (see story, this issue).

All-American Paul Hatcher, a local player, had the hot hand in the qualifying round...one of the few times the male sex broke into the winner's column.

The fair sex claimed the doubles (Anne Williams and Dorothy Mickow), the Saturday night special (Sharon Morgan), and the consolation (Lowaine Pruett). Anne has taken the doubles event twice in a row, as she teamed with Ray Van Orsow to win the Montana doubles crown. Lowaine really nailed the consolation as she was also high qualifier. And the Cry Baby event was won by Master player Sundae Webb, the "ace" player from California.

In the consolation, Phyllis Daily finished 2nd (and continues her winning ways lately), with 3rd claimed by steady George Mackie from WA. 4th was taken by Phyllis Conners.

Ken Capper, the Hermiston, OR King, is establishing a reputation as the "High-rollers" champ as he won yet another, edging out Beaverton, OR's Harry Kantas.

Fabian Nelson and Glenna Golik ran a first class tournament. Oregon continues to be a front-runner in sanctioned events, partly due to a great group of tournament directors who give players a fair shake for their entry fees!

George Smith Tops 200 in New Hampshire

The New Hampshire Open drew some 200 peggers for a one-day tournament October 6 in Nashua, NH...and George Smith came away the winner.

George (Providence, RI) bested Charles Rapoza (Brocton, MA) in final match to take home all the marbles. Veteran pegger Jack Marani (Quincy, MA) finished 3rd, and Ernie Chadderdon (Essex Jct., VT) took 4th.

Brian Heroux, Woonsocket, RI, had the hot hand in the qualifying round, and took top honors.

126 peggers played the consolation match with Frank Sheenhan, Canton, MA, edging Robert Kierman, Fall River, MA, for the title.

Director Al Miller reported \$526 donated to charity...and with the large turnout, this tournament will be scheduled again next year (Oct. 4, 1992).

Dorothy Roun: "Have Pegs, Will Travel"

Dorothy Roun, Joseph, OR, has been seen far and wide on the cribbage circuit...most recently in Fort Lauderdale, FL for the Grand National. And this time, the local newspaper featured her (and the Grand National) in a nice writeup. She even got her photo printed!

Next week, Dorothy was spotted in Salem, OR...and she finished 4th in a field of 174 peggers! Cribbage fever...catch it!

Huge 214-Pegger Event Omer Bolduc Repeats at 10th Annual Wine Valley Open

Omer Bolduc, a local pegger, repeated his 1987 win at the huge 214-pegger 10th Annual Wine Valley Open, played at Napa, CA September 28.

Omer edged out Mary Lee Brown (Pinole, CA) for the title. Tom Matthews (Fairfield, CA) took 3rd and a bushel of Master points, and 4th was claimed by Master pegger Joe Lusignan, a perennial winner from Salinas, CA.

In the early bird doubles, two southern California ladies took home all the marbles. Kathy Hourigan and Julie Tuckett (Santee and El Cajon) travelled some 500 miles to be crowned 1991 doubles champions.

Tournament director Jack Monroe reported that three meals, raffle, and his famous wine and cheese tasting event has proven very popular, attesting to a steady increase in players in the ten year run of this tournament. The 214 players were remarkable, since this event was played the same date as the Grand National in Fort Lauderdale.

Doug Brown, Ken Vetterline Earn Master Rating

Doug Brown, Pasco, WA, becomes the ACC's 96th Master player by recently winging it over the magic 2,000 Master Rating point mark. Doug is a consistent winner on the Northwest circuit.

Ken Vetterline, Bar Mill, ME, also earned his 2,000th MRP recently and becomes our 97th Master player. Ken is an excellent pegger in the New England area, and consistently racks up points on a regular basis.

Dale Munroe, Jerry Dickinson Elected to Cribbage Hall of Fame

At the recent Board of Director's meeting in Fort Lauderdale, Dale Munroe, Collinsville, CT, and Jerry Dickinson, Mount Horeb, Wisconsin were elected to the Cribbage Hall of Fame.

Dale has served the American Cribbage Congress long and well as a member of the Board of Directors, and for several years as editor of Cribbage World. During Dale's tenure as editor, the ACC's membership showed steady growth, thanks partly to his untiring publishing of our trade magazine.

Jerry Dickinson is Director of the ACC's Grass Roots Program and with his guidance, the Grass Rooters are "on the move" with an ever-increasing membership. Jerry's expert managing of this time-consuming program, plus his participation with the ACC's Board of Directors and their programs, have greatly benefited the members of the American Cribbage Congress.

Jesse Jarrell 6th Life Master

Jesse Jarrell, veteran pegger from Pittsburg, CA, became the ACC's 6th Life Master by qualifying 8th and finishing in the 17-32 bracket at the recent Grand National, running his lifetime total to 6,008 MRP's.

Jesse has had many fine finishes, and travels far and wide to compete in sanctioned play. He finished 2nd in the MRP race two years in a row (1989 & 1990), and is always a threat to win any tournament. His "grand slam" (9 for 9 with two skunks) in the Grand National's last roundup is just another example of his fine play.

Upcoming Grand Nationals

Now that the Fort Lauderdale Grand National is history, it's on to Green Bay for the 1992 edition. Green Bay will probably host one of the largest Grand Nationals ever...judging from their annual MGM open drawing some 500 players the last few years. And players will be able to say they played in the shadows of the Green Bay Packers stadium (only a couple of blocks away).

Then in 1993, the Grand National will take on a western flavor, as the action shifts to Missoula, Montana. Fresh mountain air, cold, clear drinking water (rated no. 1 in the nation), and players will be able to fish for rocky mountain trout right from their motel room...the convention center is at the confluence of the Clark Fork River and Rattlesnake Creek.

Ron Hamilton, Scott Kooistra, Joan and Jim Rein have proposed the Ramada Hotel in St. Paul, Minnesota as the site for the 1994 Grand National. The ACC's Board of Directors will be accepting other proposals for final vote in the future.

Grand National play is always something special, so peggers, mark Green Bay, Missoula, and possibly St. Paul on your calendars.

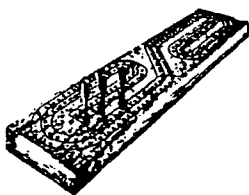

Synopsis of the Operation of the American Cribbage Congress

S. Dean Wooldridge, Rohnert Park, CA, would like to know how the American Cribbage Congress operates, who sets the guidelines for tournament play, how does the Board of Directors function, etc.

A brief synopsis: The American Cribbage Congress was incorporated in 1979 as a non-profit organization, complete with an Executive committee (President, 3 Executive Vice Presidents), and an elected Board of Directors (elected every two years by current members of the ACC). All governing members of the ACC serve as volunteers, and the BOD meet three times per year to discuss the needs and guidelines of the ACC.

Rules and guidelines concerning tournament play have been established (and modified occasionally) so our entire membership will compete nationally with the same standards. Awards, Hall of Fame, Grand National Tournament, and other items concerning our membership are managed by our BOD. Master Points earned are compiled and maintained (yearly & lifetime) by Bob McCabe, one of our executive vice-presidents. Other appointments:

Treasurer's Report and budget tabled until Reno meeting (Treasurer absent at this meeting).

Scott Kooistra reported Cribadier General program put on hold to allow Dave Proctor to gather more information before making a proposal.

Dick Cornwell discussed pegging out and claiming game rule. BOD voted 16 to 7 (4 abstentions) to change rule to read: "If a player fails to peg his points claiming a game, his opponent is required to remind the player one time only to peg his points."

DeLynn Colvert handed out proposed bumper stickers. BOD voted to purchase 10,000 stickers, giving each member one sticker (to be mailed via Cribbage World) and selling the balance at \$1 each. Lee Norris volunteered to have his name and address on sticker to take inquiries about the ACC.

Fingleton reported Grand National director Harry Stoops was ill Thursday, and the BOD members may be needed to help with the tournament.

Mickey Griffin reported Desert Shield project almost complete except for distribution of a few boards and decks of cards.

Joan Rein reported on upcoming Tournament of Champions. BOD voted to include Grass Roots club champions. Criteria #4 deleted as redundant (top 100 will all soon be Master players). Cathy Perkins moved to delete #9 (top 10% from RICA) as they should all be covered under ACC sanctioned tournaments by now. Carried with one opposed. Nick

Pond moved that any winner of T of C receive 10 year invitation, retroactive, to the T of C. Approved. Grass Roots club champions will be invited for the following year, also. Jeff Shimp moved to approve new criteria. Approved.

Scott Kooistra reported on ACC Open, Reno, Feb. 1 & 2. Barbara Woodward of the Sands will ship flyers to be inserted in Nov. Cribbage World.

Jeff Shimp discussed progress of rules committee. All ACC members who wish to suggest changes should forward them to committee (Shimp's address on inside back cover, Oct. CW).

President Joe Wergin discussed his BOD appointments, and that he felt he had made excellent appointments. Some BOD members felt that perhaps ACC memberships in regions should be considered.

Jerry Dickinson and Dale Munroe elected to Hall of Fame (Jerry on third ballot, Dale on final ballot).

BOD voted to allow players to play in consolation events with or without paying sanctioning fees, to encourage new players to participate.

BOD recommended that induction ceremony for Bob McCabe into Hall of Fame be postponed until 1992 Grand National in Green Bay, WI, in order that Bob and his family could be present.

M. K. Reynolds moved to allow new states to hold initial sanctioned tournament, waiving sanctioning fee. Carried.

Phillip Babcock suggested a committee be formed to make plans for ACC expansion. Tabled until Reno meeting.

Cathy Perkins nominated existing Executive Board for reelection. Existing Executive Board reelected unanimously.

Joe Ramos reported on Grass Roots program, including awards. Life Points accumulated should be complete in December and posted in January.

Meeting adjourned at 4:10 PM. Recording secretary: Joan Rein.
