Founder of World Championship Tournament EV BEY WINS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Galen McKie Cops Consolation George Florentine, Gene Elliot Win Doubles

■ Quincy, CA. Ev Bey, Hall of Famer, ACC Executive Vice President and founder of the World Championship Tournament won the 21st edition May 2. Bey, long a chief judge for the final match, found himself seated center stage for the finals with Dick Combie, a fine pegger from Santa Clara, CA. Ev won the match 3-1 and took home \$1,300...the largest cash award in the 21-year history of this meet. Combie won \$800 for finishing 2nd.

And as usual for this meet, Plumas County players continue to monopolize the winnings, as local Bob Melms took third, and Bob Dellinger of Graeagle took 4th in this 222-pegger event. 21 Plumas County players were in the money, taking about one-third of the cash prizes.

Galen McKie, Clear Lake, CA won the 126-pegger consolation event, edging world traveler Robbie Robson of San Jose for the title. Two Concord, CA peggers took third and fourth: Steve Reynolds and Evelyn Gilmore.

In the preliminary doubles meet, some 72 teams hit the tables, and when the curtain came down, George Florentine and Gene Elliott

from San Dimas, CA were alone at the top. Roy Banducci and Sharon Schwartz (Arroyo Grande, CA) finished a close 2nd.

Hugh Corum, Martinez, CA held the hot hand in the qualifying round, and Don Bryan, Sparks, NV was the highest qualifier from Nevada picking up the \$100 annual Gene Kozlowski Memorial award.

After a tri-tip dinner prepared by the local Rotary members, a "high rollers" event was organized. Bill Kemp, Chester, CA came out roses, winning \$425, with perennial winner Nick Ayoob (Qunicy, CA) taking 2nd. Nick is always tough on his home turf, as he is also a 3-time winner of the main event

The first round losers of the main event held a "cry-baby" event, and Phil Luke, Paradise, CA took home the bacon (\$100).

This World Championship meet remains the oldest and one of the most prestigious of the ACC's sanctioned tournaments. Some \$60,000 has been donated to Rotary's civic betterment in the 21-year history of this meet.

Cribbage in Nigeria

Imagine playing cribbage in a royal palace! Prince Sina Smash Agoro of Nigeria contacted the writer requesting information on how to form a Grass Roots club. Apparently, our Advertising and Promotion Committee's advertising found its way to the western coast of Africa.

The Prince's objective is to make cribbage the national card game. Besides sending our literature to him, a request was made to send the names of their students attending the University of Wisconsin. What a wonderful way to develop the math skills of thousands of citizens.

On May 1st the Drueke Company was sold to the Carrom Company of Ludington, MI. The Drueke family organized the company back in 1915 and it was maintained within the family all these years.

The firm manufactured chess sets, cribbage boards, and other game boards. The new company will update the operation and continue the good relations that the Drueke Company has had all these years.

A Los Angeles Times writer reports that "The Queen of Hearts is turning gray." And he notes that the King's whiskers are mixed with silver threads.

The number of tournament bridge players is shrinking by the thousands every year, and the membership's average age of hard-core players is 58. The Bridge League is not attracting young people for various reasons. The attempts being made to interest high school and college players are meeting resistance.

The young people of today want to play "fun games" rather than a regimented game that eliminates a player's imagination. Bridge is too serious when ordinary players hire experts to be their partners in a given tournament in order to acquire master points.

In the article the Times writer said: "In bridge circles, there is ominous talk of the graying of bridge."

(Your columnist rejected a bridge-teaching career back in 1945 which was centered at the Huntington and Green Hotels in Pasadena in favor of returning to Wisconsin and its grassroot games. Partnership breed lots of trouble.)

Newspaper Publicity

Cheryl Seal of Monson, ME, is a free lance writer and did a full-page feature on cribbage in the April 4-5 issue of the Bangor Maine News.

In the Congress' January 1992 roster, there are only 19 members from Maine. In the directory of Grass Roots clubs, there isn't a single club in the whole state. This fact was emphasized in the interview with the reporter.

Since then, a dozen or so calls and letters requesting information have been received here. The news story was typical of other articles in that the Congress' mailing address is not mentioned. Otherwise, twice as many contacts could be expected.

In the story, the reporter stated that cribbage was a folk game in Maine and almost every household has acribbage board. There are small tournaments held in family circles and at the local general stores. With Mainers, cribbage tends to be a more fiercely personal matter. The Congress will work to get the first GR club established in Maine.

Roy Hofbauer Cracks 1,000 MRP Barrier, Takes National Lead

With but two months of pegging action remaining this cribbage year (July 31 winds up the 1992 season), Roy Hofbauer, Washougal, WA, has taken the MRP lead for the year, cracking the 1,000 mark at the recent Snake River Open in Nyssa, OR.

Hot on his heels are a bevy of fine peggers. In the Eastern Region Phyllis Schmidt is standing at 945, with Lawrence Samet, Bill Medeiros, John Marani, and Jim Ready all within easy striking distance.

In the Central Region, Russell Adams, the Minneapolis king, is making a bid for his first All-American ranking and is leading this region with 961 MRP's. Four proven winners, all with All-American experience, are knocking on the door. They are: Jim McManus, Warren Sondericker, Duane Toll, and Joe Bernard.

In the Western Region, Ray Van Orsow and Jesse Jarrell are Hofbauer's closest pursuers.

With but two short months remaining in this cribbage year, any number of players still have a shot at the national crown. 1992 is proving to be one of the most exciting races in years. Place your bets!

Hall of Famer Ev Bey Nearing Master Rating

Ev Bey is one of the founding fathers of the American Cribbage Congress, and is instrumental in organized cribbage in the western USA. His hometown Quincy, CA, World Championship tournament was started by Ev some 21 years ago. Ev won this year's event, adding some 220 MRP's to run his lifetime total to 1,961...only 39 short of his Master rating.

Michaelis Posts Rare Double-Double

Life Master Robert "Mick" Michaelis, always a threat to win any tournament, has done it again! Last year he won the Yankton, SD Lewis & Clark Open for the second time in succession.

For a very rare (probably the first time in sanctioned competition) second double, "Mick" recently won the Hawkeye Classic in Des Moines for the second time in succession.

Michaelis is a 5-time All-American, and was crowned National Champion in 1984. His lifetime MRP's are very close to 8,000.

Horigan Takes Greater Boston Classic

Watertown, MA, April 5- Leo Horigan, Stoughton, MA bested some 138 Greater Boston Classic peggers, edging Henry DeLong, Woburn, MA in the final match. Joe Cornelissen, Halifax, MA took 3rd, followed by Jim Clemmey, Rochester, MA, in 4th. Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA took 3rd in the consolation, picking up 41 MRP's to move up to 3rd place in the Eastern Region's MRP race. Dave Clemmey, Mansfield, MA took the 88-pegger consolation title, edging Joseph Cotoia, Newton, MA in the final match..

Lichler Edges 74 Peggers in Western New York

Niagara Falls AFB, NY, March 29- Paul Lichler from nearby N. Tonawanda took the Western New York Open crown...edging Mike Milek in the final playoff match. Mike and Paul are both from North Tonawanda. Two other New Yorkers took 3rd and 4th. Joseph Angelo, from Eggersville took 3rd, and John Marchand, Rochester finished 4th. J. B. Blough has been on a roll this cribbage year, and this Grand Rapids, MI pegger took home the bacon in the 34-pegger consolation. An unusual feature of this match is the \$6 rooms at the Niagara Air Force Base. Director Stanley Bochinski has another match scheduled for this Air Force base this October 31-November 1 (see Tournament Trail, this issue).

Henry Douglas North Carolinian Takes Atlanta Classic

Atlanta, GA, April 5- Henry Douglas, Reidsville, NC, topped a field of 78 peggers in Atlanta to take the Atlanta Classic title. He had a tough match in the finals, as Joy Barnes, DeLand, FL, fresh from a win in the Grand National, was his opponent. Barnes, with this fine 2nd place finish moved up to 8th place in the Eastern Region MRP race, and stands at a nifty 554 MRP's for the year. Another North Carolinian-Paul Woytovich, Hickory, NC--took 3rd, with veteran Al Odom, Cayce, SC in 4th. Ted Depizol, Winter Springs, FL took the 50-pegger consolation crown, followed by Alan Wright, Spartanburg, SC in 2nd.

Jim Ready Nails Rhode Island Open

Providence, RI, April 26- Jim Ready. Stoughton, MA, not only was the top qualifier in the 244-pegger Rhode Island Open, but he completed a rare double and took the playoffs as well. By garnering these 342 MRP's, Jim makes a big leap into the top four of the Eastern Region for this cribbage year, and stands well over 800 MRP's. Frank Del Santo, Warwick, RI finished 2nd, picking up some 276 MRP's as well. Director Joe Ramos once again hosted a huge crowd (244 in the main event and 162 peggers played in the consolation).

Record Crowd in Marinette Appleton's Bob Loch Takes Tri-Cities Crown


Marinette, WI, April 5- Bob Loch, Appleton, WI took a short hop north and captured the record-setting Tri-Cities Open in Marinette, besting some 166 peggers. In 2nd place, and breaking out of a tie with her husband, Jim, in the MRP race was Joan Rein, Carver, MN. Joan, the ACC's secretary, picked up a nifty 169 MRP's. Bragging rights still are up in the air, however. Mike Verboomen, Crivitz, WI took 3rd, followed by Lee Tesch, Green Bay, WI in 4th. Senior Judge Don Tofte, Madison, WI picked up the 106-pegger consolation event, edging Karen Danielski, Green Bay, WI in the final playoff match. Frank Danielski, Appleton, WI, finished 3rd, followed by Richard Frost in 4th. Richard's 45 MRP's put him over the 400 mark for the year, keeping alive his try for All-American honors. Director Robert Michaelis once again ran a first class tournament, attesting to the record crowd.

Adams Wins in Des Moines

Des Moines, IA, April 12-Don Adams, a local pegger, captured a small, but animated tourney, according to tournament director Dick Ogden. Jim Tomlinson from nearby Bondurant, IA finished 2nd. Perennial winner Helen Railsback, Syracuse, NE took the 24-pegger consolation.

Bob Brumley Greater Hermiston Open King

Hermiston, OR, April 26- Bob Brumley, the Sunnyside, WA, king of cribbage, is also the king of the Greater Hermiston Open, as he took the title besting a large crowd of 144 peggers. Bob took home a sizeable bundle of MRP's (160), along with the famous watermelon trophy boards awarded in Hermiston. Brumley has been on a roll lately, and with this win, stands at the 800 MRP mark, giving him a shot at All-American honors (and the national crown). Veteran Bob Gorden, Redmond, OR, took 2nd, and 7-time All-American DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT, joined the MRP race with a 3rd place finish. With a 4th place finish, Phil Yager, Gresham, OR, picked up some 136 MRP's. Master pegger Bill Becker, Bend, OR, took the 106-pegger consolation event, moving him into the top 50 lifetime. Veteran pegger Charlie Ball, Everett, WA finished 2nd, and Bernie Saueressig, Richland WA's ambassador of cribbage goodwill took 3rd. Don Hilton, Hood River, OR, continues his MRP march this year, finishing a fine 4th...and nearing the 700 MRP mark, keeping alive his All-American hopes. Jo Evans, Richland, WA, won the high rollers event. The doubles crown went to Beverlee Honeycutt and Jeanne Hofbauer, two veteran Oregon peggers. Joe Dunn, Boise, ID, posted the high qualifier mark with 37 GP's.

Glenn St. Peter Wins West Covina Open

Covina, CA, April 25- Baldwin Park's Glenn St. Peter came home a winner at the recend West Covina Open. 84 peggers made a run at the title. Finishing 2nd was Gene Elliott, Costa Mesa, CA. Boyd Horne, Redondo Beach, CA took 3rd, and Celia Richards, Apple Valley, CA finished 4th. Noel Basilio, Walnut Creek, CA took the 46-pegger consolation crown, followed by Berwyn Friedman, Woodland Hills, CA.

188 Peggers in Lincoln City Harold Schmelzer Cops Oregon Coast Title

Lincoln City, OR, May 3- The Oceanlake Elks Lodge in Lincoln City, OR was alive with peggers May 1-3...and after three days of intense pegging, Harold Schmelzer, White City, OR, took home the championship, besting some 188 peggers...and perennial winner Bob Watkins, Portland, OR, in the final match. Local Ed Lawrence finished 3rd. DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT, took the 142-pegger consolation title, edging Doris Richmond, Woodland, WA in the final match. Roy Hofbauer, Washougal, WA, vaulted into the national MRP lead with a fine 3rd place finish. Ray Hanes, Walla Walla, WA took 4th, and moved into the top 100 lifetime. Ray also took the high roller event. Gil and Betty Johnson, Spokane, WA, continued their winning ways by capturing the doubles event. Ken Cochlin, Kennewick, WA, also continues a fine run this cribbage year by winning the crybaby event. Roy & Jeanne Hofbauer, with help from co-directors Bernie Nelson and Rollie Heath ran a first-class tournament, with steady growth projected for this event. The Oregon beaches are an added asset.

President Wergin Names Karl Grube, PhD, To Head Ad Hoc Committee: "Education Through Card Games"

During the past few years, experiments have been conducted with the promotion of cribbage in the classrooms. These instructions have been welcomed by both math teachers and principals.

ACC President Joseph Wergin has named Karl Grube, PhD, a retired professor of education (University of Michigan) to head an Ad Hoc Committee researching "Education Through Card Games."

Professor Grube has conducted several cribbage classes in the middle schools of Ann Arbor.

Dan Zeisler, a teacher in Sonora, CA, has volunteered to assist this committee, as well as Fran Fountain, a sixth grade teacher in Germantown, MD. A third volunteer is F. William Otterstein, Sparta, WI, who is a specialist in curriculum construction. President Wergin, who has a BS and MS degrees in education will be closely associated with the program.


The grapevine reports that, indeed, the marriage has taken place, as Doris and J. D. were seen at the World's Championship match in Quincy, CA...and they were married!
