Phyllis Schmidt Takes National MRP Crown

"Mick" Michaelis Wins National Open

Robert Shimoff Cops Consolation Title

Robert "Mick" Michaelis, the Marinette, WI Life Master put the finishing touch on an outstanding pegging year by winning the huge 384-pegger National Open in Raleigh. "Mick" recently won the Hawkeye Classic in Des Moines, and in July 1991 won the Lewis & Clark Classic in Yankton, SD. This National Open win comes complete with 339 MRP's (running his 1992 total to 800) and a cool \$4,000.

Another Central Region player, Mike Lipinski from Mundelein, IL, finished a fine 2nd, but simply couldn't match Michaelis's hot run on 3rd and 4th street in the final game. Lipinski took a sizeable \$2,300 and 294 MRP's home to Illinois to certainly make the trip to Raleigh worthwhile.

Paul Woytovich had a memorable tournament, as this Hickory, NC player not only took third place (and \$1,400) but also earned his Master rating.

The BIG match for those players chasing the National MRP title had Phyllis Schmidt, the Williamstown, MA cribbage queen taking a National Title winning 4th place. In one of the most exciting finishes in the ACC's history, Phyllis came into Raleigh in 4th place, a

hundred or so points behind Russell Adams, Minneapolis, Jim McManus, Milwaukee, and Duane Toll, West Allis, WI. And only Schmidt was able to garner any sizeable MRP's...and the National Championship!

Last year, Robert Shimoff, the cigar-puffing pegger from San Francisco won the National Open, and, once again, he went home a winner by taking the 200-pegger consolation event. This event was worth a cool \$1,000, easily paying for Robert's trip. Robert Einhorn, Melrose Park, PA took a nifty 2nd, followed by John McCready, Revere, MA, and Joe Ryan, Charlotte, NC in 3rd and 4th.

This match completes the 1992 cribbage year...and it has been a banner year for the American Cribbage Congress. Many tournaments set records for attendance, and dozens of new tournaments were played nationwide. The Central Region placed five players on the All-American team, with three from the Western Region, and the other two from the Eastern Region (see story, inside on the ACC's All-American team). Some 14 29-hands were scored this year (vs. 10 in 1991). The ACC crowned some 30 new Master players, 7 new Grand Masters, and 3 Life Masters. And 1993 promises to be an even bigger and better year!

The President's Column

Madison Seeks '95 Mind Sports Olympiad

Joe Wergin eagerly looks forward to the summer of 1995 when one of his fondest dreams could come true.

It matters little to Wergin that he will be 85 by then--his enthusiasm over the possibility of 15,000 people converging on Madison for the second international Mind Sports Olympiad far overshadows the angst of aging a few more years.

"I only hope I can live long enough to see it happen," he said.

The first Mind Sports Olympiad--an event in which 30 games, such as bridge, chess, poker, Scrabble, backgammon, cribbage, and dominoes are played throughout 14 days in July--is planned by its organizers for Britain in 1993.

If Wergin's influence as president of the American Cribbage Congress with its 175 clubs and 6,600 members carries any clout, the 2nd megaplayoff for gold, silver, and bronze medals and cash prizes could happen in Madison.

Last week, two of the games organizers and founders--Londoners Raymond Keene and David Levy--were squired around Madison by the Greater Madison Convention and Visitors Bureau sales director John Connelly. They called on Wergin during two days of meetings with city, county and university officials, who showed them Madison's available space for game-playing halls, visitor lodging and food service.

"As soon as I heard from him (Levy), that he wanted to start a Mind Sports Olympiad, I said it should be in Madison," Wergin told his visitors. We're a cultural city; we've got a good central location and the lakes. It's just beautiful here."

We're looking for Madison to provide us with at least 300,000 feet," Levy told Dane County Exposition Center marketing manager Kevin Scheibler at a meeting Thursday. With a proposed 1995 expansion, "it seems as though we might be able to achieve that," he said.

"Of the things you've seen so far, does Madison meet your requirements?" Scheibler asked Levy.

"I would say that Madison is exceptional," Levy said. "I was told before I came (here) by a number of people that it was a beautiful place, the sort of venue that people would enjoy coming to. Personally, It has exceeded what I was led to believe."

Wergin is a retired Postmaster, real estate broker and developer, former McFarland tavern owner, author of several books on card games, and promoter of cribbage for children as a method of learning arithmetic.

"I wanted cribbage included," he said. "That's how it all started. And I told him the second one should be held in Madison."

As per the story on the following page, Wergin has resigned from his duties as President of the American Cribbage Congress (but remains active on the BOD, and serves as President Emeritus). The above column is a story in the Madison State Journal written by Jerry Sabastian, that Wergin mailed to Cribbage World to use for this month's column.

Joseph Petrus Wergin Resigns Presidency

Joseph Petrus Wergin resigned the Presidency of the American Cribbage Congress on August 4.

Wergin has been the only President in the history of the American Cribbage Congress. On August 6, 1979, Wergin called a meeting of cribbage buffs from around the nation at the National Open in Raleigh. At this meeting the American Cribbage Congress was born. Wergin was immediately elected President ... and has held this position until his resignation.

Citing physical problems and an inability to travel to tournaments and ACC Board of Directors meetings, Wergin decided to step down in the best interest of the ACC.

Joseph Wergin has had a long and colorful history with card players. An author of two books on cribbage, one on skat, another on euchre, and he is currently working on the game of poker, hoping to have a book published soon on this subject.

But cribbage has been in the spotlight with Joe for a long, long time. Since founding the ACC, his innovations have been many. The most notable is the founding of the Grass Roots program...his Madison club is Club #1. Another first is his insistence of using the "long board" for tournament play, thus eliminating many mis-pegging problems that plagued the ACC in its infancy. In addition, Wergin has many tournament innovations to his credit, including the 0-2-3 scoring system.

Wergin was the first person inducted into the Cribbage Hall of Fame...even being enshrined before the game's inventor, Sir John Suckling (Suckling was the second inducted).

Wergin will remain active as President Emeritus of the American Cribbage Congress and will continue serving as a member of the Board of Directors. He will also continue his

work with the kids program, and has promised *Cribbage World* a continuing flow of "Guest Columns."

Robert McCabe, currently the ACC's Executive Vice-President, will immediately assume the Presidency. His able leadership in handling the ACC's Board of Director's meetings, and other concerns of the ACC, certainly indicates the Presidency has been transferred into good hands. Bob is also a member of the Cribbage Hall of Fame, and in addition to his Presidential duties, will continue to administer the Master Point lists for the ACC. His prowess on the boards is known far and wide. He is knocking on the door for his Life Master rating, and is among the leaders in sanctioned championships.

The ACC has come a long way in 13 years. Membership stands at some 6,600 members, and with McCabe's leadership, strong growth should continue. The next Board of Director's meeting will take place in Green Bay, WI in September, and the BOD will address McCabe's vacant Executive Vice-President office.

Joy Jerdee, Crystal, MN won an outstanding 13 matches in a row in Raleigh before running out of gas and finishing in the 5-6 bracket. Only "Mick" Michaelis, Marinette, WI (this year's winner) has duplicated this 13 match string...in 1984.

Harold Belles Stunned

Harold Belles, Albany, NY held 6-6-9-9 dealing the last hand of the 7th game, needing 16 to win. Viola, a 6 is cut! Oops...his opponent, with first count needing 17 to win is holding 7-7-8-8. Wait'll next year!

Michaelis Vs. Schmidt

In one of the more interesting matches, "Mick" Michaelis and Phyllis Schmidt were at it toe to toe in one of the final matches. "Mick" needed to score 11 to win and held 5-J-Q-K with first count. An 8 was cut...and desperate for two pegs, "Mick" lead a 5. Phyllis paired the 5 and the crowd gasped "nice play, wow!" But then, she showed her hand...a 4-5-5-6. What a bind. "Mick" pegged but one and lost the game...but he prevailed with large hands down the back stretch of the 7th game.

Hornbeck Loses Tough Match

Lea Hornbeck, Washougal, WA was one of Joy Jerdee's victims in her 13 match streak, and it was a tough loss. Joy needed 24 to win the 7th game, and held a 6-7-8-8 and cut a 7!

Colvert's All-American String Ended

Needing to win one of the last two games with Robert Shimoff to earn a record 8 consecutive All-American honors, DeLynn Colvert saw his hopes dashed when Shimoff scored 16, needing 16, to win the 4th game, and missed two cuts on 4th street to lose the 5th game and the match. Colvert finished 12th for the year.

Rein's Van Holds 31,300 MRP's

Joan Rein, ACC Secretary, had quite a van load home from Raleigh. The six players in the van sported some 31,300 MRP's (lifetime). Needless to say, the fur was flying on the boards all the way home. The six? Tourney winner "Mick" Michaelis, Scott Kooistra, DeLynn Colvert, Larry Loupee, Ron Morgan, and Rein (3 Life Masters, 2 Masters, and a near-Master)..

Doris Perkins Wins First New England Inaugural, Takes 1993 MRP Lead

Directors Lee Norris and Ford Jewer are off and running with their very first New England Inaugural, drawing some 160 peggers to North Kingstown, RI for a little one-day pegging.

Doris Perkins, Quincy, MA, took home the bacon...and is off and winging in the new season's MRP race. With the 160 MRP's for this win, Doris is leading the pack nationwide in the early going. This is Perkin's first sanctioned win.

Fayann Salerno, Milton, MA, came close, but had to settle for 2nd place (and 152 MRP's). Charles Rapoza, Brockton, MA, finished 9th (739 MRP's) in the Eastern Region last year, and is "out of the blocks" in fine fashion to begin the new year with a nifty 3rd place finish. Ann Somers, Bellingham, MA, took 4th.

Some 110 peggers stayed around for the consolation, and Charlie Finley, the Enfield, CT flash was not to be denied. Charlie had his usual good year in 1992, finishing 18th in the Eastern Region with 535 MRP's. 2nd, 3rd, and 4th went to Joan Morrison, Abington, MA, Pat Tucci, Saco, ME, and Robert Kaplan, Randolph, MA. Joan and Pat finished in the Eastern Region's top 100 last year, and are off to another fast start.

The players donated voluntarily to the Rhode Island School for the Deaf, in memory of Bill Seymour, to the tune of \$217. ACC members continue to show their generosity for worthwhile causes.

An interesting sidelight to this tournament: Grass Roots club 109, Holbrook, MA "hogged" the first three spots in the main event!

Phyllis Schmidt Captains 1992 All-American Team

By earning 254 MRP's in 1992's final event (the National Open), Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA, won the National MRP Championship and will captain the 1992 All-American team.

In one of the closest MRP races in the ACC's history, Schmidt edged Russell Adams, Minneapolis, Jim McManus, Milwaukee, and Duane Toll, West Allis, WI in the final event of this cribbage year.

Colvert, Marani, Ready, Medeiros, Hilton Earn All-Regional Team Honors

Two Western Region players have earned All-Regional honors. DeLynn Colvert (972), Missoula, MT, and Don Hilton (849), Hood River, OR were named (the top five in each region that did NOT earn All-American honors are named to the All-Regional teams).

In the Eastern Region, John Marani (959), Quincy, MA, James Ready (986), Stoughton, MA, and Bill Medeiros (941), Shrewsbury, MA were named.

All of the top five Central Regional players earned All-American honors, therefore, no Central-Region team members were named.

James Ready, Robert Drukman, Paul Woytovich, Earn Master Rating

James Ready, Stoughton, MA finished 2nd in the 78-pegger consolation at the Cape Cod Extra June 28, and becomes the 121st pegger to earn his Master Rating. Ready's performance in Wareham culminates an outstanding year as he accumulated some 900 MRP's, placing him in the top 20 nationally.

North Easton, MA, pegger Robert Drukman recently earned his Master rating at the National Open in Raleigh, NC. He finished a fine 5-6 in the huge field of 384 peggers to easily wing his MRP's over the 2,000 mark to become only the 122nd pegger in the ACC's history to earn this honor. With the 237 MRP's earned in Raleigh, his 1992 total of 800 culminates an outstanding year on the boards for Robert.

Paul Woytovich, Hickory, NC, also had a very fine National Open. His 3rd place finish earned 269 MRP's and he easily went over the magic 2,000 to earn his Master rating. Paul becomes the 123rd ACC player to earn this honor.

1994 Season's Play for Members Only

At the recent Board of Director's meeting in Raleigh, a resolution to limit play to members of the American Cribbage Congress ONLY for the 1994 season (beginning August 1, 1993) passed unanimously.

The consolation event was captured by local Betty Capper, followed by hot-pegging Bob Brumley, Sunnyside, WA. Tana Conell, Helena, MT, and Harvey Honeycutt, Beatty, OR took 3rd and 4th.

Tana and hubby Walt captured the early-bird doubles event, and DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT won the "high-rollers."

All 66 peggers in this event were veteran players, attested to by the low qualifying scores. All 27 GP cards made the playoffs...and only a handful of players scored 30 or more GP's in the 22-game round. Only Joe Dunn, Boise, ID, had a hot card---a very fine 41 GP score.

Club 28 Tops!

Portland's Club 28 has 99 active ACC members...and the top two Western Region players: Ray Van Orsow, and Roy Hofbauer. In addition, John Furler is the top rated of all Grass Roots players in the nation. This Oregon club really picks 'em up and lays 'em down!

Fred Dettling 120th Master Pegger

Fred Dettling, Aurora, CO, nailed the Northern Illinois Spring Classic May 17, and earned the 120th Master rating from the American Cribbage Congress.

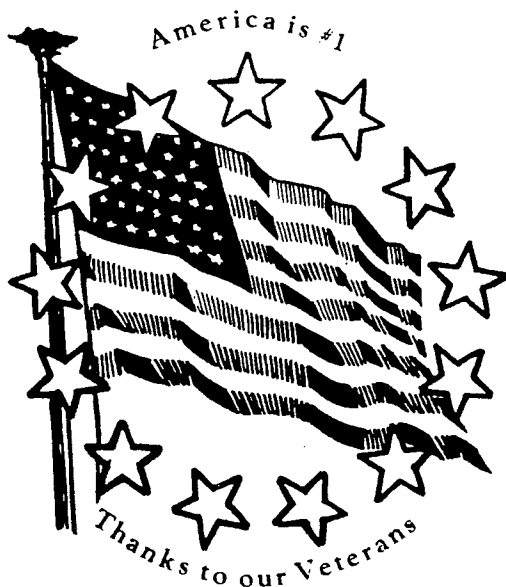

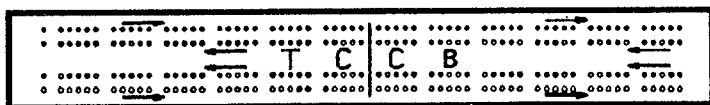

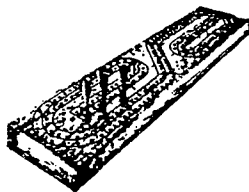
