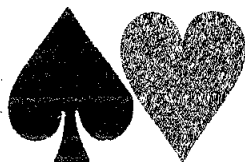

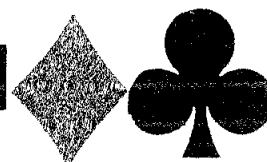

Cochlin, Schisel, Michaelis Make MRP Move

Clyde Ross Wins In Reno

Bernie Saueressig Nails 236-Pegger Consolation

Grass Valley, CA's Clyde Ross, down 3-1 in the best 4 of 7 final, came alive and won three straight games to take the recent Independence Day Classic in Reno July 2...and a nifty \$1,850 purse (and 298 MRP's).

And with a huge crowd of 330 peggers, 2nd place wasn't bad. Darlene Carr, Santee, CA, took bridesmaid honors, earning 272 MRP's. Helene Sontag, Vacaville, CA, came close and settled for 3rd place, followed by Roger King, San Jose, CA, in 4th.

Californians made a clean sweep of the Main Event, as the pegging school teacher from Sonora...Dan Ziesler...took honors in the qualifying round, posting a nice 36 (17) +196.

A huge crowd of 236 peggers stayed for the Consolation, and Richland WA's Bernie Saueressig waltzed to the title. Bernie posted a nice 3rd place finish in Spokane, WA, just a week earlier to continue a fine streak. LaDonna Govenor, Napa, CA, took 2nd. Joan Rein, the ACC's Secretary from Chaska, MN, finished 3rd, followed by Mary Gladish, the poet (page 12, July CW), from Concord, CA.

Gene Huber Scores \$1,100 29-Hand

One of the tournament's highlights was Gene Huber's 29-hand...the only one scored in the Main Event...and earned a nifty \$1,100 (\$1,000 from the Sands, and another \$100 from the ACC). This 216,580 to 1 gem is the 16th scored this cribbage year, and sets a record for 29's in a single year. Bob Maynard, Anchorage, AK, scored a 29 in the Last Chance event, and Laurie Logan, Quincy, CA, nailed this long shot in the Friday night Early Bird. Alas, these two players were a little off on their timing to earn some "gas" money.

Russell Nelsen 153rd Master

Russell Nelsen, Phoenix, AZ, has set several qualifying round record scores (44 (19) +355 at this year's ACC Open, for example), and with a fine 10th place finish (203 MRP's) has earned the 153rd Master awarded by the ACC.

In the torrid windup to this year's MRP race, three players made a move upward. Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WA, picked up 234 MRP's for a 5th place finish and wings it over the 1,000 mark for the year. Ken Cochlin, Kennewick, WA, nailed 11th place, and zips to the 1,200 mark, and perennial All-American, Mick Michaelis,

Missoula Has Playing Site Changed

Grand National Pox Continues

The last three Grand Nationals have been beset with problems. In 1991, GN Director Harry Stoops had a cruise boat go bankrupt (goodbye deposit), and a last minute site change due to a remodeling job. In 1992, Directors Gallagher, Lemke, and Miller, experienced a severe fire in the playing facility, closing down one wing...but these two events proceeded nicely despite these woes.

Now, Grand National XII in Missoula, MT has been forced to change locations due to the inability (or lack of motivation) of the Village Inn Red Lion to obtain a Montana Gaming License. Despite calls from the Governor of Montana, and the Attorney General of Montana, the management of the Village Inn remained unmoved. And without a gaming license, the Montana Department of Justice forbids play.

But not to worry. The Joker's Wild establishment has agreed to host this event. They have seating for about 400 peggers, which will handle the expected crowd. And if the number of entrants exceed this number, directors Rex Paddock and DeLynn Colvert will contract with another establishment to handle the overflow.

All four of these inns are within one block of the Joker's Wild, and have a combined 275 rooms. Paddock and Colvert recommend making early reservations, as rooms may be scarce if a large number of peggers enter this prestigious tournament.

If you wish to **cancel your reservation** at the Village Inn Red Lion, call 1-800-547-8010.

The Awards Banquet will also be re-scheduled for the Joker's Wild. The menu will be prime rib, prawns, soup, salad, rolls, dessert and beverage (\$16.85). The Joker's Wild owner, Dick Williams, has been most generous with peggers in past ACC-sanctioned events, furnishing free coffee for the weekend, reasonably priced meals and drinks, and he has even been known to add \$100 to the Last Chance event's prize fund.

So, despite the Grand National Pox, Missoula is off and winging with a new site...and the change should save every player about \$40 or so in rent and meal money for the weekend.

And don't forget the doubleheader. The Montana Championship will be held at the Joker's Wild the next weekend, not to mention a \$20/9 game match on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evening at 7 PM. See you in Montana...bring your lucky pegs!

And, of course, Bill and Dorihalee's efforts kept the tournament on track. Jim Duresky Takes Cape Cod Extra

Dave Clemmey Scores 50 MRP's

Jim Duresky, the travelling pegger from Richmond, VA, won the recent Cape Cod Extra in E. Wareham, MA, and with the 140 MRP's earned will wing it into the top five in the Eastern Region (standing at over 700 this cribbage year).

Another Virginian, Bob Moore (Norfolk) took 2nd in this 138-pegger event. George Webb, Eastern Region's Tournament Commissioner from Halifax, MA, took 3rd, followed by K. C. Finley, Enfield, CT in 4th.

In the national MRP race, David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, is among the leaders for this cribbage year, and picked up 50 MRP's for a 12th place finish, keeping his national hopes alive. Another MRP leader, Brian Heroux, Woonsocket, RI, picked up 105 MRP's for a fine 5th place finish to roll into the 700 bracket for the year.

Frank Frederickson, Randolph, MA won the 91-pegger consolation event, besting John Croce, Cranston, RI in the final match. Steven Smith, E. Bridgewater, MA, and Michael Hutchko, Hanover, MA took 3rd and 4th.

Race Horse Backdrop **Jim Hartung Takes The Roses...er, the Lilacs!**

The Lilac City Open's inaugural event had the unusual distraction of having thoroughbred horses going through their morning workouts as a backdrop to the pegging action...but did this stop Jim Hartung's concentration? No way, as he winged it to the title, and by winning this 86-pegger event this Richland, WA, pegger is knocking on the door for his Master rating.

And who won 2nd? None other than Jesse Jarrell, the national MRP leader from Pittsburg, CA. His last two month's pegging have been red hot, and he is coming close to putting a lock on the 1993 championship. His MRP totals for this cribbage year have topped 1,500...a 300 point lead over his nearest competitors.

Richland, WA's Bernie Saueressig took 3rd, and local Neil Byre finished 4th.

The hot hand in the qualifying round was held by local Edwin Weilep, barely nipping another top MRP leader...Gary Motley, Gresham, OR...as both players scored 34 GP's in the 22-game round. Motley scored 81 MRP's for the weekend, and takes over 2nd nationally, standing at 1,200 MRP's for this cribbage year.

56 peggers played the consolation event, and Ken Capper, Hermiston, OR, came away the winner, besting Rex Paddock, Missoula, MT in a wild 3-game final, as the cards went one way, then the other. Ralph Reynolds, Prineville, OR took 3rd, and Jim Hornbacher, Bothell, WA in 4th.

Rex was hot in the early-bird High Roller, and went home a winner for the weekend. Another "hot" player...Keith Forrest, Stevensville, MT... nailed the doubles, and was 2nd in the Saturday Special. Evon Forrest was the "better half" of the winning doubles duo.

Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, once again scored his hot run in a non-sanctioned event by winning the Saturday Special, and alas, failed to gain ground in the MRP race.

Missoula, MT's Henry Popham came alive in the last chance event, and won a little gas money for his Cadillac (license: "29-Hand").

Mattie Young ran a first-class tournament in her inaugural, ably assisted by Marvis Reynolds.

In Memoriam

Member: Cribbage Hall of Fame **James Arblaster** **1920-1993**

James Arblaster, Kissimmee, Florida passed away June 23 while undergoing heart by-pass surgery at the VA Hospital in Tampa, FL.

One of the founding fathers of the American Cribbage Congress, Jim will be sorely missed by all the members of the Congress.

In 1979, Jim, along with Joe Wergin and other prominent cribbage players, met in Raleigh, NC, where they agreed to form the American Cribbage Congress. Jim was elected to the Board of Directors, served as the first Secretary-Treasurer, and was a member of the Rules Committee for 10 years. He organized the Honorable Order of Cribadier Generals, set the standards for the Cribbage Hall of Fame, and developed the Rating Point System. He maintained the membership program and became *Cribbage World's* first editor. Jim was elected to the Cribbage Hall of Fame and enshrined at Milwaukee, WI, on September 18, 1982...the 3rd person so inducted.

The last few years were devoted to administering the ACC's Grass Roots Program.

He is survived by his wife, Marlyne.

Doris Perkins Earns Masters Joe Seigle Wins Eastern States Championship

Veteran Joe Seigle, Coventry, CT, decided at the last minute to give the 3rd Annual Eastern States Championship a try...and he came away the winner! He joins Al Dinwoodie and John Chambers as champions of this event.

Bob Waltzer, Woburn, MA, finished 2nd, with Jerry Bernier, Wales, MA, in 3rd. Terry Gosselin, Burlington, VT, took 4th.

The hot hand in the qualifying round belonged to John Rooney, scoring a whopping 25 GP's in a 12-game morning match (+263!).

The consolation event was won by Corrine Moore, Westminster, MA. Richard West, Attleboro, MA took 2nd, followed by Paul Petit, Pawtucket, RI, and Zeke Veradt, Taunton, MA.

Doris Perkins, Quincy, MA, attained her Master rating by qualifying 8th (of 139) and finishing 7th...and becomes the 152nd Master player.

Director Emil Chrabaszcz reports that all Eastern states were represented, in addition to several others...some as far away as Nevada and Hawaii.

Dennis Cousens, Windham, ME, took the consolation event (32 peggers)...but the BIG news is George Webb's 28-hand. George is the ACC's Eastern Region Tournament Commissioner...and he reports that this 28-hand was his FIRST in 60 years of pegging!

Grand Master Gary Motley, Gresham, OR has laid his pegs away for this season, and finished with 1,227 MRP's, leaving only Master David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, Master Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WI, Life Master Mick Michaelis, Marinette, WI, Master Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, Master Ken Cochlin, Kennewick, WA, and Life Master DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT with only an outside shot of overtaking the streaking Jarrell.

The 1993 season is more or less paralleling the 1992 season. It appears it will take about 1,000 MRP's to earn the top ten...and All-American honors. About 15 players are still in this race, and, once again, the National Open in Raleigh will decide who will make this prestigious team.

The 1993 season total MRP's for each region was much closer than 1992, with about 350 MRP's needed to earn an invite to next year's Tournament of Champions in Reno.

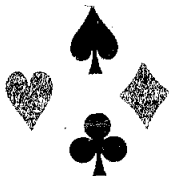
