ACC Judges Testing Examiner Wins **Al Miller Cops Holiday Classic**

December 13 was a lucky day for Al Miller, our ACC Judges Testing Examiner. This Nashua, NH pegger topped all 150 entrants at the Holiday Cribbage Classic in Woonsocket, RI.

Al is a Grand Master, and with the 168 MRP's earned in this meet pushes his lifetime total to some 4,900 MRP's, maintaining his 11th place standing in the ACC (lifetime).

Doug Russo, Johnston, RI, throws his hat into the MRP race by finishing 2nd...and picking up 152 MRP's.

Stan Babiec, N. Dartmouth, MA, finished 3rd, and John Brodeur, Dorchester, MA took 4th.

Ken Vetterline, Bar Mills, ME had the hot hand in the qualifying round, and with his top finish picked up a nifty 53 MRP's.

Some 94 peggers stayed around for the consolation event, and George Riley, Taunton, MA, edged Madelyn McGarvey, Palmer, MA, for the title. William Cooper, Marlboro, MA, and Steve Jastremski, Hopedale, MA finished 3rd and 4th.

Directors Gloria Dyndur and Ann Somers continue to host a fine tournament...attested by the steady increase of players from year to year. Dyndur and Somers reported that the players contributed \$320 to the Milk Fund charity. This event is again planned for December 12,

The Swiss Movement

In conducting tournaments, cribbage officials have been using a combination of round robin and straight elimination.

There is a third method, the Swiss Movement, which is used in large contract bridge meets. Every player competes against another person who has the same won and lost records. After the first match, those with the 1-0 record are paired. And, of course, the 0-1 people are matched against each other.

As the tournament progresses, there are more divisions. With four games completed, the

competitors will be split 4-0, 3-1, 2-2, 1-3, and 0-4. More divisions result after each match.

Everyone competes to the bitter end! The names in the standings form an elongated diamond from top to bottom. Number 1 rests on a pinnacle and at the bottom point rests the unluckiest gladiator. Throughout the meet, a player is matched against a person with a similar record. What could be fairer?

This scribe is planning a local area tournament early in 1993 to introduce the Swiss System to cribbage buffs.

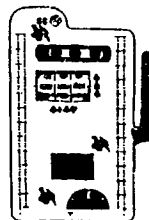

In addition to the championship, he also took 2nd in the All-Events competition. Only John Hiland, Milwaukee, could top his combined qualifying score.

Dennis Pokorney, Mauston, WI came close to taking all the marbles, but had to settle for 2nd. Russ Uecke, Menominee, MI finished 3rd, and local Carl Schroeder took 4th.

Some 125 peggers showed for this inaugural North Pole Open event...and according to Ev Bey, Sun City West, Arizona, the event is aptly named!

The consolation event had an eventful conclusion as Jim McManus, Milwaukee earned his Life Master rating...only the 9th in the history of the American Cribbage Congress...by winning this event!

Emilio Perez, Waukegan, IL took 2nd, followed by Bill Chepeck, Milwaukee, and Ed Heinowski, Muskego, WI in 3rd and 4th.

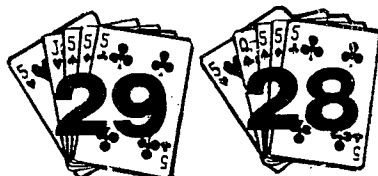
Ray Boesel, Glenbuelah, WI scored a nifty 28-hand...but winner Michaelis claims an even tougher happening. He is quoted as saying he won \$100 in the Michigan lottery after some five years of trying. He won by picking 4 numbers of 6, making the weekend memorable for Mick.

Directors Eugene and Aggie Mikulsky expressed thanks to Ginny and Frank Danielski for their help in the logistics of this inaugural event...and they hope to host this event again in 1994.

Jim McManus Earns 9th Life Master

Perennial winner Jim McManus, Milwaukee's cribbage king, has earned the 9th Life Master rating in the history of the American Cribbage Congress by winning the consolation event at the recent North Pole Open in Appleton, WI. Jim nudged over the magic 6,000 mark the hard way. He also won the consolation event at the Minnesota Valley Open October 31. Winning consolation events earn only half-points. However, over the years of competition, McManus has had numerous top finishes, and is always a threat to win any event.

Bill Shoemaker Wins in Manchester

George Taylor Tops 100 in Consolation

On Sunday, November 29, some 138 peggers sat down for a little cribbage in Manchester, CT...and after an intense day of pegging, Bill Shoemaker from nearby West Hartford emerged the winner, picking up a nifty prize, and some 157 MRP's for his day's work.

Newly crowned Grand Master Larry Samet, Wellesley Hills, MA finished 2nd...and garnered another 130 MRP's towards his Life Master.

Rhode Island peggers captured the next three spots: in 3rd; Frank Gallo (Cranston), in 4th; Gloria Dyndur (Woonsocket), and veteran Al Dinwoodie took 5th (Coventry). Dyndur is co-director of the Holiday Classic in Woonsocket.

George Taylor, Swansea, MA, took on an even 100 peggers in the consolation...and

came away with honors, edging Ron Kennelly, Somerville, MA, for the title. Robert Hinkle, Newington, CT took 3rd, followed by Roch LePage, Wilton, CT, in 4th.

Roch had the hot hand in the main event's qualifying round, picking up nearly 100MRP's in both events.

Ford Jewer, Wakefield, RI finished 7th in the main event, after qualifying 2nd, and this Master pegger continues his fine run, nearing the 400 MRP mark for this cribbage year. Another pegger on a roll this year is Jim Duresky, Richmond, VA. Jim earned another 83 MRP's in this match, and also moves into the 400 MRP range for this cribbage year.

Directors Mimi and Rit Alkas are planning to re-new this Yankee Classic again next year, with November 28 tentatively scheduled.

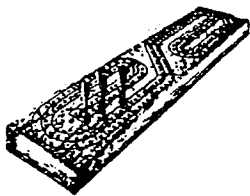
Debbie Schisel, Kenosha, WI didn't quite follow instructions...but she came close.

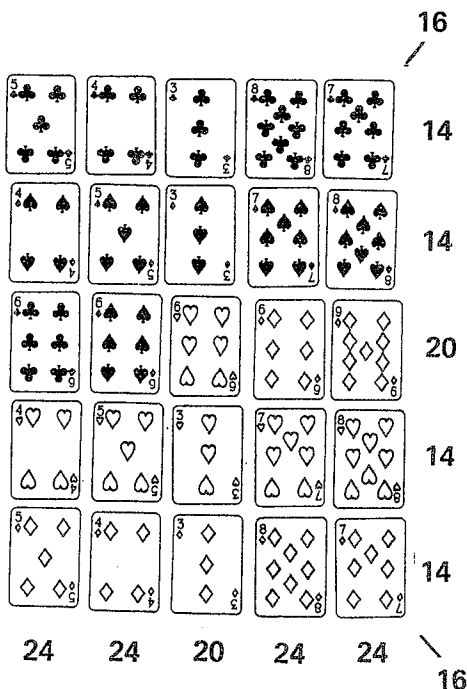

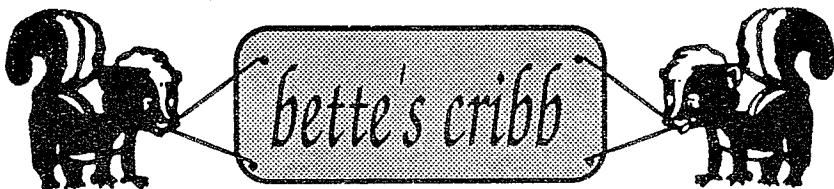
