212 Peggers in Brocton

Michael Hutchko Nails South Shore Classic

One of the nation's top one-day tournaments is the South Shore Classic, played in Brockton, MA, March 28. Some 212 peggers picked 'em up and laid 'em down...and after the smoke had cleared, only Michael Hutchko remained undefeated in the playoffs. This Hanover, MA pegger picked up a nifty purse and a sizeable 234 MRP's (after qualifying 23rd) in claiming the championship.

Ted Diamond (Randolph, MA) took 2nd, and some 207 MRP's. Rhode Island pegger Ken Patenaude (Cumberland) finished 3rd, followed by Vincent Ciccone, Quincy, MA.

The hot hand in the qualifying round was held by Jeffrey Del Santo, Warwick, RI, and with the large crowd, picked up 73 MRP's.

136 peggers stayed around for the consolation, and Wilma MacDonald, Avon, MA, came away the winner, picking up 110 MRP's in the process. K. C. Finley, Enfield, CT, is usually in the money, and once again he scored...picking up 2nd. Ed Forand, Rochester, MA, nailed 3rd, and Donald Graveline, Allston, MA finished 4th.

Ford Jewer, Wakefield, RI, finished 20th, and with the 64 MRP's, wings it over the 600 mark for this cribbage year, keeping alive his All-American hopes. Another top Eastern Region player, Joe Ramos, West Warwick, RI, finished 23rd, and with the 47 MRP's earned, wings it to the 550 range for the year, also keeping his All-American hopes alive.

David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, scored 63 MRP's in the consolation (12th), and is near the 1,000 MRP mark, standing 3rd nationally (Jesse Jarrell, Pittsburg, CA leads, with Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR in 2nd place)

Director George Webb plans on renewing this event next year, with play scheduled for April 3, 1994.

MRP Race Tightens

Paul Hatcher Wins Washington Championship

Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, won All-American honors in 1991, finishing that cribbage year in 4th place with some 1,069 MRP's. With four months to go in this cribbage year, Hatcher has reached 1,050+ and is a serious contender for national championship honors. Only Jesse Jarrell, the Pittsburg, CA king of cribbage has scored more MRP's this cribbage year.

Hatcher won the Blue Mountain Open in September for his first sanctioned win ever, followed that with a Goblins & Ghosts win in October, and now has his third sanctioned event championship in one cribbage year by winning the 156-pegger Washington State championship in Richland, WA, on March 28.

Gary Motley another former All-American from Gresham, OR, took 2nd in Richland, followed by Ed Kern, a veteran pegger from Missoula, MT. Big Bob Brumley, Sunnyside, WA copped 4th.

The cream came to the top in this event as yet another All-American, Roy Hofbauer, topped the field in the qualifying round with a fine 38 GP score.

Another perennial winner, Ray Hanes (Walla Walla, WA) took the consolation event, with Denny Van Orsow, Culver, OR, in 2nd, Bob Rendall, Kennewick, WA, 3rd, and Sue Temple, an excellent pegger from Beaverton, OR in 4th.

Local Jim Hartung nailed the Saturday night "high-roller" crowd to help pay for his wrecked Lincoln (Murphy's Law did him in at the Baker City tourney, again. Years ago a bird dumped on him during play in Baker City...and this year his car was badly dinged!).

Willie and Jo Evans once again ran a fine tournament, ably assisted by Sophie Nelson.

Luanne Felstet Takes Montana Open

Last January, Luanne Felstet (Missoula, MT) topped all players in the qualifying round at Portland's Winter Open, but, alas, lost her first round playoff. At the recent 108-pegger Montana Open, she went all the way to the championship, picking up \$800 and a nifty 120 MRP's to boot!

Local Steve Clarke took 2nd in his first sanctioned event, followed by Evon Forrest, Florence, MT, and Jeanne Hofbauer, an excellent travelling pegger from Washougal, WA.

Local John Hill (his license plate: MR CRIB) had the high qualifying score...a nice 37 GP's.

Darrel Miotke, Sublimity, OR, took the consolation event, followed by locals Bud Clarke in 2nd and Gus Johnson in 3rd. Ed Ristom, El Paso, TX finished 4th.

Another local, Henry Popham, nailed the "high rollers." His cards have come alive lately, and is a player to watch. The Doubles event was won by the Ed Dickinson clan from

Enumclaw, WA; the Saturday special by local Dean Field; and the last chance by Chris Burrell, the Libby, MT, king of cribbage. Chris has a habit of waiting until this last chance event to show his stuff, and has won several of these events.

Synopsis Board of Director's Meeting Reno, February 4, 1993

All members present except Webb, Wergin & Pond. Pond excused.

Executive Vice President Kooistra called meeting to order. Quorum present.

Green Bay meeting minutes approved.

Treasurer's report reviewed and approved.

Fingleton reported on "Cribbage in the Schools" program. Griffin offered to donate 25 boards to this project.

Tenenbaum moved to require membership in the ACC to play in sanctioned tournaments. Hornbeck seconded. Motion passed 15-9, 3 abstentions.

Ramos moved to require all Grass Roots players to be members of the ACC. Fingleton seconded. Motion carried 18-4.

Ramos moved to require the last two motions to be effective August 1, 1994. Monroe seconded, motion carried unanimously.

Kooistra reported on Cribadier General program. Proctor suggested lowering price of custom cards in order to sell them faster. BOD suggested 2 decks for \$25 to become Cribadier General. Proctor hopes program can be kicked off in Raleigh this July.

Woodward of the Sands reviewed past, present and future contributions for the TOC and JPW/ACC Open at the Sands. She expressed hopes the tournaments will be held at the Sands in the future.

Rein and Hofbauer reported they have followed up on inquiries of other facilities. None offered enough room or meeting with some of the other contributions. Rein moved to hold TOC and JPW/ACC Open at the Sands again next year. Michaelis seconded. Carried unanimously.

Colvert constructed new playoff boards for Reno at cost of \$274 out of pocket. Irons paid \$250 to Colvert. McCabe moved the \$24 balance be paid to Colvert from the ACC. Ramos seconded. Carried. Colvert granted permission to use boards at Missoula's Grand National.

Colvert reported on 1993 Grand National. Details are on track. Perkins motioned for \$1,000 for expenses. Babcock seconded. Carried unanimously.

Hamilton reported on 1994 Grand National. Scheduled for September 24, 25, and 26 in St. Paul, MN.

Ramos made bid on behalf of George Bickford for the 1995 Grand National to be held in Connecticut.

Norris moved and Fingleton seconded a motion to vote on the 1995 Grand National at the Raleigh meeting, July 1993. Carried.

Wisconsin Dells indicated interest in the 1996 Grand National.

Norris presented proposal regarding Hall of Fame selections and voting. McCabe moved and Ramos seconded to accept proposal, with changes indicated to be effective August 1, 1993. Motion carried to have *Cribbage World* publish criteria in the February issue each year.

Norris moved to adopt procedure to have no nominations from the floor. All nominations, this year only, to be sent to Kooistra in writing by June 1, 1993. Babcock seconded. Carried. *Cribbage World* to publish in March CW.

Hombeck discussed Mr. & Mrs. Cribbage World proposal, McCabe moved to discontinue the award. Monroe seconded, Carried.

Fingleton recommended that the ACC allow Joe Seigle a "one time exemption" for his tiered tournament. McCabe moved to have Fingleton appoint a committee to evaluate and report on this tournament. Ramos seconded, motion passed.

Hamilton presented a "nomination for election to the ACC BOD" form. A notice and form shall be inserted in the March issue of *Cribbage World*. Nominations, with biography due to Hamilton with postmark no later than April 15th. The June issue of *Cribbage World* will have biographies and ballots for return by July 15th. Results will be published in the September issue of *Cribbage World*.

McCabe moved for a title of Director Emeritus with a lifetime voting right be bestowed on Joe Wergin. Michaelis seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Under officer's pleasure, McCabe read a letter from Joe Wergin. Ev Bey reported on the new Rule Books, indicating a superb price, and immediate availability. Ramos noted a Grass Roots meeting would be held at 4 PM, Feb. 6, 1993 in the Heritage Room.

Note was made that anything that is newsworthy regarding tournaments should be forwarded to Ken Cambell for his historical information (see article, this issue).

Kooistra reminded everyone that the next meeting will be held at Raleigh on July 23, 1993.

Griffin moved to adjourn. So moved.

Mikulsky, Schisel Earn Master

John Hiland Continues Streak, Takes Tri-Cities Open

West Allis, WI, pegger John Hiland has been on a streak lately, and at the recent Tri-Cities Open in Marinette, WI, he continued his roll with a hard-earned victory. With 166 peggers on hand, only 42 qualified for the playoffs...and John took the 42nd and last spot, then rolled on for his win! The 180 MRP's earned gives Hiland a shot at All-American honors for this cribbage year, running his total to some 700.

Francis Froelich, Green Bay, WI, came close, but had to settle for 2nd. Dave Bartlett, Milwaukee, WI, took 3rd, followed by D. A Jeffers, New London, WI, in 4th.

Eugene Mikulsky, Sobieski, WI, qualified 4th (50 MRP's) and finished 6th (135 MRP's) to wing it over the 2,000 lifetime MRP mark to earn the ACC's 145th Master award. A short time later in the consolation event, Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WI, picked up 13 MRP's for a 9-16 finish and became the 146th Master pegger. Deb has made a fine run the past three years, and earned this award in near-record time.

Life Master Joe Bernard, the Libertyville, IL, king of cribbage, continues his winning ways by picking up the consolation crown...and another 60 MRP's. Bryan Conklin, Abrams, WI, took 2nd, followed by D. M. Peterson (Pound, WI) and James Duresky (Richmond, VA).

Four 28 hands were scored...but no 29's. Tom Stehlik, Helen Railsback, Bryan Conklin, and Ellen Swenson all picked up this 15,028-1 longshot

Director Robert Michaelis reported an oddity. Last year's event drew 166 players...and this number was matched again this year. In addition, \$249 was donated to the Salvation Army by the players.

Locals Cop Palmetto Classic

Merritt Frazier, John Ranne Take Honors in South Carolina

The locals took on all comers and came away winners at the recent Palmetto Classic in Columbia, SC. Merritt Frazier nailed the 92-pegger main event, and John Ranne topped the 72-pegger consolation.

Jim Duresky, a top pegger from Richmond, VA, has been seen far and wide pegging this season, and he racked up another bundle of MRP's with a 2nd place finish in the main event, keeping alive his chances for All-American honors this cribbage year (600 MRP's).

Fran Ward, Cary, NC, took 3rd, and Jim Hartley, a former National Open winner (1975) finished 4th. Jim hails from Wake Forest, NC.

In the consolation, Bob Gombatz, a perennial winner from Raleigh, NC finished 2nd, followed by Ted Depizol, Winter Springs, NC, and Joy Barnes, DeLand, FL, in 4th. Joy was the 1991 Grand National winner.

Richard Kerr, Ruthersford, NC topped the field in the qualifying round.

Director Al Odom reports this tourney will be held again next March.

Ray Baenen and Don Clark Play Marathon Game

Two tough peggers from Libby, MT...Ray Baenen and Don Clark...recently played a marathon game. How did the game go? An example is one deal: both hands were zero and the crib also scored zero! A very rare happening, indeed!

Nevertheless, Don teaches some 18 to 20 children cribbage at the local school every quarter. Let's hope he teaches them to score a few points every hand. Some of our qualifying rounds take a little too long as it is!

New Masters

Louine Lyda David Clemmey Ed Bloom Ed Blecker

Louine Lyda, Forest Grove, OR, picked up 35 MRP's by qualifying 10th, and went on to a 14th place finish in January's Portland Open to wing it over the 2,000 MRP mark to earn the 140th Master rating awarded by the ACC. Louine finished the 1992 season rated 9th in the Western Region.

David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, won the world's largest cribbage tournament in Reno last month (ACC Open) and with the 500+MRP's easily earned his Master rating...and also took over the nation's MRP lead for this cribbage year.

Ed Bloom, Cupertino, CA, has scored some 245 MRP's this cribbage year, and becomes the 142nd ACC player to earn Master. An excellent pegger, Ed is always a threat to win any event.

Ed Blecker, Roseville, MN, recently finished 2nd at the Capital City Open in St. Paul, earning some 152 MRP's and his Master rating (No. 143). Ed hasn't been on the "trail" as much as in the early days of the ACC, but he is still a formidable opponent, attesting by this fine 2nd place finish (of 158 peggers).

Mattie Young Hosts Inaugural Lilac City Open

Spokane's Mattie Young has travelled far and wide to do a little pegging...and now she will bring organized cribbage to Spokane, WA. She will host the first ever sanctioned event in Spokane June 25, 26, and 27. And she's doing it up right...the games will be at the Playfair Race Course! Now that's a new one...lose at cribbage, then give the horses a try!

Bob McCabe Scores 28-Crib

At the Capital City Open in St. Paul, ACC President Bob McCabe scored a very rare 28-CRIB! Local Karen Cummings discarded a 5-10 and was burned with a 5 cut, after Bob had discarded two 5's.

Ron Oila Dealt Worthless 28-Hand

Bob McCabe scored his 28-crib, but Ron Oila, Virgina, MN, was dealt his first 28-hand ever, needing 26 to win with first count. Alas, his opponent pegged 6 and out before Ron could score this gem! Keep pegging Ron!



What does this mean? Why, it's a lonesome five in a hand that does not add to the count! The single five is the dog!





Figure The Odds Right!

Information on odds losing the cut for deal 14 times in a row, using simple math.

Example: suppose you were cutting for a penny. First cut you put up a penny, pone puts up a penny. Your odds are 1 to 1, even money. The 2nd cut, after losing, you put up the penny you lost plus one. Odds are 2-1. Third, you put up 3 pennies you lost plus 1. Odds 4 to 1. Fourth cut you put up the 7 coins you lost plus one. Odds 8-1. Fifth: put up 15 plus one. Odds are 16 to 1, etc. to the 14th cut. Odds are 8,192 to 1.
