

The President's Column

Everett "Ev" Bey

As promised when elected President, I have been out waving the ACC flag at various tournaments around the U.S.

It's been a pleasure meeting and greeting members and cribbage enthusiasts, but I'm disappointed that they show no respect for the office of President...they all seem to take great delight in beating me at the grand ol' game. One unnamed soul at the Buffalo, NY tournament even went so far as to double-skunk Ye Olde Prez!

As you read in last month's issue of Cribbage World, nobody was elected to the Cribbage Hall of Fame this year. That's unfortunate, because we had five deserving nominees and there are many more out there in Cribbage-land who are equally deserving of recognition.

This was the first year that we used a new system of nominating and voting, opening it up for a wider representation rather than just confining it to participation by the Board of Directors.

Nominations can now be made by any member (see rules printed in Nov. '94 Cribbage World), with voting expanded to include directors of sanctioned tournaments and Grass Roots club directors as well as board members.

According to Pat Barrett, chairman of the Hall of Fame committee, there were 248 eligible voters and yet only 151 voted, a disappointing 61% showing.

109 tournament directors have been certified to vote, with only 59 participating, a 55% showing. The regional breakdown showed the following voting patterns: Eastern, 29 eligible, 19

voting...66%; Central, 15 voting out of 21 eligible, 71%; Western, 25 of 59, a lowly 42%.

109 Grass Roots directors didn't have much of a better voting record. Overall, they showed 61% participation, with only 66 voting. Regionally, the Eastern region had 21 out of 32 voting, 66%; Central, 10 of 14, 71%; and Western, 35 of 63, only 56%.

In all instances, the West is the group which largely failed to participate. To be elected to the Hall of Fame, candidates must obtain a 75% affirmative vote. Two of five nominees, Robert "Mick" Michaelis and Jeff Monroe, came within scant percentage points of being elected. With greater voting participation, they probably could have attained that honor.

It seems to me that when someone is nominated for the Hall of Fame, it is incumbent on the nominator to publicize and promote his or her candidate by supplying background information to the board members, tournament directors and Grass Roots leaders who will be voting. There's got to be follow-through to accomplish the task.

Let's try to do better next year!

Finally, we won a beautiful cribbage board at the recent Longest Beach Cribbage Classic held at Long Beach, WA, but when we got home we found that the holes had not been drilled. Designer Joe Nelson must have figured that we didn't need any holes, the way we've been playing lately.

Russell Nelsen Tops 376 In Reno

Russell Nelsen makes Scottsdale, Arizona his home...and three times a year he plays his cribbage at Reno's Sands Casino...and three times a year he carts off a wad of greenbacks (or so it seems). The recent Veteran's Day Classic is an example of his expertise on the boards, as this Master pegger once again took home the bacon (\$2,500 and 319 MRP's).

Gary Sand, a Northwest pegger from Spokane, WA, has been on a roll for six months or so...and he continues to pile up MRP's (and \$\$\$) as he came in a nifty 2nd.

Two-time All-American Paul Hatcher, the Salem, OR, bomber finished third...and grabbed the unofficial MRP lead for the 1995 season, as this pegger has piled up a whopping 600+ points for the year, and is off and winging for another outstanding year. Not only did Paul score some 300 MRP's in this match, he earned his Grand Master award, topping the 4,000 MRP mark.

And Greg Schleusner, Truckee, CA's premier pegger also earned his Grand Master with a fine 4th place finish.

And yet another Grand Master was earned when Steve Reynolds, Concord, CA, nailed the qualifying round with a top-qualifying 39 (18) +268.

Sundae Webb-Wiley, Antioch, CA, came away with her Grand Master early in the Main Event, as she continues her fine ACC play.

Statistician Bob McCabe will confirm these MRP numbers (and others who earned Master in this huge tournament) as soon as possible. The ratings are unofficial until posted.

234 peggers signed on for the Consolation, and Tim Hutsell, Crescent City, CA took the top prize, followed by Rob Foy, Benicia, CA, Pete Paradis, Santa Maria, CA, and Ken Koch, Blaine, WA.

R. T. Connelly, the world-travelling pegger from Yountville, CA, took advantage of the ACC's new scoring rule for Consolation play.

R. T. nailed a super 22-GP card (10 games) in qualifying to pick up some 42 MRP's.

In the Early Bird Doubles, John Thiems, Winston, OR, teamed with Ed Park, Roseburg, OR, to win this event...and cart off some \$1,000!

Two Life Masters took home the marbles in the Saturday Night High Rollers...Jesse Jarrell, Pittsburg, CA, took home the \$800 first prize, and One-Star Mick Michaelis, Marinette, WI took 2nd.

Once again the veterans benefited from this huge tournament. Director's Dorthalee and Bill Irons, with able help from a host of volunteers kept the tournament moving smoothly. The Sands Hotel/Casino were great hosts, providing the usual coffee and cakes...and a new game: a Keno 25-card tournament (scored by computer while the peggers were in action with their cribbage).

Jim Morelan Has No Respect

Little Canada's (MN) Jim Morelan has no respect. Cribbage World left his name off the final Master Point List in the September issue. Jim scored a nifty 329 MRP's for the 1994 year...finishing 51st in the Central Region.

Bumper Crop! 2 New Life Masters 5 New Grand Masters 10 New Masters Al Miller, Syl Lulinski Top 6,000 MRP's

Al Miller, Nashua, NH, and Syl Lulinski, LaGrange Park, IL, have topped the 6,000 MRP mark and become Life Masters 13 and 14. The American Cribbage Congress has been very stingy in passing out this honor...and in the 15-year history of the Congress only a handful of players have reached this plateau.

Officially, 5 players have attained Grand Master...and another four unofficially have made the grade at the Reno match (see story, page 3). The players who have attained the 4,000 MRP mark (officially) and Grand Master are:

Youth Cribbage Program

I am excited! Today (Oct. 15) I received my 20th request for the manual to teach groups of youths cribbage. As I see it now, let's suppose that 15 out of 20 recipients do indeed go into the classroom and do some teaching, and let's say the average class size is 25 students. A simple calculation tells me that 375 new cribbage players will be enthusiastically moving their pegs around a board. But let's not stop here. What if 1 in 10 of these new players teaches a friend or family member? Now we're up to 412. Let's also assume that the folks who taught cribbage to kids had such a satisfying experience (almost a guarantee), that they choose to do it again this year. Looking at the same ratios as before, we've approached the 824 nark. But wait! Let's make one more assumption; that within this time frame another ten teachers appear on the scene. Once again using the same numbers as before, there's another 275 students, making a grand total of 1,099 new cribbage players in one year alone! Far fetched? I should say not! If anything, I believe these numbers are quite conservative.

If you're currently working with youth, I encourage you to write Cribbage World and share your positive experiences. If you're not involved in a youth program, please consider it. The Youth Movement Is On!!!

Jim, if you want the odds of a 29-hand happening at a club meeting during a 9-game match, multiply the number of players x 90 (each player will play about 90 hands per 9-game match). Now take 216,580 and divide by that number. Disregard crib hands. That is your odds of a 29-hand scored that night. The odds of Charlie Finley winning 9 in a row? Knowing Charlie, the odds are even! Ed.


Cribbage Boards Galore!


