Kelso, Washington Pegger Wins Two Events In Eight Days **Darrel Miotke Makes MRP Move**

Al Grantz, a quiet, unassuming pegger from Kelso, WA, is one of the ACC's premier "streak players." Last October, he nailed three consecutive events (not sanctioned) in Montana. On May 22 he went south to the Bill Mitchell Memorial in Smith River, CA, and came away with the championship, besting some 62 peggers in the process. Then, seven short days later, on May 29, he once again won a sanctioned event. This time he came away the winner in the 103-pegger Cascade Classic IX in Redmond, Oregon.

Grantz is a Master pegger, and with this double win he will wing it to the 3,000 MRP mark...and keep him peggin' in the top 100 nationally.

Another streaking pegger is Darrel Miotke. This Sublimity, OR pegger nailed 2nd in Redmond (after finishing 5th at the huge Oregon Coast Classic two weeks earlier)...and moves into the top five nationally in the torrid MRPrace, standing at well over 1,100 MRP's.

Roger Lueschow, Maple Valley, WA, finished 3rd, followed by tournament co-direct-

or Lucille Endicott from nearby Bend, OR.

82 peggers stayed for the Consolation, and local Bob Gorden came away the winner. One of the USA's MRP front-runners, Bernie Saueressig (Richland, WA) took 2nd (45 MRP's). Bob Nunamker, Hood River, OR, nailed 3rd, with Master Louine Lyda, Forest Grove, OR, taking 4th.

Other winners: Ken Capper (Early Bird); Jim Gogolin & Ed Park (Doubles); Bill Becker & Dale Brandon (High Roller); David Harmes (Sat. Special).

Wayne Steinmetz, one of Milwaukee's premier peggers, scored a whopping 982 MRP's in the 1993 season, just missing All-American honors He continues to pile up MRP's by winning the recent 78-pegger Potawatomi Peggers Powwow in St. Joseph, Michigan, edging another Milwaukee area pegger...Marlene Lazachek...in the final match. Not only did Wayne win the tournament, he was also high qualifier, and with the combined 116 MRP's earned, becomes the ACC's 188th Master rated player.

Tournament director Jeff Shimp finished 3rd, followed by Sue Schenk, Wyoming, MI in 4th.

Darlene Vantuinen (Wyoming, MI) nailed the 48-pegger Consolation. Michelle Gryka (Grand Rapids, MI) took 2nd, followed by Lucille Simpson (Lewiston, NY), and Ron Hirshman (Milwaukee).

Director Shimp reports this event will be rescheduled again next May.

Henry DeLong Tops In Connecticut

Master pegger Henry DeLong, Woburn, MA nailed the recent Connecticut Championship, after qualifying 4th, and with the combined 150 MRP's, has zipped well over the 500 mark for this cribbage year.

Another Master pegger...Doris Perkins, Quincy, MA...finished 2nd, followed by Joyce Vanelli (Quincy, MA) and Gloria Welch (Braintree, MA).

Not only did Vanelli finish 3rd, but topped the

104 peggers in the qualifying round to take honors.

Master pegger Ken Vetterline, Bar Mills. ME took home the bacon in the 70-pegger Consolation, followed by 1993 All-American David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA. Joe Cornellisen, Halifax, MA, and Bob Waltzer, Medford, MA finished 3rd and 4th.

Director Bill Shoemaker plans on renewing this event next May 21.

Joe Ramos Eastern States Champ

Joe Ramos, West Warwick, RI, joins three other premier champions (Al Dinwoodie, John Chambers, and Joe Seigle) by winning the recent 125-pegger Eastern States Championship in Chicopee, MA. Ramos prevailed over Leo Cyr, Sommerville, MA, coming back from 0-2 to win 3-2.

Corrine Moore, Westminster, MA took 3rd, and Malcolm Enos, Ridgefield Park, NJ finished 4th.

Paul Downey, Sommerville, MA, took qualifying honors...and for the 2nd year in a row Rit Alkas, newly crowned Grand Master from Manchester, CT, qualified 2nd high.

Richard Brault, Palmer, MA, nailed the Consolation...and keeps alive his top ten hopes for this cribbage year. This "rookie" (first year) player is at the 800 MRP mark. Ken Vetterline, a Master pegger from Bar Mills, ME, took 2nd, followed by Elinor Breen, Avon, MA in 3rd and Charles Burgess, E. Greenwich, MA, in 4th.

Director Emil Chrabaszcz reports that Jeffery Gibbions and Napoleon Soares scored 28-hands, but, alas, no 29-hands showed.

Pat Liewellyn Tops in Brattleboro

Pat Llewellyn, tournament director of the huge inaugural Tri-Valley Open played in Medway, MA, March 13, came out of her "Tri-Valley" and played in the Tri-State Open in Brattleboro, VT...and took honors! And after qualifying 3rd, the 142 combined MRP's vaults her to the 500 level for this cribbage year.

Ray Tondorf not only scored a rare 28-hand, but finished 2nd, followed by Joe Seigle, Coventry, CT in 3rd. Robert Boulris, S. Bellingham, MA took 4th.

The ACC's youngest Master pegger...Brian Heroux, Woonsocket, RI, captured the 64-pegger Consolation, besting Al Miller, a Grand Master from Nashua, NH, who is knocking on the door for his Life Master (nearing the 6,000 MRP mark). Brenda Palmer, W. Springfield, MA, took 3rd, followed by Phil Martin, E. Hartford, CT, in 4th.

Jim Gogolin's Timing Is Bad

Jim Gogolin is Idleyld Park (pop. 80), OR's premier pegger. But his timing is off lately. He held 5-5-5-5 and cut a jack for a nifty 28-hand. Alas, his opponent pegged out before he could count this gem.

Thomas Azevedo is in...1,023 To Go!

Thomas Azevedo. Spring Hill, FL, is chomping at the bit, and is the first player to get his entry in for next year's JPW/ACC Open in Reno.

Someday I'll watch the game again. Perhaps once more will turn the tide. I'd hate to spend my time in vain. I'd like to learn it 'fore I've died.


Would learning crib improve my vanity?

Cedric Larson Joins "Numbers Crunchers Anonymous"

Forestville, California's Cedric Larson has recently completed a thorough study of "Nineteen Hands!" Using Wergin's book "How To Win At Cribbage" as reference, Larson laboriously charted on talley sheets the 220 possible blank hands (not counting flushes) and counted the cards that comprised these hands.

Not surprisingly, the king is the most common card in a "nineteen" hand...appearing some 130 times. The ten-card come next, showing in 112 of the 220 hands. The following chart gives the breakdown. Of course, the five is not listed...as a singleton five will always score at least two points (even if not involved in the two points).



Cedric Larson is hereby commissioned a bonafide member of "Numbers Crunchers Anonymous." He joins other notables such as Russell Adams, Minneapolis; Allan Lichty, Des Moines, IA; Gene & Aggie Mikulsky, Sobieski, WI; Tom Mentock, Sheridan, WY; DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT; etc., etc.

WARNING: These numbers illustrate the numbers of times these cards appear in the possible 220 blank hands. It's those combinations that will get you for a large crib score...for example, the jack-queen is high on the list...but not if discarded together! However, if a decision must be made between a 7 or 8 discard to your opponent ...discard the 7. The 7 is 27% safer!

Anthony Del Tufo Wins High Roller Granite State Classic, Keeps Hat In Ring For National Honors

West Bridgewater, MA's Anthony Del Tufo nailed the recent 50-pegger Granite State Classic in Nashua, NH, and, in addition to a sizeable first prize (\$100 entry) came some 53 MRP's, keeping Del Tufo in the national MRP race for this cribbage year.

32 players stayed for the Consolation, and Bob Waltzer, Medford, MA edged Napoleon Soares, Brocton, MA, for the title.



This letter edited as the length was too long for CW's format Cut for deal at the TOC, the JPW/ACC Open and other events in Reno, 4 February, 1994. My record in the TOC: lost 13 of 14 cuts. For three days, lost 45 of 54 cuts... I have pressed for alternate deals.

The playing field in cribbage can be tilted by the uncontrollable luck factors, why would T. directors choose to tilt it further with a cut (luck) for deal procedure?

...skill levels equal, the first dealer will win about 12% more...How more equal can it be in a tournament where the top 300...are participating?

...Why in matches of 2 of 3, 3 of 5, or 4 of 7, after the first cut, does the loser deal?

...A well respected tournament director and perennial top player...states that skunks occur more frequently in the first dealer's favor...a skunk is rewarded with 3 points instead of 2 points...

...Tournament directors who run their tournaments on the cut for deal basis, and not alternating (say it is difficult) logistically to accomplish alternating deals. It's interesting that we can place people in space, but can't figure out how, in a simple card game, to utilize alternating deals.

...Some directors (argue) for not alternating deals, is that they do not care to have a player play 12 games or more with the same deck...Why not...move the deck after every 5 games? I would suggest every 2 games.

...I have developed a high degree of respect for the fine, dedicated people who give many...hours of their time to coordinate tournaments...However,...I doubt that I would participate in Reno in 1995...if the ground rules, where more luck is introduced, remains the same as in 1994.

In the consolation, Joe Cornelissen finished 3rd, also GR 109.



What's The Rule?

Here is something that happened in a play-off game that isn't specifically covered in the rule book. I would like to see a ruling on this in CW and have the Rules Committee include it in their next rules change.

The play was on fourth street. The pone had a 8 count which would have made the score at hole 107. However, the peg ended up in hole 14 on first street.

The following are suggested diverse rulings on this mis-pegging:

A-The back peg sitting at hole 99 becomes the front peg as on pegging backwards.

B- Place the front peg in hole 107 as "no one ever pegs 87 holes backwards."

C- The pone has gone around the 121/"out" hole, thus has over-pegged and falsly claimed the game, and be penalized accordingly.

Cribbage World checked with Jeff Shimp, our ACC's Chief Judge, and he concurs with (B). Jeff stated that in situations not covered specifically by the rules, that common sense should prevail, and a sportsmanlike decision is called for. In this case, simply place the peg in the right track (with no penalty), and the game continues. Ed.

There was much concern for the time ACC directors invested in a tournament, WHY did this concern VAN-ISH when applied to Grass Roots? Joe Ramos estimates he puts in 30 hours per WEEK, 8-9 months of the year as National Grass Roots Statistician. Each Regional and club statistician puts in a lot of time also. But according to those 23 BODs, there is a difference. It reminds me of the man who could logically prove that water runs uphill! He redefined "up" as being towards the center of the earth, therefore, water runs uphill!

Lest we forget, it's the VOLUNTEERS who make up BOTH the ACC AND Grass Roots program work. They deserve a LOT more credit, help, and cooperation than they get.
