Rookie Director Pat Llewellyn's Inaugural Tourney Draws Huge Crowd

Joan Morrison Wins Tri-Valley Open Stan Babiec Nails 136-Pegger Consolation

Medway, MA, March 13: In her first tournament as a director, Pat Llewellyn rounded up a huge crowd of 192 peggers...a number that would give even an experienced director a workout...and she came through with flying colors!

And Joan Morrison also came through with flying colors, as this South Boston pegger came away with the championship and 200 Master Rating Points...and a boodle of greenbacks!

Romolo Picciandra, Mansfield, MA, took 2nd, followed by J. J. Rooney, Randolph, MA, and Harry Palmer, the newly crowned Life Master from W. Springfield, MA, finished 4th.

The hot hand in the qualifying round belonged to Rose Chase, N. Kingston, RI, taking home the top "Q" prize...and 67 MRP's.

One of the Eastern Region's top MRP leaders...Rit Alkas (Manchester, CT) qualified 7th, and finished 21st, to take home 89 MRP's and earned the 25th Grand Master rating bestowed by the ACC. Another Eastern Region leader...Ed Horigan (Virginia Beach, VA)...finished 12th and stands at the 800 mark for this season. Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA, picked up 157 MRP's for a 6th place finish, and stands at the 650 mark for this season's play.

Stan Babiec, N. Dartmouth, MA, won the 136-pegger Consolation event, and with the 70 MRP's earned will make a move in the Eastern Region's top 50. Bob LeDoux, Marlborough, MA, took 2nd, followed by Ray Desmarais, Johnston, RI, and Elmer Tole, Walpole, NH.

Edward Donahue Scores 29-Hand

The 10th 29-hand of this cribbage season was scored by Mansfield, MA's Edward Donahue. He needed the five of diamonds...and up it came, nailing this 216,580 to 1 long shot. In addition, this gem will be worth \$100 from the ACC. Eric Corriveau, Fred Doyle, Donald Graveline, and Frank Reddy scored 28-hands.

Pat Llewellyn reported some \$478 was donated to the local VA Medical Center...and, believe it or not...will reschedule this event again next March 12, 1995!

Stan Babiec, No. Dartmouth, MA, held the hot hand in the playoffs at the recent South Shore Classic In Brocton, MA, and picked up the championship...and a nifty 205 MRP's. The win will move Babiec well up in the top 50 in the Eastern Region, as well as an automatic invite to next year's Tournament of Champions.

Rit Alkas nailed 5th and with the 41 MRP's zips over the 700 mark for this cribbage year.

Director George Webb reported a successful tournament, and will schedule this event, once again, March 26, 1995. Mark your calendars.

Astounded!

I am astounded at our BOD! In the snynopsis of the BOD Reno meeting as reported in the April CW, our directors voted (secretly) 23-4 to remove mandatory membership for play in ACC sanctioned tournaments. I can't believe our reps would do such a thing. Was the report accurate. Can this be true?

We have a fine organization. Many of us work hard to keep it going, and to make it attractive for non-members to join and participate in its activities, But to offer the fruits of membership to non-members just doesn't make sense to me. Why in the world would the directors vote to undermine their own organization?

First, we need not be so passive, or so permissive to allow non-members to play in our tournaments. We have paid our dues, and if someone wants to enjoy the same rights and privileges as ours, then they too should become members and pay their dues!

Second, let's suppose a player is not an ACC member, and he/she wins a sanctioned tournament. What happens to the MRP's? Do they go to the winds, or do they go to the first member to finish high enough? What if we had an ACC tournament in which non-members outnumbered members, and no members scored high enough to win either cash or points?

Third, by the time a player decides to play in a major tournament, he/she should already know if they like to play cribbage! There is absolutely no reason why every player should not be a member and be required to prove membership. If a questionable player wins an award, that award should be withheld until his membership has been verified. Incidentally, I can think of only one case where a tournament director would find it beneficial to charge \$7 extra to play, but not be required to submit it as dues! That just isn't fair to the player, and it isn't fair to the rest of us.

What is fair, is a level playing field no matter where we play. So come on BOD, let's start thinking about why we have an ACC membership, and why we should strive to protect it. Above all, let's not undermine it.

Harry, you certainly make a good point for mandatory membership. I can't speak for the BOD, but I will try to summarize this on-going debate. First, this issue of mandatory membership has been thoroughly discussed at several BOD meetings. Several major tournament directors are adamantly against mandatory membership, as are some BOD members. At the present time, about 3-5% of our players are not active members...but they still pay their \$1.50 to the ACC each time they play (with little, or no benefits...no CW, no MRP's, no national honors, etc.). Last year, for example, I paid \$43.50 in sanctioning fees, and only \$7 for a membership. With the \$1.50 fee, nonmembers, in fact, help support the ACC. I'm sure we haven't heard the last of this issue. however...Ed.

Pegs Are Too Darned Big!

Many cribbage players have their own pegs, some very nice and plain, some expensive and ornate. My concern, after playing in the JPW/ACC Open in Reno, is that I found some of these pegs were getting bigger and higher. I do understand, that, I do have the privilege, to refuse my opponent, to use his or her own pegs.

As some of these pegs are getting bigger in especially their height, that some regulation should be made, as there are, I'm sure, certain players that may have a handicap (arthritus, etc.) that, guiding cards over or around oversize pegs could be a problem, and delaying of game due to cards being exposed during the deal.

Are there any others out there in Cribbage World that finds this a problem?

This is in no way to construe that I am against private pegs, just that there be a regulation drawn up, as to their size, especially in height.
