380 Peggers in St. Paul Bob Hanes Repeats

Jeff Monroe Takes Consolation Darlene Johnson Nails Astounding 23 9/9 GP Card

Grand National "Lucky 13" was indeed lucky for Bob Hanes as he became the first pegger ever to repeat winning a Grand National. This Huxley, Iowa player came to Minneapolis in 1986 and won Grand National V...and once again has found the Twin Cities a friendly place to do his pegging as he won "Lucky 13" ...and a sizeable \$2,500 in St. Paul.

Bernie Saueressig, a newly crowned Master pegger from Richland, WA, nailed 2nd (and \$1,600) to begin the new year on a very positive note. He almost came through with a win, but fell in the final match 4-3. Bernie rang up 803 MRP's in 1994 and is off and winging in the new year.

Veryle Jensen, from nearby Burnsville, MN, picked up 262 MRP's for a fine third place finish. Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA has taken a liking to 4th...as he not only finished 4th but also finished last season's MRP race in 4th place nationally (and is a member of the 1994 All-American team).

Dick Ogden, Des Moines, IA, led all scorers in the qualifying round, posting an excellent 40 (17) +274...and this mark propelled him to a win in the All-Events match (winning with a 56 GP total in this 40-game event).

Jeff Monroe, the ACC's Membership Chairman, flew into Iowa, rented a car, and then drove some 300 miles to St. Paul...but he paid for this circuitous trip by winning the 258-pegger Consolation...and a nifty \$1,125. In addition, Jeff earned his Grand Master rating earlier by qualifying 10th, picking up some 70 MRP's to wing it over the magic 4,000 MRP mark. And Neal Matzke, Forestville, WI also paid for his trip by taking 2nd (and \$825). Life Master Duane Toll (Kenosha, WI) remains solidly in 6th place nationally (lifetime) with a 3rd place finish, followed by Glenn Gauthier, a fine pegger from DePere, WI in 4th.

Play began with "Early Birds" on Friday...and Al Schaefer, a newly crowned Master from Milwaukee won the \$20 event with a nice 19 (8) +125. Jiggs Hebberecht, Sioux Falls, SD took the \$50 event with a 17 (8) +133.

Saturday night, Darlene Johnson, decided to forego the Awards Banquet and play the 9-game match...and came up with an astounding 23 (9/9) +264 (that's five skunks!).

Directors Ron Hamilton, Jim and Joan Rein, and Scott Kooistra were pleased with the large turnout...and staged a very successful GN "Lucky 13!"

Tom Terbovich from Omaha, NE, was busily pegging in the Early Bird High Roller when up popped his first ever 29-hand! Oops, too early for the \$100 paid by the ACC for a sanctioned perfect hand...but Tom didn't mind!

Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert spotted **Deb Schisel**'s name tag neatly attached to her designer jeans (on the rear side), and he asked her if she knew that her tag was there. "Of Course," she replied, "...that's where everyone looks!" No comment!

The Awards Banquet had many hilarious comments. When Fred McGibney was on the stand accepting his President's Award (a framed award), he commented that this would be placed on his cribbage awards wall in his summer cabin. He then added that this would be the only award on the wall, provoking much laughter from the audience.

And when **Bob Julian** accepted his National Championship award, he humbly said that anyone could win the award and that he had "Limited skill...and unlimited funds...."

Everett "Ev" Bey Elected President

At the recent Board of Directors Meeting in St. Paul, MN, Everett "Ev" Bey was unanimously elected President of the American Cribbage Congress. Ev is a charter member of the ACC and one of the founding fathers. This Quincy, CA, player and long-time BOD member was also instrumental in organizing play on the west coast, helping organize the World Championship match in Quincy. Just last May the 23rd Annual was successfully run, hosting their usual large crowd (256 peggers). Ev has had his hand on many policy matters as a member of the Executive BOD, and has been instrumental in many decisions benefiting the ACC.

Scott Kooistra, Yankton, SD, was also unanimously elected Executive Vice-President. Until this election he was serving as President, filling out Bob McCabe's term upon his resignation last year. Joe Ramos, W. Warwick, RI, was unanimoulsy elected Vice-President, Operations. Joe has been also serving as Grass Roots National Statistician and Awards Director. Catherine Perkins, Bear Creek, NC, was the fourth officer elected unanimously, and she will serve as Vice-President, Policy. A longtime member of the BOD, she has been active as chairwoman of the Rules Committee. In a close vote, Martha Fingleton, Milwaukee, was elected as Executive Member at Large...a post established to break voting ties of the Executive members. Jeff Monroe, Napa, CA was the other nominee.

Newly crowned Master pegger Brenda Palmer warmed up for the Awards presentation at Grand National "Lucky 13" by winning the huge Massachusetts Open September 18 in Easton, MA. This West Springfield, MA pegger is off and running for the new cribbage year, picking up a nifty 220 MRP's.

Grand Master Larry Samet, Wellesley Hills, MA, came close, but settled for 2nd...and moved up from 18th place (lifetime) into 16th place (nationally) with the 207 MRP's earned.

Al Giles and John Andrade, two fine peggers from Mansfield, MA took 3rd and 4th money home...and over 200 MRP's each, as both players qualified high.

Jeff Del Santo, however, had the hot hand in the qualifying round, and this Warwick RI pegger took home the top "Q" prize and some 73 MRP's.

A sizeable 144 players stayed for the Consolation, with Phil Martin (E. Hartford) coming through with the win. Ron Kennelly (Sommerville, MA) finished 2nd, followed by Life Master Harry Palmer (trying to keep up with spouse Brenda's MRP pace) in 3rd, and Richard Andrews (Hinsdale NH) in 4th.

Six 28-hands were scored: Frank Cummings, Delores Rego, Frank Sheehan, Neil Matheson, Bob Bousquet, and Dawn Finley.

Director Tony Del Tufo was pleased with the large turnout, and plans to renew this championship again next September 17...and next year this will be a cribbage "jamboree" as the next weekend in nearby Plymouth, MA, Grand National XIV will be played. Players...plan your vacations now!

Barry Spadea Takes 10th Greater Albany Open

Barry Spadea, Riverside, RI, bested some 62 peggers in winning the 10th annual Greater Albany Open September 11. Linda Iler (Milton VT), LM Harry Palmer (W. Springfield, MA), and Richard Schurkus (E. Amhearst NY) took 2nd, 3rd and 4th. Terri Boylan (Burlington, VT) won the 44-pegger Consolation. Tournament Director Harold Belles was the top qualifyer in the Main Event.

Cards Smoking In Montana

Rod Schott Scores 10th 28-hand ...Wins Montana Championship

With but 115 players in attendance, a record ten 28-hands were scored in the Main Event at the recent Montana Championship...and Rod Schott, a fine pegger from Richland, WA, picked up the tenth...and last...28-hand in the playoffs to propell him to the championship.

The cards were hot from the opening bell, as three players yelled "28-hand!" in the first two games! The tournament paid \$25 for the first two 28's...and Wayne Momsen, Whitehall, MT, scored the 3rd only seconds too late to collect!

Norm Slead, Helena, MT, picked up 2nd (and NO 28's). Mike McDaniel, Spokane, WA, had a "hot" weekend as he not only qualified 1st, but finished 3rd in the playoffs, taking home some 139 MRP's. Another Spokane player...Jack Miwa...nailed 4th spot.

Some 82 peggers stayed for the Consolation, and veteran Master pegger Bill Hill from Hermiston, OR took home the bacon. Local Steve Clarke took 2nd, followed by Bernie Saueressig, Richland, WA, fresh from a 2nd place finish at Grand National XIII in St. Paul a week earlier. He called the Red Lion in nearby Astoria for a room, and they reserved a single for him. Upon arriving, the inn informed him they had made a mistake. No room was available. However, to their credit, they escorted Rob to the K. C. Mansion...the oldest building in Astoria...and he was given the bridal suite for the night! And at no charge!

Rollie Heath Starting Something?

Rollie Heath, Lincoln City, OR, is the black jack dealer at the local Elks club. One night, when the action was slow, he thought that perhaps cribbage might be a good house game.

So he advertised the game with Heath, as the house, vs. all-comers. Oops, up showed Darrel Miotke, Sublimity, OR (1994 All-American team member), and Bruce Wridge, one of Portland's finest players. Double oops! Darrel won a nifty \$375 and Bruce took home some \$160.

The rules have changed. You must now pay \$1 per game, and the wagering limit is slightly lower (\$2 to \$15 per game)...but Rollie will gamely still take on all comers!

Tie-Breaker Tried in Madison

A novel way of qualifying players was tried at the recent Madison Masters Classic June 19-20. Players were qualified by Game Points only and were posted in descending order. Players with identical Game Point totals were posted in the order in which they were blind-drawn from a paper bag. Some 178 players were on hand for this tourney, and six extra players (low GP ties) qualified with this method.

According to directors Gaylord Matti and Jerry Dickinson, this allowed the playoffs to begin within one hour of the qualifying round...making life a lot easier for the directors.

However, a player's vote indicated they preferred the standard method (162 to 16).

According to Matti and Dickinson, players simply don't understand all the extra work the standard method entails. But they goodnaturedly have accepted the vote.

Long Odds

Players like to be cited for rarity. Norb Upton, Eagan, MN, was recently skunked four consecutive times, for a 1 in 38,000 event. Against an *ordinary* player; but for a newly-crowned Master?

Jim McManus, Milwaukee, always the oneup-manship Life Master, cut eight consecutive kings when cutting for the deal at the Consolation qualifying round in Racine's Belle City Open. The chances of this are 1/13 s = 815,520,721 to 1. Do you expect us to believe this, Jim?

In the September CW, editor Colvert correctly calculated the odds of cutting four jacks (or any other denomination) for the deal at 270,725 to 1, and 1/13th of that for any random card, as reported by Pat Barrett. It names no differences how deeply each cut was made, even if there was one card left at the end, assuming only one deck was used.

American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

- 1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.
- 2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following *mandatory* criteria:

A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.

B-have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.

C-have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.

3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following *optional* criteria. He or she must have:

A-promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.

B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.

C-estanlished his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.

D-served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years. E-served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.

F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years.

4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

- 1- Publish annually in the **November** issue of *Cribbage World* the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee of the ACC, postmarked not later than **January 15** of that year.
- 2- The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Ballot Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the Ballot Committee.
- 3- A Ballot Committee consisting of three (3) members of the Board of Directors shall be established to conduct the voting process for the Hall of Fame. The committee will prepare copies of the nominating letters and ballots which will be mailed to each member of the Board of Directors. each Director of an ACC sanctioned tournament, and each active Grass Roots Director on record as of 1 August of the previous year. All ballots must be postmarked not later than April 15 to be counted. No individual tournaments or club will be allowed more than one ballot. The results will be tabulated by the Ballot Committee and announced by the President of the ACC via Cribbage World at the earliest possible time. The National ACC Tournament Commissioner and the National Grass Roots Commissioner will provide the names of tournament and club directors to the Ballot Committee at the February BOD meeting.
- 4- Votes may be cast for any or all of the nominees. A candidate must receive at least 75% of the ballots cast to be elected to the Hall of Fame. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him or her. The President of the ACC will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction will take place at the Grand National tournament held in September.

Grand National Proposals Due Grand National XV (Western Region) and XVI (Central Region) playing sites will be voted on at the next ACC Board of Directors Meeting in Reno February 2, 1995.

To date, Jeff Monroe has proposed Napa, CA's Fairgrounds as a possible site for GN XV. Patrick Barrett has also proposed Wisconsin Dells, WI, as the site for GN XVI.

Senior Discount Proposal

Almost any place you go these days Seniors (incidentally, we prefer to be called "Delightfully Mature Adults" or DMA's) are offered and almost forced to take 10% discounts. This is true rather it be at Denny's, major hotels and motels, Caribbean cruises, etc....almost the entire gamut. There are however a few notable exceptions such as casino wagers, ladys-of-the evening and sanctioned cribbage tournaments.

This proposal deals only with the tournaments. It would seem that with the advancing years and obvious loss of some mental acuity and acumen, the DMAs should be given a 10% discount. Now we are not talking cash here but rather a handicap system where all DMAs (62 years of age and over) would be allowed to start from hole 12 rather than at ground zero, thus making it necessary for them to peg only 109 holes rather than the usual 121 in order to win the game.

Now I can hear some screaming at this proposal from certain DMAs who will tell you that they are still as sharp as they ever were. This sort of statement, of course, only goes to show the extent of the regression. In a similar manner we expect a certain amount of flak from some who have not acheived DMA status, griping that the delightfully mature ones are trying to take advantage of them. This of course is utter nonsense since the measley 12 point spot will probably be more than offset before turning into 3rd street by virtue of DMA over-pegs, backwards pegging and missed counts.

Under separate cover we have recommended adoption of this proposal to the BOD of the ACC and are looking forward to their prompt approval of this along with our earlier recommendation for free libations and valet parking for the delightful ones at all ACC tournaments.

These proposals were propounded only after taking a scientific sampling of the opinions of scads of ACC DMAs in the USA. Incidentally, should you sit next to one of us at a tourney and we happen to nod off, a gentle nudge will generally get us to move one seat to the right...or was it to the left? Oh, what the hell, we'll probably continue to play the tournament trail even if we don't get these minor concessions.
