<u>Possible 1997 Grand National Site</u> 1★"Mick"Wins Wisconsin Dells

1994 saw Robert "Mick" Michaelis earn his Life Master One-Star honors, as this Marinette, WI pegger soared over the 10,000 MRP mark (lifetime)...and he continues his winning ways by winning the Wisconsin Dells Classic September 11. Topping some 179 players, Michaelis earned his 14th sanctioned win...and is off and running towards his 7th All-American award.

Another former All-American, John Hiland (1993) took 2nd, and this West Allis, WI pegger is also off and winging toward another fine season. John Kolvek, Muskego, WI, finished 3rd, and former Grand National champion (V) Bob Hanes, Ankeny, IA, took 4th in a star-studded final.

Ken Reymer, a Milwaukee pegger, took honors in the qualifying round with a fine 39 (18) +275.

And Wayne Steinmetz (Milwaukee) is also off and winging towards another fine season as he topped some 108 peggers in claiming the Consolation title. Ben Wells (Racine) took 2nd, followed by Mervin Morris (Canadian) and Richard Frost (Berlin, WI) in 3rd and 4th.

The American Cribbage Congress has two One-Star players...Robert "Mick" Michaelis, and Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert...and both players came up with wins in September.

Colvert nailed the 154-pegger inaugural Longest Beach Classic in Long Beach, WA September 17, as he claimed the best run of cards in his 13-year ACC career. Not only qualifying 2nd, he also nailed a Grand Slam to take the Saturday Special.

Jim Gogolin, Idleyld Park, OR took 2nd. Grand National champ (VIII) Harvey Honeycutt, Beatty, OR took 3rd, followed by John Holseth, Medford, OR in 4th. Another Grand National champ (XII) took qualifying honors...Bayard Lliteras, Coeur D'Alene, ID with a 36 (16).

Armin Gade, Seattle, nipped Ev Bey, Quincy, CA for the 124-pegger Consolation title.

Ken Cochlin Wins in LaGrande, Oregon

The 11th Annual Blue Mountain Open in LaGrande, OR drew some 74 peggers from throughout the Northwest ... and Ken Cochlin, Kennewick, WA took honors.

Cochlin earned a spot on the 1993 All-American team (finishing 4th nationally for that year) and continues his winning ways.

Local Ron Lesley gave the out-of-towners a good tussle, but he had to settle for 2nd place. Eric Hutton drove 40 miles up I-84 (from Baker City) on his 18th birthday...and took home 3rd-place money, edging Grand National XII champ Bayard Lliteras, Coeur D'Alene, Idaho.

Jerry Hearsum, Cove, OR nailed the 52-pegger Consolation, followed by Doug Brown, Pasco, WA, Clarence Van Orsow, Culver, OR, and Betty Capper, Hermiston, OR, in 2-3-4.

LaGrande is a small, friendly town (pop. 12,000) in Eastern Oregon, and this 11th Annual event proceeded smoothly under the guidance of Charlette & Rick Springer, assisted by Marvis & Ralph Reynolds.

Maxon Brehm, DeAnna Lovelace, Herman Jacobs Tops In Nebraska

Three Nebraska tournaments were played this summer. Maxon Brehm (Grand Island, NE) won the 28-pegger Homestead Days Open in Beatrice, NE June 26; DeAnna Lovelace (Lincoln, NE) took the 38-pegger Great Plains Classic in Lincoln August 14; Herman Jacobs came through in the 40-pegger Omaha Open August 21.

Kathy Hays Tops Chief Solano Open

Some 100 peggers were on hand in Fairfield, CA for the Chief Solano Open August 13...and Kathy Hays, Livermore, CA, came away the winner (after qualifying 2nd).

Steve Reynolds, Concord, CA, nailed 2nd...and is one step closer to his Grand Master. Dale Kochenburg, San Jose, CA, finished 3rd, and Boyd McDonald, Mountain View, CA took 4th. True Miller, Fremont, CA, had the hot hand in the qualifying round.

Director George Halterman plans on two more events next year...March 11 and August 12.

Youngest VS. Oldest

At the recent Blue Mountain Open in LaGrande, OR, a Main event playoff found the youngest player in the house playing the oldest. On his 18th birthday, Eric Hutton, Baker City, OR won his match with the streaking Clarence Van Orsow, Culver, OR. Clarence is off and running in this fledgling cribbage year, and is among the leaders in the 1995 MRP race.

Ratso Roderick Tops At Redwood Classic

William "Ratso" Roderick, the Vacaville (CA) King of Cribbage came away from the 6th Annual Redwood Classic in Santa Rosa, CA with a beryl wood championship trophy board, \$800, and bragging rights, in winning the 92-pegger main event.

Bob Padgett from nearby Carmichael, CA, took 2nd, followed by Bea Olyer, the perennial winner from Fairfield, CA. Recently crowned Master pegger Mary Gladish, Concord, CA, took 4th.

52 peggers stayed for the Consolation, and Roberta Nelson, Sunnyvale, CA took home the bacon (\$300). Darrell Hunstad, Nipomo, CA, finished 2nd, followed by Roy Banducci, Arroyo Grande, CA, and Dearol White, Modesto, CA.

Director Joe Schalich, with help from Avon Ray, Alice Wilson, and club members from GR 55 had a well-run tournament, and even the weather cooperated...a comfortable 75 degrees compared to the over 100 degrees for the 5th annual. Clyde Ross, Grass Valley, CA, produced the beautiful beryl wood trophy boards.

Sidney Lampke Tops New England Championship

Some 126 peggers were on hand for the New England Championship in Windsor Locks, CT August 27 & 28...and when the pegs were laid away, Sydney Lampke (Medway, MA) was the winner. Carl Deyette (E. Hartford) took 2nd, followed by Richard Clukey (Northfield, CT) and Jack Puleo (Mansfield, MA) in 3rd and 4th.

1994 All-American Bill Medeiros (Shrewsbury, MA) won the 74-pegger Consolation, and Emil Chrabaszcz (Ware, MA) took 2nd. Sharlene Medeiros and Harvey Glass (W. Hartford) took 3rd and 4th.

Al Dinwoodie, recently crowned Grand Master was high qualifier in the Main Event...and Phyllis Schmidt took home 15 MRP's for qualifying tops in the Consolation...a new scoring rule for the 1995 cribbage year.

Is Jim McManus The Unluckiest?

Jim McManus, our ACC's 8th ranked player, and a Life Master from Milwaukee, WI called *Cribbage World* and complained that he is the unluckiest player in America.

Why? Well, in 1993 he was 12 measly MRP's from earning All-American status, scoring 1,058 (1,070 was 10th...Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WI). In 1994, Jim scored 927 MRP's, and, again, he missed All-American honors...this time by a scant 13 MRP's (he's slipping).

But this is not what Jim's complaint to CW was about. He was whining that in the recent Belle City Classic's Consolation event his cutting for deal ability went to pieces. First game he cuts a king. 2nd game, another king. 3rd game-king; 4th game-king; 5th game-king, 6th game-king; 7th game-king, 8th game-king..and finally in the 9th, and last, game he cuts a duece! The odds of cutting 8 kings in a row are fantastic. Jim claims that none other than our ACC's oddsmaker, Russell Adams, witnessed this rare event. Perhaps Jim is right...he is the ACC's unluckiest player (but certainly not the worst)!

Jeff and Jackie Shimp In Dead Heat Shelbyville, MI's Jeff and Jackie Shimp finished the 1994 season in a deadheat...both players scoring 329 MRP's. No bragging rights!





In reference to the tournament dual fee format (i.e. \$40 member, \$47 non-member) which some of us have used, the tournament director is required to send in any new memberships. If someone has not done so then he/she should be reported to the Ethics Committee in writing and the committee will take appropriate action.

Contrary to the statement by John Haller, the Board of Directors voted decisively not to require ACC membership for sanctioned tournament play for various specific reasons which were openly discussed at length. After due deliberation the Board made its majority decision and I am sure they collectively considered it to be in the best interests of the ACC.

All members have the inherent right to disagree with decisions made by the Board of Directors. However, I fervently hope that future differences can be expressed without bringing into question the integrity of the board or its individual members.

Sir John Suckling, way back in the early 1600's, came up with these rules concerning flushes. Who knows why he made a variation between hands and cribs...but if we tamper with 'em, he will turn over in his grave.

As for who deals first and how this is fairly accomplished, a cut for deal, or alternating the deal in a two-game match is certainly fair. Awarding the deal to the high qualifier, is, in my opinion, not fair in a short playoff match. In the Northwest, the majority voted on cutting for deal as the fairest, and most preferred method for beginning a game (in addition to single game matches in a qualifying round).

Many sports (golf, tennis, etc.) list the number of events vs. prize money earned to give the reader a more accurate picture of the player's skill. And, of course, the same is true in cribbage. The more you play, the more opportunity to score those Master Points. Many of our players get "hooked" when they are making a run for honors and hit the road to earn those coveted MRP's. So, Max, if you want to earn that coveted All-American award, I'm afraid you're going to have to keep your suitcase packed...and moving! I think posting the number of events a player has participated in would give our ACC members a better picture on who's doing what...and how often. Bob McCabe...want a little more work??? Ed.

Tournament Trail Section Has New Layout

Sharp-eyed readers will certainly pick up the new layout (2-column) format of our above "Tournament Trail."

Our ACC budget has been severely strained by our larger Cribbage Worlds lately. Editor DeLynn Colvert, a very frugal person, studied alternatives to cut publication costs. Every page costs roughly \$85 to print...and this new 2-column layout, with abbreviations, cuts costs almost in half. Last month's issue had five pages of tournament information. This issue has but two and a half...a saving of two and a half pages, or \$210 per issue. This equates to well over \$2,500 per year saved for the ACC.
