Bob Julian 2nd, Takes National Title

Duane Gier Wins National Open

Stroup, DeLong, Corbin, Rasmussen, Sondericker Take Satellites


The 21st Annual National Open belongs to Duane Gier, Brandon, FL. Duane remained undefeated in this double elimination match until the final match with national MRP front-runner Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI. Julian, with one loss, had to win two consecutive matches to take the title. In the first 4 of 7 match, Bob was up 3-0, and then survived a scare as Duane scored a 2-win skunk, and a win to tie the match at 3-3. Julian then won the next game to take the match 4-3.

And Julian zipped to a 3-0 lead in the championship-deciding match, but, once again, Gier stormed back to tie the match at 3-3. With the match on the line, Duane needed but three to win with first count, held a pair, and pegged one to take the championship. This final game was one of the priciest games in cribbage history, as a \$3,000 winner take all pool was also involved.

In finishing 2nd, and earning yet another 265 Master Points, Julian won the National Championship for 1994, scoring a whopping 1,852 MRP's for the year....the highest total ever under the new scoring system. Playing in over 30 tournaments from coast-to-coast, the season will be one to remember by Bob for years to come.

Richard Corbin, Cary, NC, almost held honors for the locals, as he finished 3rd, nipping cribbage Hall-of-Famer Ev Bey, Sun City, AZ in the 3-4 match. Ev is the founding father of the World Championship event in Quincy, CA, and Vice-President of the ACC.

Jerry Gruber, Minneapolis, MN earned his Grand Master (no. 30) with a fine 5-6 finish Continued on page 3.



1994 All-American Team Headed by Bob Julian

In an unusual season that saw two players tie for the 10th, and final, position, the 1994 All-American Team was announced by Bob McCabe, the ACC's National Statistician. Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI, earned the top spot, and is named team captain. His final talley of 1,852 MPR's is one of the top scores ever posted (and this total is the top score under the new scoring system). Scott Kooistra scored a record 2,182 in the 1990 season. National honors are evenly divided with four members from the Western Region, four from the Central Region, and three from the Eastern Region. Joe Bernard (4), Syl Lulinski (3), Jesse Jarrell (6), and DeLynn Colvert (9) are repeat members. The team members:

and tied with Virgil Dulin, Fayetteville, NC. Both players took home a nifty 228 MRP's. Lucille Simpson, the travelling pegger from Lewiston, NY tied with Grand National Director Harry Stoops...another veteran pegger from Hialeah, FLA.

190 peggers signed on for the Consolation, and Sandra Stroup, Elgin, IL took home the bacon, edging newly crowned Grand Master Russell Adams, Minneapolis, MN in the final playoff match. Two Georgia peggers nailed 3rd and 4th...Mark Adams (Tucker) and Victor Strumminger (Atlanta).

Some players mistakingly feel with a double elimination, best 4 of 7 Main Event (and with skunks counting two games) that they will not get to play enough games, should they lose early. But, that is not the case, as players can peg to their heart's content for four days running. Beginning with a Friday Early Bird (won by local Dick Corbin with a 18 (8) +160), and then a Consolation, followed by a Last Round-Up (won by Henry DeLong, Woburn, MA). On Sunday night, a High Roller event was played with Life Master Warren Sondericker, Greenfield, WI, taking home \$1,800 (plus some pool money). Local Bob Gombatz took 2nd...and he rarely gets shut out during a weekend's play. He earned his Grand Master during the 1994 season. And finally, a Losers-Losers wrapped up play with George Rasmussen, Arlington, VA nailing a Grand Slam 9 for 9 card.

And once again, the National Open helped decide the All-American race for the year, as Bob Julian solidified his top honors. Joe Bernard scored 80 MRP's to hold on to the 2nd spot. Jesse Jarrell, the perennial All-American, needed his 130 MRP's to finish 9th for the year (945)...and Russell Adams scored 95 MRP's with his Consolation 2nd place finish to tie for 10th, the last spot, with Bill Medeiros. Both players finished with 940 MRP's for the year. Russell's 95 points were right on the money! Medeiros finished 36-48 and earned 14 MRP's...right on the money, also! This marks the first time in the ACC's 14-year All-American team history that a tie has occurred.

Directors Cathy Perkins, Russ Perkins, Bob Gombatz, and Tom Miller, with a host of volunteers kept this 21st National Open on track and running smoothly. And Leonard Peoples, for the 21st time, kept play on time and organized with his "behind the scenes" help!

Vignettes From Raleigh

In the Friday Early Bird, Fred McGibney, S. Burlington, VT, was pegging with local Chris Wilkerson...and both players hold a club flush. Lo and behold, a club was cut for the starter card! Of course, the possibility exists for a club crib, too...but this rarity has never been reported!

Joe Bernard, needing to hold a pegging hand, was dealt 5-5-5-5-6-9. Not needing another 28-plaque, he discards the 5-5, holding the 5-5-6-9. A queen was cut...no 28-hand...but he wins the game (again)!

Early in the Main Event, Joe Bernard meets Bob Julian...and Bernard is clinging to a thread of hope that if he should win, he might sneak in to the top spot nationally. However, it was our "Rodney Dangerfield's" year and Julian won 4-1, and rolled on to 2nd place...and the National Championship.

Fred McGibney Earns President's Award

Every year the President of the ACC awards a special "President's Award." Scott Kooistra, our current President has bestowed this honor on S. Burlington, VT's Fred McGibney for his many years of service as Treasurer of the ACC.

Portland Kicks Off New Season In Style

Portland's Summer Open kicked off the ACC's 1995 season in grand style, as some 183 peggers from throughout the nation began the season's pegging at the Ramada Inn in Portland, OR.

Mike Kuvaas, a Master pegger from Medford, OR, started the MRP scoring for the year by nailing the 22-game qualifying round with an electrifying 41 (18) +302, scoring some 67 MRP's for the effort...and for one brief moment was the number one player in the USA for the 1995 season.

But the next day, Irving Busby, a tournament rookie player from Spokane, WA, came away the winner...and with the 200 MRP's came away the national leader in the first week of play.

Jim Sime, a veteran pegger from Kennewick, WA, finished 2nd, followed by Larry Lee Hassett, Roseburg, OR, and Clarence Van Orsow, Culver, OR, in 3rd and 4th.

Ray Van Orsow earned a spot on the All-American team in 1992, and Denny Van Orsow came through in 1994...could 1995 belong to Clarence?

136 peggers played the Consolation, and Master Ken Capper (Hermiston, OR) continues a "roll" by winning this event. Steve Reynolds, another Master pegger from Concord, CA, took 2nd...and is inching in on his Grand Master. Local Chuck Vance nailed 3rd, and Willie Evans, a newly crowned Master from Richland, WA took 4th.

Frank Lake, LaPine, OR, once again won the High Roller, and locals Harry Kantas and Richard Martin took the doubles. The Saturday Special went to Robert Landon (Keizer, OR), and the Cry Baby event was won by local Max Williams.

Director Leslie Hein was pleased with the turnout and the many favorable comments.

President Emeritus Joseph Wergin Presides in Madison

Joseph Petrus Wergin began the Madison Masters Classic in 1979...the first year of the American Cribbage Congress.

Since that time, Wergin has had a long run as President of the Congress, and upon his retirement was named President Emeritus by the ACC's Board of Directors.

Still active in cribbage in his Madison, WI, area, Wergin was on hand for the 16th annual Madison Masters Classic June 16...and he welcomed the 178 peggers as they began the pegging action.

Terry Cambell Wins First Tournament Local Terry Cambell nailed his first tournament...the Friday Early Bird at the Madison Masters Classic XVI. Cambell had only been a member for one week before winning!

Sanctioned Play Reminder

Martha Fingleton, our ACC's National Tournament Commissioner reminds tournament directors that all sanctioned events must have head-to-head elimination matches, and if directors fail to conform to this requirement, the results will not be sanctioned.

Fingleton also points out that on August 1, 1994, Master Rating Points will be given for the Qualifying Round of sanctioned Consolation tournaments. Every qualifier must have the opportunity to win the tournament in which he/she qualifies.

Tournament Directors are also required to return at least 85% of entry fees in player benefits (prize money, trophies, etc.) at all sanctioned tournaments. The one exception is a tournament that benefits a charity...and then only if the amount is well advertised before play begins.

New England Off & Running

Ken Vetterline Nails New England Inaugural

The 1995 season in the Northeast began play in N. Kingstown, RI August 7...and Master pegger Ken Vetterline, Bar Mills, ME won this New England Inaugural going away. And with the win (156 peggers), takes over the Eastern Region's MRP lead with some 160 MRP's. 

Leonard Peoples Fixture In Raleigh 21st National Open Dedicated to Nick Pond

The 21st Annual National Open in Raleigh, NC was dedicated to the memory of Nick Pond, the founding father of this prestigious national tournament. Nick passed away last December 19.

Nick began this event back in 1974. The playing site was the WRAL radio/TV station's studio. There was ample space for the 168 players that signed on, but the format was unusual. Since this was one of the first organized tournaments, Nick improvised the playing tables in a unique fashion. Individual card tables were distributed throughout the studio, and each game was played at a card table.

Now, who do you suppose set up this sizeable collection of card tables? None other than Leonard Peoples...a hard-working co-worker with Nick.

Cribbage World interviewed Leonard in Raleigh this July, and he fondly reminisced about his long association with Nick and the National Open. He remembered that the very first Open had a single elimination and the entry fee was only \$10. And first place paid \$280. The Velvet Coat Inn hosted the 2nd Open, and the format was again single elimination.

The first double elimination event (and Monday play) was at the Hilton Inn in 1976. 155 players were on hand, and with an increase in the entry fee to \$25, the top prize went to \$1,200. And again, Leonard was there with Nick organizing and setting up play at the tournament.

And to this day, after some 21 National Opens, Leonard is the man behind the scenes keeping play organized and on schedule. His expertise and hard work help make this National Open a smooth-running, well-organized quality tournament. Nick Pond chose his co-workers wisely.

Many of the organizers and Raleigh players were sporting tee-shirts at the National Open with Nick Pond's picture in a NC State basketball uniform. Nick was an All-American basketball player before he became an All-American Cribbage Tournament Director! Cribbage players nationwide will long remember Nick's well-organized, well run tournaments.

Letters to the editor ...

Youth Cribbage Program

There have been several attempts to establish a strong youth following in the ACC. Besides the Cribadier General Program in which David Proctor should be highly commended, and a few isolated instances throughout the country, there is no organized efforts to teach or encourage kids to play this great game.

Creating a strong foundation of young players makes a ton of sense. Not only will it keep membership in the ACC growing, but it also gives kids something to feel good about themselves. I know. As a junior high school teacher, I have taught cribbage to over 300 young adults. I've watched cribbage raise math grades, produce new friendships, teach sportsmanship, and enhance relationships at home (many kids have developed a bond with a grandparent thanks to cribbage), In Sonora, CA, an after school cribbage club keeps more than a dozen teens from going home to an empty house after school.

As you read this right now, think back on how you learned to play cribbage. Did your grandfather teach you, or did you learn in the service? Was it at school, or at a local tavern? Perhaps it was a good friend or even your spouse who repetitively showed you that a double run is always worth eight points. Regardless of who taught you to play this great game, there's no doubt that you've taken it to heart, and currently receive many, many hours of enjoyment moving those pegs! Wouldn't you like to share this same feeling with someone else?

The July issue of Cribbage World printed a short article about getting involved in the Youth Cribbage Program. Within two weeks of that publication, I heard from quite a few eager people who want to teach cribbage to kids. As a result of this, I spent a couple of weeks expanding a brief document I put together on teaching cribbage to kids, into a detailed manual which includes everything from how to get in touch with school personnel, to conducting a youth tournament. It is loaded with handouts for the classrooom, and has day by day lesson plans which will virtually ensure a successful experience for all involved.

Grass Roots Players...We Need Your Help!

Now that this manual has been completed, we need teachers! I truly believe that if a member or two from each grass roots club around the country, would find the time to go into 6th-8th grade classrooms once or twice a week) most teachers would welcome community support in the classroom), the Youth Cribbage Program would become a viable entity across the country.

George Bickford Scores 19 Hand!

George Bickford and "Pegs" Abernathy have been playing 3 games of special cribbage at our tourney for 2 or 3 years. They use 2 jokers, which in your hand may be called any card. I always try to watch 1 or 2, as both players can be counted on to inject some levity into the game. George is holding the 8, 5, 4, joker and calls the joker the 3 of hearts. He then cuts the 3 of hearts. He needs a bunch so during the play I count his hand. "My God, George, do you

know what you have?" I say. He lays it down and says "Pegs, I've got a smooth 19! I think its my first!"

Tom Miller Raleigh, NC

Yes, Tom, George is a card! He gave me this "lucky" black hat to wear in Raleigh. I wore this hat and you guessed it...I didn't win a dime! Too many "19" hands! Ed.

Cornwell Disagrees

I disagree (naturally) with the odds you quoted in the July issue for needing exactly five cuts to determine the first dealer.

The probability of each pairing is 3/51 (three cards that could pair out of 51 available), so the probability of four consecutive pairs is (3/51)4 = (1/17)4. The probability of no tie on the fifth try is 48/51 = 16/17. The product of the two probabilities is $(1/17)4 \times 16/17 = 16/175 = 1/88741.06251$.

The odds against requiring exactly five trials is one less than the denominator, or 88,740.06251. I don't see any likely error that would result in 84,100.

The fact that the rules require the first cut to be at least four cards deep and not more than half the deck, and the second cut to leave at least four cards doesn't effect the probabilities (or odds).

The published value is not that large a percentage in error (I claim), but players who might wish to try their hand at calculating probabilities could be discouraged at not being able to get a value equal to the "published" one.

Grass Roots suggestions: Let couples draw for seating so they will not play each other. This will forestall the desire to help your spouse win a game if your card is bad and theirs needs help (things happen).

I took a friend (Irving Busby) to Portland. He made 1st and I made 5th. I can't live with him now for a year. In his last game Busby had a 2-8-8-9 and cut a 7, needing 12 to win. This ever happen to you or me?

In a format where skunks and spread points are ignored, Phil Martin, Bob Waltzer and Zeke Veradt each won 18 of 24 games to lead their teams into a triple tie for the 1994 National Team Championship. Waltzer and teammates Henry DeLong and Medford Smith won six games in their final nine game set as did Veradt playing with wife Cindy and Bob Drukman. Martin led Bill Shoemaker and Tournament Director Joe Seigle to 8 out of 9 wins in their last match overcoming the two game deficiency and creating the triple tie. It was the second year in succession the DeLong-Waltzer-Smith trio was caught at the wire. The 14 team event, the only one of its kind nationally, will be repeated on June 3, 1995, as a prelude to the Granite State Classic.

Four of us sat down at our Auction House after work to play a few games of cut throat. The players were Norm Saeger, Arlene Barrett, Mike Barrett and myself. Norm, Mike & Arlene all cut the deck and each player cut a Jack. Since I was on the phone in the other room, I didn't see the actual cutting of the three Jacks but they were all in "cutting shock" as I sat down. I looked, laughed, and said "I can beat that" as I cut the 4th Jack!

Needless to say, the "cutting shock" was severe after that and the conversation for the rest of the day was "what are the odds." Can you help us in finding the odds of this and let us know if this has ever been heard of before. We await you decision.

If you specify before the cutting the specific denomination (in this case, a Jack), the odds would be (check me on this Russ Adams): $13 \times 17 (3 \text{ of } 51) \times 25 (2 \text{ of } 50) \times 49 = 270,725$ to 1. If the denomination is random (matching any cut card four times), then the odds would be $17 \times 25 \times 49 = 20.825$ to 1. Ed.


