# 492 Players in Green Bay

# Capodagli, Dockter Cop Honors in Central Region Doubleheader

Some 492 peggers braved a late winter storm and converged on Green Bay for the MGM's annual pegfest...an event that pernennially draws the Region's largest crowds. And this year was typical. Beginning on Friday night, a record 624 peggers played doubles (312 teams), and yet another 36 played the High Roller event.

Locals Bill Capelle and John Samorski took honors in this kick-off doubles play, and local Pat Thompson won the High Rollers, picking up a nifty \$1,000 and a trophy clock.

But in sanctioned play, Ken Capodagli, Bensonville, IL copped the action, taking home \$2,300 and a large trophy clock in topping the huge crowd of 492 peggers. Milwaukee's Bill Philleo has had an amazing string of high finishes in Green Bay in recent years... and by finishing a strong 2nd, continues his winning ways. Jeff Wussow, Green Bay, took 3rd, followed by local Mark Verhayen in 4th.

Local Gerald Danielski took top qualifying honors, posting a very fine 39 (18) +217.

Green Bay players also nailed the Consolation, as Jim Heemstra, Mike Rozmarch, and Ruth Zimmerman, all locals, finished 1-2-3.

Only out-of-towner MRP frontrunner Steven Reynolds, from Concord, CA could break into the winners column...and then only by finishing 4th. Steve also qualified 6th, and picked up 137 MRP's to wing it over the 1,000 mark for the year...and the national lead.

Patrick Barrett, Wisconsin Dells, WI, is hot on the heels of Reynolds in the MRP race, and by qualifying 6th in the Main Event, and finishing in the 17-32 bracket, is near the 900 MRP mark for this cribbage year.

Directors John and LaVon Thiems, and Donna and Larry Hassett gave extra effort in getting this event off the ground, furnishing the players with excellent facilities, raffles, souvenirs, trophies, refreshments, and press coverage.

Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert snapped a slump and won his nation-leading 23rd sanctioned event. His final match was a tight tussel with Jim Broadhurst, a fine pegger from Medford, OR. With the win, Colvert throws his hat in the MRP race and is at the 800 mark for the year.

Jim Sime, Kennewick, WA, finished 3rd and has topped the 500 MRP mark for this cribbage year, keeping his top-ten hopes alive. Larry Williams, Sun Valley, NV, finished 4th.

Crescent City, CA's Jim Brooks nailed the qualifying round with a fine 37 (17) +210 to take honors.

Shelly Meceda, a local pegger, took 2nd, followed by Dar Giese, another pegger from Wallace, ID, and local John Andrews.

John Sheerin, Chugiak, AK, nailed the 29-pegger Consolation.

Synopsis

# Board of Directors Meeting Reno, NV, February 2, 1995

All members present except Babcock (excused), Capper (excused), and Angell.

Minutes from last meeting approved after noting a correction regarding Round Robin format relating to one-day only tournaments.

McGibney reported on Operating Statement for first six months of Fiscal Year 1995, noting ACC in better shape than last year. Balance sheet omitted but would be mailed with the minutes.

Ramos and Fingleton reported on centralizing ACC's information. Fingleton moved to require a written interim contingency plan for following positions by August 1, 1995: Cribbage World Editor, Membership Secretary, Treasurer, National and Grass Roots Statisticians, Regional Tournament Commissioners (3), National Tournament Commissioner, and National Master Rating Points Statistician. Approved unanimously.

Fingleton moved to increase ACC dues as follows: \$10 Individual, \$12 couple, \$3 Junior (remains same), \$80 Life, \$40 Life Spousal. Rate increase to be effective August 1, 1995. Fingleton noted increase postal rates, automating ACC systems justifies increase. Ramos amended to include expiration dates by Larry Hassett. Motion passed.

Fingleton moved to approve expenses not to exceed \$750 during the period from now until June 30, 1995 for membership secretary assistance. Motion passed.

Patrick Barrett discussed Hall of Fame nominations. Motion carried 15 to 7 to follow guidelines set forth. Barrett will count ballots after deadline at a tournament site (probably Milwaukee).

Ethics Committee noted no new reports of inappropriate behavior since last meeting.

Bey reported on Senior Judges Program, indicating need for more. Shimp indicated additional Senior Judges will be added soon.

Ready reported 1995 Grand National on schedule for Plymouth, MA. Brochures shipped 10 days earlier by UPS had not arrived in time for meeting.

Monroe proposed 1996 Grand National be held in Napa, CA, September 27, 28, 29, 1996. Approved. Barrett proposed 1997 Grand National be held in Wisconsin Dells, WI on September 26, 27, 28, 1997. Approved.

Barrett moved to amend the Tournament of Champi-

ons criteria to include Grass Roots member reaching 1,000 point level (Bronze). Motion carried.

Horigan presented proposal for a new Master Point chart based on number of matches won in playoffs and percentage for qualifying. Horigan and McGibney, after discussion, moved to form a committee regarding proposal. Vice-President Policy will appoint committee to present formal proposal at next meeting. Motion carried.

Audit discussed. It has been three years since audit was done. The books closed on June 30, 1994. The first week in July books are ready. Suggestion that committee of 3 be formed and that one member of audit committee should be a CPA and not a member of the BOD. Shimp willing to serve and would contact Barbara Buntrock regarding work session in Raleigh.

Hassett motioned to increase members on Ethics committee from 5 to 7 effective August 31, 1995, with at least 2 members from each Region. Motion carried.

Hombeck proposed to increase funding for junior tournaments. Wergin interjected thought regarding getting cribbage in schools and homes as important to ACC's growth. Michaelis moved to give up to \$250 for Junior Tournament based on expense vouchers approved by tournament commissioner. Motion carried.

Hofbauer moved to make 3 of 5 playoffs mandatory on first rounds of a 2-day tournament. Carried.

Hamilton noted this is an election year, with open nominations. Election to be handled in same manner as last election with exception of having two people picking up and counting ballots, as noted by Griffin.

Kooistra moved to hold JPW/ACC Open and TOC at the Sands Regency, Reno, NV again in 1996. Carried.

It was noted that playoff brackets in the back of the new rule book are incorrect, and that correct one be printed in *Cribbage World* for insertion in rule book.

Bickford requested approval for Peer Tournament exemption. Fingleton reported that the letter to her indicated a permanent allowance. Tournament Commissioner has authority to allow 3 variances. With one open, she would allow it.

Larry Samet reviewed progress on National Match Play Tournament. Dickinson has pamphlet with GR information for tournaments. Shimp announced meeting for Judges for JPW/ACC Open and TOC play.

Horigan proposed mandatory cross-checking of score cards. Put on next meeting's agenda, in addition to Rookie of the Year and Distinguished Service Award.

Rein moved to adjourn. Minutes recorded by J. Rein.

# Betty Capper Cops Oregon Championship Reynolds, Hatcher Make MRP Move

Betty Capper, the better half of Mr. and Mrs. Cribbage World in the mid-1980's, and a hard working tournament director from Hermiston, OR, finally received her award from the Cribbage Gods, as she nailed the huge (174-pegger) Oregon Championship in Prineville February 19. In winning this long-running event (some 14 years old), Betty took home a nifty \$1,000 and a bushel of MRP's. She was unable to attend the Reno JPW/ACC Open due to medical problems...but made up for lost time in taking the championship in Oregon.

Glen Hefner, Creswell, OR, finished 2nd after a fine run. Sharon Morgan, Bend, OR, took 3rd...and had to play one of the nation's hottest peggers in the 3-4 bracket...Steve Reynolds, from Concord, CA.

In finishing 4th, Reynolds tacked on another 150 MRP's, and has taken the national lead for this cribbage year, standing at about 950!

Ed Park, Roseburg, OR, nailed the 114-pegger Consolation, and had to get by that travelling pegger from San Jose, CA in the final match...R. M. "Robby" Robson!

Mike Braukmann edged his dad, Randy, for 3rd place. These kids simply don't have any respect anymore! This duo hails from Hillsboro, OR.

# Dick West Tops Super Lite Classic



# Cribbage Board Puzzle Solved

The unique cribbage board unearthed by Julio Sartor and reported in February's Cribbage World is producing production clues, according to Bette Bemis, President of the Cribbage Board Collectors Society.

Bette writes that she has received information on at least seven varieties of the "Fool-Proof" board. This board has pull-up and push-down permamently attached pegs, and the board was also used to keep score for at least two other card games in addition to cribbage, namely Bezique (a game similar to Pinochle) and Whist.

One board of this type was manufactured in Windsor, WI in the mid-1800's by the Windsor Mfg. Co. Another board with pushin or pull-out pegs was John Gill's Cribbage Board and Whist Counter, patented in 1863 and manufactured in New York. Another board of this type was manufactured by the Specialty Company, Cortland, NY around 1890.

Three other boards with push-in or pull-up pegs have been reported. Two are varieties of unknown manufacturers, and the third is a metal-framed board made in Marden Lane, NY.

At any rate, in appears that in the mid-to-late 1800's, small metal and wooden boards with attached pegs were popular, but with the turn of the century, their manufacture ceased. But these boards certainly make great collectibles.







# Master Point Race Heats Up Steve Reynolds, Bob Gombatz Take Lead George Bickford, Robert Medeiros, Darrel Miotke, Paul Hatcher, Rit Alkas, Ed Horigan, Patrick Barrett and Bob Julian Hang Tough

With but four short months of pegging action remaining this cribbage year, the Master Point Race for honors is up for grabs.

Bob Gombatz, a premier pegger from Raleigh, NC, has taken to the cribbage trail with a vengeance, and has been piling up MRP's at every stop in making a spirited run for the roses. Gombatz's pegging is mainly in the Eastern Region and he is second nationally with 972 MRP's.

Meanwhile, out west, Stephen Reynolds, Concord, CA, has also been making a move. After finishing 4th in the 174-pegger Oregon Championships, and a Consolation 4th in Green Bay (not yet posted), has scored an outstanding 1,079 MRP's...and has grabbed the national lead.

Two Eastern Region players are nipping at the leader's heels...George Bickford, a Grand

Master from W. Springfield, MA, and rookie Robert Medeiros, Quincy, MA. This is Medeiros' first year of tournament pegging, and his numbers are astounding, considering the fierce competition encountered in sanctioned tournament play.

The next six players are all experienced peggers, making a close finish for this year's race for top ten almost a certainty: Master Darrel Miotke from Sublimity, OR, finished in the top ten last year, and is looking for a repeat performance, standing at nearly 800 MRP's; Grand Master Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, is highly motivated to crack the top ten once again (having done so in 1991 and 1993). Rit Alkas, Manchester, CT is a perennial winner, and Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA...an All-American last year... is in the hunt once again. And don't count out last year's national champion. Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI, is once again making a move, leading the Central Region with a nifty 742 MRP's...and with his robust schedule, will certainly be a threat for honors once again. Another Central Region player in the race is Patrick Barrett, Wisconsin Rapids, WI.

Many other peggers are still in the hunt. Anyone with 500 or more MRP's have an excellent chance of overtaking the leaders, as many large tournaments remained to be played.
