World's Largest Tournament

Connie Eaton Tops 1,421

Connie Eaton, playing out of Grass Roots club 24 in Mesa, Arizona topped all 1,421 players in the annual Grass Roots National Tournament. And the tournament smashed all records for participants, besting last year's mark by some 152 players.

Eaton won 16 of 18 games in besting the field, and took home the top prize of \$500. Adding two skunks gave her a grand total of 34 GP's.

Chip Digiovanni, club 22 (Orlando, FL) won 15 games (with two skunks) to take 2nd...and \$400.

Dennis Cuprey, club 117 (Virginia Beach, VA), also won 15 games with two skunks, but the spread point tie-breaker gave him 3rd (and \$300). Al Doucet, club 119 (Smyrna, GA) won 14 games, adding four skunks, for 4th...and \$200.

Joyce Keeling, a Spokane, WA pegger playing out of Las Vegas, scored the event's only 29-hand.

Tournament Director Eugene Mikulsky reported that 276 players received prize money, all scoring 24 or more game points. 362 players received Grass Roots National Points (scoring 23 or more game points). Players from 100 clubs participated. 77 clubs held a

Grass Roots National Tournament, with club 61 in Green Bay leading the way with 41 players. Club 67, Parkway Valley, MN drew 32 players. Club 120, Wisconsin Rapids, WI had 31 players.

Dues Increase

This is the month that the American Cribbage Congress' new dues structure takes effect.

The bulk of ACC memberships are up for renewal in August and September of each year; and this dues increase corresponds with our fiscal year.

For most of our 15-year existence, the ACC has charged a nominal dues fee, the last rate...\$7 for singles and \$8 for married couples...being in effect for some 10 years. With ever-increasing printing costs and postal expenses for our monthly publication, *Cribbage World*, a dues hike was long overdue.

The BOD approached this problem warily, but since its announcement earlier this year,

At the same time, we would like to call your attention to the new life membership rates available to those 60 years of age and older. The former \$60 life membership has been replaced by an \$80 charge; life member spousal one-time dues go from \$25 to \$40.

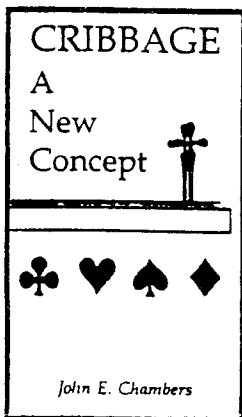
And, with the addition of Master Points for Consolation qualifying, we expand the rating system by charging \$2 for each entry in a sanctioned tournament, rather than the \$1.50 previously levied.

More tournaments...more opportunities to earn Master Points...more rating awards!

We're striving to centralize our entire ACC operations, enlarging our computer network to handle more members, more statistics, more records, eliminating the widespread "volunteer" system that has seen us through the formative years. It takes more \$\$\$ to do the job right.

Your new BOD will be taking action on this proposal at its annual meeting on Friday, Sept. 22 during the Grand National XIV at Plymouth, MA. These meetings are open to the general membership and everyone is invited to attend to see your ACC Board in action.

Reynette Cladianos Tops In Reno

Reynette Cladianos topped a huge field of 352 peggers at Reno's Independence Day Classic...and took home the \$2,000 grand prize! Reynette is a local pegger, and with the "home field" advantage waltzed to the title, winning the final match 4-1.

Master pegger Rex Paddock, Missoula, MT, snapped a cold spell in taking 2nd...and a nifty \$1,500.

Two Californians took 3rd and 4th. Harold Sontag (Vacaville), and Art Fisher (Seaside) added considerable MRP's to their lifetime totals (and sizeable purses) with their high finishes.

Jack Monroe, Napa, CA, had the hot hand in the qualifying rounds, scoring a nice 37 18 +121. Monroe will be the director of the upcoming Grand National XV in 1996, and is famous for his wine and cheese tasting annual tournaments in Napa.

A huge Consolation event (258 players) was played, and Clarence Van Orsow, Culver, OR, continues his fine play this cribbage year by winning the event. Not only did Van Orsow take home the \$850 prize, he has soared over the 500 MRP mark for the year.

Ron Logan, Queen City, AZ, took 2nd, followed by Master Frank Ornic, Forest Grove, OR, and Tom Patmore, Miranda, CA, in 3rd and 4th.

Many of the national MRP leaders were on hand for this event, as the torrid annual MRP race is winding down. Newly-elected Hall 'o Famer Mick Michaelis, Marinette, WI, fared the best, as his 11th place finish vaulted him into the top ten, standing at 1,200 MRP's. Bob Gombatz, Raleigh, NC, qualified high and gained another 100 MRP's, keeping him abreast of the streaking Robert Medeiros, Quincy, MA for the top spot this cribbage year. Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, and Darryl Miotke, Sublimity, OR, added MRP's to keep their top ten hopes alive.

Sharon Wilson, Medford, OR, blistered the satellite events, as she won the Friday Early Bird, and the Saturday High Roller. Bob Gombatz took home the bacon in the Sunday night game.

The Sands offered players a \$1,000 prize for a Saturday 29-hand. Alas, no takers.

Bill and Dorthalee Irons, Roberta Huff, Barbara Woodward, and many others, once again ran a first-class tournament...and the Veteran's Family Relief Fund came away the winner, as the players donated 15% to this fund.

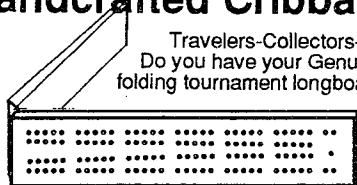

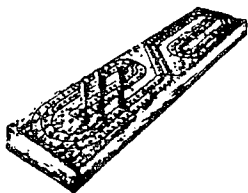

Two veteran cribbage players, Lloyd Coulter, 69, and Kaley Erickson, 70, both of Quincy, CA died in recent months. Coulter, winner of the World Championship tournament in 1982, died April 11 after a long illness. He is survived by his wife, Earline. Erickson, winner of the World Championship in 1984, died June 3, following a long illness. His wife, Tati, survives. Their lives paralleled each other. Both lived most of their lives in Quincy, both served in the Pacific during World War II, both were life members of the VFW, and both were longtime members of the Quincy Volunteer Fire Dept. and the Eagle Lake Assoc., and both were avid cribbage players and members of the ACC, taking part in numerous tournaments in California and Nevada. Their deaths mark a great void in the Northern California cribbage arena.

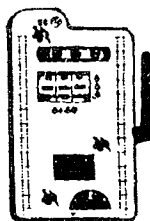

The round of 4 will play a best of 35 games (winning by two), then the final round of 2 will play a best of 45 games, winning by three games. A win counts as three game points and a skunk is four GP's.

The round of 64 was not filled as play began, and several players played head to head to gain entry into the final 32. Several matches were played in Reno in July...and Charlie Ball (Mesa, AZ) completed two matches and won them both to be the first to enter the final "sweet" 16.

At least six matches were played. Roger Wilson, Denver, CO, streaked to an easy win over Life Master One Star DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT.

Cribbage World will follow these matches with great interest, and monthly reports will be published.

Directors are Jeff Monroe, Roy Hofbauer, Warren Sondericker, Duane Toll, Bill Shoemaker, and Larry Samet. Entry fee: \$500. The prize fund for the winners will be sizeable.

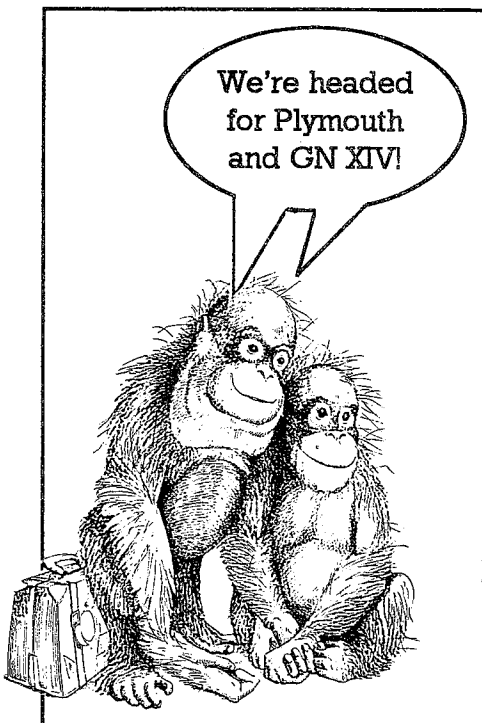

What's a Peer Tournament?

Simply stated, a peer tournament permits people to meet comparably skilled contestants in the qualifying round. The standard we used is the ACC master point total compiled by each contestant, lifetime. These totals are supplied by Bob McCabe, ACC National Statistician.

In the past we have made up groups ranging from 24 to 44 players. Contestants have advanced to the next round in comparable percentages from each group. Obviously we have eliminated many of the one sided games that normally occur when people of proven ability meet players with lesser skills. The 20 plus "Master" level achievers who have gone head to head in our first two tournaments have expressed appreciation for getting the opportunity to meet all peers.

The first two tournaments had the winner coming from other than the top rated group. There is no question that this format gives the average player an equal opportunity to finish high on the prize list.
