Simpson, Pruett In Reno Julian Wins Consolation, Takes MRP Lead

It was ladies day in Reno November 12 as Lucille Simpson and Lowaine Pruett finished 1-2 at the huge, record-setting (394-pegger) Veteran's Day Classic.

Simpson's win helped her celebrate her birthday as this travelling pegger from Lewiston, New York picked up some \$2,200...and a whopping 339 MRP's.

Pruett is also a travelling pegger from Dallas, OR, and was recently seen in Ajijic, Mexico pegging in the Mexican Open. Her 2nd place finish earned a sizeable prize and nearly 300 MRP's!

Bob Gromek, Las Vegas, NV, finished 3rd and picked up his Master rating (and a few extra MRP's toward his Grand Master). Bill Hill, Hermiston, OR, took 4th, and earned the 56th Grand Master rating awarded by the ACC. In addition, the 254 MRP's earned will propel Hill into the 500+ range in the early going for the 1996 cribbage year.

However, Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI, made the BIG MRP news, as this former ACC national champion nailed the 252-pegger Consolation, taking home 139 MRP's...and the national lead for this cribbage year. His total to date? 677 MRP's. Only Brenda Palmer, the Eastern Region's MRP leader, is close (a virtual deadheat).

Jim Broadhurst, Medford, OR, finished 2nd, followed by Bob Snyder, Atascadero, CA, and Artland Kaai, Costa Mesa, CA, in 3rd and 4th.

In the Main Event, Dean Deniz, Nevada City, CA, had the hot hand in the qualifying round, as he topped the record field with a 38 18 +223 (and a sizeable Q prize).

In the Early Bird Doubles, Tim Hutsell, Crescent City, CA, teamed with Todd Malmgren, Clackamas, OR, and came home the winners, as they topped a field of 144 teams and took home a cool \$960.

Armin Gade, Seattle, WA, was begged to play the High Roller Saturday night, as the field was uneven, and after much cajoling by the director, Gade reluctantly sat down and played...and won the \$750 top prize. The streaking Roger Wilson, Boulder, CO, took 2nd...and \$600.

The Sunday Last Chance was nailed by Chris Quigley (\$400), as this Vacaville, CA pegger continues a fine 1996 year.

Bill and Dorthalee Irons, assisted by Barbara Woodward of the Sands and a host of uniformed veterans, ran a first-class tournament. Reno...and the Sands...continue to be a mecca for cribbage players, attested to by yet another record crowd. The upcoming TOC and JPW/ACC Open will continue the action in early February at the Sands.

Our Future Is Our Youth!

That's as much true for the American Cribbage Congress as it is for the USA.

Dan Zeisler, coordinator of the ACC Youth Cribbage program, reports that he has received almost 100 requests for his Teacher's Manual on how to teach kids cribbage.

He is enthusiastic about the "Cribbage in the Classroom" project telling Ye Olde Prez: "I can't begin to express my excitement over this fabulous response, and often catch myself visualizing classrooms full of youngsters counting double-runs and moving their pegs with pride."

In the tradition of our founding President, Joe Wergin, Dan is "Thinking BIG!"

He told me of plans to move ahead and take the Youth Program to a new level. His concept calls for establishment of after-school Youth Cribbage Clubs competing amongst themselves, as well as with other clubs (ala Grass Roots).

Just imagine the impact our 121 active Grass Roots clubs could have if they sponsored at least one local Youth Cribbage club! We're taking this up with Gene Mikulsky, new GR commissioner.

One Grass Roots director I discussed this with, suggested that it might be appropriate to hold a Saturday session of Grass Roots club, inviting local kids to attend to learn some of the courtesies, fine points, and ethics of playing the game. (A refresher for some adult cribbers isn't too bad, either!)

Such activity could see the eventual creation of national youth recognition program for

exemplary young players. Perhaps a nationwide "mail" tournament for Youth Club members might also evolve...similar to the national tourney held by the Grass Rooters.

Which Grass Roots Club will be the first to sponsor a Youth Cribbage Club in its community?

As an incentive for tournament directors and Grass Roots clubs to sponsor local Youth Cribbage tournaments, the ACC BOD recently increased the amount of subsidy for Youth tournaments to \$250, subject to approval by the three Regional Tournament Commissioners. If you're interested in sponsoring a Youth Tournament in your area, apply to your Regional Tournament Commissioner.

Funds for this purpose come from the Cribadier General program, an honorary program envisioned by our first ACC secretary, the late Jim Arblaster. Membership is this August group is available to any ACC member at \$25 a pop...for which you receive a beautifully encribed membership plaque.

Lea Hornbeck of Washougal, WA has recently been appointed to head up the Cribadier General program. He succeeds Dave Proctor of E. Longmeadow, who chaired a successful project selling souvenir ACC playing cards, which increased the Youth tournament kitty from \$300 to nearly \$1,500.

200 Peggers Brenda Palmer Nails New Hampshire Open

Brenda Palmer, West Springfield, MA, has roared out of the blocks this cribbage year and won the huge 200-pegger New Hampshire Open On October 1. This Master pegger has scored over 600 MRP's this young season and has taken the National MRP lead...and is on track and nearing her Grand Master.

Master Charles Rapoza, Brockton, MA, finished 2nd, and is also working for his Grand Master. Another Master pegger--George Johnson--finished 3rd, followed by Gloria Dyndur in 4th. Johnson hails from Fitchburg, MA, and Dyndur from Woonsocket, RI. Johnson was also high qualifier and picked up a whopping 249 MRP's in this meet.

Some 120 peggers were on hand for the Consolation, and a pegger from far-off Montana took home the marbles...I.V. Graham from Libby. Graham does his pegging far and wide, as he also runs a tournament in Alaska once a year...the Funny River Open.

Frank Cummings (Chelsford, MA), John Rooney (Randolph, MA), and Earle Remington (Cumberland, RI) finished 2-3-4.

Director Al Miller always draws a crowd, and next year's match will be played October 6. Miller reported that some \$360 was donated to the Children's Hospital.

1996 Is A 29-Year?

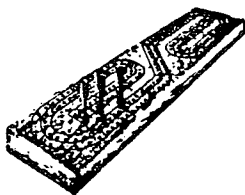

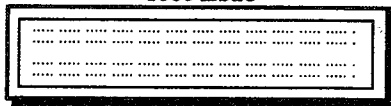

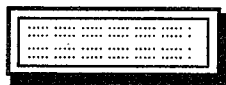

Board of Director's Meeting Plymouth, MA Sept. 22, 1995

Kooistra called meeting to order at 1:05 PM. All present except Morgan.

February 1995 minutes reviewed and accepted.

McGibney reviewed Financial Statement for last year and budget for upcoming year. He noted increase in revenue and areas of savings. Approved.

Kooistra welcomed new members and expressed gratitude for departing members.

Shimp discussed audit of ACC. Will give Buntrock more time to complete audit. Matter to be resolved by Reno's Feb. meeting. Shimp suggested three-person audit team be formed.

Members of BOD should be listed in CW periodically with telephone numbers and addresses.

Ramos reported on Restructuring Committee indicating need for computer upgrades. He recommended \$2,900 upgrade for Membership equipment, and \$100 to upgrade MasterPoint system. Carried.

Ramos moved to approve \$1,400 to write upgrade for ACC's system to store detail on each ACC member by tournament. Motion stipulates that ACC owns the program including the source code. Unanimously approved.

Barrett reported elections elected new member to Hall of Fame (Michaelis). He reported only 58% of eligible votes were cast. Criteria to be published in Nov. VW each year.

Kooistra and Perkins reported Ethics Committee had suspended Victor Struminger for 2 months. He appealed, but BOD approved the suspension (Sept 25-Oct. 25, 1995). Hatcher and Morgan added to Ethics Committee to bring total to 7.

McGibney nominated Terri Boylan as Assistant Treasurer and Corporate signatory on ACC's checking account. Approved. This move was in conjunction with need to backup key personnel. Note: Resolution of this Corp. to open an account with Merchants Bank and to authorize establishment of accounts was signed on Sept. 22, 1995.

Monroe reported GNXV going well for Napa, CA. Barrett noted GNXVI is coming along as expected. Ready reported 348 players registered to play and going well. Barnes circulated fliers and proposed a bid for 1998 Grand National for Daytona Beach, FL, with an October date.

The BOD agreed with Samet's suggestion that recognition to those deceased be given by leaving their names on the top 100 list with a notation by their name.

Samet proposed "Rookie of the Year" and "Top Junior Player" awards be given. To be discussed at Feb. 1996 meeting.

Horgan discussed new Master Rating Point System. After much discussion, proposal tabled for further action at Feb. 1996 meeting.

Rein is to set up files with rules, regulations, and other matters voted on over the years.

Kooistra asked to table item "O" on the agenda to Feb. regarding Qualifying Points for Double Elimination Tournaments.

Rein presented Lightning Printing's sample CW in reference to a bid submitted by this firm. Shawn Andrusko, ACC member, submitted bid. Bid awarded to Lightning Printing to begin with Nov. issue of CW.

BOD voted to award Neoma Kern, ACC's labeler and mail sacker for 5 1/2 years, three month's severance pay (\$330).

Kooistra reported that Dave Proctor has resigned as Cribadier General Chairman. Profits to date: \$1,200. Lea Hombeck to replace him. McGibney advised BOD that Proctor had submitted an ad expense for GNXIV program. Kooistra moved to reimburse him from CG account. Approved.

Elections of officers conducted by Lulinski. The results: President: Ev Bey. Executive Vice President: Scott Kooistra. Vice President Operations: Joe Ramos. Vice President Policy: Cathy Perkins. Executive Member at Large: Syl Lulinski. All unanimous with exception of Executive Member at Large, with Lulinski edging Fingleton.

Kooistra moved to authorize \$300 to Joe Wergin for expenses as addition to budget for coming year. Approved.

Shimp and Horgan seconded motion to accept budget with additions and amendments as noted earlier. Moved.

CW was instructed to print Financial Report.

Monroe noted that "Cribbage Anyone" flyer needs updating and reprinting. Bids to be submitted at Feb. meeting.

Barrett submitted an ACC logo for approval for shirts, jackets and caps.

Shimp reported that he will be adding new Senior Judges and noted some judges need to update appointments.

Dickinson resigning as Grass Roots National Chairman and will be phased in by Gene Mikulsky. BOD thanked Dickinson for a job well done.

Hassett moved to accept proposal regarding spouse life membership (under 60) change. Proposal was defeated.

Meeting adjourned at 5:15 PM. Minutes recorded by Joan Rein.

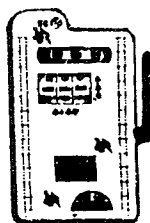

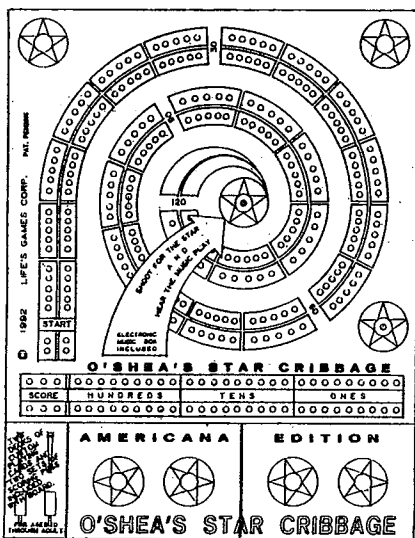

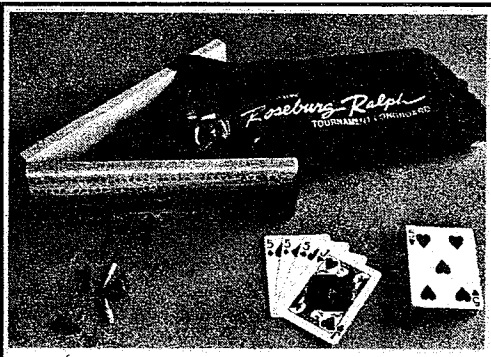
