Record Crowds Predicted

Reno Time!

Deadlines For Entry:

TOC- January 14 JPW/ACC Open- January 30

Once again it's Reno time! The upcoming Joseph Petrus Wergin/ACC Open is predicted to shatter last year's whopping 954-pegger attendance mark...and the preliminary Tournament of Champions should do likewise (402 players in 1994).

Tony Del Tufo, West Bridgewater, MA is expected to make a run at repeating as champion (and another \$10,000), as well as last year's TOC winner...Clair Morse, Bend, OR (who took home a whopping \$8,035).

Entry forms for the JPW/ACC Open are in November's *Cribbage World*. The deadline for entry is January 30...and the Sands hotel reservation deadline is January 20.

The Tournament of Champions is by mailed invitation only. Director Joan Rein has completed the mailing to those eligible to play. Deadline for entry is January 14. The criteria for entry into this prestigious event was published on page 13, November *Cribbage World*. Rein reports some 680 invitations have been mailed, and as of December 15, returns are far ahead of last year's pace...indicating a record attendance, once again!

Reno is hosting a national bowling tournament on the same weekend and this will very likely cause a severe room shortage in the city. The directors of these twin tournaments are advising all players to make room reservations as soon as possible.

The JPW/ACC Open and the TOC have a long and colorful history. In the early days of the American Cribbage Congress, Las Vegas was selected as the best site for an annual Tournament of Champions, and with director Dick Graham at the helm, the first annual was played at the Riviera in December 1982. Two more events were played in Las Vegas, but with poor attendance. The ACC's BOD decided to move to the Reno area and the 4th edition was played at Karl's Casino in Sparks, Nevada, in January 1986. TOC Attendance improved considerably (36 to 113). The satellite "Western Open" improved from 56 to 211 in Sparks. The fifth edition moved to the Sands in downtown Reno, and this year's 13th Annual TOC will be the 9th at the Sands. This moved proved a wise one, as attendance continues to climb with each passing year. A history of these events, including winners, is published on page 3, this issue.



The President's Column

Turning the calendar on a new year is a time for retrospection, a review of what we've accomplished and a forecast for the future. This holds true for the American Cribbage

Congress as the board of directors considers a proposal made by Joe Ramos, Vice-President Operations, to reorganize and consolidate our statistical and record-keeping operations.

At the present time, the ACC relies on more than a dozen unpaid volunteers, working on a part-time basis, to accomplish these vital functions.

Membership records are kept in Napa, CA. Tournament Commissioners are located in Milwaukee, WI; Washougal, WA; and West Springfield, MA. *Cribbage World* is edited, printed and mailed in Missoula, MT. Master Points are maintained in Milwaukee, WI. Our historical archives are kept in Modoc, SC. Secretarial duties are centered in Carver, MN, and finances are deposited with the Treasurer in South Burlington, VT.

Grass Roots club activities, too, are scattered nationwide. The Commissioner's official is in Mt. Horeb, WI; the National Statistician is located in West Warwick, RI; and there are six Regional Statisticians in a half-dozen other locations around the U. S.

In addition, the Judges program is operated by members residing at Shelbyville, MI; Monterey, CA; Nashua, NH; and Bear Creek, NC. Other important facets of the ACC are likewise widespread.

Ramos' suggestion, now being studied and polished by a special committee, calls for establishment of a central office, staffed by a contracted employee, to maintain continuity and back-up for all aspects of the ACC operation.

A slight dues increase is forecast to accomplish this centralization, adding about 25% more funds to augment our present \$120,000 annual income.

The board of directors will decide this matter at its February 2 meeting at Reno, NV. where the Tour-

namment of Champions will be held February 3 and the record-setting Joseph Petrus Wergin/ACC Open takes place February 4-5.

One of the most important ACC functions is our Judges Certification program. This is not just a program for qualifying members to serve as official judges at our sanctioned tournaments, it is intended to get everyone familiar with the Official Tournament Rules & Regulations (our Bible!), by requiring them to take a simple "open-book" test to demonstrate their familiarity and awareness of the rules.

Testing Examiner Al Miller's current roster of Certified Judges lists 307 ACC members...129 in the Western Region; 100 in the Eastern Region and 78 in the Central Region.

Al tells me that the 3-year certifications of 93 of those Judges expire at the end of 1994...and if they want to continue to serve in that capacity, they better renew their qualifications immediately! Check your certificate: if the last two digits are "94," that means YOU. And this includes prominent ACC members who are among the original qualifiers, Charter Judges, if you will. Mid-January, when the new list of Judges will be compiled, is the deadline for re-qualifying.

How do you re-qualify? Just send Al two questions (with answers) that you have created from the Rule Book, plus \$1 to cover a new badge, mailing, etc. His address: 12 Michael Ave., Nashua, NH 03062-1418.

Currently, less than 5% of our membership has taken and passed the Judge's qualification...we should have at least 10%.

For those who have not yet applied, the Judges qualifying test is available from Miller at a \$3 first-time charge. For other information, call Al at (603) 882-7204.

Dante Club and Yankee Classic

David Clemmey Nails Consecutive Wins Ed Horigan Keeps Pace

David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, recently won two consecutive New England tournaments, and has, once again, thrown his hat into the ring for national honors. This is one of the ACC's finer runs, as both tournaments were sizeable (182 and 142 peggers). In 1993, Clemmey won the 862-pegger JPW/ACC Open in Reno, and finished the 1993 cribbage year in 2nd place nationally.

On November 6, Clemmey came away the winner in the Dante Club, Western Massachusetts Open in West Springfield. The huge field (182 peggers) gave Dave a whopping 205 MRP's.

Three weeks later, he once again was a winner...the 142-pegger Yankee Classic! Adding another 160 MRP's to his yearly total, he now stands at the 400+ mark for the year.

Another streaking player, Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA, finished 2nd at the Dante Club match, and stands at the 500 MRP mark for the year.

Ken Vetterline, Bar Mills, ME, scored 532 MRP's in the 1994 season, but by qualifying first at the Dante Club match, and finishing 9-16, has already scored some 450 MRP's this year, and is off and winging towards another fine season.

John Cross (non-member) and Joe Beauregard, Pawtucket, RI finished 3rd and 4th (Dante Club match).

Henry DeLong (Woburn, MA), Charlie Finley (Enfield, CT), and Robert Drukman (N. Easton, MA) finished 1-2-3 in the 118-pegger Consolation.

Three weeks later at the Yankee Classic (Manchester, CT), George Webb, Halifax, MA, finished a strong 2nd (after qualifying 7th) and with the 190 MRP's earned is inching ever closer to his Life Master rating.

Chet Hinkle, Jr. (Plantsville CT) finished 3rd, and Life Master Phyllis Schmidt continues her fine play by taking 4th. Phyllis hails from Williamstown, MA.

The high qualifier in Manchester was Robert Irving, Cranston, RI.

Pawtucket, RI's Jeff Del Santo not only was top qualifier in the Consolation (86 players), but continued on to win the playoffs. With the 67 MRP's, Del Santo is nearing the 400 mark for the year.

Directors Mimi and Rit Alkas report that next year Phil Martin and Bill Shoemaker will take over the directorship, and this event will once again be scheduled in November, 1995.

Dante Club's director---George Bickford---also plans on a re-run next November 5, 1995.

Russ Fisher Tops In Florida

Orange City's Russ Fisher topped the field of 122 peggers in Kissimmee, FL, November 13 and took home the Jim Arblaster/Florida Open title.

Frank Schweig was a long way from his Illinois home, but he paid for his trip with a nice 2nd, followed by Grand Master Bob Gombatz (Raleigh, NC) who not only finished 3rd, but took qualifying honors. Burt Metcalfe, Ellenton, FL took 4th.

Jeannie Daesch (Miami Springs) and Phyllis Aronoff (Quincy, MA) finished 1-2 in the 78-pegger Consolation.

Darrel Miotke Rolls In NW

Last year's Western Region champion, Darrel Miotke, continues his fine play as he won the recent Prineville (OR) Lions Open. In besting 60 peggers and picking up 67 MRP's, he joins the race for national honors. Early in November he finished 5th at the huge Reno meet, and stands well over 600 MRP's for the year. Fred Kimball, Walla Walla, WA came in 2nd, followed by local Loretta Williams and Craig Hays (Boise, ID) in 3rd and 4th.

Jerry Blackman, Bend, OR, won the 46-pegger Consolation. Kathy Hays (Boise) took 2nd.

Central Region Update:

October and November are the peggin' months in the Central Region. The following tournament reports were received in the nick of time for publishing in this issue:

Minnesota Valley Open (October 29): Jim and Joan Rein are directors of the huge upcoming Tournament of Champions in Reno...and they get in shape by directing the annual Minnesota Valley Open in Chaska. Some 124 peggers were on hand, and **Joe Hammes**, Minneapolis, came away the winner, edging local Veryl Jensen in the final match. Local Jerry Gruber finished 3rd, followed by John Stamschror, Waukesha, WI in 4th. Ken Rymer, Milwaukee, won the 76-pegger Consolation, and Lloyd Kraft (Seymour, WI) took 2nd. This event will be re-run again next October 28.

Capital City Open (November 5): Des Moines, Iowa hosted this event, and with 35 peggers on hand, director **Dick Ogden**, fresh from a hot run at Grand National XIII in St. Paul, took home the title. Another Iowa director (Hawkeye Classic) Larry Loupee finished 2nd. Howard Pearson, Black Hawk, SD, took the 22-pegger Consolation.

Polish Open (November 4, 5, 6): Frank and Ginny Danileski run one of the Central Region's favorites, and this event followed suit, as a whopping 192 peggers signed on (and 120 played the Consolation). **Willard Peters**, Green Bay, took the title and a whopping 200 MRP's. Local Ken Rehm finished 2nd, followed by Gerry Danielski (Green Bay), and local Harry Langman in 3rd and 4th. Marlene Lazachek (Milwaukee) earned a spot on the Central Region's All-Star team...and she continues her "All-Star" performances by nailing the Consolation...and another 60 MRP's. 1993 All-American John Hiland, West Allis, WI, took 2nd. Two Green Bay players...Ruth Zimmerman, and Bea Connelly...finished 3rd and 4th. Four 28-hands were scored: Laura Bruckner, Leonard Bluma, Russell Uecke, and Lloyd Scott came away with this rare gem. ACC President Ev Bey was spotted pegging away...a long way from his Sun City, AZ home. The Danielski's are planning a rerun again next November.

Great Plains Classic (November 13): **Terry McCoy**, Fairmont, NE won this annual event, edging Jack Shaw, Lincoln, NE in the final match of this 36-pegger tournament.

Minnesota Turkey-Peg (November 18, 19, 20): Highly-ranked ACC players came to the top in this 115-pegger event. Life Master Joe Bernard (Libertyville, IL) took top-qualifying honors with a nice 36 (17) +234, and newly-crowned Master **Al Schaefer** (Milwaukee) took the play-offs. His final match was with another Life Master...Duane Toll (Kenosha, WI). Dick Cossak (Little Canada, MN), and Craig Peterson (Circle Pines, MN) finished 3rd and 4th. 74 players played the Consolation and Tim Krawczyk (River Falls, WI) edged yet another Life Master (One-Star Mick Michaelis, Marinette, WI) to win this event. Master Norb Upton (Eagan, MN), and Dave Gustafson (Minnetonka, MN) took 3rd and 4th.

Kah-Nee-Ta Unique Tourney Bill Becker Scalps Field

Bill Becker, Bend, OR, was ranked 61st in the nation as last year's pegging came to a close...but he has moved up a notch or two by winning the recent Kah-Nee-Ta Classic in the Oregon boondocks. Becker was on a roll the entire playoff round, losing but one game. And in the finals, he nailed Denny Edwards, Hermiston, OR, 3-0 to claim the 5th annual title. Edwards had a fine weekend, nevertheless, as he won the Friday High Rollers, and came away the top money winner.

Paul Nolz, Redmond, OR was top qualifier on Saturday with a fine 35 (16) +219, and came away 3rd in the playoffs in this 110-pegger event. Darrel Miotke, Sublimity, OR, was the Western Region's top player in 1994, and by finishing 4th, has rolled into the 600+ MRP range, and on pace to repeat as the Western Region's Champion for 1995. Only Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, has topped the 600 mark for this cribbage year.

The Consolation drew a sizeable 90 peggers and Jerry Blackman, Bend, OR nailed a grand slam 19 (9) +188 to pick up some qualifying MRPs, but Phil True, Richland, WA, rolled to the playoff win, edging Master Bill Hill, Hermiston, OR in the final match. Frank Symons, Madras, OR took 3rd and DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT finished 4th.

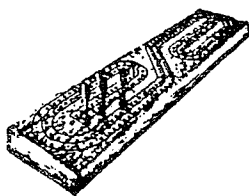

The ACC's Board of Directors will discuss this at their February's meeting in Reno. Let's hope this increase can be handled without a dues increase.

Books cost \$5. Fingleton asked to send Dan Zeisler (Sonora, CA) a book and work with him regarding materials. Motion carried to authorize Fingleton to sell boards, cards, etc. and to handle proceeds.

Kooistra reported on Cribadier General Fund. He proposed asking Dave Proctor to transfer funds to cancel loan balance. McGibney stated program not documented or controlled properly. Cards sold at Grand National by Charlie Finley would probably pay off \$200 loan.

McGibney requested more documentation for expenses at children's tournaments.

Barrett reported on Hall of Fame balloting. No one voted in this year. He noted negative and positive aspects of program. He reported it was a lot of work, but it went fairly smoothly.

Discussion regarding timeliness of HOF nominations and voting in relation to GR end of year. Motion carried to change dates for nominees (Jan. 15) so ballots can be mailed after Feb BOD meeting. Ballot deadline would then become April 15.

CW to print requests for nominees in Nov. issue.

Ramos reported on proposal to restructure ACC insuring a backup of any or all key positions of the ACC. Larry Hassett discussed automation. It was noted a central location might be needed. Sartup costs discussed. Perkins recommended a committee to research present system vs. automation over the next three years. Monroe, Norris, Dickinson, Fingleton, Hassett, Shimp, and Denny Moore were selected by chairman Ramos.

Dickinson reported on GR program. Perkins reported on GR audit and reviewed a financial report that had been presented to the board.

McGibney suggested a committee of two to audit books once a year, commencing with an audit at Raleigh each year. Barbara Buntrock has Fiscal year 92-93 and it needs to be completed.

Bickford proposed a round-robin format for play-off for all qualifiers of the Main and/or Consolation under the guidelines for all tournaments and asked that all forms be updated. Motion carried 15-9-2.

Hamilton reported on GN XIII ("Lucky 13") with everything coming along fine and indicated the the \$1,000 given to them would be returned to the ACC.

Jim Ready reported on '95 Grand National indicating that it was again scheduled at the Plymouth (MA) Sheraton. Rooms would be \$82/night. Shuttles would be available to airport and hotel.

Monroe submitted bid for '96 Grand National at Napa, CA.

Colvert asked to put notice in CW regarding GN proposals and the vote on the '96 and '97 GN was delayed until the Feb. '95 BOD meeting. Barrett noted interest in hosting the '97 GN in Wisconsin Dells, WI.

Nominations presented for election of Executive Board of Directors. Ev Bey unopposed for President when Kooistra declined nomination. Scott Kooistra was unopposed for Executive Vice President. Joe Ramos unopposed for Vice President Operations. Jerry Dickinson and Cathy Perkins were nominated for Vice President Policy. Martha Fingleton and Jeff Monroe were nominated for Member at Large.

The Executive Committee noted they discussed Ramos' proposal regarding automation (backup) and the agenda.

Rein moved to accept the same criteria for the Tournament of Champions as last year as permanent criteria. Carried.

Shimp moved to amend the motion to strike the invite for any present member of the BOD. Defeated.

Motion carried, with TOC criteria becoming permanent record.

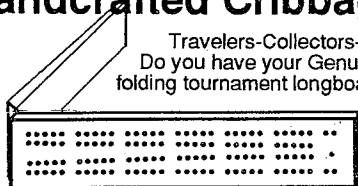
Hassett discussed pay-offs, guidelines, regarding what is benefit vs. expenses at tournaments.

South Burlington, Vermont

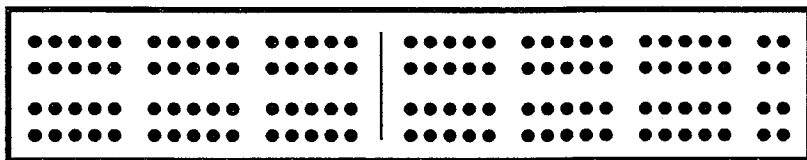

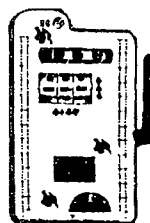
