Clams, Oysters, and Salmon

Gilkeson Lasts Longest

After the record crowd of 162 peggers feasted on clams, oysters, and salmon, they settled back to do a little serious pegging at the recent Longest Beach Classic in Long Beach, WA.

Dave Gilkeson, Winchester, OR, pegged the longest, as he won the championship...and \$1,500! Being confined to a wheel chair was no handicap to Dave, as he breezed to the title, picking up 180 MRP's and a trophy, along with the sizeable first place prize.

Jim Keeling spends his winters in Las Vegas...and he pays for his winter's lodging with his poker winnings. And he also pays for his summer's lodging in Spokane, WA with his cribbage winnings as he took 2nd (with a sporting concession of a 3-4 match with Richard McNeil (also of Spokane) keeping him alive for the final match. McNeil inadvertently claimed the match with a miscounted hand, but when informed of the mistake, he magnanimously awarded the match to Keeling. McNeil finished 4th, as Jim Brooks, Crescent City, CA prevailed in the 3-4 final.

Vernon Ward, another Cresecent City pegger, topped the qualifying round with a 37 16+201.

Darren Black, Portland, OR nailed the 130-pegger Consolation. Jason Jukubos (Roseburg, OR), Mike Reich (Weston, WA), and Dale Kochenburg (Santa Clara, CA) finished 2-3-4.

This event was sponsored by the merchants of Long Beach, and with the \$2,000 added prize money, the local hospitality, and the ocean setting contributed to the increased attendance from last year's event. A rumor is circulating that the merchants may add \$5,000 to this fall's event.

Arlene and Hal Halldorson, with able assistance from Roy and Jeanne Hofbauer kept all events on schedule...and furnished the crowd with a huge bowl of jelly beans, in addition to the added prize money.

The President's Column

In this month's issue of *Cribbage World* (the one you're holding in your hand right now!) you'll find your official ballot for the bi-annual election of the ACC board of directors.

I want to urge every member to vote...it's your right and privilege, the one way you can help formulate policy and influence the future of the American Cribbage Congress.

This year we reduced the size of the board to 25 members...all of whom will be elected. The five Presidential appointments have been abolished. Appointments by the President (with concurrence of the Executive Committee) will only occur in the future when a vacancy is created by resignation or death.

According to Ron Hamilton, chairman of the nomination committee, 31 members have been nominated; 25 of them are present board members and six others (some of whom have been previous board members and officers).

Five directors--Jim Angell, Phil Babcock, Ken Capper, Lee Norris and Bill Wright--have opted not to seek re-election. We owe them a debt of thanks for their past service.

Five candidates are running from the state of Wisconsin; three each from California, Massachusetts and Washington; two from Illinois, Minnesota, Montana and Oregon; and one each from Arizona, Florida, Michigan, Nebraska, North Carolina, Rhode island, South Dakota, Vermont and Virginia.

Our rules specify that "no more than four (4) members of the Board shall be elected from one State." This means that at least one of Wisconsin's candidates will not be elected.

New rules adopted Feb. 3, 1994, also call for no more than 10 and no less than six Board members from any Region. Adoption of these three criteria was meant to apportion representation throughout the United States, with no State or Region being dominant.

Now it's up to the members to vote their choices.

Remember, all ballots must be returned to Cathy Perkins, V-P Policy, 1030 Barker Road, Bear Creek, NC 27207, before July 15th. Counting of the ballots will take place by a committee of three members, appointed by Mrs. Perkins, during the National Open at Raleigh, NC, July 29-31, 1995.

The newly-elected board of directors will be installed at the Grand National at Plymouth, Massachusetts September 22-24, 1995.

Just like pegging out to complete a game, be sure to vote and do your duty as an active ACC member.

Vern Kennebeck World Champ! Miotke, Schleusner Make MRP Move

Vern Kennebeck, down 2-0 in the best 3 of 5 championship match, came back with three straight wins to nip Darrel Miotke for the World's Championship in Quincy, CA on May 7.

Some 236 peggers were on hand for this annual event, and Kennebeck took home (to Magalia, CA) some \$1,500 for the championship ... and 240 MRP's.

In taking 2nd, Miotke (Subimity, OR) garnered a whopping 228 MRP's and zips to the top of the national MRP leader board with 1,200+ points.

Greg Schleusner, Truckee, CA, in finishing 3rd, also made a MRP move, nearing the 900 mark for the year.

Heidi Glashan, a 4th Street Terrorist from Pittsburg, CA, took home 4th.

Local Cal Anderson had the hot hand in the 18-game qualifying round, posting a 35 14 +313 (complete with 7 skunks).

Some 140 peggers stayed for the Consolation and Harry Ng bested Mary Ryan for the title. Both players hail from San Leandro, CA. Roger King (Santa Clara, CA) and Dean Denis (not member) took 3rd and 4th.

This 24th Annual World Championship kicked off Friday night with a doubles match. Some 90 teams picked 'em up and laid 'em down...and when the final bell rang, two Northwest bombers took home the money. Paul Hatcher and Jim Gogolin, two Oregon peggers, who routinely pocket prize money, took home \$500...and got their pictures in the local paper for the effort.

Al Schaefer came a long way from his Wisconsin home, and he helped pay for the trip by copping the Cry Baby event.

A High Roller (\$50 entry) contest went into the wee hours, with Billie Reddell, San Luis Opisbo, CA taking home the top prize (\$595). Two special perennial awards were presented: highest qualifier (Bob Moon Memorial) from Plumas County: Bill Dore; and the highest qualifier from Nevada (Gene Kozlowski Memorial): Brian Riches (Reno).

In an unusual opening ceremony (for a cribbage match), Teri Gallagher sang a very fine National Athem to kick off the main event. And the Quincy Rotary Club once again served an openair lunch and a steak dinner for the evening meal. The Rotary Club members, along with director Mike Taborski, ran a first class tourney...and next year's 25th (Silver Anniversary) annual is planned to be extra special. The Rotary Club is looking for a corporate sponsor to sweeten the purse, with hopes that ESPN, TNT, and Sports Illustrated will participate in covering this event. Plans are being made for hosting upwards to 500 players for this special anniversay match.

Leave The Kids At Home

It's not unusual for a son or daughter to beat a parent at cribbage, but at GR Club 28's (Portland, OR) Wednesday match on March 15, three parents were beaten simultaneously on the 8th game.

Teri Hein defeated her mother Leslie by 33 points; Bruce Van Orsow beat his dad Ray by 12 points, and the streaking Jason Hofbauer waxed his mother Jeanne by 9 points.

Oregon Coast Classic Draws Record Crowd

Jim Broadhurst Tops On Oregon Coast

Jim Broadhurst came close at the innaugural Timber Classic in Roseburg, OR in March (taking second). In May, he came a few miles north to the Oregon Coast Classic...and took home the championship.

Down 3-1 in the best of 7 final, this Medford, OR player won three straight to take the title and the \$1,200 first prize in this record-breaking 206-pegger field.

Todd Malmgren, Clackamas, OR, almost had the event in the bag, but had to settle for 2nd place. His last chance found Broadhurst in the stinkhole dealing, with Malmgren needing five pegs. He held an unusual hand: 2-2-2-9. The 4th deuce was cut, giving Malmgren a safe lead, but alas, little chance of winning.

Ron Morgan, an ACC BOD member from Missoula, MT, ran a hot streak in the playoffs for a 3rd place finish, followed by Ray Van Orsow, Portland, OR in 4th.

Bruce Gentry, Kennewick, WA, parlayed the ACC's 11th 29 hand of the season into a top qualifying score of 37 16+226 to cop the top "Q" prize...and another \$100 from the ACC for the 29 gem.

George Rasmussen, Chehalis, WA, analyzes his cribbage numbers on a steady basis (with a little black book) and the effort paid off with a Consolation win, besting the 129 peggers in this event. Dorothy Conroy (Forest Grove, OR), Nancy Lorenz (Salem, OR), and Jim Hartung (Richland, WA) finished 2-3-4.

Directors Roy & Jeanne Hofbauer, Bernie Nelson, and Rollie Heath ran an excellent tourney, attested to by the record crowd. The tourney, held on Mother's Day on a nice sunny weekend, drew players from throughout the Northwest, and a few were spotted from the Central Region.

In-Kreb-ible Krebs

Ron Krebs, Prineville, OR, has set a new standard for tournament play...THREE 28 HANDS!

In game 19 in the qualifying round at the Oregon Coast Classic, Krebs plunked down a 28-hand to win the game. After rotating to game 20, he once again played another 28-hand (hand five). Two 28-hands in the space of six deals (and with two decks of cards). To top this off, in the next day's Consolation, he plays yet another!

This mark will be very hard to beat!

Side Bars?

Bernie Nelson commented that from now on, his tournments will require three judges...and a side bar to judge tough calls. Too much OJ!

Duane Toll Has Tough Weekend

Perennial winner Duane Toll was spotted pegging in Oregon's Coast Classic, and he had a tough weekend. He confided to *Cribbage World's* editor that three of his opponents cut kings in cutting for the deal...and they won the deal! Tough weekend!

Jim Gogolin Earns Master

Jim Gogolin, Idleyld, OR, has been knocking on the door for his Master rating...and he finally earned this honor in the Oregon Coast's Consolation event.

Capper Wins "24" Game

Ken Capper. Hermiston, OR had an unusual game with Bud Ferrigno, Canby, OR. Ferrigno begins the game with a 24-hand...and Capper ends the game with a 24-crib. The score? A win by 24. What is Ferrigno's seat number? Silly question! 24!

Glen Kirchoffer (Waukesha, WI) and Bill Tushar (West Allis, WI) finished 3-4.


