968 Players: New World's Record

Schnurr, Hokenson Win In Reno

For the fifth consecutive year attendance records have been broken in Reno! This year's Joseph Petrus Wergin/ACC Open drew some **968 players**...the largest gathering of cribbage players in the 364-year history of cribbage! The Sands Hotel and Casino was buzzing for all three days of pegging, as the opening bell for Friday's Tournament of Champions also drew a record **404 players**.

This year's doubleheader also set records for prize money. Combining the Sands \$3,500 added purse (for both events), with the record crowd's entry fees added to sizeable amounts. The Tournament of Champions winner took home a whopping \$8,075, and the JPW/ACC Open winner netted a cool \$10,000!

Joseph P. Wergin/ACC Open

Leo Schnurr, a Canadian from Garabaldie Highlands (suburb of Vancouver, BC) outlasted the huge field to grab the top \$10,000 prize. Leo thus becomes the first foreigner to score a win in this prestigious event. Bill Irons, a local player, almost kept the championship at home, but he had to settle for 2nd...and *only* \$6,800!

Two Montana players...Mike Haggerty (Missoula) and Keith Forrest (Stevensville) slugged it out for the next two spots, with Mike

prevailing for 3rd (and \$4,700). Keith took home a nifty \$3,500 in finishing 4th.

Haggerty added to his laurels by also taking qualifying honors, scoring a huge 40 GP's in topping the 968-player field. The "Q" top prize was \$1,400...and the combined \$6,100 prize will go a long way in helping Mike through medical school.

5th through 8th also paid well, as Vaida Stevens (Oroville, CA) packed home \$2,800 for 5th, newly-retired George Rasmussen (Arlington, VA) won \$2,200 for 6th, Bill Erickson (Libertyville, IL) garnered \$1,800 for 7th and Darrel Hunstad (Nipomo, CA) warmed up for his upcoming Nipomo Open (April 28-30) by finishing 8th...and winning \$1,500.

Any successful tournament lives off its publicity, letting players and the general public know what's happening.

We've always advocated sending news releases about upcoming tournaments, GR activities and other cribbage events to your local newspaper(s). Just give them the information and you'll find that 99% of the papers will be willing to publish it, at no charge.

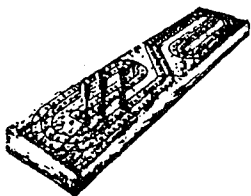
Besides pre-tournament publicity, we have also suggested that tournament directors send results of their tourneys to the papers. We've done that with our World Championship in Quincy, CA with great success.

Following through on our suggestions, Paul Barnes in Florida sent a post-tournament result story to the hometown paper of the winner of his tournament and was pleasantly surprised that they published it. We do this all the time for our tournament and the winner is usually amazed to see his exploit featured (sometimes with a picture) in his local paper.

So you don't know how to write a news story? Just give 'em the facts...remember the 5 W's of news writing...**Who, Where, What, When, & Why (and sometimes How)**! If the newspaper can't use it as you write it, they'll re-write it to fit their style as long as they have all the essential facts.

Try it after your next tournament: send the vital info about the winner to his or her hometown newspaper, and garner some valuable publicity for the ACC. Keep peggin'!

Allen Karr Wins Huge Consolation

The Consolation event signed on a record 748 players...the fifth largest tournament in the history of the Congress...and when the pegs were laid away, Allen Karr, Green Bay, WI, came away the winner.

Grand Master Bob Gombatz, Raleigh, NC, made his trip to Reno worthwhile by taking 2nd. Adrian Levy, Lafayette, CA, nailed 3rd, and last year's National Open champion...Duané Gier, Brandon, FL...took 4th.

In 1993 David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, won the JPW/ACC Open, and in this year's edition he took advantage of the ACC's new Consolation qualifying round awarding of MRP's by taking top honors...and picking up a few more MRP's.

Lee Chambers Scores 7th 29 Hand

Lee Chambers, a veteran pegger from Corvallis, OR, scored the only 29-hand of this three-day marathon, and will be awarded \$100 from the ACC. This gem is only the 7th to be scored nationwide this cribbage year.

Ted Hokenson Tops TOC

Ted Hokenson, Marquette, Michigan, topped a record crowd of 404 peggers in the preliminary Tournament of Champions. The championship awarded \$8,075 to Ted, but no Master Points, as this event is by invitation only.

Clifford Allen, one of Spokane, WA's premier peggers, finished 2nd (and won \$5,800), followed by Bruce Sattler, Baltimore, MD (\$4,250), and Virgil Dulin, Fayetteville, NC (\$3,250) in 3rd and 4th. Life Master Syl Lulinski, LaGrange Park, IL took 5th. Grand Master Bob Gombatz finished 6th, and for the 2nd year in a row, Life Master Jim McManus, Milwaukee, WI, finished 7th. Bill Hill, a Master pegger from Hermiston, OR, took 8th.

Scott Kozlowski Cops TOC Consolation

Local Scott Kozlowski picked up a nifty \$2,060 by winning the 236-pegger Consolation. Bob Pilcher, Juneau, AK, took 2nd (and \$1,800), followed by Reidsville, NC's Henry Douglass in 3rd. Richard Bett, Sr., Hamburg, NY, took 4th.

Players came from far and wide to play in this record-breaking three-day event. Some 36 states and Canada were represented. No one region of the country lay claim to having the winners, as the prize money was distributed to players from all areas of the nation.

Directors Joan Rein, Scott Kooistra, Jeanne and Roy Hofbauer, combined with scores of volunteers did a remarkable job of keeping all events moving smoothly. The Sands Hotel/Casino proved great hosts, keeping the players in coffee and danish for three days running. The ACC's Board of Directors voted unanimously to play the 1996 match once again at the Sands. The 1995 record crowd of 968 may once again be bypassed in 1996 if the yearly trend of increased attendance continues.

John Hiland Leads Central Region to Record All-Star Win

The Central Region, boasting 4 Life Masters, 2 Grand Masters, and 2 Master players coasted to a record All-Star victory in the preliminary All-Star Event in Reno.

John Hiland, West Allis, WI, lead the Central team with an outstanding 28-GP card in this 16-game match. In fact, all four of the top spots were won by Central Region players: Syl Lulinski, LaGrange Park, IL (24 GP's), Joe Bernard, Libertyville, IL (23 GP's), and Jim McManus, Milwaukee, WI (22 GP's) helped complete the sweep as the Central team set a record combined score of 172 GP's.

This yearly match now stands at 2-2-1 (Western: 2, Central: 2, Eastern: 1).

Norm Wright, Madison, WI, got into the spirit of Reno immediately upon arriving at the airport. Spotting a video poker machine in the airport mezzanine, he promptly plunked in five quarters. He held an ace of diamonds, and drew four cards. Eureka! A royal flush! \$1,000!! Norm probably had visions of 1983 in his mind...he was the ACC's National Champion that year.

Martha Fingleton, our ACC's National Tournament Commissioner, and BOD member, has been to Reno many times. She had never qualified for the playoffs...until this year! Alas, she got bumped early.

In a heated game, a player inadvertently pegged one too many and falsely claimed the game. After calling a judge, this player's opponent licked his chops at the prospect of stealing a game. The judge moved the player back to hole 120, then correctly assessed a 15-point backward penalty. Now the player is 16 points from game. The judge directs the player to count the crib. Over it goes...and it is a **16-point winner!** Much to do about nothing!

Roy and Lila Ellis, Spokane, WA, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary during the weekend. Alas, the cribbage Gods did not reward them (as it did **Marge Bartelson** on her 60th anniversary January 7, in Mesa, AZ...scoring a 29-hand, a 24-hand, and winning \$99 in GR 53 play).

Dwight Christiansen, Stratford, CT, had an unusual run of holding jacks for nobs. Five in one game, four being in a row, with the five-point bonus winning the game. All in all, he scored 12 nobs in a three game stretch.

After three days of grueling pegging, a player was observed beginning the pegging sequence by leading the 10 of clubs. His exhausted opponent gruffly demanded "What's the count?" *Cribbage World* will not print the answer. Both players obviously were suffering "pegged out disease."

Rick Rickmyer, Concord, CA, came into Reno sporting 267 MRP's for the year. Scoring 57 MRP's in the qualifying round and picking up an additional 210 MRP's in the playoffs he exactly doubled his 1995 MRP total! Then after losing in the playoffs, he signed on for the Consolation. The last seat number left in the cup was Y16...**the same number he had been given in the main tournament!** Incidentally, the 267 MRP's earned Rick his Master rating!

Darrel Hunstad Nails Monterey Bay/Larry Good Memorial

Darrel Hunstad, Nipomo, CA, warmed up for the Reno match (where he was destined to finish 8th of 968 players) by winning the recent Monterey Bay/Larry Good Memorial in Sea-side, CA.

Darrel bested some 102 players, and edged Boyd Horne, Redondo Beach, CA, in the final playoff match to cart home the championship. Sara Horne, Boyd's spouse, faced her husband in the top four round, and lost. But she came back to take 3rd, nipping local Dave Gustafson in the match for 3rd and 4th.

For a brief moment, it appeared that defending champion Mary Ryan, San Lorenzo, CA, may repeat last year's performance, as she qualified with a very fine 38 GP (17) card.

62 players stayed for the Consolation with Al Wigger, Cupertino, CA, taking home the marbles. Bob Sutton, Burbank, CA took 2nd.

Dues Will Increase August 1, 1995

The American Cribbage membership fees have held the line since January 1, 1988. In fact, a cost reduction for married couple's fees from \$10 to \$8 was accomplished several years back.

However, the postal increase this January 1, 1995 (up 14% for 2nd class mail) has forced the ACC's BOD to evaluate the budget...as this increase will cost at least an additional **\$1,560 to mail *Cribbage World* each year.** And, of course, other expenses are up. In the last seven years, inflation had taken another 25% or so of our spendable income.

Reluctantly, at the Reno BOD meeting, members voted a dues increase to offset these increases, to keep the ACC solvent.

Effective August 1, 1995, dues will increase to \$10 single, \$12 married couple, with Junior memberships remaining at \$3. Sanctioning fees will also increase from \$1.50 to \$2 per player.

According to Membership Chairman Jeff Monroe, if your yearly membership begins after August 1, paying early at the old rate will not be allowed.

Grand National XV: Napa, CA Grand National XVI: Wisconsin Dells, WI

At the recent Board of Directors meeting in Reno, the sites for the 1996 and 1997 Grand Nationals were approved.

In September, 1996, Grand National XV will be held in Napa, California. Jeff and Jack Monroe will head the committee making arrangements. Napa has long been hosts for cribbage as they hold their annual Wine Valley Open on a yearly basis.

In September, 1997, Grand National XVI will be held in Wisconsin Dells, Wisconsin. Patrick Barrett is in charge of this event, and arrangements are being concluded with the Holiday Inn Aqua Dome in Wisconsin Dells. This huge convention facility comes complete with a 100 foot long octopus water slide and huge indoor and outdoor pools. And Barrett has much experience in directing cribbage tournaments, as his large yearly Wisconsin Dells Classics will attest.

Both locations appear to be great sites for our annual awards banquets and match play. Mark your calendars for a fun-filled weekend.

Cambell also reported a new cribbage phenomenon is on the loose! Jim Roberts, Martinez, GA, a retired navy office walked in, paid his membership dues, and sat down and played the Early Bird. His card? Only a 20GP (9) +166! He qualified for the playoffs the next day as well...but got bumped in the first round of playoffs. However, for his first sanctioned tournament, this was an auspicious start, indeed!

National Match Play Shows Interest

A proposed "Granddaddy of High Rollers" is showing considerable interest, according to organizer Larry Samet.

At the recent BOD meeting in Reno, Samet reported some 50 players nationwide have shown interest in playing this \$500 entry event. A field of 64 players will begin play, with first and second round matches a best of 25 games (winning by 2). Third and fourth round play would be a best of 30 (winning by 2). Round five would be a 35-game match (winning by 2), and the final match would be 45 games, winning by 3.

The prize fund with 64 players:
1st: \$10,000. 2nd: \$7,000. 3rd-4th: \$3,400.
5-8: \$1,000. 9-16: \$500. This allows \$200 for trophies.

And this year's apple board trophy belongs to Jack Moritzky from nearby Mabton, WA. His final match was a tight tussel with local Mike Brooks, but Jack scored "barnburners" on 3rd and 4th street in the final game to put the match away.

Last year's Tournament of Champion winner...Clair Morse (Bend, OR)...is warming up for the upcoming TOC by nailing down 3rd place, followed by local Greg Van Metre in 4th.

Some 88 players attended this year's event, marking a new high in attendance. Director Brumley had excellent paybacks, and with the help of his Sunnyside crew, rounded up scores of door prizes from local merchants. If you went home empty-handed, your luck was sour, indeed!

Ruby Reich is a newcomer to the tournament trail...but, nevertheless, she topped all the players in the qualifying round with a fine 38 (17) +122.

Hermiston's Ken Capper topped the field in the 56-player Consolation, with newly crowned Grand Master Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, taking 2nd...and adding a few more MRP's to his sizeable total for the year. Chester Sobkoviak, Richland, WA, took 3rd, followed by Joe Aubrey, Spokane, in 4th.

Nancy Sand, Kennewick, WA, nailed the ACC's 6th sanctioned 29-hand in the qualifying round to pick up a quick \$100...and a framed plaque at this years Grand National.

29-Hand In Doubles 2.88 Times Tougher Than In Singles

According to our odds master Russell Adams, Minneapolis, MN, the odds of scoring a 29-hand in doubles is some 625,000 to 1.

In singles play, the odds of this gem is 216,580 to 1. This makes a doubles 29-hand 2.88 times tougher.

Why? Only five cards are dealt in doubles vs. the standard six cards in singles. That one extra card makes this rarity much easier to come by.

In furnishing Cribbage World with this tidbit, Adams added "playing two games per day for 86 years, at ten hands per game, would give you a 50-50 chance of scoring this hand. I wouldn't go for it!"

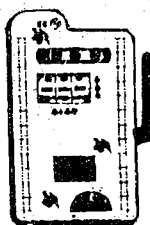

24,740 Discrepancy

In this issue Russell Adams claims scoring a 29-hand in doubles (five cards dealt) is 625,000 to 1.

Now, along comes Bruce Bowman, and he calculates the odds at precisely 649,740 to 1...making it just a little tougher! Bruce writes: "I've calculated the probability of a 29-hand when only five cards are dealt to be exactly 1 in **649,740**. That makes this feat exactly three times as rare as getting a 29-hand in a two-handed game (1 in 216,580). I also calculated the probability of getting a 28 hand in the five-card game. It's 773 in 30,537,780, which is **39,505.537** (approximately). This is only 2.62 times as rare as the 28 hand in the six-card game (1 in approximately 15,208,113).

Bruce hails from Ann Arbor, MI, and markets a cribbage computer program called "**Cribbage Master**" (advertised in this issue).

Both Adams and Bowman are masters of the odds game...and *Cribbage World* would not bet against either mathematician. Numbers buffs...get out your sharp pencils and let's get another "OJ" controversy going!

Quiz Answer

Hatcher had scored a 16-point hand and pegged from hole 77 into hole 93 (correctly) with first count, being the non-dealer of the hand.

Now, his opponent scores an 8-point hand, and inadvertently reaches across the board and picks up Hatcher's front peg and moves it into her track at hole 109 and releases the peg!

Stunned, Hatcher calls for a judge. **The ruling: Rule VIII. Pegging, Section 8. Pegging With Opponent's Pegs. a. If a player records points by advancing the opponent's peg or pegs, they lose those points and the opponent keeps them. There is no additional penalty for touching the opponent's pegs.**

With this good fortune, Hatcher wins the game and qualifies for the playoffs with a 12-GP card, and rolls on in the playoffs to 2nd place, and garners a fortuitous 29 MRP's in this 56-pegger event.

The cribbage Gods work in strange ways.

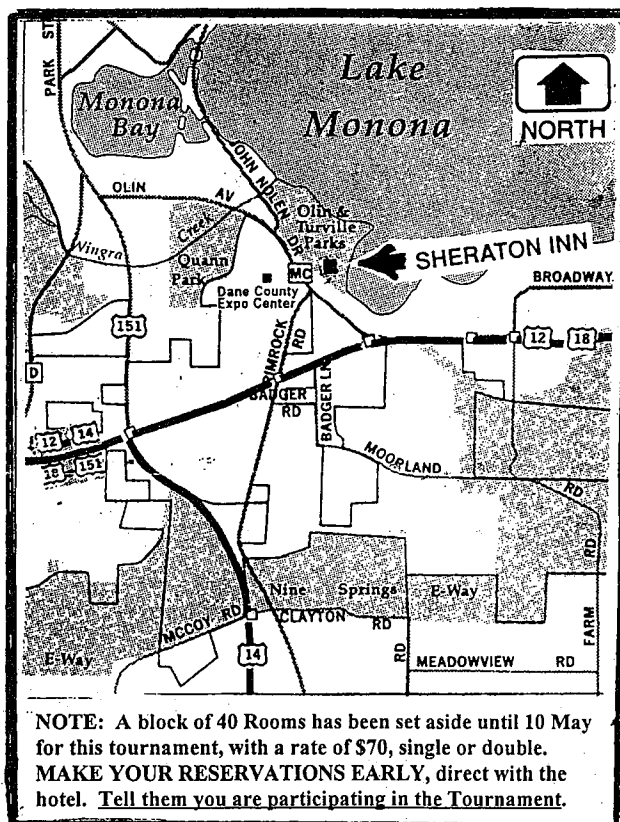

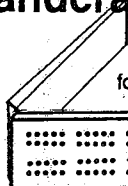
