Rit Alkas!

National Open Champion Takes National MRP Title

Rit Alkas, playing out of Manchester, CT, came to Raleigh, NC, for the last sanctioned match of the year standing in 4th place in the annual Master Point race. And with all the marbles on the line, Alkas came away with the 22nd Annual National Open championship and won the 1995 National MRP title as well.

Alkas, with the win picked up 277 MRP's and \$3,000 to win the 1995 title in glorious fashion. By finishing the year with a whopping 1,756 MRP's Alkas will captain the 1995 All-American team.

Perennial winner Russell Adams, Minneapolis, MN, a two-time All-American, nearly repeated for the third time with a solid 2nd place finish. Adams finished the year with 1,119 MRP's and earned All-Central Region honors...and \$1,600.

Six time All-American "Mick" Michaelis took third in this 284-pegger match and zipped to his 7th All-American team honors, finishing the season with a rush (1,526 MRP's) and 3rd place.)

Jay Fortunato from nearby Spartanburg, SC, finished 4th.

Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WI, tied for 9th and earned Grand Master...and a spot on the All-Central team, topping off a fine season's play with 1,105 MRP's.

Life Master Jim McManus, Milwaukee, WI, nailed the 160-pegger Consolation, finishing the season with 800+ MRP's. Local Larry Phifer took 2nd, followed by Texan Clyde Anderson (El Paso) and Bob Julian in 3rd and 4th. Julian completed another fine season following his 1994 National Championship and finished as another All-Central region player (1,030MRP's).

Local Bob Gombatz, in the MRP race all season, nailed the Friday Early Bird (212 entrants), but alas, scored only 8 MRP's for the weekend. Nevertheless, he earned All-American honors, finishing 4th with 1,489 MRP's and had an outstanding season.

What a wonderful and appropriate site for a commemorative Crib tournament.

Elsewhere in this issue you will read the results of our recent ACC Board of Directors election and Cathy Perkins' account of the balloting and counting procedures.

My congratulations to the 25 Directors who were elected to serve your growing association. Unfortunately, the cutdown from 30 Directors

to 25, sees some familiar names left off the Directorate, but we know we can still count on their expertise and enthusiasm for the good of the ACC.

Our thanks to Mrs. Perkins and her score of ballot-counters for their great tally effort.

After all is said and done, however, we're confused about one thing: the vote turnout, with only 775 ballots being cast this year.

Looking up the record we find that we're at an all-time high in membership, yet our voting record diminishes:

1988: 5,277 members, 31.5% votes cast;
1989: 5,258 members, 34.0% votes cast;
1993: 6,526 members, 14.7% votes cast;
1995: 6,654 members, 11.6% votes cast.

Does this indicate a lack of interest or can it be interpreted to mean that the membership is satisfied with our administration and its operation? We hope it's the latter.

Another front-runner for MRP honors, Robert Medeiros (Quincy, MA) failed to advance in the best 4 of 7 matches, but this rookie pegger also had an outstanding season, very nearly winning top honors for the season. He finished 2nd, scoring 1,650 MRP's.

The National Open is noted for many cribbage events, beginning with Gombatz's win in the Friday Early Bird. Al Schaefer, Milwaukee, nailed the Loser's Losers (114 players). Schaefer also earned a spot on the All-Central Region team, finishing the year with an even 999 MRP's. The Last Roundup (80 players) saw Wayne Hittle, Raynham, MA come through with a win, followed by the High Rollers event...won by local Jim Townsend.

Directors Bob Gombatz, Catherine Perkins, Russ Perkins, Tom Miller and Howard Baum, with help from many others, ran an excellent tournament...and reported some \$43,990 was paid out to the 284 contestants. Players came from 29 states and Canada.

Vignettes From Raleigh

An interesting (visually) match seen at Raleigh was a battle of the hats. Bill Campbell, wearing a wild, floppy hat with moldy berries (?) attached had a tough battle with Russ Perkins. Perkins also was wearing a huge cowboy style hat. The winner? The hats!

An important match found Rit Alkas and Bob Gombatz hard at it in the final 64 round. Both players had a shot at the national championship, with the winner in the driver's seat. This match was highly unusual, as both players were determined to intimidate the other with fast play. The furious-paced match went to Alkas, 4-3 (one game being a skunk in Alkas's favor). The time? 42 minutes to play the six games! Seven minutes a game is, indeed, very fast!

Frank Abernathy, Clayton, NC, had the truly perfect hand. He held 5-5-5-5 dealing and cut a jack...and that's **30 points!** And Frank comes up with this question: "What ACC charter member has never played in a sanctioned event?" The answer: His wife, Joyce!

Another battle royal found Life Masters Syl Lulinski and Mick Michaelis in a final 64 match. This time around, Michaelis prevailed...and he went on to 3rd place and All-American honors!

Marlene Lazachek, Milwaukee, WI, nailed 2nd in the High Roller...and with all this extra loot to give her added motivation has volunteered to help Bob McCabe with the monthly Master Point lists.

Rit Alkas Heads Up 15th All-American Team

National ACC Statistician Bob McCabe released the final standings for the 1995 cribbage season, and Rit Alkas, Manchester, CT leads the field and takes honors for this cribbage year.

Alkas won the title in grand style by winning the season's last event...and a prestigious one at that...the National Open! And by winning, Alkas very nearly has earned his LifeMaster, having earned some 5,886 lifetime.

Robert Medeiros, a player from Quincy, MA, playing in his first year in ACC sanctioned meets very nearly came away with the title, scoring a hefty 1,650 MRP's and finished the year a solid 2nd!

Robert "Mick" Michaelis, recently inducted into the Cribbage Hall of Fame came on like gangbusters the last three months of the season, and this Marinette, WI pegger finished 3rd with 1,526 MRP's.

Bob Gombatz and Brian Heroux had a shot at winning the title in Raleigh, but the cards didn't cooperate...and they finished 4th and 6th. Heroux is the ACC's youngest Master pegger...and is very nearly a Grand Master (3,941 lifetime). Gombatz terrorized the Eastern Region all season, and came close to taking all the marbles. He is nearing his Life Master, having earned 5,795 lifetime.

Stephen Reynolds, Concord, CA, held the lead or was not far from it all year, opted not to attend the National Open and settled for 5th place (1,446). Darrel Miotke, Sublimity, OR, also opted not to attend, and finished a stellar season scoring 1,414 (and 7th). DeLynn Colvert, *Cribbage World's* editor took home his 10th All-American honor by finishing 8th. Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA copped her 4th All-American honor and finished 9th with 1,291. Schmidt was National Champion in 1992. George Bickford, W. Springfield, MA had a solid season and took home 10th and the last spot on the All-American team.

*The new BOD consists of 25 members. Mick Michaelis was the fifth candidate elected from Wisconsin. The ACC's Bylaws forbids more than four members from one state, therefore, candidate no. 26 is elected (Larry Hassett). The composition of the new Board will be ten members from the Central Region, eight from the West and seven from the East. ACC Bylaws allow no more than ten members from one Region, no fewer than six from each Region.

Balloting Process

Catherine Perkins, Bear Creek, NC, served as election Chairwoman, and since she was on the ballot, the following procedure was established:

A box was rented at the local post office in the name of the ACC, and was used ONLY for incoming ballots. The local postmistress sorted and banded the ballots and they were sealed in large manilla envelopes at the post office. On July 28 the envelopes containing the ballots were moved to a safe deposit box at the North Raleigh Hilton. On Saturday, July 30, a group of cribbage players opened the sealed envelopes, counted and tallied the ballots, immediately after opening the envelopes. The ballot counters recorded, on each ballot, the number of votes cast per each ballot. The ballots were divided into groups of 50, counted by one person reading to another, and then cross tallied. In each group of 50, if the number of votes per person did not equal the number of votes cast per group, recounts were conducted immediately. 775 ballots were cast, and 11,252 votes were marked.

Eastern Region Completes Stellar Season Robert Medeiros, Harry Palmer, Mary Murphy Grab New England Titles

The Eastern Region wrapped up the 1995 season with three New England events (and the National Open in Raleigh) culminating a stellar season. This Region dominated ACC play with many regional players earning top honors nationally.

New England lead the way in sanctioned play this past season, and the season's ending events added new laurels to many established players.

Hockomock Classic, Taunton, MA, June 24, 25:

Robert Medeiros continued his assault on the boards by winning this sizeable 142-pegger event, adding yet another 160 MRP's to his nation-leading point total. This Quincy, MA rookie pegger has streaked to some 1,600+ MRP's in winding down the 1995 season. Roger McGillicuddy, Stoughton, MA took 2nd, followed by Marge Pistone, Bridgewater, MA, and Jack Howsare, Virginia Beach, VA, in 3rd and 4th. Tony Del Tufo, W. Bridgewater, MA edged Charlie Burgess, E. Greenwich, RI for the 88-pegger Consolation title. Two top-ranked players added MRP's with high finishes: Brian Heroux, Woonsocket, RI tacked on 115 MRP's to zip to the 1,400 mark, and George Bickford, W. Springfield, MA, added another 155 MRP's to move up to the 1,300 mark.

Maine Open, Westbrook, ME, July 9: A record 118 peggers played this event and another Eastern Region frontrunner took the title: Harry Palmer, W. Springfield, MA. Tony Del Tufo came on strong the latter part of the 1995 season and finished 2nd. Fred McGibney, S. Burlington, VT, nailed 3rd (and was recently elected to the ACC's BOD). Frank Reddy, Swampscott, MA, took 4th. Brian Heroux won the 76-pegger Consolation, with John Groz, a long way from his Poinciana, FL home, taking 2nd. Rit Alkas, Manchester, CT, took qualifying honors in the Main Event, adding 40 big MRP's in his drive for the national championship.

West Side Summer Sizzler, W. Springfield, MA, July 16:

The last NE event of the season was directed by Harry Palmer, and he reports that Mary Murphy, Springfield, MA took home the marbles...and 140 MRP's in this 122-player event. Last year's rookie of the year, Richard Brault, Palmer, MA, finished 2nd. Earle Remington, Cumberland, RI, and Dudley Dumaine, Weston, MA, took 3rd and 4th. Carl Palmer, Northridge, ME nailed the 88-pegger Consolation, with Elmer Tole, Walpole, NH taking 2nd. And there was Robert Medeiros in 3rd...and picking up another 41 MRP's.

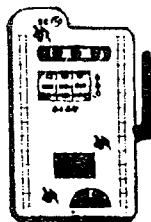

DeLynn Colvert Takes Devil Mountain Caper

The last event in the Western Region this cribbage season, the Devil Mountain Caper in Martinez, CA, was won by *Cribbage World* editor DeLynn Colvert. In winning this 144-pegger event, Colvert moved past the 1,300 MRP mark for the year. Pat Coffey, Concord, CA came within a whisker of winning, owning a 3-0 lead in the best 4 of 7 final, but his cards went dead and had to settle for 2nd. Dick Combie, Santa Clara, CA, and Jesse Jarrell, Pittsburg, CA took 3rd and 4th. Steve Reynolds, a Western Region MRP leader, tacked on some 181 MRP's with a top-qualifying (37 GP's) and 5th place finish...and heads the region with 1,400+ MRP's, culminating an excellent season's play.

Marilyn Andersen, Grass Valley, CA picked up the Consolation win (66 peggers), Jackie Doppelt, Vacaville, CA, Howard Mustain, Castro Valley, CA, and Adrian Levy, Lafayette, CA finished 2,3,4. Millie Coffey, Concord, CA posted an excellent 9/9 20 GP qualifying card, and Levy also posted a Grand Slam.

Friday doubles were won by locals Emmett Schumer and Rita Larsen. Bill Robe from nearby Pittsburg, CA won the Saturday High Rollers.

Mary Gladish, with help from Heidi Glashan (and others) ran a first-class tournament, and are planing on renewing this event again next July. The Diablo Lions netted \$733 from the players, donated to charity.

Julie Tuckett, Ron Hirschman Have Tough Day

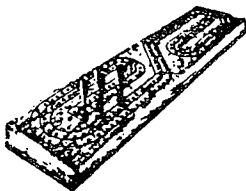

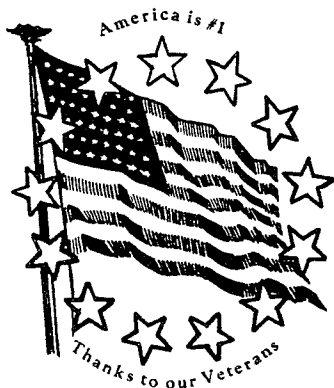

Another Viewpoint

In response to Tom Mentock of Sheridan, WY. Counting 4 of a kind is a case of viewpoint. He may look at it as 6 pairs = 12. I look at it as 3 of a kind = 6×4 possible trios = 24.

Ask him how he would count this example: 6 of hearts, 6 of diamonds, 6 of spades = 6 (yes or no?) 6 of hearts, 6 of diamonds, 6 of clubs = 6 (yes or no?) 6 of hearts, 6 of spades, 6 of clubs = 6 (yes or no?) 6 of diamonds, 6 of spades, 6 of clubs = 6 (yes or no?) $6 \times 4 = 24$ points!

Also, have him explain the use of his analogy of the license plate 5-5555. There are no hands in cribbage containing 5-fives. I didn't get the point or relativeness of that statement.


