Central Region Doubleheader Danielski Takes MGM Shelstad Tops In St. Paul

MGM Open, Green Bay, WI: Frank Danielski, a Masterpegger from Appleton, came through with his first Main Event championship by winning the huge 440-pegger MGM Open February 25. With the win, Danielski is zeroing in on his Grand Master as his lifetime MRP's are at the 3,700 mark. He also joins the MRP race for this cribbage year with some 600 MRP's earned to date.

Frank Martello (WI) came close, but settled for 2nd. Life Master Warren Sondericker (WI) is back on track by taking 3rd, followed by Master Walt Chowanec (WI) in 4th.

Jeff Lui (WI) nailed the qualifying round with a nice 38 18 +166 to take home the top "Q" prize.

But on Friday night, the MGM always has the record crowd...as this is doubles night! This year, some 308 teams (that's some 616 players) sat down for the annual event, and two local peggers, Mathes and Pacet, came away with the top prize, winning 8 of 10 games (2 skunks).

The Friday night High Roller saw Dennis Ulberg (WI) take home the bacon, winning 7 of 9, 16 +111, as a record 38 peggers made a run at the high stakes.

On Saturday night, 192 peggers pegged for sizeable prizes, and local Bob Brown scored a

grand slam 8/8 (19) +188 to win honors. Marlene Lazachek (WI) also score an 8/8 grand slam to take 2nd.

Life Master Jim McManus, the Milwaukee whiz, came through in the 210-pegger Consolation, edging Tom Borkowski (MI) in the final playoff match. Dale Rohm (WI) finished 3rd, followed by Roberta Schweig (IL) in 4th. Her broken leg failed to dampen her pegging skills, as she once again had a high finish.

In the Last Chance, Ron Koziol (WI) came away the winner.

Tom Gallagher, Bob Miller, and Jerry Lemke, and crew hosted the Central Region's premier event in fine fashion...and even the weather cooperated this year, as a little sunshine came through (the thermometer wasn't below zero!).

Capital City Classic, St. Paul, MN:

Pete Shelstad kept honors in his home state of Minnesota as he zipped to the title in the 196-pegger (recordcrowd) Capital City Open on March 3. His final match with Bob Chase (MN) was a close one, but Shelstad prevailed and copped the \$1,200 top prize. Chase took home a nice \$900.

The President's Column

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 25th Anniversary of the World Championship Cribbage Tournament that I started 'way back in 1972 will be held in Quincy, CA, on May 3-4-5, 1996.

The sponsoring Rotary Club is adding \$5,000.00 to the prize fund, in appreciation of the support that has been shown to this tournament and its contribution to the club's community projects over the years.

Also, for the first time, the tournament will be held over a 3-day period, rather than the one-day event it has been in the past, Mike Taborski and Dan Smith, co-directors, are expecting a record turnout for this gala event.

A Saturday night banquet will honor all past winners of the WCCT as well as ACC Hall of Famers and board members who will attend. We've issued a special invitation to all board members and hope that we get enough to conduct a "pre-tournament" tournament among the directors, to see who's the "Best of the Board."

World Championship, you say? How does a little town in the middle of the Northern Sierras rate such a prestigious title?

Back in 1972, after a long hard winter, when the loggers (main industry of the area) were fretting about getting back to work, I decided to hold a countywide cribbage tournament. You see, the loggers had nothing to do all winter but hang out in the bars and play cribbage...so I thought: "Why not, before they go back to work in the woods, get them all together to determine who is the best cribbage player in the county?"

I suggested the idea to the late Bob Moon, a saavy Chinese friend who was the manager of the Plumas County Chamber of Commerce, offering to underwrite the tournament as a promotion event sponsored by my four county newspapers. We met at the local watering hole to discuss the idea over a drink and he agreed to help.

We had another drink and he offered the suggestion that the tournament be a "state championship" since he had friends in Sacramento and San Francisco who fancied themselves as cribbers and would like to be included.

We had another drink and decided to expand our view: "Hell, there's no cribbage tournament known as the World Championship...so let's just call it that and go globally."

During its 25-year existence, many have questioned the name, but nobody has ever challenged it, and it has been sanctioned as such ever since the ACC was first organized...the oldest sanctioned tournament alive. Starting off its first year with about 50 participants, it grew over the years to nearly 400 players and has now settled down to about 250 every year. And we've had players from England and Germany to make it truly a "world" event.

In addition, we take credit for spreading the ACC gospel and helping start some two-dozen cribbage tournaments in California, Nevada and Oregon by sharing our know-how and our mailing list.

For a GREAT time, join me in Quincy in early May. It's easy to find, fly into Reno, drive north of highway 395, take a left turn at Hallelujah Junction and it's 75 miles west on highway 70. See you there!

April 15th is an important date for two reasons. One, it's the day your income tax is due, and two, it's the postal deadline for board members, tournament directors and Grass Roots Club directors to cast their ballots for the ACC Hall of Fame. Remember, you can vote for one or for all six nominees. (See story in this issue.)

Mark McClure Continues Winning

Mark McClure won \$2,800 for taking 5th at the record-breaking JPW/ACC Open in Reno...and upon returning home to Anchorage, AK, went on to win the Alaska State Championship the very next week!

In topping the 59 peggers, McClure has picked up a whopping 319 MRP's in the space of only 10 days!

Local Raldo Estridge finished 2nd, followed by two other Anchorage players in 3rd and 4th...Ron Juliussen and J. D. Hahn.

Don Warfield, another local pegger, was top qualifier.

LeRoy Hayden nailed the 25-pegger Consolation, and Shelley Mesceda finished 2nd.

Director Kevin Mesceda reports that this event will be scheduled again next year.

Northwest's Granddaddy Event Colvert Takes 19th Annual NW Open

DeLynn Colvert, Cribbage World editor, snapped a prolonged slump by winning the 19th annual Northwest Open in Baker City, OR...and won his nation-leading 26th sanctioned Main Event.

Ken Capper, (OR) finished a strong 2nd in this 76pegger match...and has now finished 1-2-3 in recent Northwest events, and continues one of the best streaks on record.

Tom Anderson from nearby LaGrande, OR took 3rd, followed by Jo Kirby, Richland, WA, in 4th.

Darren Black, Portland, OR, took qualifying honors, and is near the MRP lead in the Western Region, standing at 900+.

Some 52 peggers played the Consolation and Kathy Farrens (ID) took 1st. Gary Sand (WA), Leslie Hein (WA), and Lea Hornbeck finished 2-3-4.

Local Steve Palmer edged his grandmother (Sandy Palmer) in the Crybaby event. Shawna Brown (ID) won the Time Passer (7/7), Betty & Gil Johnson (WA) nailed the doubles. Mike Reich (OR) took the Saturday night game, and DeLynn Colvert (MT) won the High Rollers.

Jones Hom Takes Willows

On February 17, Jones Hom was hot! He not only qualified first, but went on to win the championship in the playoffs. Dennis Gage and Jeff Monroe, two peggers from Napa, CA finished 2nd and 3rd. Monroe picked up some 136 MRP's for his showing, and he joins the national MRP race for honors (with nearly 800 MRP's). Jim Langley (CA) took 4th.

Director Carl Martens reports he will schedule this event again next year (third Saturday in February, 1997).

Record Crowd In Florida Larry Phifer Tops Orlando Open

Director Paul Barnes reported that the recent Greater Orlando Open has set a new attendance mark...a whopping 151 peggers! And the players came from nationwide, many of them "snowbirds" from the northland.

Larry Phifer, a pegger from Raleigh, NC, took home the marbles, edging Russell Cook (FL) in the final match. Marvin Lang (IL) came in 3rd...and earned his Master rating. Dean Jeffers (WI) took 4th.

Bob Gombatz, Raleigh, NC, nailed top qualifying honors and finished in the 9-16 bracket, tacking on another 121 MRP's to zip to the top of the Eastern Region's MRP list for this cribbage season.

Locals Virgil Townsend and John Blowers went 1-2 in the 90-pegger Consolation. Bobby Stuart, Georgia's premier player, took 3rd, followed by George Bickford (MA) in 4th. Bickford is the Eastern Region's Tournament Commissioner who makes a habit of winning on the boards.

The players donated \$1 to the Cribadier General's program according to director Barnes. He reports that he will direct an event June 7-9 at the same site in Daytona Beach that will be used for the 1998 Grand National.

Synopsis Board of Directors Meeting Reno, NV, February 1, 1996

All members present. Sept. '95 minutes reviewed and accepted.

McGibney reviewed Financial Statement for last six months of 1995. He noted increase in revenue and assets reflecting dues & sanctioning fee increase. Approved unanimously.

Shimp reported audit not complete as promised. Records need to be retrieved at this point and asked for committee to conduct audit in Raleigh, NC in July '96. No assistance volunteered as per CW request. Kooistra, Bernard, Hatcher volunteered for committee. Perkins offered assistance of her Mary Bowes. CW to ask for volunteers to contact Perkins.

Horigan presented proposal for Master Point system revision. After much discussion the motion passed 14-10, 1 abstention. New system will begin with new MPR year, Aug. 1, '96.

Master Points for qualifying round in doubleelimination events discussed in detail and a motion to award 2/3 points to undefeated and 1/3 points to once defeated to approx. top 12.5%, based on round robin tables was passed, effective Aug. 1, '96.

This motion revised to award points on equal basis throughout the approx. 12.5% whether or not they had been defeated. Passed unanimously.

Restructuring Committee report given by Ramos. New equipment purchased for Monroe (\$2,900). GR computer program completed and in process of working out "bugs." Next step will be for program to allow GR directors to input data via electronic means. Program should be complete in March '96. McCabe advised of the \$100 to upgrade the MPR system and he will be updating shortly.

Ramos reported all key positions have backup people with exception of *Cribbage World* editor, Colvert. CW to once again publish request for volunteer for that position. Ramos making directory of key jobs, complete with job descriptions and individuals responsible and backups.

Hornbeck is now heading up Cribadier General Program. He will be mailing 1-page letter outlining Junior Events.

Colvert reported on CW printing at Lightning Printing in Minnesota. Early problems solved and working smoothly. The ACC is saving approx. \$800/month.

Expulsion of Robert Irving for allegedly altering scorecard discussed. Approved unanimously. Irving to be notified by registered mail. Bickford to notify regional tournament directors.

Hatcher reported that Ethics Committee has resolved

Doppelt/Chief Solano dispute. Hatcher withdrew discussion of publication of Members Expulsion or Suspension after some informative discussion.

Perkins moved to delete the word 'playing' from the second paragraph of the Code of Ethics. The sentence now reads "In view of the Above, the following are considered to be 'unacceptable' practices and are..." Motion passed.

Perkins moved to add "Actions that are detrimental to the objectives of the American Cribbage Congress as delineated in the Constitution and by-laws." Motion carried.

Samet discussed 2 new awards. He withdrew his proposed Junior award until he could discuss Junior play with Zeisler and Hombeck. "Rookie of Year" award discussed and will be effective Aug. 1 '96 with eligibility to be decided by date of membership (no earlier than prior March). This would allow 17 months for eligibility. Samet also proposed a "rookie team." Motion approved.

Bickford moved to hold Grand National at Daytona Beach, FL on Oct. 23-25. '98. Motion passed. Monroe discussed 1996 Grand National. Flyers passed out. Monroe reported all going as well as could be expected. Barrett stated Grand National in Wisconsin Dells, WI on Sept. 26-28 is still on line.

Hassett discussed ACC Rules and Regulations being combined into one document. President Bey suggested sending copies of each section of files to appropriate committee for updating and condensing. Bey to send Rein a list of committees for expediting process.

Hassett reviewed standards for tournament reporting concerning expenses and benefits under the same categories. Perkins will chair Ad Hoc Committee on subject with Fingleton and Hatcher assisting.

Barrett reported 6 HOF nominations: Joe Siegle, Joe Ramos, Frank Zabrowski, Jeff Shimp, Gene "Moose" Beigler, and Elbert Hargesheimer. Problems with reproduction and mailing costs of nomination writeups discussed. Rein moved to allow Barrett to condense letters as necessary for this year and to add criteria "one-page typewritten" in the future. Approved.

Barrett moved to go on the "Internet." Information provided regarding costs and method. Motion passed.

Bey discussed letter from Joe Siegle to charge sanctioning fee for Junior Program. BOD felt it would be acceptable.

President Bey discussed Silver Anniversary edition of World Championship in Quincy, CA. He invited BOD to this three-day event (May 3-5), indicating he would buy lunch on Fri.

Ramos moved to allow \$750 to Monroe for extra help during tax season for his membership duties. Motion passed.

A suggestion to have elections of officers every two years to coincide with election of BOD was discussed. It was noted that this was a change in the Constitution/ByLaws and would need 30 day advance notice.

Hofbauer moved that it be mandatory to return entry fees to individuals who were unable to attend a tournament. Motion passed 13-12.

Hofbauer moved that "late fees" be given back to players in player benefits. Motion failed. Proposal was referred to an Ad Hoc Committee (Shimp). Motion passed.

Monroe moved for a new toll-free telephone number under the new '888' system. Approved.

Bernard asked to extend a "Thank You" to the Sands for hosting TOC and JPW/ACC Open and for BOD lunch and beverages. Rein moved to hold TOC JPW/ACC Open at Sands in 1997. Passed unanimously.

Julian moved to adjourn. Passed. Minutes recorded by Rein, Recording Secretary.

The new system would reward high finishes with a greater percentage of MRP's in contrast to the present system that rewards low finishes with the bulk of MRP's awarded.

However, some board members feel the new system still has some "bugs" that need to be ironed out. President Ev Bey will call for a mail vote that may delay implementation of the new system, and will give members of the BOD a chance to re-evaluate the numbers, and/or fine tune the numbers. Cribbage World will keep our members informed as developments occur.



Rasmussen Amazing

I continue to be amazed by George "Ras" Rasmussen and his database of discarding statistics from real game play. Once again, George is in complete agreement with Cribbage Master, which determines its results on the basis of mathematical probability theory and a database derived from analysis of millions of random deals. In the March issue of CW (pg. 18), George determines that for 2,000-plus situations with a Queen-nine discard to the opponent's crib, the crib will score an average of 4.087 points. Cribbage Master says 4.082. George's number for a King-six discard is 4.115. Cribbage Master's is 4.110. George's numbers give a 0.028 point advantage to Queen-nine, which is exact agreement with Cribbage Master.
