Colvert Earns ACC's First Two-Star

Bayard Lliteras Tops Vets Day In Reno

Newly crowned Grand Master Bayard Lliteras is at it again! After winning Grand National XII (and topping some 406 peggers) in October, 1993, he has won yet another whopper. This time around he nailed the Veterans Day Classic in Reno! This event sported some 380 peggers and came with a nifty \$2,175 top prize. After qualifying 77th (of 95). Lliteras's cards warmed to the task, and he topped off the tournament by winning the final match 4-1.

Annett Eiffert, a pegger from Citrus Heights, CA, came close, but simply could not match Lliteras's hot run, and she settled for a nice 2nd...and \$1,625.

Jackie Doppelt, Vacaville, CA nailed 3rd (and a sizeable \$1,350), followed by local Dan Burandt (\$1,075).

Cribbage World editor DeLynn Colvert earned the ACC's first Two-Star in grand style as he topped the huge field in the qualifying round with a 37 17 +298. He continued on to finish 10th...and earned a whopping 295 MRP's to easily wing it over the 15,000 mark.

Some 256 peggers played the Consolation, and Bill McCammon from nearby Incline Village, NV took home the top prize (\$850). Omer Bolduc, Salinas, CA, Wayne Steinmetz, Milwaukee, WI, and Brenda Palmer, W. Springfield, MA, finished 2-3-4.

Friday night's action sported a huge doubles event, and two Californians took home the top prize...Clifford Clark and Mike Hayden. This pair split the \$880 winner's prize.

Saturday night had a High Roller event and Walt Christenbury, Gig Harbor, WA scored a nice 157+50 to top a very tough field. He took home \$550. George Rasmussen, Chehalis, WA nailed 2nd (\$450)...and his mathematical analysis of cribbage continues to pay him dividends (see his "Tips" in recent Cribbage World's).

The Sands Casino hosted an unusual Sunday night game, and Alaskan Mike Rowe took honors with a 19 8 +211. 211 spread points in a 9-game match is very high, indeed!

And as usual, Reno continues to be a mecca for cribbage, attested by yet another huge crowd. Bill & Dorthalee Irons, with help from a bevy of volunteers ran another first class event...and the Veteran's Fund was enriched by some 15% of the entry fees. The Sands Regency provided the players with the usual pastries and coffee three days running...and there was Barbara Woodward, once again putting in a long weekend in support of this event.

Jerry Dickinson Resigns

In a very unselfish gesture, Jerry Dickinson of Mt. Horeb, WI has resigned as a member of the ACC Board of Directors so that the new Grass Roots Commissioner, Gene Mikulsky of Sobieski, WI, could be appointed in his stead.

Acting with the unanimous consent of the Executive Committee, I am most happy to make this appointment.

Jerry, longtime Grass Roots Commissioner, sincerely felt that his successor, Gene, should be an ACC Director, but the By-Laws limitation of no more than four from any one state precluded Mikulsky's appointment unless there was a Wisconsin vacancy. Jerry provided that opening, willingly, without hesitation.

Besides spearheading a very successful Grass Roots program for many years...since its inception by Founding President Joe Wergin...Dickinson capably handled the rewrite of the ACC's Constitution and By-Laws, as well as other important tasks handed to him by the Board of Directors.

We'll miss Jerry's thoughtful counsel on the BOD, but we know we can count on him for any other job that might fall his way.

I first met Jerry when I visited Joe in Madison some years ago and we drove out to Mt. Horeb to talk to Jerry about the Grass Roots program. After our discussions, we got into a 4-handed crib game, each player pegging on his own board. As luck would have it, my board was turned 180-degrees from the others and I wound up pegging backwards, losing \$\$\$. It'll always by Mt. Horrible to me!

At the last Board meeting, the Directors gave the Executive Committee permission to spend up to \$5,000 between meetings, if necessary. Realizing that we have long been at risk in possible litigation or court suits, the Executive Committee looked into the purchase of Directors', Trustees' and Officers' Liability Insurance.

We contacted several insurance brokers among our membership and obtained 4 or 5 bids, some ranging as high as \$2,650 per year.

We finally settled on Shimoff & Associate's \$1,100 low bid from Federal Insurance Company (Chubb) for \$1-million coverage each loss/aggregate with a \$1,000 deductible for each loss. This coverage offers non-profit organization liability which covers all Directors and Officers and employees of their management and professional exposures, as well as their publishing exposures (i. e., libel, slander, defamation of character).

In our 17 years of existence, we have never been threatened or exposed to any legal action. Now we can afford it, so it's time that we be sure we're not running "bare."

New England Rolling

Heroux Tops Massachusetts Open Alkas Cops Dante Club

New England continues to host sizeable cribbage tournaments as the recent Massachusetts Open drew some 132 peggers on September 15 and the Dante Club Open fielded 130 peggers on November 3.

Brian Heroux topped the Massachusetts Open, and this two-time All-American from Woonsocket, RI is off and running in this year's early going. Donna Gavin, a local pegger, finished 2nd, followed by George Johnson (Fitchburg, MA) and Ford Jewer (Wakefield, RI) in 3rd and 4th.

Richard Kelliher (MA) topped the 76-pegger Consolation, with Dolores Rego (MA), John McReady (MA), and Dorothy Boreham (MA) in 2-3-4.

A highlight of this event was the ACC's 3rd 29hand. This \$100 gem was scored by Bart Sargent, a pegger from Westwood, MA.

Director David Clemmey will play this event again next September 21, 1997. Clemmey also reported that the Heart Association benefited \$132 from the player's dollar donation.

Rit Alkas, Manchester, CT, begins the new season on a winning note as he captured the 130-pegger Dante Club event in West Springfield on November 3. Alkas won the National Championship in 1995 and continues his winning ways. Jack Gauthier, New Britain, CT took 2nd, followed by two newly crowned Masters...Cindy Veradt, Taunton, MA, and Frank Gallo, Cranston, RI...in 3rd and 4th.

Brenda Palmer, a 1996 All-American from W. Springfield, MA copped the 78-pegger Consolation. Richard Brault, Palmer, MA nailed 2nd, followed by John Cross, W. Springfield, MA, and Dudley Dumaine, Weston, MA, in 3rd and 4th.

Director George Bickford has scheduled this event again next November 2, 1997. He has directed this event 20 years and says "I think it is time to turn over the reins to someone else." Charley Finley, Jim Law and Tim Fiorini may do the directing next year.

Paul Kilkelly, Waukegan, IL finished 2nd (after qualifying 22nd), and he, too, took home a sizeable 174 MRP's. Richard Kurz (WI) and Life Master Jim McManus, Milwaukee, took 4th.

McManus, with this lofty finish, topped the 10,000 MRP mark and becomes only the 6th player in the ACC's history to earn MRP's in the five-digit range...and his One Star!

Ginger Nelson, Madison, WI, topped the huge field in the qualifying round... and took home a nice 53 MRP's (and 5 more in the playoffs) for the effort.

The big news in the 86-pegger Consolation saw Martha Fingleton, Milwaukee, finish in the 5-8 bracket, and picked up the ACC's 23rd Life Master award.

Don Flesch, Brookfield, WI, won this event, topping Dan McCarthy, Berlin, WI, in the final playoff match. John Syftestad, Mt. Horeb, WI, nipped One Star Joe Bernard, Libertyville, IL, for 3rd place. Bernard, after qualifying 1st, earned yet another 54 MRP's.



Director Steve Leech kicked off cribbage action in Beatrice, Nebraska on October 20, with the Inaugural Homestead Open.







Minimum Paybacks For Sanctioned Tournaments

The Amertican Cribbage Congress specifies that all sanctioned tournaments must have minumum paybacks of 85%.

The ACC also specifies that all satellite events must have a minimum of 90% paybacks.

Fairness to the players is paramount. Prizes and formats of each event should be prominently posted *before* play concludes (and players should know upon signing on for an event what percentage receive prizes).

Bruce Bowman Has The Odds

I've calculated the odds of getting various numbers of 28-hands in 1,800 deals. Your determination (Nov. CW) of the chances of getting one 28-hand in 1,800 deals as 1,800 in 15,028, or 1 in 8.45 is only approximately correct despite the fact that the chances of getting a 28 hand in one deal is 15,028. That the correct odds are not 1,800 in 15,028 can be seen by examining a similar situation. Consider rolling a die and hoping to get, say, a 5. The probability of this event is 1 in 6 (compared to 1 in 15,028). Suppose we consider rolling the die 2 times (compared to 1,800 hands, i.e., 1,800 tries to get a 28-hand). We ask, what would be the probability of getting one 5? The correct answer is not 2 in 6. There are 36 equally likely outcomes of rolling a die twice, viz., 1-1, 1-2, 1-3...6-4, 6-5, 6-6. It is easily seen that in 10 of these there is a single 5. Thus, the probability of getting one 5 is 10 in 36, or 2 in 7.2, not 2 in 6. Similarly, the odds of getting one 28-hand in 1,800 deals are not as good as 1 in 8.45. The odds are actually 1 in 9.41. Now, what about the probability of getting two 28-hands in 1,800 deals? Consider, again, rolling a die twice. What are the chances of getting two 5's? Easy. It's 1 in 36. So, just as your calculated odds for getting one 28-hand in 1,800 deals is a little off, so too is your result for two 28-hands. The correct answer for getting two 28hands is 1 in 157.1, not 1 in 125. The probability that there will be no 28-hands in 1,800 deals is 1 in 1.127, i.e., 88.7 in 100. The odds and equivalent probabilities for getting zero through four 28-hands in 1,800 deals are shown in the table below:

The actual chances of getting a 28-hand in any given deal are, of course, 15,579 in 234,122,980, or 1 in 15,028.113486.



Peer Play Controversy Continues

Sandy Floz, CW October issue comments on PEER play, is obviously a well intentioned relatively new member of the ACC. The reasons for having a PEER event (only one sanctioned in the country) is to give the novice and newer players a chance to earn some prize money in tournament play and ring up some Master Points in tough competition. Both feats are most difficult in blind draw seating.

Folz needs to understand that although the ACC gains several hundred new members each year, we lose about 3/4ths that number each year. Why such heavy attrition? People who fail to earn dollars and Master Points or Red Points, get fed up after a year or two and vote with their feet. They drop out. A PEER event at least gives them a better shot and keeps them interested. As we know, after the qualifying round no PEER edge remains.

Sandy should understand also that the October PEER event story comments that "11% of the games were by skunks" is a reference to random seating events where skunks will be about 14%. The rich get richer syndrome.

The ACC will never boast of many PEER tournaments. Those that may be initiated should be given support by everyone anxious to see the ACC go into an accelerated growth period. Joe Wergin, President Emeritus of the ACC, has long recognized and endorsed this approach. His consul in this matter should be praised, not ignored.

Shuffling Tidbit

Parade Magazine had the following: "You once said that researchers had determined that it takes 7 ordinary shuffles to thoroughly mix a deck of cards. I regularly play a solitaire game that requires 2 decks. How many times should I shuffle them to get the same result? Ans: 9 times. 6 decks require 12 shuffles. Casino owners won't be pleased to hear this, but fewer shuffles just aren't enough. More shuffles don't help much.

I've played GR for about a year and one tournament, and realize that many players don't shuffle 7 times as prescribed in the above Parade Magazine article. If clustering of cards occur due to weak shuffle, it naturally favors the dealer, who plays with two hands to his opponet's one. However, picking up the deck offered for a cut and shuffling further when warranted can cause bad feelings, expressed or implicit. Therefore, this suggestion: why not change the rules so the non-dealer shuffles. Should he prefer a soft shuffle, the dealer should be pleased. But chances are that in no time we'll see universal thorough shuffling in our cribbage get-togethers.

Smokers Face Discrimination

I just received my invite to the Tournament of Champions and I am sick and tired of the descrimination that is shown toward smokers. Most tournaments are going to non-smoking and the years I have been in the ACC this is the last one that I will put up with it.

Slow Player Problem?

Boyd McDonald (CA) wrote Cribbage World at length concerning slow play. He noted that one GR club has appointed a "Slow Player Trainer/ Coach." This person investigates reports of slow play and then determines, in conjunction with the slow player, what actions could be taken to speed up their play. Under no circumstances may a player criticize another player about slow play. The Trainer/Coach does the tactful instructing.

McDonald points out several areas to improve speed of play:

Cut down excessive conversation.

Shuffle 3 or 4 times with an over/under cut to conceal the bottom card is sufficient.

Be ready to count when it is your turn.

Take your breaks when you have an obvious wait for the next game.

Be ready for all aspects of play. Good, common sense will tell you when you are holding up play...simply looking at an empty chair next to you (on a regular basis) should give you a clue! Work on speeding up your play...15 minutes maximum per game!


