Grand National Preview

Shawn Andrusko Tops In Wisconsin Dells

Wisconsin Dells, WI, is where the ACC pegging action is in September as Patrick and Linda Barrett directed the annual Wisconsin Dells Classic...and three weeks later Grand National XVI. November's *Cribbage World* will make a full report on the annual GN bash, but this issue will focus on the large (174 pegger) Classic played September 5-7.

Shawn Andrusko pegging out of Minneapolis held off newly crowned Grand Master Al Schaefer (Slinger, WI) for the title, and took home a nifty \$1,400 and a piece of the national MRP lead in the early going this cribbage year. John Williams, a Master pegger from Brooklyn Park, MN copped 3rd, followed by Les Kvien (IL) in 4th.

Elmer Morlock (Minneapolis) was smoking in the qualifying round, and scored a very nice 39 19 +255 to take honors. This scored propelled him to an All-Events win (62 GP's). Another Minneapolis pegger...David Jacobsen...tied his 62 GP score and shared this win.

112 peggers played the Consolation and the ACC's 8th ranked (lifetime) Duane Toll (Cudahy, WI) came away the winner. Toll is inching in on his One-Star rating. Todd Schaefer (Oakdale, MN) very nearly won the national title in last year's action (finishing 2nd) and he finished 2nd once again in Consolation play. Master Roberta Schweig (IL) nailed 3rd, followed by Mark Habighorst (WI) in 4th.

Director Barrett had a full array of events for the large crowd, and spirited play continued throughout the weekend. The Satellite winners:

I recently joined the electronic era, buying a home computer.

Thanx to Steve Sattler, publisher of the ACC's home page, we're well-represented on the world wide web.

Browsing and searching for "cribbage," we printed out some 70 colorful pages having to do with the grand 'ol game and the ACC. Besides the ACC material, there's also information about Sattler's Baltimore (MD) Cribbage Club, Paul Barnes' Greater Orlando (FL) Cribbage Club, George Bieber's Brass Pegs Cribbage Club of Portland, OR, and the Richmond (VA) Cribbage Club, all affiliated with the ACC.

Underwritten by the Sands Regency Hotel/Casino in Reno, NV, the ACC home page includes a history of the ACC, Master Rankings, the Tournament Trail by date and state, the top 50 players in each of our three Regions, information about our Youth Program, Grass Roots information, playing tips by some of our authors: Dan Barlow, John Chambers, DeLynn Colvert, and George Rasmussen, items on cribbage board collecting, etc.

Sattler was assisted by Roger Wilson of Boulder, CA as a web site production director, and Denny Moore of Napa, CA for custom software programming.

It's a fine representation for the ACC.

In addition, cribbage surfers can find a page listing Amusing Cribbage Facts; Carte Primus, a software cribbage game; Cribbage, Inc., a North American organization that operates an E-mail tournament; the National Cribbage Club of Abbotsford, B. C., Canada; as well as rules for 5-person and 6-person cribbage.

I know there's several cribbage games available for computers, I've seen them demonstrated at various tournaments. However, I found one on my computer, "Cribbage For Windows 95, Freeware," which I downloaded and have readily available for practice-play.

Joy Barnes Tops New England Inaugural

Joy Barnes, pegging out of DeLand, FL, (and fresh from earning her Master rating) nailed the 138-pegger New England Inaugural August 10 in Woonsocket, RI. The win came with 196 MRP's and "travelling money!"

Her road to the championship was not an easy one, as her last playoff match was with Brian Heroux...and he was pegging on his home turf. His second place finish was special, however, as it propelled him to the ACC's 28th Life Master (and he is the youngest).

Two other stellar peggers finished 3rd and 4th...Dorothy Boreham (MA) and Charlie Rapoza (MA). Rapoza also will hold this 4th place finish special, as it came with Grand Master honors (the ACC's 86th).

Emil Chrabaszcz (MA) nailed high qualifying honors with a 23 10/12 +216...and he is approaching his Lifer Master rating. A 23 GP card in a 12 game match scores 45 MRP's in the ACC's new scoring system.

Larry Phifer (NC) won the 80-pegger Consolation, with John Marshall (RI) taking 2nd. Warren Gallagher (MA) and Life Master Harry Palmer came in 3-4. Marshall scored the event's only 28-hand...and that makes it two years in a row he has pulled that trick!

Director Lee Norris also had a Team Event satellite and three highly ranked players pulled down first place...Brian Heroux, Rit Alkas, and Rob Medeiros. This trio won 22 games of the 36 played.

Norris reports that he will play it again next August 9. Mark your calendars.

Bobby Stuart was a long, long way from his home in Lawrenceville, GA on September 14. He was scratching for "gold" in Last Chance Gulch in Helena, MT. And he came up a winner, nailing the 58-pegger Capital City Classic, taking home \$400 and some 135 MRP's (after qualifying in the top 1/8).

Another pegger a long way from home was Laurie Logan (AZ), and she came close to taking the top prize, losing 2-3 to Stuart in the final match. Ken Daugherty (WA) grabbed 3rd, with local Ken Haab taking 4th.

I. V. Graham (MT) rolled to a great 40 18 +261 in the qualifying round...and that score is worth 70 MRP's under the new scoring system.

It appeared the locals voted to be kind to out-of-staters as Carol Henderson from San Diego took the 34-player Consolation. Jack Perkins (MT), rookie Kirsten Bessette (MT) (first tournament), and local Kathy Thompson finished 2-3-4.

Local GR club 25 ran the show, and under the guidance of Wes Walimaa, Walt & Tana Conell, and a bevy of helpers, ran a first class event, rolling out the red carpet with amenities for the players. And they paid a whopping \$80 to first round losers (with a \$40 entry)...an unheard of amount for that bracket. This largess is possibly responsible for the increase in attendance this year from last year. Their attendance was up some 61% (36 last year). The cribbage grapevine may be working...and perhaps the new scoring system will aid attendance in the smaller events. For example, I. V. Graham's 40 GRP qualifying score earned 70 MRP's...the same score at the ACC Open (with 1,000 players) would also earn 70 MRP's. The late Ed Horgan's concept of equal points for equal difficulty is, at last, finally at work.

PEER Draws 144

Frank Corrado Wins New England Championship

Local Frank Corrado nailed the 144-pegger New England Championship on August 24, in the ACC's only PEER grouping tournament. Pat Llewellyn (MA), Grand Master Charlie Finley, and Stel Gasparoni (MA) finished 2-3-4.

George Healy posted a nice 34 16 +174 in the qualifying round...and that scored 40 MRP's under the new system.

70 players played the Consolation and Stan Babiec (MA), a newly crowned Master pegger took home the top prize. Grand Master Lee Norris (RI) took 2nd, followed by new Master Joy Barnes (FL), and Ann Somers (MA) in 3rd and 4th.

Babiec had a memorable weekend, as he won two events. In addition to his Consolation win, he also took the Friday Candlelight Singles...and his Master rating was frosting on the cake.

Directors John Chambers and Joe Seigle reported a plethora of 28 and 29 hands. Maurice Bellemare (MA) scored the ACC's 2nd 29-hand of the new season (and \$100 from the ACC). David Harper, Paul DePuy, Malcolm Enos, and Don Shields pulled down the 28 hands. Syd Lampke and Marguerite McKenna took home the Doubles event.

Directors Chambers and Seigle will play this event again next year in August.

Disaster Strikes ACC Membership Roster

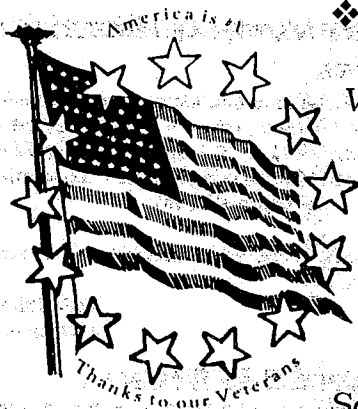
Jeff Monroe, our ACC's Membership Chairman, has our roster listed in a computer program...and disaster has struck. A thief broke into his office and stole the computer!

And it took him quite a while to score that elusive 29-hand...but he did...on September 4!

Bruce Bowman Does Flush Odds Arithmetic

Bruce Bowman has laid to rest the debate about the odds of getting a flush in your hand...or in the crib.

This numbers whizz has calculated that the odds of scoring a flush in your hand in 10.85 to 1 (4-card flush), or 45:18 to 1 for a five-card flush. The odds of scoring a 4 or 5 card flush is 8.75 to 1.

As for a crib flush, a worthless 4-card flush is 80 to 1. Getting the cut to match the suit of the other four cards (for a 5-point bonus) is 355 to 1!

CW quotes Bowman: "I found Ev Bey's column (Aug CW) about the relative difficulty of getting flushes in hand and in the crib to be thought provoking. The rarity of a five-card flush in the crib is great, so maybe it should be worth more than five points...or maybe four-card flushes should be awarded. On the other hand, getting a flush in the crib is mostly a matter of luck, so the award shouldn't be too great. (In any case I am NOT proposing a rules or scoring change.

...The in-the-crib probabilities are easily determined estimates, and the calculations assume that neither you nor your opponent considers the possibility of a flush in the crib when selecting discards. DeLynn's estimates for in-the-hand flush odds (1 in 10 and 1 in 50) are very close.

By the way, I don't think it was really fair to ask Russell Adams to estimate flush probabilities "By cogitation." Paper, pencil, a calculator, and a little bit of time are needed!"

Bruce, CW thanks you for your efforts in figuring these odds. The flush odds in the crib will be slightly higher than yours, since some players do make an effort not to throw two cards of matching suits; all other factors being equal. By the way, cribbage fans, check out Bowman's ad in this issue about his "Cribbage Master" computer program. Not only can you play computer cribbage, you can also check out odds on your crib discards.

CW received a letter from Russell Adams and he says "Who says mathematics is not negotiable?" He figures a flush every 30 hands, and a 5-card flush once in 150 hands. I'll go out on a limb and say a flush every SIX hands (by empirical knowledge...and the school of hard knocks). I'll agree with Bowman's 5-card flush odds of 45 to 1. Ed.

Facts About Our Deck of Cards

Did you know that there are three one-eyed face cards? The jack of spades, the jack of hearts...and the king of diamonds.

And CW bets you won't know these tidbits. All face cards have a common name (this goes back a long, long way).

The jacks are named:

Spades: Ogier

Hearts: LaHire

Diamond: Hector

Club: Lancelot

The queens are named:

Spade: Palas

Heart: Judith

Diamonds: Rachel

Club: Argina

The kings are named:

Spade: David

Heart: Charlemagne

Diamond: Caesar

Club: Alexander

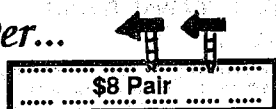

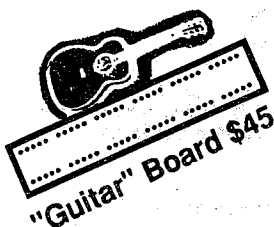

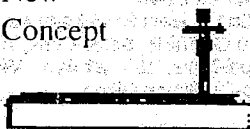
