National Open Kicks Off New Year

### Townsend Wins National Open Takes MRP Lead

With a new Master Rating Points system in place, the 24th National Open in Raleigh, NC kicked off a new year...and a new system to earn MRP's. The new year began on August 1...and on August 4th, the winner's crown was placed on Jim Townsend, a local pegger. He finally cracked the winner's circle after several attempts.

His win came the hard way, as he had to best the streaking One-Star Joe Bernard in the final match. In winning the match 4-2, Townsend nailed down a large purse, 196 MRP's, plus a bonus 30 MRP's for finishing in the top one-eighth (a new wrinkle for double-elimination events). In taking home 226 MRP's, Townsend kicks off the 1998 season as the number-one player nationwide.

Bernard, fresh from a huge win in Yankton two weeks earlier, very nearly won it all. After taking his first loss early in the third round (increasing his winning odds enormously), he nevertheless streaked to the final match before losing. Bernard confided to CW that the final-match loss cost him some \$3,200 in pool and purse winnings! Nevertheless, the past two weeks have handsomely rewarded his pegging efforts.



235 players entered the Main Event, and another 146 played the Consolation. Michael Burnham, Ackworth, GA, took home the bacon in the second-chance action...and took home 84 MRP's under the new system's scoring (in addition to any possible qualifying round MRP's...the top 1/8 score points in this round).

Peggy Goss, Beverly Hills, FL took 2nd, and begins the new season with 63 MRP's. She finished the 1997 season 51st in the Eastern Region, scoring 379 MRP's...and she begins the new year with a fine start. Marlene Lazachek, a Master pegger from the Milwaukee area took 3rd, and is inching in on her Grand Master, standing at over the 3,000 mark. Al Tenenbaum, Cranbury, NJ, is also over the 3,000 mark...and he took home 4th.

The National Open offers cribbage, cribbage, cribbage, and Brenda Palmer, W. Springfield, MA, fresh from being named to the 1997 All-American team, won the Friday Early Bird. A special event was played on Saturday, and Art Jonas, Fayetteville, NC took the top prize. Another popular event...the Losers Losers...saw Thomas Ballwig, Norfolk, VA win going away. The Last Roundup was captured by Ted Monroe, Honea Path, SC. None other than two-time national champion Bob Julian, the travelling pegger from Milwaukee, won the High Roller.

A highlight of the weekend's matches saw Lindsay Peever, Leesburg, FL, score a 29-hand...the first of the 1998 season, and \$100 from the ACC for this sanctioned gem! Dee Dee Burgess scored that elusive 28-hand (and will receive a framable plaque from the ACC).

Directors Catherine Perkins, Russ Perkins, and Tom Miller continue to run a first-class event, with the North Raleigh Hilton furnishing spacious playing areas, along with other top-quality amenities. Next year's event will wind down the 1998 season, and players will, once again, be in Raleigh to earn those season-ending MRP's! This year's match was scheduled a week after the 1997 cribbage season's closing bell, keeping some players at home.

#### Portland Summer Open Draws 188 Clair Morse Wins 1997 Final

Clair Morse, a Master pegger from Bend, OR finished the ACC's 1997 season in grand style. He won the 188-pegger Portland Summer Open. In the process, he tacked on another 200+ MRP's and pocketed over \$1,100 for a fine weekend of pegging. And he vaults upwards in the Western Region's MRP race, winding down the season with some 800 MRP's (and is among the Region's top ten).

Local Eugene Wilkerson came close to taking it all, but simply could not match Morse's run of cards, but, nevertheless had a great weekend, bringing home bushels of MRP's and a nice 2nd place check.

Bill Wakeman lead a large contingent of California peggers by taking 3rd, followed by Irving Busby, Spokane, WA, in 4th.

Joe Cover from nearby Salem nailed a great 39 18 +316 to easily take qualifying honors.

Leslie Hein began the 1997 season last August in this same event, and scored a 29-hand...and this time around scored a Consolation win. This Washougal, WA pegger has found a home in Portland! Bob Clark, Walnut Creek, CA picked up 2nd in this 132-pegger event. Young Jason Shumate, Kings Beach, CA, continues a fine run by taking 3rd, and Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) polished off a fine season by taking 4th. The 70 MRP's earned run his nation-leading MRP total to over 1,700.

This event was the final ACC-sanctioned tournament of the year, and attracted players from throughout the USA. Many were on the move hoping to cash MRP's and move up in the standings. However, only Morse, with his Main Event win, made a major move upwards.

Director Dorothy Mickow, with able assistant Jeanne Hofbauer kept the show on the road with all events on time and running smoothly. Mickow plans on renewing this event again next year... and she will wind down the ACC's 1998 campaign (along with Raleigh's National Open).

#### Ouiz:

What is the most peg points that can be scored by playing one card?

Answer: 15! The non-dealer holds A-A-3-3. Dealer holds A-A-2-3. The play goes: 3-3-2-A-A-A-A..."15" for 12 (four of a kind) + 2 (for 15-2) + 1 for the "go."

This can be scored four ways. In addition to the above hands, these combinations will add to 15. 2-2-A-A, 2-5-A-A; 2-2-A-A, 3-4-A-A; and 4-2-A-A, 2-2-A-A. These may be combined in a variety of ways, but all 8 cards add to 15, with four aces held for last.

#### **Record All-Events Score**

An All-Events contest has gained favor in the Central Region recently (and will be given a go in Montana this October). This match combines the Friday night Early Bird with the Main Event and Saturday Night contest. The combined 40 games are scored by Game Points only.

What is the record score to date?

Patrick Barrett (WI) scored a super 70 GP's at the Tri-Cities Open in Marinette in April. His 18-35-17 combined score was, as Barrett reports, "As good a run of cards that I've ever had!"

Barrett is directing the upcoming Grand National XVI in Wisconsin Dells...and is zeroing in on his Life Master (6,000 MRP's).

Joe Wergin Promotes Cribbage (and Skat)

## One-Star Joe Bernard Takes Yankton's Lewis & Clark Classic

The tradition of outstanding cribbage players winning the Lewis and Clark Classic continued this year in Yankton, SD. Life Master One-Star Joe Bernard of Libertyville, IL edged Darlene Johnson (Minneapolis) by five points in the deciding game to claim the \$2,000 first place check...and he also picked up a whopping 229 MRP's. It was Bernard's first Yankton championship. This event has been won four times by One-Star Mick Michaelis (Marinette, WI) and twice Life Master Russell (Minneapolis) in the ten-year run of this event.

Sharon Schaefer (Milwaukee) claimed third place, and Walt Wasielewski (Jackson, MI) took fourth.

Cribbage newcomer Ron Ralston, Hartford, IA, rallied with a 20-hand on fourth street to edge "Gabby" Kraft (Seymour, WI) to win the 110-pegger Consolation.

Scott and Linda Kooistra, along with Jean Clayton, directed another smoooth event involving 167 players from 18 states. They also held a Junior tournament with a dozen players. 15-year old Jeff Lamoreux (Jefferson, SD) won the title with Yankton hometown pegger 11-year old Allison Hoyne taking runnerup honors.

Jim Rein, Carver, MN, took the All-Events crown, while Michaelis kept his annual strong showing at Yankton intact with a 2nd place in the All-Events, and another 2nd in the qualifying round in the Main Event. Doug Henderson was the top qualifier with a nice 37 +229 card...four pegs ahead of Michaelis.

Sharon Fargher, Fort Collins, CO, took the Early Bird tournament with a Grand Slam. Lloyd Kraftwon the Saturday Night Special.


A highlight of this event was the ACC's 18th 29-hand of the season. Don Ernst, Eagan, MN, nailed this gem in the Consolation qualifying round...and earns \$100 from the ACC. This 29-hand was the only bright spot in the game as Ernst lost by some 20 points.

#### **Ballot Counting Procedure**

Ballots were collected and tabulated by Heads Up Therapeutic Horseback Riding Program, Inc., PO Box 262, Pittsburg, NC 27312. This volunteer aganecy is 501(c)3 organization which provides therapy for individuals with physical and mental disabilities.

To ensure accuracy, the following procedure was used to count the BOD ballots:

All white ballots were destroyed.

The number of votes per ballot were counted and recorded at bottom of each ballot.

Ballots were divided into groups of 10, each group attached to a numbered tally sheet.

Total number of votes per group were recorded on the talley sheet.

Votes per candidate were counted for each group of 10.

Each group was then cross tallied. If the number of votes per individual did not equal the total number of votes per group, a recount occurred for that group.

Individual totals were transferred to tally sheets and complete totals cross checked.

## All-American Teamed Named DeLynn Colvert Wins National Championship

Bob McCabe, the ACC's National Statistician, completed the compilation of the ACC's 139 sanctioned events for 1997, and reports that the following players have earned All-American honors, having finished in the top ten nationwide:

- 6-Robert Medeiros, Quincy, Massachusetts: 1,102
- 7-Martha Fingleton, Milwaukee, Wisconsin: 1,093
- 8- Russell Adams, Minneapolis, Minnesota: 1,078
- 9- Ford Jewer, Wakefield, Rhode Island: 1,038
- 10- Jim McManus, Milwaukee, Wisconsin: 1,034

Todd Schaefer, Rollie Heath, Martha Fingleton, and Ford Jewer earned their first All-American honors this past season. Fingleton, in addition to a top-ten finish, also earned her Life Master and was elected to the Cribbage Hall of Fame...making the 1997 cribbage year one to remember.

Brenda Palmer earned her 2nd All-American, having finished 9th last year with 1,175 MRP's. This year's 1,321 vaulted her to 3rd place.

Rit Alkas won the 1995 championship, and is now a 2-time member.

Robert Medeiros very nearly won the 1995 title, and he, too, is a two-time member.

Russell Adams, the pegging professor from Minnesota, has earned his 3rd All-American award.

Jim McManus is a 4-time All-American and joined the One-Star players this past season (10,000 MRP's).

DeLynn Colvert is a 12-time All-American and won his third national championship this past season...in addition to becoming the ACC's first Two-Star player (15,000 MRP's).

#### Master Point Tidbits:

George Rasmussen came within a whisker of earning a top-ten spot. He missed by a single MRP!

For those peggers wanting an invite to the annual Tournament of Champion, you had to score 338 MRP's this past season (if you had not qualified by other criteria...see criteria list, this issue). The 50th-ranked player in the Central Region scored 338 MRP's, meaning that all players nationwide who scored 338 have earned an invite. In the Eastern Region, 62 players earned the necessary 338, and in the Western Region 84 players did the trick. John Holseth, Medford, OR, was no. 84 in the West! Al Dinwoodie, Coventry, RI, was no. 62 in the East.

#### Sanctioned Events

Some 139 sanctioned tournaments were played in the 1997 cribbage year (August 1 - July 31). These tournaments averaged 108 players per event. In the 1996 cribbage year, 136 events were played, but the average was slightly higher...114.5 players per event. The 1998 season appears to be heading for another banner year. "Tournament Trail" is already loaded with events. Cribbage fever...catch it!



Lo and behold, a couple of weeks later Andy passed away, much to Mike's sorrow.


But Mike faithfully sat on the park bench every day, hoping Andy would fulfill the agreement.



The American Cribbage Congress has begun a new season...and with a new Master Rating Point System. This system rewards players equal points for equal difficulty, giving our players, nationwide, an equitable shot at those coveted Master Points.

As an example, the ACC kicked off the new season with matches in Boise, ID, Minden, NE, and Raleigh, NC. Boise's match had Gene Sissel score a whopping 39 GP's in the qualifying round, and he went on to claim the playoff round as well. This outstanding effort in this 80-pegger match netted Sissel 212 MRP's! At Minden, only 21 players were on hand and Helen Railsback won this event. But Railsback scored an amazing 28 GP's in the 12-game qualifying round...and 70 MRPs! With the new MRP system she scored a total of 140 points. A 12/12 grand slam and winning three consecutive playoff matches is a feat that should be rewarded handsomely...and it was! At the National Open in Raleigh, a large crowd (234) pegged for honors and Raleigh's Jim Townsend came away the winner, scoring 226 MRP's. The 2-3-4-5-6 finishers all scored over 100 MRP's. This includes 30 MRP's that is awarded to the top 1/8 finishers (a change in scoring double-elimination matches). In the West, East, North, and South, players are off and running with equal points being scored for equal difficulty! This year's MRP race should be of great interest...as the players with the best winning percentage will rise to the top!

This will require coordination and more GR volunteers, but in the long run, wouldn't it be nice to be in a regular big event without having to travel to Reno? This, plus more emphasis on youth and peer tournaments are ideas worth expanding. Now onto year two...I'm still a rookie, but I'm learning. Now let's keep the positive energy high by doing something about the pegging out rule.

My suggestion: by verbally declaring victory and showing your opponent that you have enough points in your hand to go out, you have officially won a game. Pegging out is optional. Let games be decided by the draw of the cards and the skill of the players, not by rule technicalities!"

#### **ACC Guidlines Followed**

In last month's CW Craig Terrell questioned the prize money given at the World Championship Silver Anniversary held in 1996. He questioned whether the sponsoring Quincy Rotary Club did, in fact, add the advertised \$5000 to the purse.

As ACC requires, we pay back 85% of the registration fee less \$2 per entrant that we send to the ACC and any other non-cash dividends provided to the contestants. In our case that involves the donuts, plaques, ink pen, lunch and dinner. All other associated expenses and the contribution to charity comes from the remaining 15% and whatever we make off of the raffle, bar and food service after covering costs.

In 1995 we had 232 players with a prize fund of \$7450 in the main event. At our Silver Anniversary event we had 372 players and paid back \$16,540. A quick check of the math

will assure you that we followed ACC guidelines and then added the \$5000 to the purse. Last May we had 284 players and paid back \$8950. For what it is worth, we only take the allowed 15% from the main and consolation tournaments. The Q-pools, Saturday Night Special, High Rollers, and Crybaby tournaments are each at 100% payback. The doubles on Friday night is paid back at 85% less the evenings pro-rated expenses.

We would have no problem posting expenses or a breakdown of the payback should ACC require that as well. I would suggest, however, that ACC members such as Craig have some faith in their organization. Tournament directors are required to send in a final report to ACC detailing the expenses and paybacks. Isn't that the accountability Craig and other players want?
