MGM: Sondericker St. Paul: Adams

MGM Open, Green Bay, WI, Feb 27-Mar 1: The 18th Annual MGM Open drew a whopping 400 players for the Main Event, and an even more amazing 564 players for the Doubles on Friday night. But, not unexpectedly, a newly crowned One-Star player took home the marbles in the Main Event...none other that Warren Sondericker, the Milwaukee king of cribbage! Just last month he had earned his One-Star rating (10,000 MRP's, lifetime)...the ACC's 7th. This mammoth winearned Sondericker some \$1,800 and a nice 252 MRP's, and he is off and running for his Two-Star award!

Milwaukee's Wayne Steinmetz came close and settled for 2nd, as this Grand Master continues to pile up MRP's and high finishes.

The huge Friday night Doubles match saw Kathy Henderson (WI) team with Karl Bremmer (WI) to win going away. Dave Bartlett (WI) and Keith Schaenger (WI) nailed 2nd.

54 players played the High Roller, and Don Patrin (MN) came away the winner (\$1.300).

The Consolation was won by Marsha Mahan (WI), with Tony Danihel (WI) in 2nd. The high qualifier was Larry Rowley, a Grand Master from Fitchburg, WI.

Other satellite events: Sat. Doubles; Michelle & Ron Rivest (WI); Sat. Singles; Sharon Beale (MI); Last Chance; Scott Henderson (MI).

A highlight of this event saw Bill Tushar, West Allis, WI score that elusive 29-hand. This gem was worth \$100 from the MGM (plus a pin) and another \$100 from the ACC. This was the 12th 29 of the year.

Directors Tom Gallagher, Bob Miller, and Jerry Lemke reported some \$2,000+ was donated to the Cerebral Palsy fund, and other charities.

Capital City Open, St. Paul, MN, Mar. 6-8: 172 peggers converged on the Ramada Inn in St. Paul the first weekend in March and, once again, the cream came to the top as Life Master Russell Adams won his 7th Main Event...and yet another 196 MRP's (plus a sizeable first place prize). This University of Minnesota professor had no small task in his final match, as his opponent was Master Todd Schaefer, last year's Central Region champ (and the tournament's director). Russell's cards remained hot, however, and he won going away, 4-0.

Dave O'Gorman (MN) and Kevin Bremmer (WI) finished 3-4. Bremmer's 105 MRP's keep him in the thick of this year's MRP race, having scored nearly 600 for the year.

Dennis Dahlin (MN) scored a nice 38 18 +204 to take qualifying honors.

Youth Cribbage

Congratulations to Dan Zeisler, our indefatigable Youth Cribbage chairman.

He recently held his 5th Annual tournament for kids at Sonora, CA Belleview School, where he is a 7th grade teacher. It drew a record turnout of 92 players 13 to 20 years old..."a success beyond my wildest dreams," he says.

Letters and phone calls poured in from parents about what a great time their kids had.

Dan uses cribbage in his classroom because it helps to challenge students mentally. It also develops cooperation, sportsmanship, critical thinking and math skills, he maintains.

He says it's proven to be an esteem booster for students who don't excel in other subjects for those who become motivated by realizing they can do it.

His 23-page teaching manual is available to any ACC member who wants to work with a local school system in teaching cribbage in classrooms. Contact Dan at 21429 Montgomery Road, Sonora, CA 95370...(209) 536-1549; fax (209) 536-0851; or via e-mail at "danthefan@yahoo.com."

Lately, Dan has been getting inquiries from cribbers, parents and grandparents, who want to teach their offspring the grand ol' game. His manual is for class-teaching and doesn't apply in these instances; however, the Executive Committee has authorized him to purchase 25 of President Emeritus Joe Wergin's book "Cribbage For Kids," and make them available for family teaching purposes at the usual price of \$8.95, plus shipping.

Margie Golick, senior psychologist at the McGill-Montreal Children's Hospital Learning Center emphasizes the educational value of playing cards: "If I could choose one teaching aid besides a pencil and paper, it would be an ordinary deck of playing cards. In those 52 pieces of pasteboard are limitless possibilities for developing manual dexterity, visual efficiency, concepts of space and time, number principles or sorting and grouping, and mental alertness, thus sharpening the child's wit and ability to learn."

She emphasizes: playing cards assists in the development of handwriting through improved motor skills such as handling, shuffling, dealing, fanning, which supports finger and hand movements;

Playing cards esposes children to a variation of simple rhythms by providing stimulation to the eye and hearing;

Playing cards provides many opportunities to learn and practice sequencing, requiring the young learner to take turns, watch the sequence of play and respond to peer noise and coaching;

Playing cards absolutely demands a concentration of visual discrimination, defined by color, shape, number and pattern of spots;

And, finally, playing cards reinforces the facility of language through verbal skills, calling for simplified auditory response, clear directions and correct plays.

Besides, it's fun!


Jackie Chateauneuf (SC) took honors in the qualifying round, and took home 71 MRP's (and \$390).

But when he won, these words he's choose


Brilliant playing, is why I won Then turn and grin at everyone The day he had the great grand slam First in the club, you understand

Synopsis Board of Directors Meeting Reno, January 29, 1998

BOD Meeting called to order at 11 AM. All present except Jarrell (excused).

Minutes accepted from September meeting with a minor change (Samet to Hassett on 2nd page).

McGibney reveiwed financial report and budget. Issueing 1029's discussed. Colvert (CW) is being compensated \$150 for type setting (to pay off Colvert's \$7,000 investment in 1991), \$200 in compensation, \$150 in rent. Monroe (Memberships) receiving \$250 in compensation and \$125 in rent. Ramos moved to compensate Colvert \$350 to prepare CW in addition to the \$150 month rent for a total of \$500 per month. Carried. Ramos moved to compensate Monroe \$300 per month to maintain ACC Membership in addition to \$125 per month rent, for a total of \$425. Carried.

Financial statement accepted. Perkin's motion carried.

Fingleton noted nothing to report concerning "Championship Tournament."

Ready moved to accept new proposal for tournament reporting and guidelines by Bickford. Bickford moved to amend the motion to repeal the former regulations and guidelines with Fingleton seconding. Carried.

Rein presented proposal for First Class mailing for the next election of the BOD. Fingleton moved to approve First Class mailing with followup review of results. Monroe noted he needs a cut-off date for membership eligibility. Motion approved. Rein to work with Hatcher, final report to be presented at the October, 1998 meeting.

Al Lindner (WI) presented Grand National (2000) proposal for the Ramada Inn in Fau Claire, WI. Bob Madsen presented a bid for the Grand National (2000) on behalf of Gene Beigler for the Prospect Heights Convention Center in Chicago (Radisson Hotel).

These two bids will be discussed (and a final vote taken) at the October meeting in Daytona Beach.

Steve Sattler reviewed goals and objectives regarding the ACC on Internet and advised the BOD of progress to date. He felt we were right on target with goals...increased membership, communication and more youth participation. He noted we were dangerously close to capacity and needed to increase our service policy. This would require a setup charge of \$300 to \$400 plus an additional \$385 thereafter. Barrett moved to increase 1998 budget for the Internet \$385. Carried.

Sattler recommended a backup individual be used for the Internet. The cost would be approx. \$750 to set up another individual for the internet. McGibney suggested we incorporate Sattler (WWW.Cribbage. Org) into the budget. Rein moved to spend the \$750 for backup individual. Carried.

Sattler will be on Agenda for October for a proposal on Advertisers for our site on the "net." Archiving on the interent will also be discussed at that time. The Sands prepared a nice lunch for the BOD and guests at 1 PM. Meeting reconvened at 1:45 PM.

Shimp reported on recommendations provided on the audit. Most of recommendations were already in place with others being readied for implementation. He asked all BOD members to review audit for further discussion at the October meeting.

Rein presented a review of the Master Points being awarded now versus the old system and suggested another review in October.

Ready moved to award the bid for printing 10,000 Rulebooks to Josten's as presented by Colvert for \$3,350. Colvert to do layout. Lulinski to send significant rule changes to Cribbage World. Rule books to be shipped to Monroe. He will send 50 to each of the BOD, a case (480-500) to each Regional Commissioner for dispersing to any tournament director requesting them. One case to be shipped to Gene Mikulsky for disbursement to any Grass Roots director (for \$1 each). Shimp and Lulinski suggest that significant rule changes be announced at tournaments and Grass Roots. Hofbauer, Perkins, Kooistra to sell at their tournaments (mid-summer). New Rule Books effective August 1. Al Miller has copy of new book and will start testing it soon.

ACC stationery will be discussed at October meeting. Colvert, Barrett, Rein will present BOD members with bids prior to meeting.

Rein moved to authorize Barnes to purchase new Grand National banner 16 feet long not to exceed \$350. Carried.

Hatcher proposed review and updating handbook for the BOD regarding policies and procedures. Bey moved to proceed with the research committee. Carried.

Kooistra reported on JPW/ACC Open indicating decision needed as to whether to expand or hold entries to 1,024. Rein also reported we need to look at TOC. A common cut-off date will be used next year for the TOC. JPW/ACC Open and room reservations. The BOD asked for recommnedations to be presented at October's meeting.

Lulinski moved to hold JPW/ACC Open and TOC at the Sands Regency in 1999. Carried.

Barrett handed out ballots for Hall of Fame voting. No candidate was successful.

Bey discussed Executive Committee decisions and concerns. Hall of Fame picture sizes are problem for shipping and storage.

Membership recruitment to have Marketing committee report at October meeting.

Tournament directors may bar player from their tournament ONLY (earlier decision by BOD).

Mailing labels are available to tournament directors for .02 each.

Distribution and mailing of CW to be investigated, in hopes of speeding up delivery.

Lulinski moved to buy a fax machine for each of the three tournament commissioners, the total not to exceed \$1,000 for the three, Carried.

Bey moved to purchase new computer equipment for approx. \$2,000 for Colvent for Cribbage World use. This system to be compatible with Monroe's and McCabe's units. The equipment to stay with future Cribbage World editors. Carried.

The next meeting will be October 16, 1998 at Daytona Beach, FL. Lulinski moved to adjourn, Carried. Minutes recorded by Rein.



Ethical Behavior by Paul Hatcher Chairman, Ethics Committee

The founding fathers of the American Cribbage Congress felt very strongly about the need for members to display good ethical behavior during participation in ACC sponsored activities.

Article VII of the ACC Constitution and Bylaws establishes a Standing Committee for Ethics, and Article X provides the procedures for this committee to follow when reported breaches of the ethical standards of the ACC are reported.

The Ethical Standards of the ACC are published on page i of the current ACC Rule Book.

It's Unofficial...Harry Palmer Earns ACC's 8th One-Star AND Takes Commanding MRP Lead

The Greater Orlando Open was played in Kissimmee, Florida on February 20-22...and February 22 a horrific tornado struck the area, killing scores of Floridians. But a few hours earlier, Harry Palmer was a whirlwind on the cribbage boards a few miles away, as this West Springfield, MA pegger won the 147-pegger event. In winning, Palmer has roared into a solid position in this year's Master Point race, standing at the 1,100 mark for the year. His closest competitors are running some 400 points to the rear. In addition to this astounding mark, Palmer earned the ACC's 8th One-Star rating (10,000 MRP's). This event's report has not yet been processed by National Statistician Bob McCabe, and remains unofficial.

Other unofficial reports on huge Central Region events (MGM & St. Paul) have Warren Sondericker (One-Star from WI) and Russell Adams (Life Master from MN) making major moves upwards by winning these large meets. Adams is at the 600 mark for the year.

Other players who have topped the 600 mark for the year are Joe Bernard (IL), Shawn Anruskso (MN), Jeff Monroe (CA), Bob Clark (CA), George Rasmussen (WA), Roger Wilson (CO), Paul Hatcher (OR) (unofficial), and DeLynn Colvert (MT) (unofficial).

With four months to play in this cribbage year, Palmer is certainly in the cat-bird seat, as a score or more players are playing catch-up cribbage. Many large events remain to be played, and one player scoring that once-in-a-lifetime hot streak could still score that upset. Cribbage fever, catch it!


