Kolby Tops Record St. Croix Classic

John Kolby, pegging out of McHenry, IL, topped a record field of 200 peggers at the recent St. Croix Classic (June 4-5-6) in Turtle Lake, WI. The players came from far and wide, with 15 states being represented. A large contingent of highly-ranked Eastern Region players showed, as did players from the Western Region as play winds down this cribbage year with players after those coveted Master Rating Points.

Kolby's final playoff match was with Jean Cervantes (WI). Both players were well rewarded for their high finishes, with Kolby taking home 196 MRP's, a beautiful trophy clock and \$1,500. Cervantes earned MRP's and \$1,100. 1992 National Champion and One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) grabbed 3rd (and perhaps a berth on this year's Eastern Region All-Star team with the 105 MRP's). Bob Sommers (MN) is edging in on his Grand Masters with a 4th place finish.

Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), in the hunt for MRP honors this cribbage year, made his long trek from Montana worthwhile by taking qualifying honors (37 18 +249). With a 17-32 finished, his MRP take was 76 MRP's, keeping pace with the leaders as this year's action winds down.

134 played the Consolation and Norma Corbo (MN) took home the top prize, followed by One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) in 2nd, Master John Syftestad (WI), and Grand Master Gene "Moose" Biegler (WI) in 3-4. Al Bailey (MA) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Director Al Lindner and the St. Croix Casino offer bonus's for 24-hands, 28 & 29-hands, and Grand Slams. Some 279 24-hands were paid \$25 each; five 28-hands received \$250 each (Cyril Schmidt, Bill Shirland, Barney Baird, Joan Rein, & Wally Miskowic). Danielski's Friday Grand Slam netted a cool \$100. No 29's showed. The casino's largess netted the players a hefty \$8,325 bonus for the action...and weekend's certainly contributes to the popularity of this event. Tournament Play

How many sanctioned cribbage tournaments does the average ACC member participate in each year?

I do about 8 to 10, and I have a feeling that's about the average for most members. Of course, there are some high-rollers (Colvert, Julian, Samet, Schmidt, Toll, Adams, Sondericker, Shumate, Sr. & Jr., and Wilson) who don't miss very many.

Is it the prize money that attracts the crowds or the neat style that marks some tourneys?

Many tournaments have to furnish food due to lack of facilities to feed a huge crowd. Does that bring 'em back year after year? We know, in Quincy, where the Rotary Club puts on a great barbecue, that it gets rave reviews every year.

Extra events...like an early bird, a Saturday night special, a doubles event, Last Chance and Cry Baby...also have a tendency to attract players, too.

Back East we're told, they mainly do one-day tournaments, while the Central Region and West cater to two-day events.

Each tournament director is on his own...there are no stringent ACC rules about how to conduct a tournament. So he or she has to please the players or they won't be back the next year.

Grand Master Jones Hom, Fairfield, CA, is on a tear this cribbage year. On May 15 in Red Bluff, CA, he waltzed to another win in the 70-player Red Bluff Red Hot Open, and with the 147 MRP's has zipped over the 1,000 MRP mark for the year...and an excellent chance at the National Championship. A topten All-American award is certainly within his grasp as well.

His final match pitted him with Herschel Mack, a wily pegger from the Northern California coast, but Hom's cards remained hot for the win. Avon Ray (CA) and Jeff Pask (CA) nailed down 3-4.

Master Ron Morgan (CA) is a veteran of the cribbage wars, and his expertise rewarded him with qualifying honors...a nice 27 12/16 card...and 40 MRP's.

38 peggers played the Consolation and Master Jason Shumate (CA) won 6 of 7 to take qualifying honors, and finished 2nd, bringing home a combined 48 MRP's, keeping his name in the hat for National honors with some 1,100 MRP's in the bank. E. G. "Swede" Hanson (CA) won the event, followed by Master Mary Herrmann (CA) and Master Boyd McDonald (CA) in 3-4.

Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) won the Friday night game, but, alas, no MRP's for that effort. Local Jim Langley scored the meet's only 28-hand.

Director Ron Sargent got his first sanctioned event off the ground in Red Bluff in fine style, and his unusual one-day event was well received.

One-Star Duane Toll (WI) took national honors in 1987...and he is on the prowl once again. On May 16 he took home the Potawatomi Peggers Pow Wow Championship, blitzing 90 peggers in the process. His final playoff match pitted him with tough-pegging Life Master Martha Fingleton (WI), but he is not to be denied this cribbage year. The win propelled Toll well over the 1,000 MRP mark for this cribbage year...and a shot at the National Championship. Toll has earned All-American four times, and appears on track for number five!

Sandra Stroup (IL) and Merv Morris (ON) came home 3-4. Richard DePouw (MI) topped the field in the qualifying round with a nice 36 GP card.

Grand Master Aggie Mikulsky (WI) won 7 of 9 in a tough field to take qualifying honors in the 46-player Consolation, but One-Star Joe Bernard (IL) won the playoffs and is winding down yet another fine season, standing at the 700 mark. Sue Schenk (MI) and Grand Master Ginny Danielski (WI) finished 3-4.

Master Bill Shirland, Denver, scored a nice 36 GP card in the qualifying round to take honors. Shirland continues a fine season, having topped the 600 MRP mark for this cribbage year.

Two Votes For "Let 'Em Play"

A thumbs up for the April article "Let 'Em Play" and a thumbs down for "Hey, The Consolation Is For Losers" in the May issue.

It is a real strain on some older people to really concentrate through 22 games, however, they can still do pretty well for 9 games. We are talking about people who enjoy playing, that have contributed to the ACC for years. If we don't want "just anyone" playing the Consolation, then we also eliminate those other players, who have contributed a lot to the ACC over the years from trying to reach another plateau.

Thousands of people have to work Saturdays. Ev Bey, our president, said in the May CW "The ACC was formed in 1979 with the intention to promote cribbage for the benefit of the players rather than for the benefit of the promoters. Do we want to tell avid members, that because they have to work on Saturdays, they can't play in any tournaments that will give them Master Points?

Losers? If the Consolation is for losers, why are Grand Masters and Life Masters playing? More players mean more money to the winner and more winners. A person only plays nine people in the qualifying round no matter how many are playing or who they are. I say let anyone play who wants to play and pays the same fees that I do.

I would like to comment on the recent controversy about consolation tournament eligibility.

Consider that 90% of tournaments (if not all in the East) require some sort of play for the Main on Sunday mornings; tough for members who have a commitment to Sunday morning worship. (Not a lame excuse in my book). Budget-minded members may not be able to afford \$50 for a Main but could pay \$20-25 for a Consolation, and still earn Master Points. Whatever the case may be, I'm not suggesting to hold mid-week tournaments, nor do I feel that expenses should be not be shared by all players.

Bottom line...what's wrong with letting members who only wish to play in an afternoon Consolation, pre-register and include some "fair share" of expenses? Say \$5-7 on top of a \$20 entry. When little or no extra cards and no lunch are needed for these players. their "fair share" can only reduce the net expenses to directors. Doesn't everyone benefit?

This problem of Consolation play (open to all, or just for losers in the Main Event) has been thrashed around in the ACC's Board of Directors meetings more than once. And in each discussion on this matter, I believe the ACC BOD members voted to let everyone play, with discretion given to the tournament director. Most directors allow all to play, but some (Reno and elsewhere) feel that violates the concept of "consolation"...for losers of the Main Event ONLY!

Jeff Shimp Clarifies Combining Hand Count

Jeff Shimp is in charge of the Senior Judges Program, and Cribbage World asked his advice about Donald Smith's problem of combining your hand count with a known count (but unseen) in the crib...and pegging out in one move (before showing the crib).

According to Shimp, the rules are clear. He cites Rule IX (Counting and Recording Hand and Crib Scores). Section 2a: The counting and pegging of the hands and crib shall be done in the following sequence. Each step must be completed before the next step is started... Section 2b: Next, the dealer counts his/her hand, announces the total, and pegs the score. The dealer shall then place the dealer's hand on the pone's side of the board, still face up... Section 2d: Finally, the dealer exposes the crib, counts it, announces the total, and pegs it....

Shimp adds that this is a classic case of using the Rule Book to win a game (in the pone's case). The Dealer knows he has sufficient points in the crib to win, and simply, in haste, pegged out with only the hand exposed. At that point, if the pone chooses, he may stop play and claim a false claim of game. A judge has no choice but to follow the Rule Book and so judge. However, a pone may, using generous sportsmanship, ignore the rules, knowing full well the dealer has sufficient points to win.

A word to the wise to our ACC players. Follow the rules, peg correctly, and this kind of situation (that can cause hard feelings) will never occur.

An apology is due Donald Smith from Cribbage World. His quiz was not published in entirety, and the editor's comments were biasing answers.

The American Cribbage Congress is winding down year number 20, and America's peggers continue to earn honors in record numbers. This 20th year has been a banner one. Some 34 players have earned their 2,000th Master Rating Point this year, and another 16 have earned Grand Master (4,000 MRP's). Five peggers have earned a lofty 6,000 MRP's...and Life Master.

Life Master: Wayne Steinmetz, Milwaukee, WI. Steinmetz won the 64-player Consolation event at the Island Quest in Michigan on May 9...and his 6,000th MRP. Only 39 ACC players have reached this level. For the past several years Steinmetz has been among the national leaders. This year has been special, as he has topped 800 MRP's and may very well earn All-American honors.

Grand Master: Clair Morse, Bend, OR. Morse earned his Grand Master (4,000 MRP's) with a fine 5-8 finish at the 140-player Spokane Valley Open (WA). He becomes Grand Master no. 126. He also scored his first sanctioned 29-hand in Spokane (three, lifetime). He is a veteran player in the Northwest and a threat to win at any time.

Master: Rose Chase, North Kingstown, RI. Chase had a high finish at the Ocean State Classic (RI) on May 2, and zipped to her 2,000th MRP...and Master number 393. She joins her husband, George at this level, as this duo continues their fine play.

Fayann Salerno, South Easton, MA. Salerno won the 108-player Consolation at the Ocean State Classic, and with the 63 MRP's earned has also topped the 2,000 mark, and Master no. 394. Her skill on the boards is well known in the Eastern Region.

Jack Shumate III, Kings Beach, CA. Shumate has been on a roll this cribbage year, having topped the 700 MRP mark. He won the Gold Country Challenge Consolation (50 players) to wing it over 2,000 MRP's...and Master no. 395. Shumate is a unique player in the Western Region, sporting long hair, and unusual hats, and is a force to be reckoned with.

Peter Paradis, Santa Maria, CA. Paradis is a veteran of the cribbage wars in the Western Region (primarily in California), and he continues to pile up MRP's with his skillful play. He recently earned his 2,000th MRP (no. 396).

Six-Horse Race MRP Race Up For Grabs

With but a single month left in the cribbage year, the annual MRP race is up for grabs. Six players have topped the 1,000 mark and have the edge on their competitors as the season winds down. **DeLynn Colvert (MT)**, **Bob Julian (WI)**, **William "Wes" Summers II (CA)**, **Duane Toll (WI)**, **Jason Shumate (CA)**, and **Jones Hom (CA)**. Colvert, Julian, and Summers II have topped the 1,200 mark. Shumate, Toll, and Hom are only a step behind.

Last year's co-champion, Paul Hatcher (OR) is making a late season move, and is nearing 1,000, as is Sharlene Medeiros (MA). Both have outside chances of overtaking the leaders with a hot finishing run. Les and Deb Kvien are at the 900 mark as this Illinois duo are also on the move. Others in the hunt are Wayne Steinmetz (WI), Todd Schaefer (MN), and Donna Hassett (OR). This trio is over the 800 mark for the year. A dozen or more peggers have topped 700, and with a hot run, can earn All-American honors (top ten). Once again, it appears that the National Open in the Eastern Region, the Polish Open and Lewis & Clark Open in the Central, and the Portland Summer Open in the Western Region will decide who will be king of the hill in the ACC's 20th year!
