# Bill Medeiros Cops Ocean State Classic

Director John Chambers' Ocean State Classic in Pawtucket, RI drew a whopping 202 peggers on May 2. His format has a reasonable entry fee (\$35) and no side pools, no Q pools, or team play is allowed. Perhaps this appeals to the rank and file ACC members, as his recent events have all drawn sizeable crowds.

Life Master Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA turned 50 on April 23...and 11 days later proved that Life Begins at 50! He won this huge event! After qualifying 14th, his combined MRP take was some 216 MRP's, vaulting Medeiros to 7,300 MRP's (lifetime).

His final playoff match pitted him with another Life Master...Brenda Palmer (MA). Palmer's 2nd place finish (and 9th qualifying spot) earned yet another 172 MRP's, and a move upwards in the Eastern Region standings. And yet another Life Master finished 3rd...Rit Alkas (CT). Gertrude Theriault (RI) nailed down 4th (and 105 MRP's).

Grand Master Phil Martin (CT) smoked the qualifying round, winning 11 of 12 to earn honors.

Fayann Salerno (MA) very nearly earned her Master rating by winning the 108-pegger Consolation. (CW figures her totals now stand at

1,991!) Life Master Larry Samet (MA) earned a combined 60 MRP's by finishing 2nd (qualifying and playoffs) to wing it over the 700 mark for this cribbage year...and he is among the national leaders. Master Joan Morrison (MA) and Romano Picciandra (MA) finished 3-4. Picciandra is nearing his Masters with this high finish.

Bob Moroz (MA) is not an ACC member...and he lost 27 MRP's. He had a Grand Slam (8/8 +150) in the Consolation qualifying round and finished 9-16.

Chambers reports that only one 28-hand showed...a gem scored by Earle Sweet (RI). He also reports that he will schedule this event next May 7, 2000. Mark your calendars.

### **New ACC Manual**

**Damn, are we getting organized!**

For the past 20 years...ever since the American Cribbage Congress was organized...the Board of Directors has adopted a myriad of rules and regulations to guide ACC play and operations.

When we adopted the current Constitution and By-Laws, we considered compiling all these details as a part of that document. Thanx to Jerry Dickenson, who authored the latest Constitution and By-Laws leaving the details out of it and setting up a separate loose-leaf volume that would contain the ACC rules and regulations, organizational policies and procedures.

The Executive Committee gathered up all the unwritten material, the assorted resolutions and Board minutes, turned them over to Verne Nielsen and through the magic of his computer we now have an 85-page loose-leaf book that contains everything anyone would want to know about how the ACC operates.

Paul Hatcher, VP-Policy, spearheaded the collation, assisted by President Bey, Executive VP Syl Lulinski and Secretary Joan Rein, who combed past minutes and files to compile the vital information.

The 26 chapters run the gamut from Archives & History through the Youth program. Anything anyone wants to know about each particular program or phase of ACC activities is neatly pigeon-holed for ease of instant research.

The document will be presented for adoption to the Board of Directors at its annual meeting in Las Vegas on Friday, September 10, 1999.

It'll be great to have a "Bible" to refer to and depend on.

The oldest sanctioned tournament, World Championship #28, was held in Quincy, CA the first weekend in May...beautiful weather, no snow, the players lounged around the Plumas County Fairground's picnic tables during lunch. This tournament has settled down to about 250 players every year...it's unique, they enjoy the mountain hospitality and atmosphere, and keep coming back!

As far as I know it's the only cribbage tournament that starts things off with the Star-Spangled Banner, sung a cappella by Terry Gallagher, one of the local high school teachers.

Director Mike Taborski then presents some honorary gifts to get the crowd in a good mood: SF 49er caps to three Wisconsin cheeseheads attending; a bag of California oranges to the lone Floridian present; canned salmon for three Alaskans who made the scene; and a map for the Aleutian Islander who came the farthest.

But the highlight was the seating of last year's champ. All players were seated; but seat #1 had been left open and was vacant, until...with great fanfare...sponsoring Rotarians escorted in '98 champ Rollie Heath of Lincoln City, OR, to the seat of honor. Much applause...a great way for the previous year's winner to be recognized. Every tournament ought to try this, it sets a nice tone for the entire tournament.

George Healey (MA) and Sam Schwartz (MA) came home 3-4. Harry Palmer (MA) is a rare One-Star player and his expertise came through with a great 24 GP card in the 12-game qualifying round...and yet another 50 MRP's. He is the ACC's 8th All-time ranked player.

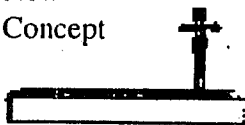

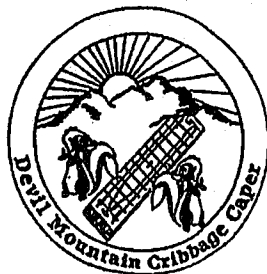

# WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

## Greg Schleusner Tops 240

Greg Schleusner, a Grand Master from Truckee, CA, came home the winner at the 28th Annual World Championship in Quincy, CA on May 2. And this is the 2nd time Schleusner has won this huge event. He won in 1987 and is a rare repeat winner. This win came complete with 196 MRP's and \$1,200. Dennis Gage (CA) was narrowly defeated in the final match, losing 2-3. Gage went home with a nifty \$700...and 147 MRP's in this 240-player match.

The King of World Championship play is local Nick Ayoub (he has won the Main Event three times), but this time around he had to settle for a Consolation win (90 players).

Doubles play kicked off this event on Friday evening, and 88 teams pegged for honors. Jerold and Shirley Montgomery (CA) came home tops, winning \$500.

The High Rollers attracted 42 players, and Grand Master Roy Banducci (CA) took home \$500 in winning this event. The Saturday Night Special

was won by Sacramento's Mike Kozlowski. Mike's brother Casey won this event last year. Laurie Logan is a Quincy native, and she picked up \$100 in winning the Last Chance event.

Special prizes went to Bonnie Van Bergen (highest qualifier from Plumas County) and Les Sumner, Sparks, NV (The Nevadan who finished highest).

Director Mike Taborski reported players were present from throughout the USA (11 states represented), with Mike Barber travelling 4,000 miles to play (from Unalaska, AK). A Floridian made the trip and several from Wisconsin were on hand. And, as usual, the local Rotary club's community service projects benefitted from the event. The Rotarians worked overtime preparing lunch and a bar-be-cue dinner, and according to Taborski, "Everything went smoothly, not a hitch for the entire weekend!"

Matt Kacer, Ankeny, Iowa, nailed a sizeable 102 players at the recent Hawkeye Classic in Des Moines, Iowa. And now for the rest of the story...his father Larry won this event several years ago. 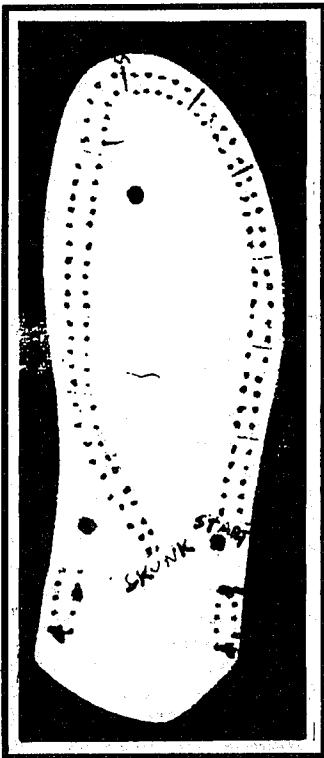

I've been cribbing there since 1959...40 years...with a group of enthusiasts that in the early years numbered 15 to 20 guys and now totals 10 of us. On Mondays and Fridays we play four or five games at lunch time, most often four-handed, and occasionally six. Based on 40 years x 52 weeks x 9 games per week (ignoring the fact that in the 60's and 70's we often had two four-handers play simultaneously), I come up with 18,720 games...NEVER in all those years have we had a 29-hand! In fact, the combined memories of the surviving cribbers recall only ONE 28-hand! Is this an anomaly...or what!

## Hey, What's GP, MRP, Master, Life Master, Etc. Mean?

Paul Larson (WA), a newcomer to ACC play, recently wrote CW a letter wanting to know what all the "jargon" is in *Cribbage World*. Here are a few explanations:

**GP- Game Point.** Every win is worth two game points, a skunk is worth three, A loss is zero.

**MRP's: Master Rating Points.** Every sanctioned event awards MRP's. The qualifying round awards 1 of 8 (80 players, 10 earn points). MRP's are awarded points depending on the number of GP's earned...a chart is available for all players and should be posted on the tournament wall. The playoff rounds (1 in 4 qualify for playoffs...80 players, 20 will qualify for the playoffs) also award points. The Main Event has a 7 + 7 format (7-21-42-70-105-147-196-252-315). Each round of playoffs awards an extra 7 points. A "Bye" round counts as a win. In the Consolation, the playoffs award points on a 3 + 3 basis (3-9-18-30-45-63-84-108-135). Each playoff round is worth an extra three points. The qualifying round, once again, awards points on a 1 in 8 basis. A chart should be posted to aid in clarifying the points involved.

**Judge:** An ACC member who has been certified by taking the Judges Examination. All disputed calls should be handled by a certified judge(s).

**Master, Grand Master, Life Master, One-Star, Two-Star, etc.:** The ACC has a rating system based on lifetime accumulation of MRP's. A person earns Master at 2,000 MRP's; Grand Master at 4,000 MRP's; Life Master at 6,000 MRP's; a One-Star at 10,000 MRP's; a Two-Star at 15,000 MRP's; a Three Star at 20,000 MRP's, etc. Some 392 ACC players have earned Master, 125 have earned Grand Master, 38 have attained Life Master, 10 have earned a lofty 10,000 MRP's...and One-Star, and a single player has topped 15,000 and Two-Star.

**All-American Team:** Every year the ACC awards the top ten players as members of that year's All-American team. Each year begins anew in the race for the roses.

**Grand Slam:** Winning all games in a match.

**String of Pearls:** Losing every game in a match.

**Sanctioned Event:** A tournament sanctioned by the American Cribbage Congress. MRP's are earned ONLY in sanctioned events.

## Quiz

**Donald Smith, Oregon City, OR**

After the pone pegged his hand, the dealer, having more than enough points in hand and crib to win the game, claimed the game by placing his peg in the game hole. Opponent alleges that it was a false claim of game because the player did not have sufficient points in his hand, by itself, to go out, therefore, over-pegged the hand to claim the game.

What would you decide if you were a judge? You must refer to the Official Rules. Write to: Donald Smith, 15092 S. Brunner Rd., Oregon City, OR 97045.

*My intent is not to bias any answers to this quiz, but I would like to throw my two cents worth into this predicament. The Rules are primarily meant to penalize a cheater, but, in fact, penalize stupid play. For example, picking up your front peg. Oops. it now becomes your back peg! No intent to cheat, just a stupid move. Pegging backwards is the same thing... a stupid move. The player was certainly not intending to cheat. (I Never saw anyone win a game by pegging backwards). Mixing your hands together before counting...another stupid move, as both hands are dead. Certainly not trying to cheat here (knowing the rules). And how about throwing three cards to your own crib? Nice move! You now play a three-card hand and your crib is dead. Trying to cheat? Hardly! Stupidity in action once again. And, addressing Smith's contention that the dealer knew he had sufficient points in his hand and crib to win the game and he simply combined the score and pegged out (combining an open hand and a concealed crib hand). This is a no-no. Each hand must be pegged in sequence and singly; therefore, I rule it was, indeed, a false claim of game...and another stupid move. The player was certainly not intending to cheat. His stupidity cost him the game! Slow down and peg correctly...don't let stupidity penalize you! Ed.*

## Another Quiz

**Dan Mitchell was the 43th...and Last Player to Qualify. How did he get a Bye?**

At the Oregon Coast Classic, some 172 players were on hand, and Dan Mitchell (CA) qualified 43rd...and last. Yet, he received a "bye." How did he do this? Well, his opponent failed to show the next morning for the playoffs. 21 easy Master Points! (It was no "bye," it was a forfeit.)

## Join The American Cribbage Congress

The American Cribbage Congress was founded in 1979 to foster tournament play and camaraderie among all players in the United States and Canada. The Congress is a non-profit organization governed by an elected Board of Directors. Appointed Tournament Commissioners, National Statistician, Membership Secretary, Cribbage World Editor, Grass Roots Commissioner, Judges, and others keep the organization humming. The Congress is divided into three regions...Eastern, Central, and Western. Sanctioned tournaments abound from coast to coast with friendly competition. Players make new friends, and travel far and wide to do their pegging. The Congress sponsors two major events yearly...The Grand National (played in Las Vegas this year on September 10--12) and the Joseph Pettus Weighn/ACC Open, played annually in early February in Reno, NV. You can win \$10,000 at this event!

Players accumulate Master Rating Points at sanctioned events. These points are accumulated on a lifetime basis, with rankings bestowed by the Congress. Masters, Grand Masters, Life Masters, and other ratings are awarded based on lifetime Master Points. And every year, the top ten players are named to the All-American team. Other awards include \$100 for every sanctioned 29-hand scored. About 20 lucky members receive this award every year. 28-hands are also recognized. In addition to national sanctioned play, the Congress has a Grass Roots organization, allowing players to play in local clubs on a weekly, or monthly basis. Rating Points are maintained for these clubs, and a yearly champion is crowned. A novel event is the annual Tournament of Champions. This event is by invite only, and players who have proven superior by various rating methods are given an invitation to play. This event is played in Reno in conjunction with the JFW/ACC Open. Last year, some 500 peggers attended this prestigious event.

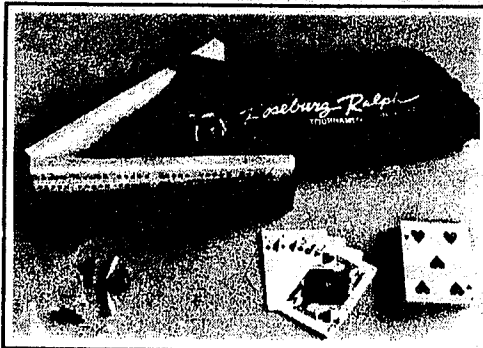

Julian finished 4th at Crescent City, CA, while Colvert nailed a 5-8 spot at the larger Red Bluff Red Hot Open. Both players garnered 42 MRP's for that effort and remain in a virtual dead-heat (1,148 vs 1,175, unofficially, with Colvert holding a slight lead).

In the Central Region, Grand Master **Sharlene Medeiros** (MA) continues to set the pace (774), with Life Master **Larry Samet** (MA) and Grand Master **Peter Setian** (MA) at 700.

Other players scoring well this cribbage year are: Grand Master **Wayne Steinmetz** (WI), Life Master **Paul Hatcher** (OR), Grand Master **Jones Hom** (CA), **Bob Wikstrom** (WA), Master **Donna Hassett** (OR), Master **Todd Malmgren** (OR), Newly-crowned Life Master **Roger Wilson** (CO), and Grand Master **George "Ras" Rasmussen** (WA). A hot streak by any of these players may very well propel them to the National Championship.

Some 24 peggers have topped the 600 MRP mark for this cribbage year...and one hot streak could mean the difference between All-American honors...or the also-ran category. Cribbage fever, catch it!
