## AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS

### ***Unique Doubleheader Draws Large Crowds*** **Morlock Tops Treasure Island** **Rein Breaks Ice at WI Dells**

With a controversial mid-week format, the recent Treasure Island Open in Red Wing, MN drew a sizeable 166 players in their inaugural event at the Treasure Island Casino/Hotel. The added prize money undoubtedly contributed to the numerous players on hand...and Elmer Morlock from nearby Minneapolis came away the winner. His winner's purse was a whopping \$2,700 and 196 MRP's. Minneapolis is also the home of Life Master Russell Adams, and he nailed down 2nd, a huge prize and 147 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total (nearing 9,000). Grand Master Aggie Mikulsky (WI) and local Patricia Smith finished 3-4 and were also well-rewarded for this effort.

Minnesotan Arnold Groskreutz posted 18 wins in the 22-game qualifying round to take honors (38 18 +219).

Marlon Jones (IA) posted 4 skunks in the 9-game Consolation qualifying round to take honors (16 6/9 +74), but it was Al Gunderson (MN) coming home the winner in the playoffs. Jones finished 2nd (and took home an aggregate 60 MRP's). Master Gloria McLeod (MN) and Mike Moyer (IA) finished 3-4.

Director Jerry Gruber had two matches to welcome the players on Wednesday, and the 7-game welcoming match saw three grand slams scored: Sherry Slife (WI) 15 7/7 +150; Brad Bartholomew

(MN) 15 7/7 +115; and Vern Ness (MN) 14 7/7 +106. Wednesday night the action picked up as 124 players played this early bird and Grand Master Joan Rein (MN) smoked the field with a great 20 9/9 +191. Local Bruce Smith came close with another grand slam 19 9/9 +189, but had to settle for 2nd.

According to director Gruber this was a very successful event, considering the mid-week format. He estimated that some 50 new players were on hand, with 25 joining the ACC. The casino contributed \$6,000 added prize money, making the Main Event payoff a whopping 150%. Gruber is considering this mid-week doubleheader format in conjunction with next year's Grand National in Eau Claire, WI. He invites our ACC membership to make their wishes known to their Regional BOD Directors, pro or con.

**Rein Tops Wisconsin Dells**  
Grand Master Jim Rein, Carver, MN, has had many top finishes over the years, but a Main Event win has eluded him...until he broke the ice at the Wisconsin Dells Classic on October 17. His victory came the hard way, being down 0-2 in the best 3 of 5 match, to Master Jerry Fischer (WI). With three

straight wins, Rein came home the winner, picking up a sizeable purse, 196 MRP's, and bragging rights. His lifetime totals have him knocking on the door for his Life Master rating (5,900+).

Fischer's 2nd place finish added some 147 MRP's as he, too, continues to pile up the MRP's.

Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) snapped a lengthy cold spell by knocking down 3-4, winning the All Events with a great 67 GP's (in the 40-game format), and scoring well all weekend. His good fortune continued on his flight home, getting bumped and taking a \$400 voucher for use at a later time. Green Bay's Al Karr tied for the 3-4 spot, and this pair each took home 105 MRP's.

The hot hand in the qualifying round belonged to Cyril Schmidt (WI), winning 17 of 22 (37 17 +307).

Bob Jackson was a long way from his Pennsylvania home, but it paid off with a Consolation win (118 players). The win also gave Jackson an invite to the upcoming Tournament of Champions. Joy Shimp (IN) came close in taking home 2nd. Master John Syftestad (WI) and Bob Brown (WI) finished 3-4.

Tom Markham (WA) recently rolled over the 2,000 MRP mark and Master. He continues to pile up the points by taking qualifying honors with a nice 37 17/22 +236.

## ***It's Miller Time!*** **Al Miller Wins Two** **Massachusetts Open, Sept. 26**

Al Miller, a Life Master from Nashua, NH is on an unprecedented roll! He won back-to-back events in New England in late September and early October. His first win came at the 108-player Massachusetts Open, with the final four all highly-ranked ACC players. Miller came out the winner with the streaking Paul Gallagher (MA) taking 2nd. One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) and Life Master George Bickford took home 3-4. Bickford also had the top qualifying score...a very nice 24 10/12 +235.

62 players stayed for the Consolation and Mike Azevedo (MA) took home the marbles, followed by Mary Agee (MA), Life Master David Clemmey (MA) and Wayne Hittle (MA) in 2-3-4. Edward Ciccone (MA) won 6 of 7 to take qualifying honors.

Al Miller, once again, came home the winner in the huge 138-player New Hampshire Open. In winning back-to-back events, Miller scored a whopping 378 MRP's, vaulting him into the thick of the annual national MRP race. Miller edged David Statz (NH) in the final playoff match to continue his winning streak. Grand Master Lee Norris (RI) and Life Master Larry Samet (MA) took home 3-4. Life Master Bill Medieros (MA) nailed 24 GP's (12 games) to earn qualifying honors.

Wendell Woodard (NH) won the 80-player Consolation, with Frank Cummings (MA), Grand Master Neil Friets (NH) and Fred Pierce (ME) in 2-3-4.


## Whitelaw, Stowe Cop Youth Tournament



Called to order at 10:08 AM by Lulinski. All members present.

A welcome extended to all new members of BOD, and a "thank you" to departing members, especially to Fred McGibney for many years of outstanding service as Treasurer.

Treasurer's Report accepted.

George Riley's audit report reviewed. Some work still needed, but ACC's finances look better.

Ramos objected to ACC GR Financial Report being part of BOD agenda. Mikulsky noted that auditor for GR was working on audit. Report accepted.

Hatcher appointed to keep Hall of Fame archives. Barnes thanked for printing HOF photos on internet.

Rein moved to complete last two rounds for TOC after qualifying round of JPW/ACC Open on Sat. at approx. 4PM. Time constraints, plus allowing spectators to view final matches a plus. Carried.

Kooistra moved to approve clarifications of TOC Criteria as presented by Rein. Carried.

Lulinski moved to reject proposed Sands Hotel/Casino contract until clarifications are made. Verbal agreement with Sands for next two years. Approved.

Hatcher presented proposal and discussion for mid-week tournaments. Rein discussed Treasure Island Casino mid-week event. Bickford moved to approve sanctioning this event (Oct. 13-15) as a one-time, not to set a precedence event. Approved. Bickford, Hofbauer, Bernard will address this issue with new guidelines at BOD meeting in Feb. 2000.

Shimp discussed "judges decisions" noting that judges need to stress "Play the game, not the rule book!" Then judge accordingly.

Julian and Perkins moved to require mandatory membership for the Grand National and JPW/ACC Open (Main & Consolation). Carried unanimously.

Julian reported on bonding for Membership Secretary, Treasurer, Vice-President, Operations, Secretary General and National Grass Roots Commissioner. \$326 cost per year will cover all five for \$100,000 each.

weekend in Sept. 2001. Carried. Perkins & Barnes to be liason to event.

Hatcher reviewed expulsions regarding Galante and Monroe. Galante expelled effective immediately (he did not respond to letters). Julian reviewed Monroe file, indicating a felony charge of Grand Theft of \$73,000 had been filed. Monroe suspension will remain in place awaiting outcome of Sept. 15th hearing and/or trial of Monroe. Carried.

Thank you given Verne Nielsen for exceptional job on Guidelines Manual. Hatcher moved to approve manual. Any changes to be reviewed by Hatcher and forwarded to Nielsen for implementation. carried.

Lively discussion regarding Grass Roots ensued with finger pointing and hostility.

Eiffert conducted election of executive officers. Those elected for the year Sept. 1999 thru Sept. 2000 are: President: Cathy Perkins; Executive Vice President: Syl Lulinski; Vice President of Policy: Paul Hatcher; Vice President, Operations: Patrick Barrett; Executive Member at Large: Jim Ready.

Thank you given to all who worked on general election of the BOD. Report on election processes and results made by Hatcher. *Cribbage World* will mail ballots and biographies for 2001 election. Carried.

Barnes moved to publish election results and limitations by state & region before the election in *Cribbage World*. Carried. This would let members know the reason some would not be able to hold office if over the limit per state or region.

Bernard moved to pay ACC Statistician McCabe \$200 per month, effective Oct. 1, 1999. Rein moved to amend the amount to \$300 per month. Carried.

Hassett showed proposed cover paper for *Cribbage World* for purposes of labeling at time of printing, saving time and money. *Cribbage World* editor and Membership Secretary will make decision.

Rein moved to hold future All-Star games on Friday nights in conjunction with Grand National, effective with All-Star teams for 1999-2000 year. Reno's Thursday night match for this year scheduled as before. Carried.

Lulinski moved to approve executive board's actions. Approved.

Resignations tendered by Lulinski, Hofbauer, and Jarrell. (Later rescinded).



## Youth Cribbage

After teaching cribbage to nearly 700 young people in the Sonora, CA area, I have relocated. I am leaving behind a program which led to a record-breaking 93 kids attending my annual Sierra Youth Tournament in 1998.

I am now in the Grass Valley area of California. I am no longer a teacher, so I don't have a target audience to start with as I did before. However, in the two months I've been here, I've already taught one group of 15 elementary school kids in an after school program, and I am currently working with another 12. In February, I plan on having my annual youth tournament continue (stay tuned for details) in this area with the hopes of building it to the size it got in Sonora, within a couple of years.

The point here is that it only takes one motivated individual to turn on a whole community of kids to cribbage. Could someone out there in Cribbage Land be one of those people? My manual on how to teach large groups of kids cribbage is still available. In fact, I've already distributed nearly 300 of them throughout the country as well as Canada, the Virgin Islands, and recently Japan! ## Capital City Classic Report Missing Grapevine News:


### George Rodriguez Sweeps Last Chance Gulch

# American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

## Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.

2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following **mandatory** criteria:

A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.

B- have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.

C- have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.

3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following **optional** criteria. He or she must have:

A- promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.

B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.

C- established his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.

D- served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years.

E- served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.

F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years.

4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

## Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

1. Publish annually in the November issue of *Cribbage World* the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, postmarked **no later than December 10 of that year**

2. The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.

3. Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open Tournament in Reno, NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.

4. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.


