Cribbage Challenge Works! **PUYALLUP FAIR PROMOTES CRIBBAGE**

The Western Washington Fair in Puyallup, WA is the 5th largest fair in North America and the largest west of the Mississippi River.

For the past four years Cliff Brandsmaa, director of the Lacey (WA) Peggys Grass Roots club has organized a fair booth that has paid dividends almost beyond belief. This year was no exception. In a 17-day period, the Grass Roots players in the area manned the booth and played challenge cribbage on six boards to the 500,000 or so visitors who passed the cribbage booth. Lines were several deep waiting to play, and some 700 winners walked away with a winning certificate...and cribbage brochures ("Cribbage Anyone?"). Some 6,000 brochures were distributed. Another 4,000 signed on for a free drawing for a custom cribbage board (7) to be given away.

After some 34 volunteer shifts (with 5-6 GR members per shift), and the winning names for cribbage boards drawn, the ACC was declared the winner! Brandsmaa estimates the ACC has added some 600 new members to the roster the past four years, and the Grass Roots program is rolling in the Western Washington area.

Fair management is so impressed with the cribbage booth, that this year additional space was allotted.

And not just Western Washington benefitted from the booth. A National Directory of Grass Roots Clubs was available for visitors that came from every state and many Canadian Provinces.

The following Grass Roots clubs participated, many of the members having been recruited at this fair booth, attesting to the success of the promotion: Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club; Everett Peggys; Kitsap Peggys (Port Orchard); Lacey Peggys (Olympia); Pierce County "31-for-2" Peggys (Tacoma); Sea-Tac Peggys (Federal Way) and Sno-King Peggys (north Seattle).

The volunteers are too numerous to name here, but Region II Commissioner Patrick Ward, and George "Ras" Rasmussen were very instrumental in this promotion. The American Cribbage Congress' Board of Directors voted \$200 to aid in this promotion...and it was money well-spent.

One board winner was from Newton, Iowa. Could that be the famous Iowan pegger from Newton...Larry Loupee? Ed.

Bill Medeiros Tops In New Hampshire

Life Master Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA, is among the top 20 ACC players (lifetime), and he made a move upward by winning the huge 156-player New Hampshire Open on October 1. The win came with 196 MRP's, a sizeable purse, and bragging rights. Steve Brescia (MA) came home 2nd, and he picked up a nice 147 MRP's to begin the new cribbage season. Henry Bergeron (NH) and Life Master George Webb (MA) finished 3-4...and 105 MRP's. Webb and Medeiros are in a virtual deadheat for lifetime MRP's.

Jerry Moren (NH) scored 21 GP's in the 12-game qualifying round to take honors.

Joan Fletcher (CT), fresh from her win at 30,000 feet flying home from GN XIX, must have learned a trick or two at that altitude, as she qualified tops in the 82-player Consolation. But it was Bill Richmond (CT) coming home the winner in the playoffs. He nipped ACC Treasurer Fred McGibney, a Master pegger from S. Burlington, VT. James Edgar (NH) and Joe Ruggerio (NH) took home 3-4.

Director Al Miller reported Syd Lampke (CT) and One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) scored the meet's only 28-hands...and no 29's showed. Miller's events always draw large crowds, attesting to his expertise in managing sizeable tournaments.

Collier Tops in Nebraska

Clay Collier from nearby Beatrice, NE, took home the bacon at the recent Great Plains Open in Lincoln, NE. This Master pegger is a former Grand National champion (IX-1990) and this time around he took home 105 MRP's, bragging rights, and the top prize. Richard Smith (NE) nailed 2nd, with Master Herman Jacobs (NE) and Raymond Menuey (IA) finishing in the 3-4 slot.

Local Ray Bohy scored a nice 24 GP card in the 14-game qualifying round to take honors. The Consolation played to 16 players, and no MRP's were awarded. Jack Show had the top qualifying card.

Director Alfred Berchtold reported an oddity...Helen Railsback waxed her husband, Buzz, by a whopping 71 points, as these two Grand Masters continue their heated competition.

Western Region Wrap

Many events have been played in the Western Region the past two months. The following tournaments are summarized:

Shut Up and Deal, Castro Valley, CA, August 25-27: Director Mary Ryan had a great crowd of 106 players vying for the Shut Up and Deal championship in late August. Roland Hall, Napa, CA came away with the win, besting Bob Christopher (CA) in the final playoff match. And there was One-Star Bob Julian (WI) in a tussel with Master Jay Snyder (CA) for the 3-4 spot. Julian is off and winging to begin the new year. Master Mel Ashley (CA) scored a superlative 40 GP to take qualifying honors. Cy Madrone (CA) took home the Consolation crown, besting the travelling Todd Malmgren, a Grand Master from Oregon. Malmgren is also out of the blocks with a great start in the early going. He narrowly missed All-American honors last year. Richard Wardenburg (CA) had a great Consolation...finishing in the 3-4 bracket after taking qualifying honors. The satellites: Friday: Mary Herrmann (CA); Doubles: Terry George & Bob Todd; Saturday Special: Anne Sheeran (CA); High Rollers: Bob Julian (WI); All-Events: Mary Herrmann, Bob Julian (tie). Team: Keeley, Leonard, Snyder, Herrmann, Julian.

Blue Mountain Open, LaGrande, OR, September 8-10: With 66 players in a spirited match at the County Fairgrounds, it was Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer coming home the winner...and another 147 MRP's to add to her lofty lifetime total. Daulph Plummer (OR) had a great tournament, topping the field in the qualifying round and finishing 2nd. His MRP take? A nice 155 MRP's. Local Danella Royal and Ken Julkowski (OR) finished 3-4. And it was Todd Malmgren, again, winning the 36-player Consolation. Rod Marshall (WA) finished 2nd. Grand Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) nailed the qualifying round. Grand Master Bill Hill (OR) won the High Rollers, and Royal teamed with Mike Bowen (OR) to take the doubles. Charlette and Rick Springer ran a fun event in LaGrande, a small western Oregon town that has a rich history with the old "Oregon Trail" wagons years ago.

Winnemucca Fall Classic, Winnemucca, NV, September 22-24: Considering the conflict with Grand National XIX, this event drew a great crowd of 92 players...and they came to play! Grand Master Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA zipped to the win, edging the red-hot Valerie Sumner (NV) in the final playoff match. Thomas Owens (CA) and Grand Master Bill Hill (OR) finished 3-4. Master Frank Hansberry (CA) posted a nice 37 GP card to take qualifying honors. 1998 All-American Bob Clark (CA) won 8 of 9 in the 62-player consolation's qualifying round (and finished 3rd), but it was Grand Master Roy Banducci winning the event. Tad Pilecki (CA) finished 2nd. Director Marvis Reynolds reported Darlene Carr winning the Early Bird, and Shirley & Jerold Montgomery (CA) copping the doubles. The Last Chance went to Swede Hanson (CA). The host Winners Casino is noted for reasonable rooms, and hospitality plus, attested to by yet another large crowd.

Doucette/Wensel Open, Anchorage, AK, September 25: Willie Bragg (AK) topped the field and won the playoffs as well in a small (28 players) event in Alaska on September 25. Paulette Rowe (AK) took home 2nd. Mary Kreiger (AK) won the 18-player Consolation.

Southern Lions Open, Medford, OR, September 29-October 1: Master Gerald Hahn (OR) nipped 52-players to take home bragging rights, with Rick Baird (OR) finishing 2nd. Grand Master Jim Gogolin (OR) and Burt Ellis (OR) finished 3-4. Grand Master Jim Langley edged John Holseth (OR) to take home the Consolation win. Director Marvis Reynolds reported satellite action went to: Early Bird- Larry Antijunti (OR); Doubles-John Theims & Burt Ellis (OR); High Rollers- Jim Broadhurst; and the Night Owl was won by Grand Master Bill Wakeman (CA).

Colorado Fall Classic, Denver, CO, October 6-8: Director Roger Wilson reported that it was bad luck to be a top qualifier in this 64-player event. Seven of the top 8 qualifiers lost in the first round playoffs. Cliff Stoltz (CO) edged Les Johnson (CO) for the title. Sue Edwards (CO) and Wes Hall (SD) finished 3-4. Robert West won 17 of 22 to take qualifying honors. Veteran Grand Master Dick Graham (CO) won the 32-player Consolation. Howard Guill (WY) nailed 2nd. Friday's action saw Shad Breeling (NE) winning going away.

Clemmey Wins Portside

With a sizeable 114 peggers in action, it was Life Master David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA coming home the winner. With yet another 147 MRP's in the bank, Clemmey has reached the 7,000 MRP mark, and is ranked in the top 35 ACC players (lifetime).

Ray Klocko (VA) nailed down 2nd place (and 105 MRP's), followed by Danny Bennett (VA) and Sharon Deane (VA) in 3-4. Louis Kessler scored the top qualifying score...a nice 35 16/22 +244 (45 MRP's).

Grand Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) won 9 of 10 games to take Consolation qualifying honors, but it was Jeff Raynes (NC) winning the playoff action. Mary Grothe (PA) took 2nd, followed by Medeiros and Grand Master Dwight Christiansen (CT) finishing 3-4. Medeiros's MRP take added 64 MRP's to her lofty lifetime total (5,200+).

Halucka Makes Friends

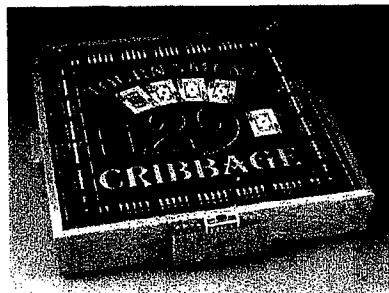
Fumi Halucka, Santa Maria, CA, knows how to make friends.

Veteran Duff Bonomi has been trying for the Montana crown for several years, and he went home the bridesmaid, albeit with \$675 and 105 MRP's. Life Master George "Ras" Rasmussen (WA) copped third, and he is out of the blocks winging this cribbage year, setting the pace in the Western Region with well over 300 MRP's in the bag. Only One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) has a higher talley in the early going. Another player sizzling in the early going is Marion Buckley, the pegging Royal Mounted Policewoman from Edmonton, AB. She finished 4th. She had recently nailed the High Roller at GN XIX.

Master Mike McDaniel (WA) had the top qualifying round card...a 35 16 +187.

With 61 peggers in action in the Consolation, Lorne Tanton, another stellar pegger from Edmonton, AB, came home the winner...and took the Friday Time Passer as well. Virginia Reilly (ID) took home 2nd, with local Michelle Barthelmess and Bill Sword (OR) in the 3-4 bracket. Sword also copped the High Roller and took home an aggregate \$880!

Other satellite winners saw Jim Best (ID) team with Lee Carpenter (ID) to take the Doubles. 2000 All-American Jack Moritzky (a newly-wed from WA) win the Saturday Special, and none other than Three-Star DeLynn Colvert, the meet's director, coming home the winner in the Last Chance event.

LeRoy Mill (MT), Jesse Jarrell (CA), and Wes Walimaa (MT) scored that elusive 28-hand...but no 29's showed.

Synopsis

Board of Directors Meeting

Eau Claire, WI - Sept. 22, 2000

All members present except Kooistra and Ready (excused)

Minutes approved from Feb. meeting.

Thank you extended to Roger Wilson (outgoing Treasurer) and welcome extended to Fred McGibney for assuming Treasurer duties.

Financial Report presented by McGibney. Approved. BOD requested report be received couple of weeks before meeting.

Audit approved unanimously (reviewed by McGibney). McGibney noted that the ACC has never had a complete full audit.

Lulinski deferred discussions regarding Grass Roots (GRCP, Inc.) Dissolution, Manual, TIN, & Audit). These items will be discussed at Reno Meeting (2001).

Julian reviewed Monroe situation. Offer received from Monroe of one-time payment of \$30,000 as restitution to avoid prison time (work-release program possible option). Perkins moved to accept \$35,000 with incarceration. Amended to accept no less than \$30,000 and leave incarceration up to judge's discretion. Approved by one vote. Julian commended for his work on case...at no cost to ACC.

Perkins moved to increase stipend for Treasurer from \$200 to \$300 month. Carried 11-9. All positions regarding compensation will be reviewed and addressed at Feb. 2001 meeting.

Report on upcoming Grand Nationals; Lindner reported 400 players and 100 at Awards Banquet. Kitts reported on Richmond, VA, GN. Sponsors, prizes, etc. on track. Fliers available soon. Eiffert reported on Lake Tahoe GN (2002). She is now co-director. Shuttles from Reno to Kings Beach being investigated.

Hom reported on minors at tournaments. Asked for guidance. Bickford will bring guidelines to Feb. BOD meeting.

Hatcher asked BOD to address letter from Steve Sattler, and direct Perkins to notify Sattler the complaint filed had no merit because it was a committee action, not an individual action, and the complaint should have been directed at the entire committee. Rein moved to have all Grass Roots discussions and election of officers to after addressing suspensions. Defeated 8-13. Hatcher asked for a letter to Sattler with copy to all BOD members. Lulinski moved to drop allegations against Hatcher. Carried.

Barnes discussed advertising, indicating \$200 given to Puyallup Fair (WA) which runs for 3 weeks. Shimp noted need for Senior Judges in the West and East.

standing committees and officers reported. Hatcher resigned from Ethics Committee.

Elections for new Executive Board (2000-2001), effective following meeting:

President: DeLynn Colvert
Executive Vice President: Syl Lulinski
Vice President Policy: Paul Hatcher
Vice President Operations: Bob Julian
Member-at-Large: Jim Ready

Lulinski noted new Executive Board would be contacting Standing Committee Appointments during lunch break.

Hatcher moved that a limited audit be performed when personnel changes are made to positions of Treasurer, Membership Secretary, Grass Roots Commissioner. Amended by Perkins to "funds to be paid by the ACC." Carried.

Hassett reported on Membership Secretary's memberships, expenses, etc.

Hom moved to accept Protocol as rule. (Procedures regarding dissemination of information among various committees of the ACC). Carried.

Hofbauer moved to bar expelled/suspended individuals from Satellite events. Carried.

Lulinski moved to add to rules and guidelines: ACC Grand Nationals must be held no earlier than 3rd weekend in Sept. and no later than 2nd weekend in Oct. and that Commissioners give priority to any tournament that is displaced by GN in reclaiming original weekend the following year. Carried. Bickford moved that proposal for GN be presented in writing at least one month before BOD meeting in which location is awarded for that year. Carried.

Rein moved to hold Tournament of Champions and JPW/ACC Open at Sands (Reno) in 2002. Carried. Rein moved to hold an Open 12-game Satellite event on Friday afternoon in lieu of TOC Consolation, allowing companions of TOC entrants to participate. Carried with 5 opposed. Perkins moved to add TOC criteria, "Anyone qualifying for an invitation only due to being Grass Roots Champions, Grass Roots National Tournament Champion or Grass Roots Regional Champions receive a one-year invite to be used any of the following three years. However, if using another invite qualification during that time period it would be considered used. Carried (two opposed). Shimp moved to remove criteria #8 (BOD members have automatic invite), since change of format allows Friday afternoon play. Carried.

Bickford moved that muggins not be an option of players at tournament. Either entire tournament has muggins or it does not. Carried.

Barnes asked for \$13,000 be approved for Public Relations. Exec. VP Lulinski indicated that it had been approved out of order. Exec. Board will address this matter.

Bickford motioned sanctioning fee be lowered to \$1 for one year. Failed. Bickford motioned to lower sanctioning fee to \$1.50 with effective date of January 1, 2001 with no time period designated. Carried (two opposing).

Lulinski moved to accept amendments to the Constitution/Bylaws. Carried. *Article IVg: Board vacancies that occur between elections shall be filled for the unexpired term by the individuals...in order...who were elected and received the most votes in the last election. This appointment must be consistent with the stipulations listed in Article IVc, d, and e. In none of the candidates meets those criteria, the vacancy is filled by Presidential appointment, if approved by a majority of the Executive Committee.*

Lulinski moved to accept change to Article VI.d. Carried. *Article VI.d: The Executive Committee shall be empowered to act for the Board between meetings. A written report of any actions must be submitted to the BOD at the next scheduled Board meeting.*

Lulinski discussed publishing names of suspended individuals without explanation in *Cribbage World*. No action taken.

Hassett moved to approve Article XI - Conduct. Carried. Effective date: Sept. 1, 2000. *Article XI - Conduct. a. Persons accepting a position in the ACC Organization whether elected, appointed, or certified, shall agree to abide by the ACC Constitution and Bylaws, ACC policies, BOD directives, and any other documents or directives approved by the ACC BOD (hereafter referred to as "official documents"). The official documents will be taken at face value. Infractions of this section may result in disciplinary action. b. Members shall promote the goals and positive image of the organization. Any member whose actions directly or indirectly reflect negatively on the ACC or its goals may be disciplined. c. Violations must be reported to the Ethics Committee, The Ethics Committee may take any of the following actions (normal Ethics Committee procedures apply, as appropriate): 1. Inadvertent or minor violations may result in an official warning or reprimand; 2. Repeated offenses and/or willful infractions may result in removal from all positions held in the ACC, suspension and/or revocation of membership. Violators will not be allowed to hold a position in the ACC for a minimum period of five years. The Ethics Committee may impose a longer time period;*

and 3. Members, who exhibit wanton disregard of the official documents, disrupt ACC functions and/or tarnish the image of the ACC may be subject to expulsion from the ACC. d. Members expelled from the ACC will lose all privileges, honors, and any rankings they may have earned."

Hassett moved to approve amendment to Article VII (other Committees). Failed to receive two-thirds vote, defeated.

Llewellyn moved to table the proposal to amend Article Xc (Ethics) until the next meeting. Carried.

Rein moved to remove the dissolution requirement regarding suspension of Ramos and Mikulsky. No call for vote. Rein moved to keep a restricted account for the Grass Roots funds only...not to intermingled with the general funds of the ACC except for purposes of filing taxes. Carried.

After a suspension hearing with Hatcher (Chairman of Ethics Committee); Eugene Mikulsky, Member of the BOD of the GRCP, inc.; Syl Lulinski, Exec. VP, orating, Shimp moved to lift the suspension immediately noting that Mikulsky needed to work with Rein in order to transfer funds to the ACC's Grass Roots program. This should be accomplished before the Reno meeting. Carried. *(Grass Roots funds will be distributed proportionately to the ACC Grass Roots and other members of the Grass Roots who have chosen to join the ICCA or become independents).* Rein indicated that if matters were not taken care of by the Reno meeting (Feb. 2001), she too could be suspended if they did not trust her. Wikstrom moved to add an amendment to say "when the Grass Roots funds are returned the suspensions will be lifted." Defeated. Perkins read letter of guarantee of monies to the BOD by a member of the ACC. Motion to lift suspension and let Rein and Mikulsky work out details on return of monies was called. Unanimously approved.

ACC Policy Manual review was moved to Feb. 2001 meeting. Assumption made to accept manual changes with necessary corrections at Reno meeting. No motion tendered.

Lulinski stated next meeting will be at Reno (Sands) on February 1, 2001. Meeting adjourned.

At the recent Awards Ceremony in Eau Claire, several players expected a trophy board for Grand Master, and Life Master. However, two years ago, the Executive Committee, Ev Bey, President, changed that policy. The ACC's Manual states that all ACC members that achieve Master rating be awarded a trophy board, and awards for Grand Master, Life Master, One-Star, Two-Star, etc. receive engraved plaques.

At the Daytona Beach Grand National Board of Director's meeting, a change in policy concerning 29-Hand awards was discussed. The BOD voted to mail a framable award commemorating this rare feat and not award them at the Awards Ceremony. The \$100 for a sanctioned 29-hand stands.

American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.

2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following **mandatory** criteria:

A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.

B- have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.

C- have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.

3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following **optional** criteria. He or she must have:

A- promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.

B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.

C- established his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.

D- served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years.

E- served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.

F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years.

4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

1. Publish annually in the November issue of *Cribbage World* the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, postmarked **no later than December 10 of that year.**

2. The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.

3. Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open Tournament in Reno, NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.

4. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.

HARRY HARRIS FUNTIME Crazy Over Cribbage

About a year ago, Genecy, my favorite companion, after hearing me repeatedly lamenting my failure to find cribbage players, spotted a one-inch newspaper announcement that a group of addicts was convening on the first Wednesday of every month.

I investigated, won six of my first set of nine games and a \$35 first prize — and was hooked. Now every first Wednesday is circled on my calendar.

At first the games were played in Elkins Park. Since January, home base has been the Pitcairn Club at the Willow Grove Naval Station.

The 16 to 24 participants, mostly male, mostly gray-haired, range in age and occupation. They include lawyers, optometrists, a former British bookie, housewives, a retired barber, a retired policeman and, among the younger players, an aspiring opera singer.

Virtually every cribbage buff becomes a Johnny Appleseed, spreading the gospel. In my own home I infected my late wife, my children, my housekeeper and even casual visitors.

Cribbage is a card game of luck and skill in which

pegs are advanced around a peg board. The boards themselves can be rectangular, square, round, triangular, Z-shaped, S-shaped, M-shaped, peculiar (in the form, say, of a bowling ball, a cactus or a toilet seat) or even built around the number 29 (the highest possible score for a single hand).

Cribbage, initially cribbidge, was invented in the 1630s by a British poet, Sir John Suckling, who also concocted the lyric “Why so pale and wan, fond lover?”

Cribbidge quickly became England’s most popu-

lar game. Originally the goal was 61 points (now it’s 121) and each player was dealt five cards (now it’s six), but Suckling’s rules are virtually unchanged.

I can’t remember how or when I first learned the game, but portly, mustached Elkins Park lawyer Franklin A. Wurman, who oversees the Willow Grove group, has no similar uncertainty.

He was taught, he says, by Steve Klein, a Cheltenham High School classmate, before their

graduation in 1949. He kept playing in college, during World War II service and in law school.

He’s a fount of factoids: Another Franklin, first name Benjamin, was a cribbage fan. Cribbage is depicted in several movies: “The Sting,” “Front Page,” “Barry Lyndon.”

Wurman doesn’t limit himself to the Willow Grove action. He attends cribbage tournaments as far off as Nevada, North Carolina (“Raleigh, 15 times”) and Massachusetts.

Recently, to gain new recruits, he gave free Monday night instruction at Elkins Park library.

All the Wurmans are players: wife Nancy, sons Joseph and Richard, daughter Bryna. Son-in-law Brian, Wurman says, was told (kiddingly) that he couldn’t join the family until he learned the game.

Wurman, an ardent collector of cribbage boards, is credited in Bette L. Bemis’ hobbyist “bible,” “Cribbage Boards 1863-1998.”

He owned only two boards when he went to England in 1959 but bought a half dozen more at Portobello Road antique stalls. Now he owns almost 300. Fifteen of the more unusual he recently displayed at the Elkins Park Library.

I own only four boards: large, small, round and unique.

Intrigued by variations like Race Track Cribbage and Crib-Derby, I purchased JK Games’ Cribb Racing, but was disappointed because it used conventional pegs. My son had an enlarged version of the board transferred to plastic, and now we’re the only cribbage players in the world who can play the game with miniature horses. ◆

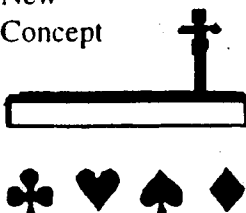
