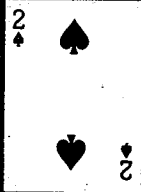

Western Region Doubleheader

Mike O'Malley Cops Portland Ron Balmer Tops Washington

Portland, OR, Jan. 9: Mike O'Malley, pegging out of Salem, OR, came home the winner at the Portland Winter Open. In besting some 156 players, O'Malley took home 196 MRP's, and a four-figure winner's check. Grand Master Jim Gogolin (OR) zipped over the 5,000 MRP mark (lifetime) with a 2nd place finish. Californian Adrian Levy and Master Gary Rose (WA) took home 3-4. Master Ron Morgan (CA) finished in the 5-8 bracket and keeps his top-ten hopes alive for this cribbage year. The 70 MRP's earned zips Morgan to well over the 500 mark and he is among the national leaders.

Harry Kantas (OR) topped the field in the qualifying round, winning 16 of 22 (35 GP's).

Master Lynn Gillespie (WA) put on quite a show in the Consolation qualifying round. He scored a grand slam 9/9 with 5 skunks (23 GP's). His scorecard is shown in this issue. Jack Moritzky (WA) won this 106-player event, and he too, is among the national leaders. And, in addition, he is closing in on his Grand Master rating. James Seufert (OR), Jerry Hearsom (OR), and Master Heidi Glashan (CA) finished 2-3-4.

Centralia, WA, Jan 16: Ron Balmer, Puyallup, WA, learned about the ACC and organized cribbage at the Puyallup County Fair...and armed with an ACC membership, zipped to the Washington State Championship. This auspicious start to his tournament pegging career netted Balmer 196 MRP's and well over \$1,000 in prize money. Rob Anderson (WA) nailed down 2nd, and another sizeable purse (and 147 MRP's). Master Tom Markham (WA) and Mike McDaniel (WA) took home 3-4 in this 177-player event.

Sharon Hejtmanek (MT) is having a banner year in the qualifying rounds. She once again came home tops with a 37 17/22 +239. Earlier this year she has posted 36, 38, and 42 GP cards. These high finishes have her among the leaders this cribbage year (nearly 500 MRP's).

124 players stayed for a Consolation that proved to be quite eventful. Half-way through the qualifying round, a fierce wind storm knocked out power, and players milled around for well over an hour before power was restored and play could continue. Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) took qualifying honors, and Life Master Roy Hofbauer (WA) took the playoff action. Jim Merriman (WA), Joe Cover (OR), and Ermin Bear (OR) finished 2-3-4.

One-Star Bob Julian Cops Menominee MGM

Bill Shirland Tops Eau Claire Classic, Earns Grand Master

Keshena, WI, Nov. 7: With a large group of 165 peggers on hand, veteran One-Star Bob Julian came away with his 6th sanctioned Main Event win...and vaults into the thick of this year's MRP race. This 3-time National Champion from Milwaukee came away with 196 MRP's and a nice winner's check in winning this popular Central Region event.

Richard Kuehn (WI) took home 2nd...and 147 MRP's. Bob Chase, a Master pegger from Minneapolis, took home 3rd and Ron Williams (WI) nailed 4th.

Ken Rehm (WI) won 17 of 22 games to take qualifying honors (35 17 +227)...and the lion's share of the Q pool.

Gene "Moose" Biegler, the West Bend flash, won the 76-player Consolation ...and took home his Life Master to boot. The event awarded 63 MRP's, and Biegler easily zipped over the 6,000 MRP mark (lifetime) to earn the ACC's 43rd Life Master. Master Ron Hirschman (WI) took 2nd, followed by Vince Oettinger (WI) and Carol Kumbalek (WI) in 3-4. Grand Master Larry Rowley (WI) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Directors Tom Gallagher, Bob Miller, and Jerry Lemke, once again, had a full slate of events, complete with awards for 24, 28 and 29-hands. The winners:

Eau Claire, WI, Dec. 5: Bill Shirland, pegging out of Denver, Colorado, made December 5 a very special day to remember. He won the 156-player 5th Annual Eau Claire Classic...and earned his Grand Master to boot! In picking up 196 MRP's Shirland easily winged it over the 4,000 MRP mark and the ACC's 134th Grand Master.

The final four was a who's who in the ACC, as Grand Master Aggie Mikulsky (WI) took home 2nd, followed by One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) in 3rd and Life Master Martha Fingleton (WI) in 4th. Master John Syftestad (WI) had the hotcard in the qualifying round...a nice 37 17/22 +234.

Deb Kvien, Vernon Hills, IL, zipped to Life Master No. 44 by taking Consolation qualifying honors (17 8/9 +87). This event had a sizeable 90 players...and Bob Sommer (MN) is nearing his Grand Master with this playoff win. Don Flesch (WI) did earn his Grand Master by finishing 2nd. He earns the ACC's 135th. James Weires (MN) and David Shaff (MN) nailed 3-4.

Wikstrom also scored the ACC's first 29-hand this cribbage year... a gem in Redmond, OR last August.

93-year old Ole Olson (WA) qualified with a 29 14/22, and won his first-round playoff match with ex-World Champ Rollie Heath (OR), proving once and for all that cribbage is a game for all ages!

Grape-Vine Report Pat Barrett Sizzles At North Pole Open

A grape-vine report arrived at CW just in time to make this issue. Life Master Pat Barrett (WI) was sizzling at the recent North Pole Open in Appleton, WI. After qualifying 2nd (36 16/22 +144), he came home the winner in the playoffs as well. This run netted a whopping 246 MRP's, and Barrett throws his hat into the top-ten race for this cribbage year with this 31-9 run. Second place? None other than One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI).

A highlight of this event saw Bob Brown (WI) score the ACC's 10th sanctioned 29-hand in the Consolation playoffs... with none other than another One-Star player: Duane Toll (WI). Toll won the match.

Portsmouth, VA, Dec. 12: Bill Whiting from nearby Williamsburg took home the marbles at the Holiday Classic. In besting a sizeable 74 peggers, Whiting took home 147 MRP's, the top purse...and bragging rights. Georgian Dave Foxwell finished 2nd, with Bruce Sattler (MD) and Eastern Region front-runner Paul Gallagher (MA) in 3-4. Gallagher is a Grand Master and has tacked on a hefty 500+ MRP's this cribbage year.

Aaron Geroux (NC) won 16 of 22 qualifying games to take honors. His 33-GP top card attests to a veteran group of peggers in attendance.

Some 54 players stayed for the Consolation, and Bob Milk came home the winner, besting Steve Sattler (MD) in the final playoff match. Master Bobby Stuart (GA) and Danny Bennett (VA) took home 3-4. Hugh Berry (VA) won 9 of 10 to take honors in the qualifying round.

A highlight of this event saw Jack Brown cut the 5 of diamonds for the ACC's 9th 29-hand of this cribbage year. And Steve Sattler nailed two 28-hands...one being sanctioned.

With an even bracket of 64, Barnes took home 105 MRP's, the winner's purse, and bragging rights. Earl Luton (NC), Dave Foxwell (GA), and Master Russ Perkins (NC) finished 2-3-4. Foxwell also took qualifying honors with a 33 GP card in the 20-game round.

If he could get just one more skunk, his card would be the highest 9-gamer in the history of the American Cribbage Congress.

He began the game with a run of hot cards and he was standing at hole 82, with his opponent dealing...and well back. If Gillespie could just score three points over average on the next three deals, the record would be his! Alas, his cards turned cold (6-6-4) and he won by only 13 points. Nevertheless, the card below stands as one of the top five best cards ever recorded in ACC history.

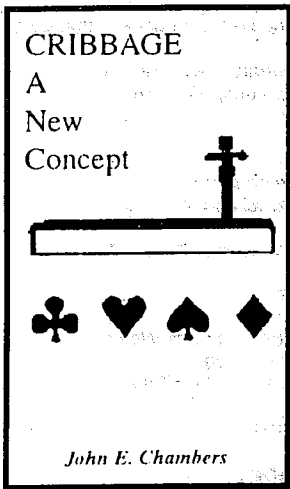

Jarrell, Hatcher Lead MRP Race

As the ACC hits the halfway mark this cribbage year, two veteran highly ranked peggers are leading the way in the annual MRP race. **Jesse Jarrell**, a One-Star play from Pittsburg, CA, has forged into the lead with an unofficial 735 MRP's. Life Master **Paul Hatcher** (OR) is but a step behind, posting 710 MRP's to date. One-Star **Harry Palmer** (MA) has been earning MRP's at almost every stop lately, and has zipped to the mid 500's. Tournament of Champions Controversy

Verne Nielsen recently wrote advocating changing the TOC to a "rotating" event in concert with the Grand National. Verne wants the TOC to be a "premier event" rather than a "Step child" (his quotes).

I break from Verne, in that I believe the current TOC, held at the Sands in Reno, IS a premier event, one that makes the weekend at the Biggest Little City in the West the most exciting three days in all of Cribbage.

Paraphrasing, Verne wants to:

- 1-Make it a 2-day event prior to the GN (22-game qualifier).
- 2- Make it affordable and fairer by rotating between regions.
- 3-Reduce overcrowding at the Sands.

I believe:

1- We play enough 22-game qualifiers. Champions at a higher level can catch a break and not have to suffer cribbage burnout playing 44 qualifying games in three days, no matter where the TOC is held.

2- The TOC is as attractive as it gets. A chance to play against the TOP players in the country is something all those players won't shy from, believe me! I don't believe a shift in venue makes it any fairer, it merely shifts the amount of fairness for a short time to one region or another.

3- The Sands handles overcrowding like no other regular tourney host. Putting 1,000 people in two adjacent rooms is daunting to any facility, and would not be changed by moving the TOC. I would be willing to bet that less than 5 people who play in the TOC do not choose to play in the Open. That doesn't change either tourney's entry one bit. Verne concludes that tying the TOC with the GN will "assure" two things: 1- A respectable turnout at every Grand National (there have been record tournouts in 2 of the last 3!). 2- The TOC will be a TOURNAMENT for the champions. (Verne, you forget, they become champions by GOING to tournaments). The jewel in the Cribbage Tournament Trail is the TOC/JPW Open weekend. I plan for it, as do many others. If one wants to play at a CHAMPIONSHIP level, it is a trip we expect to make. Moving it would diminish a great tradition, a shining opportunity, and a wonderful tournament. See you in Reno!

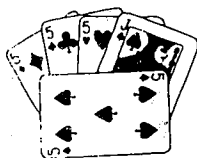

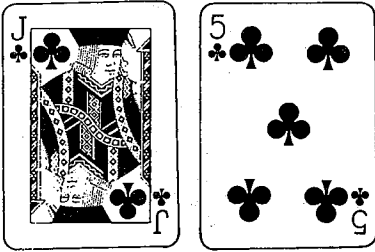
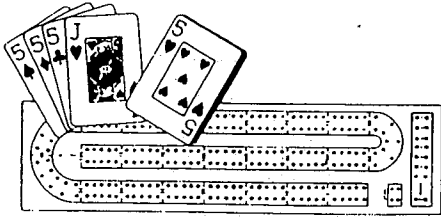
No. 1 Vs. No. 2

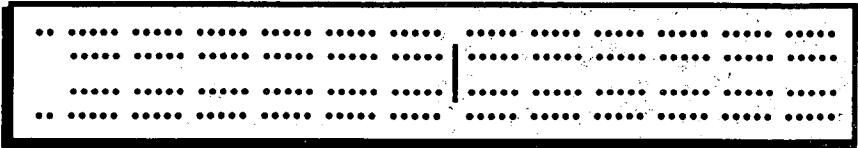
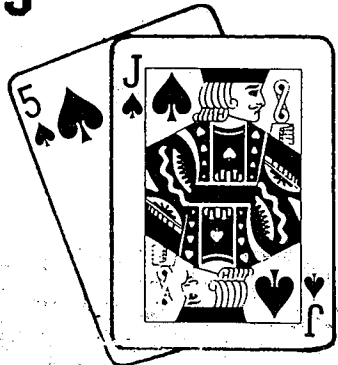
