208 In Turtle Lake

Charles Runs Table At June St. Croix

Director Alan Lindner was forced to turn away peggers at the June edition of the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI as some 208 peggers were shoe-horned into the St. Croix Casino. Playing space simply ran out.

With this record crowd, it was Green Bay's Clarence Charles' day in the sun. With a great 40 18/22 +266 qualifying card under his belt, he continued on to take the playoffs as well. This championship run netted Charles a nifty combined \$3,235, and an astounding 266 Master Points.

Les Kvien (IL) simply could not match Charles' hot run of cards, and settled for 2nd money...and 147 MRP's. Kvien is knocking on the door for his Grand Master with this high finish. Doug Muneke (MN) and James Dahl (WI) finished 3-4. Dahl is also nearing his Grand Master.

Bill Johnson (WI) nailed the 124-player Consolation, nipping Master Bob Chase (MN) in the final playoff match. One-Star Bob Julian (WI) keeps his hat in the ring for top-ten honors this cribbage year by taking 3rd, and Don Christensen (CO) nailed down 4th. Kathie Kjertsen (MN) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Director Lindner reported players were turned away by phone in advance of play, and others who showed on Friday night and Saturday morning were also turned away. He urges all players to register far in advance in the future to guarantee a spot in the competition.

With much side pool action, players scoring well were Martha Sondericker (\$1,110) and Connie Staven (\$1,440). Daryl Halopka (WI) had a hot weekend as he lost his last game on Friday night to lose his grand slam, then qualified 2nd in the Main Event (37 GP's), and finished in the 5-8 bracket, taking home \$775. His wife, Bonnie, finished 12th Friday night and scored five 24-hands during the weekend, giving this duo gas money to spare.

As usual the St. Croix Casino were great hosts, furnishing soda, juice, and coffee, plus great food. Remember! Sign up early for the next edition of this popular event!

Hejtmanek Takes Alberta Open

Sharon Hejtmanek, Missoula, MT, came home the winner at the inaugural Alberta Open in Edmonton on June 4. The win was special as she also earned her Master rating. And the 147 MRP's zip her to well over 600 for the year, with an outside chance of earning All-American honors. Local Ron Saik came close with a 2nd place finish. He saw his chances evaporate when Hejtmanek hit a 3-6-6-6 with a 3 cut in game number 6. His take? 105 MRP's, \$525, and a trophy board. Hejtmanek took home a nice \$725 and the champion's trophy board.

Shirley Ruff (AB) and Estalita Ells (ID) nailed down 3-4 in this 67-player event. Walter Steubel (AB) topped the qualifiers with a nice 36 16/22 +232.

Fredella Haab (MT) ran the table in the Consolation (43 players). She qualified with a 16 8/9 +92 and won the playoffs as well. Her final playoff match pitted her against the streaking Grand Master Jack Moritzky (WA), but she prevailed in a tough match. Moritzky is at the 1,000 MRP mark for the year, and keeps his hat in the ring for national honors this cribbage year. Marvin Blomquist (AB) and John Simac (MT) took home 3-4.

Wrightman Tops Nipomo

Californian Ron Wrightman came home the winner at the recent Nipomo Open on May 28. In topping 110 players in the field, Wrightman carted home 147 MRP's...and bragging rights.

Theilma Weber (CA) earned her Master rating (unofficially) by taking home 2nd...and the 105 MRP's run her lifetime tally to well over 2,000. Fumi Halucka (CA) and John Galbreath (CA) finished 3-4. Golda Rager (CA) topped the field in the qualifying round, winning 17 of 22 (35 GP's).

One-Star Bob Julian (WI), in quest of a 4th National Championship, took home the 78-pegger Consolation event, topping Abby Cohen (CA) in the final playoff match. John Mock (CA) and Ira Deutsch (CA) finished 3-4. Master Amellee Killion (CA) scored a grand slam 19 9/9 +180 in the qualifying round to easily take honors. This great score netted Killion 24 MRP's.

Director Darrell Hunstad scheduled Friday and Saturday satellite matches. Master Linda Swiontek (CA) won Friday's event and Golda Rager continued her torrid Saturday pegging in winning the 2nd satellite.

Hunstad reported that Julie Hardardt (CA) scored a 29-hand...the 21st scored in sanctioned play this cribbage season. He also reported that Roland Kerber (CA), Bill Bishop (CA), and Angela French (CA) scored 28-hands.

Hot (Not So Hot) Team

Out in Redmond, OR, they had team play in conjunction with the main qualifying round.

With all the top runners in action as the season winds down, five hotshots pooled their money and formed a team. They couldn't lose, since their lifetime Master Rating Points topped some 53,000!!

Oops! They finished 8th (of 16 teams) with a dismal 119 GP's (a 23.8 average) in the 22-game round (110 games aggregate). Who were they? Two-Star DeLynn Colvert, Two-Star Jesse Jarrell, One-Star Paul Hatcher, Grand Master Rollie Heath, and Grand Master Jack Moritzky.

The winning team? Jim Hombacher, Clair Morse, Jim Sime, Ken Capper, and Jack Moritzky. Their lifetime totals? 22,800!

Heath Wins Spokane Open

In 1997 and 1998 Rollie Heath (OR) earned All-American honors, and finished 20th in 1999. As the 2000 cribbage season winds down, Heath, once again, throws his hat into the MRP race. Fresh from winning the Yreka Gold Panners (CA), he won yet again at the Greater Spokane Valley Open on May 28. In topping the 120 players, Heath took home 182 MRP's (including a qualifying round score 33 = 35 MRP's)...and zips to well over 900 for the year.

Charlie Huber (ID) finished 2nd, and simply could not match Heath's run. Master I. V. Graham (MT) and Master Jim Sime (WA) finished 3-4.

Another Master pegger...Mike McDaniel (WA)...scored one of the season's best qualifying scores. He nailed a 41 18/22 +248 gem to easily take honors (and 75 MRP's).

92 players stayed for the Consolation and Mike Gilbert (WA) took home the bacon. Bill Leu (WA), John Jameson, and Grand Master Rex Paddock (MT) finished 2-3-4. Master Leslie Hein (WA) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Rit Alkas Tops In New York

Rit Alkas, 1995 National Champion, is at it again. This time around he nailed the Western New York Open on May 28. This Manchester, CT pegger is moving in on his One-Star with the win, and is standing at a lofty 9,800 MRP's. In picking up the win in this 74-player event, Alkas took home yet another 147 MRP's...and bragging rights.

Master Bob Clark was a long way from his California home and he paid for his trip by taking home 2nd. Clark earned All-American honors in 1998, and he continues his winning ways. Dan Toussaint (NY) and Connie Ewka (MI) came home 3-4. Stanley Bochinski (NY) nailed the qualifying round with a nice 35 GP card in the 22-game round.

Master James Huser (WI) won the 49-player Consolation (and 45 MRP's), topping Peter Lerch (VA) in the final playoff match. Two New Yorkers took 3-4...Paul Eichler and Richard Schurkus.

Director Shamus O'Connor played a Friday night Early Bird, won by Phillip Lococo (ON), and a doubles match on Saturday night. Jim and Kathy Blough (MI) took home this event. O'Connor also reported Bob Camenga (NY) and Richard Schurkus (NY) scored that elusive 28-hand, both coming in the Consolation playoffs.

This event is noted for the inexpensive Air Force base rooms, and the expertise of director O'Connor keeps peggers coming back to New York, attested to by ever-increasing crowds.

Midnight Pegging

Way up north in Edmonton, AB, Marion and Harold Buckley had a welcoming cook-out on Thursday night for the visiting peggers, and a great time was being held by all...but when Harold set up tables for some outdoor pegging beginning at 8 o'clock for a 9-game match, the American peggers thought he may be a bit daffy. But no, when the match wound down at 10:30 PM, it was still daylight! Now, that's one for the books! Who won? None other than the H & H girls (Sharon Hejzmanek, MT, and Rosemary Hendricks, WA). The Buckley's hospitality was outstanding, and the "ice" was broken quickly between the Canadians and the Americans. And it didn't take very long to figure out what you were losing in a "Five-Ten" game, when playing with Canadian money (\$3.65 American).

Anomalies In Paradise, Edmonton

Strange happenings occur in cribbage from time to time, and the first weekend in June saw two unusual happenings.

First, at the Nugget Classic in Paradise, CA. The qualifying round scores earned three peggers a new status. First, Jones Hom (CA) came home with enough qualifying MRP's to earn Life Master. Then Ron Morgan (CA) earned his Grand Master, and Bob Dellinger (CA) also earned his Masters in this unusual round.

Up in Edmonton, AB, the qualifying match proved to be a very close one. Rarely does a 26 GP card qualify for the playoffs, but this time around Bill Hill (OR) and Del Allen (AB) both qualified with a 26 GP card!

Morse's high finish added some 70 MRP's and runs this year's totals to the 1,000 mark...and an excellent chance for All-American honors (if not the national championship, as well).

Gallagher added some 105 MRP's, running this year's talley to well over 600 MRP's for the year...and a good chance of making the Eastern Region's All-Star team (top 8).

of the month

The Five Trap

By George "Ras" Rasmussen

In one variation of a five-trap, you must possess 6-7-7-10, 6-7-8-J, or 6-7-9-J or other combinations where you can hold the 6-7 as your final two cards. If you have two 7's as indicated, lead from the 7. If you have the 8 or 9 in combination with the 6-7, lead from the 8 or 9 so that you keep your trap jaws open with the 6-7 ready to spring on the 5. If you lead from the 7, 8, or 9 and dealer plays a 10-point card, there is a strong possibility that your trap will work. Of course, you must have a card that will put the count over 26. Otherwise, the 5 you planned to trap will be played and escape the trap. The dealer is then forced to lead remaining 10-point card, non-dealer response is the 7, forcing the dealer to play his 5, at the count of 22. Your 6 completes the trap for 28, a run of 3, and a go. A nifty 3-point gain!

George, on the other side of the coin, as the dealer, and you have played two 10-cards, and your two cards remaining are a 5 and a 10-card, take a look at what your opponent has played. If only two cards are on the table and they are NOT a 10-card or 5, the percentage play is to lead the 5, thus escaping any trap that has been set by your opponent. Ed.

Dealer pegged 22-0! Believe It Or Not

Tom Fiorini (MA) wrote CW about a play that was unbelievable that happened in Raleigh at the National Open in 1983. The non-dealer was in the 120th (last) hole, with first count and the dealer was 22-points out. The non-dealer held 4-9-10-10, and the dealer held 4-4-4-6. The non-dealer led a 9, the dealer played a 6 for 15-2. The non-dealer then made his faux pas, he played a 4 for "19." Oops, the dealer played 4 (go)-4-4 (for 2-6-14) and game! Believe it or not! 22 pegs and out!

Incidentally, Fiorini wrote this could be a possible scenario for a total of 74 points for the dealer, if a 5 was cut, and the discards were 5-5, and 5-J. Top that, cribbage land!

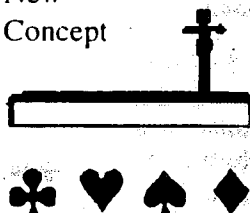

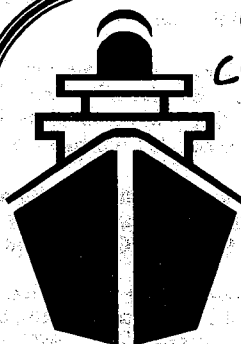

At Last...

The Rules of Noddy

Cribbage World has tried, without success, to find the rules of Noddy. This game was the forerunner of cribbage.

Russell Lovell, Jr. (Sandwich, MA) tracked down the rules of Noddy. This set of rules was published in "Early Card Games" by MacGregor Historic Games, 2229 E. 34th St., Minneapolis, MN 55407.

Noddy

Probably used a 30-hole board for recording scores, one-track per player.

Dealer deals 3 cards, then turns top card. If a Jack ("Knave Noddy") he gets 2 points and takes them straight away. This card was also called "His Heels." This is not part of the hand count.

Non-dealer states his 4-card count by type of count as "15-2 and a pair is 4" and scores **without showing the cards**. This count includes 1-for-the-jack if the suit matches the suit cut.

Dealer announces his hand count and scores it **without showing the cards**. He may also include one for knobs.

After scoring the hands, play sequence begins. The non-dealer leads a card as in the standard game of cribbage. The dealer responds, and play continues until the first 31 is scored, or a go. The unused cards are not played.

Cards are scored in a similar manner as cribbage, with some exceptions. For example a run of 3 scores 2-points, in the hand and pegging. Scoring is the same as in cribbage, except flushes count in pegging (3, 4, 5, or 6). A run of 4 is 4 in pegging or in the hand. A run of 5 scores 5, and a run of 6 scores 6. Exact 31 is 2-points, a "go" is 1-point.

After pegging the hands (and the hands revealed) an overcount is corrected, and undercount is lost.

Game score of 31 wins. No penalty if loser is far behind.

Early "Cribbage"

Sir John Suckling, an English Knight, Poet and Gamester, modified the game of Noddy into a new game called "Cribbage" in the early 1600's.

Sir John began by doubling the score of a game to 61 points. He also added a 5-card crib, and the board now included a double row of 30-holes for each player. Once around and a winner was declared.

The dealer deals each player 5 cards. Each discards 2 cards to the dealer's crib.

The starter (or common) card, by agreement, may be the top card of the pack, as in Noddy, or may be cut.

The dealer scores 2 points for a cut jack.

In the first deal, the non-dealer scores 3-points to compensate for the dealer's crib. Thereafter, the crib advantage alternates with no further compensation.

Non-dealer does not show his cards, but announces his 4-card hand value, including composition of the count (as in Noddy). This is followed by dealer's announcement and score. This announcement of the count allows the other player to anticipate what cards may be held by his opponent, and play accordingly. The astute player may even underestimate his hand such as not reporting a pair, in order to gain a possible 6-count.

The pegging sequence begins with the non-dealer and continues, as in Noddy, to 31, or "go" with scores for pairs, runs, 15's and flushes. However, in Cribbage all cards are to be played out.

When all cards are all on the table, the counts are verified, and overcounts retracted. Undercounts, whether deliberate or accidental, are lost.

The dealer counts and scores his crib. This new feature with 5 cards allows new combinations; namely, double-double runs, triple runs, full house, double run of 4, run of 5, pair and run of 3, and 5-card flushes (not 4-card flushes).

Game is 61. If loser has 45 or less he is "lurched" and the stakes doubled.

The Modern Game of Cribbage

In the early 19th Century, Cribbage was modified once again into a 6-card deal that we play today. A run of 3 counts 3, not 2. No flushes are counted in the pegging sequence, and a flush may be a 4-card flush in the hand, but must be a 5-card flush in the crib. The 3-point allowance for first crib was eliminated, and the game was "twice around" or 121 points.
