Western Region Events

McDonald World Champ Lawrence Cops Oregon Coast

In Early May, the Western Region is abuzz with (CA), Bud Warner (CA) and Peggy cribbage events. The two largest are the World Championship in Quincy, CA (May 5-7) and the Oregon Coast Classic in Lincoln City, OR (May 12-14). Both events topped 200 players, rewarding the players with sizeable MRP's and cash prizes.

World Championship: Master Boyd McDonald, Mountain View, CA, came home the winner at this 202-player event, winning his final match 3-0 over the streaking Jesse Jarrell (CA). With the win came 196 MRP's, \$1,000 and bragging rights. McDonald is zeroing in on his Grand Master as well with this prestigious win. Jarrell's 2nd place finish netted 147 MRP's and vaults him into the National Master Point lead for this cribbage year...and he earned his two-star rating as well (15,000 MRP's, lifetime). This was Jarrell's 3rd consecutive 2nd place finish, and he is piling up MRP's at a record pace in April and May. He leads the pack with 1,400+ MRP's for the year.

Eric Nelson (CA) and Steve Harding (CA) nailed down 3-4. Aloha Montooth (CA) topped the qualifying round field with a nice 34 GP's in the 20-game match.

Grand Master Jones Hom (CA) took qualifying honors in the 82-player Consolation, but local Master Al Libby won the playoffs. Karen Pogue

Cunningham (AZ) finished 2-3-4.

Director Mike Taborski had a full array of satellite events. The winners:

The Quincy Rotary Club hosted a well-run affair, and provided the players with an excellent lunch and dinner. In addition, a very successful raffle with many nice prizes netted the Rotarians funds for their charity projects.

Oregon Coast Classic: Ed Lawrence, pegging out of Depoe Bay, OR, won the 219player Classic, nipping Master Lea Hornbeck (WA) in the final playoff match. The win came with some \$1,500, 196 MRP's, and a coveted Bill O'Malley trophy board. Hornbeck took home 147 MRP's, a four-figure 2nd place check, and another O'Malley board.

Master Donna Hassett (OR), fresh from winning her Grass Roots club championship, nailed down 3rd, followed by Ed Park (OR) in 4th.

Grand Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) took qualifying honors with a superlative 39 18/22 +270 to easily take honors. This high score also propelled her to wins in the team events. A new event on tap was the "Sadie Hawkins" team event. A woman picks a man for a partner, and this proved to be a very popular event (58 teams played). Jeanne picked spouse Roy and they waltzed to the win with a combined 67 GP's.

132 players played the Consolation, and Diane Harvey (OR) came away the winner, besting Grand Master Bernie Saueressig (WA) in the final playoff match. George LaBrasseur (OR) and Henry Carle (AK) finished 3-4. Carle's high finish netted him his long-awaited Master rating. Grand Master Harvey Honeycutt (OR) topped the field in the qualifying round with a 17 7/9 +135.

Directors Roy and Jeanne Hofbauer, Rollie Heath, and Bernie and Sophia Nelson had all events on time and well posted. The paybacks were fair and generous, attested to by yet another large crowd. And the ocean setting is another plus for those combining their pegging with a seaside outing.

World Championship Vignettes

Bruce Forbes, Chico, CA, is the only player who has attended all 29 World Championship events.

Two-time World Champ Nick Ayoob (Quincy) was the only player to score a 29-hand...and he recorded this gem in the 12th game of the qualifying round.

Richard Brown traveled all the way from East Malling Kent, England in a try for the World title.



Paul Hatcher Earns 12th One-Star

The Yreka Gold Panners faced severe competition from Lake Tahoe and Hermiston, OR in late April, but 23 hardy peggers showed for their first annual Gold Panner event.

For Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, the event proved memorable as he earned the ACC's 12th One-Star rating (10,000 MRP's lifetime). He won the 20-player Consolation to zip over the 10,000 mark.

Ex-World Champ Rollie Heath, a Grand Master from Lincoln City, OR, won the Main Event, and Grand Master Todd Malmgren (OR) took home 2nd.

Mike and Deena Lowry (CA) copped the Friday Doubles and won 2 of the 4 door prizes (unique gold pan trophies). Burt Ellis (OR) won the Friday preliminary game; Gerald Hahn took the Saturday game, and the Last Chance was won by none other than the director...Scott Dague.

In an interview with Cribbage World, One-Star Hatcher said that despite the few entrants in this event, it was a fun filled weekend, nevertheless. Earning One-Star is exciting, to say the least.

Palm Tree Degging

Helen Barach from Tacoma, WA nailed the April edition of the Hawaiian Open. In besting the 23 players, Barach took home 70 MRP's, and bragging rights (and a sun tan?). Rodney Kanno (HI) finished 2nd.

Fred White, Hawaii's only Master pegger, took the Last Chance event.

180 In Pawtucket Karyn Fischer Tops Ocean State

Kayrn Fischer, pegging out of North Providence, RI, came to play at the huge 180-player Ocean State Classic. She outlasted the field to take home the championship, 196 MRP's, and the top purse. Her last playoff match at this Pawtucket, RI match pitted her with Steve Scardace and her cards remained strong to gain the win. Mike Azevedo (MA) and Life Master George Webb (MA) finished 3-4.

Gene Santa (RI) had the hot hand in the qualifying round, scoring a nice 23 GP card in the 12-game round.

John Brodeur (MA) smoked the field in the Consolation qualifying round with an excellent 16 GP's in the 8-game round to take honors. When the playoffs wound down, only PatFrattalone (CT) remained unbeaten to take this 104-player event. Frattalone earned 63 MRP's with the win. Charles Truett (MA) took home 2nd, followed by Donna Gavin (MA) and Brodeur in 3-4.

Director John Chambers reported a single 28hand was scored...Al Tenenbaum from the Sunshine State. This event is one of the largest played in the New England area this cribbage season, attesting to Chamber's expertise at managing tournaments.

Fletcher Tough In Black Hills

Bob Fletcher, Aurora, CO was right at home in the Black Hills, as he nailed the Black Hills Open in Rapid City on May 7. In besting some 37 peggers, Fletcher took home 105 MRP's...and some Black Hills gold. Mark Robinette (CO) finished 2nd, with meet director Ron Hopp (SD) and T. J. Lewis (SD) in 3-4.

George Rodriguez (MT) continues his fine play this cribbage year by taking qualifying honors with a nifty 35 GP card in the 22-game qualifying round. His MRP total for this year is at the 700 mark.

Wes Hall (SD) very nearly ran the table in the 26-player Consolation, taking qualifying honors (17GP's, 9 games) and finishing 2nd in the playoffs. Pink Pinkerton (WY) took home 1st, with Dan Graf (SD) and Howard Pearson (SD) in 3-4. Tamie Hopp (SD) won the Friday Special, and T. J. Lewis copped the Saturday night game.

Master Point Race 2nd + 2nd + 2nd = 1st! Jarrell Scores 437 MRP's, Zips to National Lead

Jesse Jarrell, Pittsburg, CA, has unofficially roared to his Two-Star rating (15,000 MRP's) this past month by scoring three consecutive 2nd place finishes in large tournaments, picking up 125 MRP's at the Rio Linda Open, 145 MRP's at the Lake Tahoe Challenge, and yet another 147 MRP's at the World Championship in Quincy, CA. This outstanding three weeks of pegging netted Jarrell 437 MRP's, and vaults him into the National MRP lead with some 1,428 MRP's (unofficial).

Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, scored just enough MRP's at the Yreka Gold Panners (CA) to earn his One-Star, but could not match Jarrell's run. He stands at 1,200 MRP's for the year. One-Star Bob Julian (WI), Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), and Master Ron Morgan (CA) stand at the 1,000 mark for the year. Morgan's great run has him knocking on the door for his Grand Master rating.

Five peggers have topped 800 for the year, and have an outside chance of taking home the national championship. They are: Grand Master Jack Moritzky (WA), Life Master Frank Danielski (WI), Master Robert Chase (MN), Grand Master Clair Morse (OR), and Life Master Patrick Barrett (WI).

Nine peggers have topped 700 MRP's for the year, and will have to pick up their pace a bit to take top-ten honors this cribbage year. All nine have great track records in years past, and could easily zip to honors. They are: Grand Master Todd Schaefer (MN), Grand Master Roger Wilson (CO), Grand Master Jim Waldorf (OR), One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA), One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI), One-Star Duane Toll (WI), One-Star Harry Palmer (MA), and Grand Master Mary Herrmann (CA).

Some 15 peggers have topped 600 and have an excellent chance of making the All-American team if they can hit a "hot streak.!" With many large events yet to be played, the race is on! Cribbage fever! Catch it!

William "Ratso" Roderick Wins Rio Linda Open, Not Jesse Jarrell

Last month's CW stated that Jesse Jarrell (CA) "nailed" the Rio Linda Open, and was called on the carpet by director Craig Hays for misinformation. No so, argues CW editor DeLynn Colvert. Some Thoughts On Betrayal

The membership of the American Cribbage Congress has, overwhelmingly, been exceedingly fortunate in our dealings with each other. We have several thousand members who embody the aims and objectives of the organization people who are attracted and retained by the friendly competition offered at Grass Roots and Sanctioned Tournament venues. It is a tribute to both the letter and spirit of our playing ethos and practices that very few persons have been suspended and/or expelled for rules violations. Situations involving public rancor between members have been nearly nonexistent.

So why are we so depressed?

Webster's Encyclopedia Unabridged Dictionary of the English Language defines "betray" as "to be disloyal to; to disappoint the hopes or expectations of; to deceive, mislead." Webster's defines "trust" as: "reliance on the integrity, strength, ability, surety, etc. of a person or thing; confidence...'trust' implies instinctive unquestioning belief in and reliance upon something."

Two high-profile members of the ACC have been accused in the past 16 months of the theft of money from the membership of the organization. We are angry and sad because our trust has been betrayed. This leads, naturally, to a generalized attitude of suspicion to which we are unaccustomed. Additionally, we begin to wonder if our own judgement is less insightful than we would like to believe it is...

How pathetically desperate these persons must have been to even contemplate such indecent acts against others who have sincerely felt them to be friends!

They deserve our pity, but not our money.

Because of the nature of this recreational pursuit, it is probable, in our estimation, that attempts of this sort are likely to be made in the future. We sincerely hope that, should such incidents occur, they will continue to be dealt with quickly and judiciously. We also hope that the ACC Board of Directors will continue in its resolve NOT to consider the reinstatement of expelled cheaters, of whatever stripe. We are a social organization devoted to a game that we all enjoy, and have neither the inclination not the expertise to rehabilitate persons with character disorders.

What we hope most of all is that members do not allow these isolated acts of desperation-induced betrayal to create a poisonous lack of trust in each other. We are lucky to be part of an organization composed almost entirely of truly wonderful people. We simply cannot afford, no matter what the circumstances, to forget that.



Nunez Cooked Goose

Glenn Nunez (CA) was pegging with Annett Eiffert (CA) and needed 11 pegs to win the game with first count at the recent Lions Open in Alamo, CA. Eiffert needs 8 pegs to win the game as the dealer. Nunez holds 3-3-2-1 and feels confident the game is his. A 10 is cut and he is home free, right? Wrong. He leads a 3 (normally a good play, right?). Wrong. Eiffert holds a 4-5-6-7. The game is over! No matter what sequence the cards are played (after the 3 lead), Eiffert will score a run of 7 and 31 for 2 on her last card played.

Discarding Techniques And Board Position

The cards you discard into your opponent's crib can vary, depending on both you and your opponent's board position. Let's take the following two examples for the same hand.

You are dealt 2-3-3-4-J-J. There is no flush.

Example 1: Your are at the 115 hole, and your opponent (dealer) is at 116.

Example 2: You are at the 82 hole, and your opponent (dealer) is at 88.

Example 1: You should discard the 4-J. You only need 6 pegs to go out. The main object is to keep your opponent from pegging out. By keeping one of the Jacks, you've kept an escape route, in case your opponent tries to get into a run. You should lead the 3. If your opponent lays a 4, trying to set up a run, you can play the Jack, and stay away from the run.

Example 2: You should discard the pair of Jacks. You need 13 to get into position for your deal. The best chance is to hold the double-run, and the odds are very good, that with the cut, you will have at least 12 points. On the other hand, your opponent is dealing 7 holes short of position. Giving him the pair probably won't enhance his crib that much, and he'll be short when you are dealing from the 95 hole (or better). You have three hands to count, and with a little bit of luck, you win the game.

World Championship Update

I had heard from a few players who competed at our World Championship (WCCT) in May that several of their Grass Roots players were not returning to Quincy because they felt the prize money wasn't enough. I heard one say, "Gee, you have over 200 players in Quincy and the top prize is only \$1,000. I played at a tournament recently where the top prize with 100 players was \$1,500.

That misunderstanding needs to be addressed and, as a tournament director, I need some input from tournament players.

First, let me put our cards on the table. As ACC requires, we pay back 85% of the registration fee less \$2 per entrant that we have to send to ACC and any other non-cash dividends provided to the contestants. For the WCCT that includes the coffee, donuts, plaques, lunch and dinner. All other expenses associated with the tournament comes from the remaining 15%. Whatever we make off the raffle, bar and food service go to our club's charity.

This year in the main event we had 202 players with a prize fund of \$6,520. Here's a simple, but complete breakdown of the math (the same formula we use every year): Registration: \$60. From that we deduct \$6 for lunch, \$12 for dinner, \$2 ACC fees leaving \$40 for the prize fund. Multiply times 202 = \$8,080. Deduct \$410 for trophies, \$170 for coffee and donuts. That leaves \$7,500. Our allowed 15% cut equals \$1,125 (that's what's available to pay fairground rent, sound system rental and other expenses). \$7,500 less the \$1,125 leaves \$6,375 for the prize fund, and we paid back \$6,520.

One quick point regarding the food. Quincy isn't big enough to feed a group our size, and certainly not in time for the players to return in a timely manner to resume play. Those who have attended any of our tournaments know our primary focus is to have a good time, play as much cribbage as we can in the time allowed and listen to what our players want from us. And that's hand! Since his is the last game, been the key to our successful tourneys.

We run a fun, smooth tourney and hate to lose players for reasons that are within our control, so here's my questions. We've obviously giving the players more than their share of the purse, so are we paying too many places? We returned money to all those who qualified, in our case that was 51 qualifying, so 33-51 received their \$60 entry back, then graduated the paybacks to reach the \$1,000 first place prize. That's \$1,140 that could go to the top finishers. We've heard it both ways, if you qualify you deserve some money. Others argue to the contrary. We also provide plaques to the top 32 qualifiers, maybe those should be eliminated? Do players want more money paid to the top finalist? I'd love to hear from you and other tournament directors if you have any suggestions. I'll be happy to share them in an article or letter in a future Cribbage World.

Next year, we'll be crowning our 30th World Champion. Will it be you? Hope you can make it.




