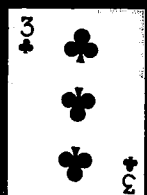
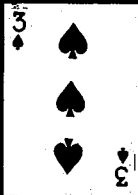

## ***Records Galore!***

# **Schleusner Tops 1,091 Roderick Wins TOC**

The Sands Hotel and Casino remodeled their facility to accommodate all comers at the recent JPW/ACC Open in Reno. With past JPW/ACC Open events limited to the first 1,024, and having players turned away, the remodeling and added cribbage playing space proved worthwhile...as a record 1,091 players signed on for pegging action. This is far and away the largest cribbage tournament under one roof in the long history of the grand old game.

Kicking off the long weekend, the Eastern Region All-Star players waxed the Central and Western players (see story, this issue) on Thursday night...and the pegging action was on!

On Friday, the prestigious Tournament of Champions (by invite only) kicked into gear, and Life Master Larry Samet (MA) came out of the blocks hot, nailing top qualifying honors with a nifty 30 14/16 +218. But when the playoffs wound down, only Master Phyllis Roderick (CA) was left standing...and \$8,000 richer! Victor Struminger was a long way from his Georgia home, but his second place \$6,000 check more than paid for his trip. Ted Hokenson (MI) wasn't complaining about his \$4,000 third place finish, either! Life Master Sundae Webb (CA) rounded out the final four with a nice \$3,000 for 4th place.

The TOC Consolation (not sanctioned) had an unusual format as no playoffs were scheduled. High-card score determined the winners, and Frank Podjun (GA) scored the 308-player field's high card, taking home \$1,230 for the win. Grand Master Roger King (CA) took 2nd (\$1,080), followed by Joe Daesch (FL), and Mike Burns (MN) in 3-4.

The next morning the huge 1,091 field showed to play the JPW/ACC Open and the Sands was abuzz with players as far as the eye could see. Master Jack Howsare (VA) smoked the field with a great 40 18/22 +366 to easily take qualifying honors (and \$1,270 Q money). But when it came to the whopping 10-round playoff action, Greg Schleusner, Truckee, CA, came home the winner. Not only did he take home the grand enchalada (\$10,000), but also earned the ACC's 47th Life Master rating as well. And Fred White (HI) became Hawaii's only Master pegger by finishing 2nd...and winning \$8,000. Patricia Echard, a local pegger, nailed 3rd, followed by George Rodriguez (MT) in 4th. Rodriguez vaults to 3rd place in the Western Region with this high finish (635 MRP's this cribbage year).

Finishing 5-8 was well worth-while and Mattie Bradshaw (GA), Herry Gelson (RI), Master Barry Spadea (RI), and Jean Taylor (FL) turned the trick.

Some 816 peggers signed on for the Consolation, establishing yet another record crowd for a second-chance match (last year saw 814 play the Consolation). Mark Robinette (CO) scored a grand slam 9/9 20GP +187 to take qualifying honors. Larry Antijunti (OR) came home the winner and took home a sizeable check, plus 135 MRP's. Frank Leier (MN) nailed 2nd, followed by Master Mitch Bourland (OR) and Robinette in 4th. Robinette's combined fine showing netted 111 MRP's.

In an oddity, Life Master Deb Kvien and Master Les Kvien (IL) finished 5-6, showing how kitchen table cribbage events out the game. Rod Marshall (WA) and Master Harold Schmelzer (OR) rounded out the top 8.

Eleven 28-hands were scored, but this is not a record. The following players scored this gem: Bruce Page, David Clemmey, Harry Gelson,

George Taylor, Julie Hardardt, David Hubsch, Edward Donahue, Rich Van Hall, John Alig, Mona Wahlig, and Donald Smith.

A 29-hand was certainly expected to show with the record crowd's enormous number of games played...and it did! Darlene Stier (AK) nailed this gem, and took home \$100 from the ACC for the 11th of the year.

Joan and Jim Rein (TOC), Jeanne Hofbauer and Roy Hofbauer, and Scott Kooistra (JPW/ACC Open) were tournament directors of these mammoth matches, and with a bevy of volunteers doing superlative work, all events rolled smoothly to conclusion. And, once again, the Sands, with the aid of Barbara Woodward's expertise, rolled out the red carpet for the players...and added \$7,000 prize money. The annual gathering of the clan continues to pack 'em in.

## Vignettes...FROM RENO

With a record-breaking 1,091 players, the odds of playing a friend was very remote...but there was Al Stanek playing Lyle Beiswenger. They were North Dakota's only ACC members playing.

After Fred White (HI) won \$8,000 for finishing 2nd in the JPW/ACC Open, he invited 11 Hawaiian peggers out to celebrate. The tab? Right at the \$1,000 mark! Atta way, Fred!

In the TOC, Larry Harmon (CT) scored a non-sanctioned 28-hand...and lost to Dick West (MA).

Phyllis Roderick (CA) won the TOC...and \$8,000. She was very fortunate to get by her first-round playoff match with Paul Hatcher (OR). The first two games of the match, Hatcher needed but FOUR points, with first count, to win. Both times he scored THREE!

Harold Schmelzer (OR) discovered that two of his pegging friends were celebrating their 41st Wedding Anniversary. He gave them each a set of hand-carved ivory pegs.

Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft (WI) won last year's JPW/ACC Open. While playing, a fellow player nudged Gabby's opponent and whispered "You're playing last year's champ!" After two deals Gabby was still on first street and his opponent was heading home on third street. Gabby surveyed the situation and said, "I didn't scare you a bit, did I?"

Vonita Gill (WA) complained to Rollie Heath (OR) that she had not qualified in some two years. Heath promised to take Gill to dinner when she finally made the cut. And she did, and Rollie sprang for dinner. This time around in Reno, Gill won \$4,000 on "Let It Ride" poker. Did she take Heath out for dinner?

Two-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) was sporting a scraggly beard. He explained he wasn't shaving until he finally qualifies in a Main Event. Three weeks later...it is still growing...

## Barrett Cops North Pole

Life Master Pat Barrett came to play at the Recent North Pole Open in Appleton, WI. Not only did he qualify 2nd (of 140 peggers), but came home the winner in the playoffs as well. His combined MRP take? 246 MRP's! Standing at well over 500 MRP's for the year, he now is among the national leaders.

Master Bill Sperry topped the field in the qualifying round with a very nice 37.18/22 +202.

One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) nailed 2nd in the playoffs (147 MRP's) and vaults to the top of the Central Region in points scored this cribbage year. Gary Schmidt (WI) and Master Marvin Lang (IL) came home 3-4.

84 played the Consolation and Jim Knorr (WI) took honors in the qualifying round (18 8/9 +156), but One-Star Duane Toll (WI) took playoff honors (and begins a hot streak that will take him to the top three in national ratings). Emilio Perez (IL), Nancy Vachavake (WI), and Grand Master Aggie Mikulsky (WI) finished 2-3-4.

## Eastern Region Wins Tie-breaking All-Star Game

With Peter Setian leading the way with a 26 GP card (16 games), the Eastern Region All-Star team coasted to a convincing win at the tie-breaking 10th Annual event in Reno on February 3.

The score now stands at 4 wins for the Eastern Region, and 3 each for the Central and Western Regions. In this year's match, the Eastern squad won 73 games with 9 skunks, followed by the Central Region with 62 wins and 6 skunks. The Western Region posted 57 wins, with 9 skunks.

Phyllis Schmidt (Eastern) took 2nd in the Q event with a 23 GP card. Donna Hassett (Western) copped 3rd with another 23 GP card, and the Eastern Region's Frank Corrado nailed 4th (22 GP's). Setian was also high scorer in 1998, scoring an identical 26 GP card.

## Ed Horigan Elected Into Cribbage Hall of Fame

At the recent Board of Directors Meeting in Reno some 11 ACC members were considered for induction into the Hall of Fame.

The late Ed Horigan from Virginia was elected, receiving 19 of 23 votes cast. 17 votes were required for election into the Hall of Fame. Horigan is most noted for his insistence on a fairer Master Rating Point System, and labored above and beyond the call of duty to have a equal points for equal difficulty system put in place. He also earned his Grand Master rating in 1996. He is the 19th member elected into this elite group.

Others nominated: Gene Biegler, Ken Cambell, Jesse Jarrell, Joe Bernard, Duane Toll, Warren Sondericker, Phyllis Schmidt, (the late) Jim McManus, Harry Palmer and Bob Julian.

## Membership Secretary's Report

Larry Hassett, Membership Secretary, presented the Board of Directors a detailed report for the past year.

As of January, 2000, memberships stand at 7,218. California continues to lead the way with 1,343 members. Oregon and Wisconsin have topped 600, with Washington (554), Massachusetts (413) and Florida (405) having sizeable numbers. California, Washington and Oregon are leading in signing on new members.

## Jesse Jarrell Vaults to MRP Lead

One-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) has zipped into the national MRP lead for this cribbage year. Riding an unprecedented three sanctioned wins this cribbage year, he continues to tattoo almost every event and his totals now stand at 768 for this cribbage year. Hot on his heels is Life Master Paul Hatcher (OR). Hatcher recently underwent open-heart surgery, and hasn't found his stride since resuming play. He has 710 MRP's to date.

George Rodriguez (MT) has had an astounding year, considering he plays mainly in Montana and Reno. He has compiled an excellent 635 MRP's to date. Life Master Larry Samet (MA) is also over the 600 mark. Master Jack Moritzky (WA) will also be over the 600 mark when the Wine Valley event is posted. The report was lost in the mail, and a copy re-surfaced to give Moritzky his overdue MRP's (he is also unofficially a Grand Master).

Some 16 peggers have topped 500 for this cribbage year, and it appears, once again, that the national championship is up for grabs. Many large tournaments remain to be played, and a player with a hot streak can take it all.

## Who's Close?

Elmer Morlock (MN) is standing at 1,994 MRP's, needing but a scant six to earn Master. Francis Froelich (WI) is at 1,992, and Richard Cossack (MN) has 1,989.

## Mid-Week Sanctioned Events

The Board of Directors have been wrestling with the sanctioning of mid-week events. Some directors want to "ride" a big event by having a preliminary mid-week double-header. This was successfully accomplished in Minnesota and Wisconsin this October.

The BOD compromised by voting that each Region could schedule a mid-week event, one per quarter, or 4 per year. The Regional Tournament Commissioners would make the determination, based on past track records, etc.

## No More Re-Certifications

The Board of Directors voted to rescind the Re-certification of ACC Judges.

# **Valentine's Day Games**

## **Duane Toll in Minnesota**

Valentine's Day is becoming a favorite date for cribbage play. In Antioch, California some 94 players attended the annual Valentine's Day Open...and In Blaine, Minnesota, their Valentine's Day Special drew 98 players.

The California edition saw Jackie Doppelt (CA) take home the "valentine"...and almost made her Grand Master to boot. Another pegger of the fair sex, Marion Buckley (AB) finished 2nd...and she always gets her man! She is a Royal Canadian Mounted Policewoman! Two Californians finished 3-4...Tom Owens and Harry Ng.

Last year's national MRP runnerup, Wes Summers (CA), took qualifying honors with a nice 29 14/18 +91.

Jim Hansberry (CA) nailed the qualifying round of the 56-player Consolation...and came home 3rd in the playoffs, but H. Ross Njaa (CA) won the playoff action. Jim McKnight (CA) and Tad Pelicki (CA) finished 2-4.

An oddity had two brothers each scoring 28-hands...Jim & Frank Hansberry. Winner Doppelt and 2nd place finisher Buckley also scored a 28-hands. Director Sundae Webb gave special awards for heart flushes (right on!) and the first 12 24-hands.

**Blaine, MN, February 13:** One-Star Duane Toll (WI), fresh from winning the North Pole Open Consolation, is on a roll. He won the 98-player Main Event at this year's Minnesota Valentine Special and has unofficially topped the 500 MRP mark for this cribbage year. Dan Pluff (MN) finished 2nd, followed by Babe O'Gorman (MN) and Master Dave Gustafson (MN) in 3-4. Master Bob Chase (MN) won 11 of 14 to take qualifying honors.

Les Kvien is moving in on his Grand Master rating by taking Consolation qualifying honors (winning 7 of 8), but Al Bailey (MN) came home the winner in the playoffs. Stacey Brown (MN), Dave Yaeger (MN) and Frank Leier (MN) finished 2-3-4.

Three 28-hands showed: Al Greenlee, Al Bailey, and Larry Algiers scored this gem. No 29's showed. Director Jerry Gruber reported all events went smoothly and he is looking forward to next year's match.

**Bowman's Wife Picks College Football Upsets**  
Bruce Bowman reported on how poorly Las Vegas predicted the spreads on college football bowl games (missing by a 12.3 average). He says his wife knows how to do this more accurately. She picks winners by the colors of their socks. Bowman says she is great on picking upsets!



## **Q-Pools!**

A Q Pool is a Q Pool...is a Q Pool...not true! At the recent TOC and JPW/ACC Open, held in Reno, only 50% of the qualifiers actually received Q money. Yes, the pre-game rules did specify only one in eight would receive Q payments. However, I do not believe in the fairness or the equity of this practice.

Websters dictionary defines a qualifier as: one who or that which qualifies. The majority of cribbage players strive to qualify, wherever they play. Their reasons are to continue play in the tournament and collect Q money, to help defray costs, and to garner master points. ALL of the tournaments which I play in the New England area pay ALL certified qualifiers Q money. I sincerely believe that this practice is true to the term qualifier and fair to all players. A qualifier is a qualifier...is a qualifier!

In conclusion I would suggest, in the interest of fair play, that the National Tournament Commissioner and Regional Commissioners seriously consider a ruling that ALL tournament directors be required to pay ALL qualifiers that have entered the Q Pool.



## Ras is No. 3!

Playing internet zone.com cribbage, he recently won 14 of 17 games to run his rating to 2,800. Of the 187,000 rated players, only two have a higher rating (2,818 and 2,804). That makes ACC member Ras third in a whopping crowd of peggers.

Ras also states that some 374,000 players play ladder cribbage worldwide. That is a source to tap for the ACC to say the least!

## Questions

Lil Holtman, Vancouver, WA, poses three questions to CW.

They are:

Q: What were the least number of hands played in a game?

A: *Four deals...and out! (Very, very rare!)*

Q: What was the biggest point spread between a winner and a loser?

A: *In a Montana Championship match, a player was beaten 121-30. A triple skunk. And he did NOT peg backwards! Anyone in cribbage land know of a worse score?*

Q: What are the most pegging points possible in one hand?

A: *The old 29-12 pegging hand. Example: 4-4-4-3-3-3-3. 12 points for the first player, and 29 for the 2nd player. A 5-5-5-5-2-2-2-2 nets the first player 14, the second player still scores 29! Anyone in cribbage land beat that?*

## Grass Roots Awards Clarified

Joe Ramos, our National Grass Roots Statistician, e-mailed *Cribbage World* stating that many Grass Roots players were misled by January's cover story stating that all sanctioned 29-hands are rewarded with \$100 by the ACC.

He claims many players thought that Grass Roots 29-hands also receive \$100. This is not true.

Lee Norris e-mailed CW information about Grass Roots Awards. He states that the Grass Roots issues certificates for 28-hands, 29-hands, Grand Slams (9 in a row), and Bronze Award (1,000 Grass Roots points). ## Keep TOC In Reno

Ref: Verne Nielson Letter in Jan. CW.

The first TOC and first Open's were held in 1982-83-84 at the Riviera in Las Vegas. The TOC had entries of 42-22-36 for a total of 100 in 3 years. The Open had 32-56 for a total of 88 in 2 years. The first tournament in Sparks in 1986 had 113 entries in the TOC, and the Western Open fielded 178. The events moved to the Sands (Reno) in 1987 and entries were 178 (TOC) and 454 (ACC Open). In 1988 entries increased to 232/648.

The Sands, with Barbara Woodward's help, has made the TOC/JPWACC Open the largest and most successful cribbage tournament in the world. If the members want a 2-day tournament for the TOC, then keep it at Reno and make it a 4-day event combined with the JPW/ACC Open.

The 1996 Grand National at Napa had 428 entries, the 1997 GN at Wisconsin Dells had

456, and the 1998 event at Daytona Beach fielded 280 entries. In 1999, Las Vegas hosted a record 678. Why? Probably because the players like gaming. With the Grand National rotating among the three regions, the possibility exists that gaming would not be offered at a Grand National site. And if the Grand National can't get a large attendance on it's own merit, don't prop it up with the TOC. The TOC, as well as the JPW/ACC would probably suffer a loss of attendance, without assurance the GN would have an increase.

The Sands under the supervision of Barbara Woodward, with the assistance of many others too numerous to mention, has made the TOC/JPW the success it is. Why punish the Sands and reward somebody else for the fine job they have done? Keep the TOC/JPW in Reno at the Sands.
